Remember, How You Can Be a Fruitful Witness is a transferable concept. You can master it by reading it six times; then pass it on to others as our Lord commands us in Matthew , "Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you."

God loved us so much that He gave His Son. Christ died for our sins. Christ rose from the dead. Christ wants to come into every life. We must be born again. We must receive Jesus Christ. To as many as receive Jesus, God gives the right to become His children. By grace you have been saved, through faith. These points were then removed from the board. We continued to Laws Two, Three and Four, following the same procedure. At this point, the chalkboard was always clean. The distilled essence of the gospel is contained in the Four Spiritual Laws booklet. Origins of the Four Spiritual Laws Booklet Originally, the Four Spiritual Laws was written only for our staff, who were asked to memorize it as a witnessing tool. As a result, the number of people who received Christ increased dramatically. The content of the Four Spiritual Laws began to crystallize in my thinking during the summer staff training in at a time when our staff numbered less than fifty. One of our speakers for our staff training that year was a Christian layman who was an outstanding sales consultant. He emphasized that to be successful in sales, a person must develop a clear, simple, understandable presentation that can be used over and over again. He then compared the witnessing Christian to the secular salesperson. To be effective in communicating our faith in Christ, he stresses, we must develop a simple, understandable, reasonable presentation for the gospel which we can share with everyone. The better and more often you communicate this simple presentation, the more fruitful you will be in your witness for Christ. He illustrated his remarks by telling of several well-known Christians who had their own special presentations. But, though I have never heard him speak, I would be willing to wager that he has only one message for everyone. Basically, he tells them all the same thing. The longer he spoke, the more irritated I became. Furthermore, I resented his using me as an example before the rest of the staff. Initial Reaction Gives Way to Inspiration But when it was all over and I was licking my wounds, the most serious of which was my bruised ego, I began to reflect on exactly what I did share with various people. That afternoon I wrote down my basic presentation, and to my amazement I discovered my friend had been right. Without realizing it, I had been sharing basically the same message with some variation with everyone. I asked each staff member to memorize it, and we all began to use it in our personal witnessing. The next year, as we concentrated on sharing this simple message in dependence on the Holy Spirit and His power, our ministry was multiplied a hundredfold. Most non-Christians do not need to be convinced that they should become Christians. Rather, they simply need to be shown how to become a Christian. So I prepared a condensed outline, complete with Scripture verses and diagrams, and each member of the staff memorized it. As more and more people became involved in our training program, it became apparent that we needed to make the presentation available in printed form. As a result, the Four Spiritual Laws booklet was born. But we do know that literally millions of men and women have received Christ through the direct, simple presentation of the gospel contained in this booklet. According to our estimate, more than one billion copies have been distributed in all of the major languages of the world. He went back to share his enthusiasm with his church and with his assistant minister. The assistant was not impressed by the booklet. He disliked tracts, and this looked like just another tract. He tossed it on his desk, not even bothering to read it. A few days later a city official came by to inspect the church facilities. As she was about to leave after her inspection it suddenly occurred to the assistant minister that he had not talked to her about Christ. He looked around quickly, and the only thing he saw was the Four Spiritual Laws booklet, which he had tossed aside in disgust some days previously. She misunderstood, however, and began to read it aloud in his presence. She read every word, and by the time she got to Law Four, tears were streaming down her cheeks. She came to the prayer and prayed aloud, leading herself to Christ. By this time the assistant minister was so impressed that he came to Arrowhead Springs to find out for

Booklet Melts Skepticism Another heartwarming experience demonstrates the effectiveness of the booklet. A man, who was greatly admired in his home town, was not a Christian. In fact, he was known as the town skeptic because he never responded positively to the many who witnessed to him personally. He had befriended the parents of a Christian friend who felt especially concerned for his salvation. After obtaining a Four Spiritual Laws booklet, this friend decided to call on the skeptic and read it to him. Any man would be a fool not to receive Christ if he really understood what is involved. Suggestions for Evangelism as a Lifestyle Now, permit me to share several simple suggestions that will help you to introduce others to Christ as a way of life. First, begin every day with prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to empower and lead you to those whose hearts He has prepared. Second, relate to people in a loving, natural, personal way. Everyone responds to love. Not everyone will be prepared to receive Christ or even be positive in his response. Some may even be antagonistic. God may want you to sow the seed to use you as an instrument of harvest. Whatever the case, relax and let Him do what He wants to do through you. Remember, just as all fruit in an orchard is not ripe at the same time, so some individuals will be ripe for harvest and others will still be green “not yet ready to respond to the gospel. Consider every gospel conversation a great privilege and opportunity, not a legalistic responsibility. Make sharing your faith in Christ a way of life. Third, use a clear, simple presentation of the gospel. There are many benefits which result from using a tool such as the Four Spiritual Laws. Let me list some of them: It enables you to open your conversation easily and naturally. It gives you confidence in your witnessing because you know what you are going to say and how you are going to say it. It enables you to be prepared at all times and to stick to the subject without getting off on tangents. It makes it possible for you to be brief and to the point. It enables you to lead others to a personal decision through a suggested prayer. It offers suggestions for growth, including the importance of involvement in the church. It also enables them to show those friends and loved ones how they, too, can make their own commitment to Christ. Making the Complicated Understandable A well-known Christian leader, highly gifted as a theologian, shared with me his frustration with me over his lack of effectiveness and fruitfulness in witnessing for Christ. The large number of Bible verses he used would confuse most people and prevent them from making an intelligent decision. I challenged him to use the Four Spiritual Laws presentation daily for the next thirty days and report his progress to me at the end of that time. When I saw him two weeks later, he was overflowing with joy and excitement. He wanted to share the Four Spiritual Laws booklet with everyone. He even shared in the swimming pool with water up to his neck! And the best part of all is that he keeps on doing it. I thank God with all my heart for this change. One of the most difficult barriers to overcome in witnessing is just getting started. No matter who you are or where you are, opportunities are always available. Assume that whenever you are alone with another person for more than just a few moments, it is a divine appointment and as answer to your prayer. In addition to sharing Christ with students, executives and lay people individually and in groups large and small, I witness regularly to porters, elevator operators, maids in the hotels, taxicab drivers, filling station attendants and people in numerous other types of work, on a plane, it is often easy to engage the stewardess or a seatmate in conversation by having in hand either a Bible, a Four Spiritual Laws booklet, or some other piece of Christian literature. Following a group meeting, whether a church service, a Bible study, a student outreach meeting or some similar gathering, you may wish to introduce yourself to different individuals. Then, after a warm greeting, proceed with the following questions in whatever way is natural for you: If the individuals indicate they have already heard of the Four Laws, ask their opinion, review the booklet, and give them the opportunity to pray and receive Christ, if they have not already done so. Simple Conversations Starters There are many effective ways of establishing contact with another person. After a cordial, friendly greeting, you can say: Have you ever heard of the Four Spiritual Laws? I would like to share it with you. It contains truths that I believe will be of great interest to you. Would you read it and give me your impression? This little booklet, the Four Spiritual Laws, will help you to know for sure that you will go to heaven when you die. If you have a more unhurried opportunity, you may find it helpful to take a few minutes

If you only study one page on this section on evangelism, this page is it. Because here is where you will learn three of the most important verses of evangelism: When Jesus was on the earth, He taught. He taught with words and His words had a very strong effect on people. They angered some and broke others. But when Jesus spoke, things happened. He raised the dead by speaking, "Lazarus, come forth" John He calmed the wind and sea with words, "Then He arose, and rebuked the winds and the sea; and it became perfectly calm" Matt. The Word the Bible is described as having many qualities: If you abide in My word, then you are truly disciples of mine; and you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" John 8: The Word of God is a mighty weapon. That is why you should memorize! It is the powerful message of salvation to sinners. If you know that the Word of God will accomplish what God wants it to and if you know that the gospel has power to save, then it should ease your mind to know that in witnessing you are using two very powerful weapons: The Word of God is the Bible. The Gospel of God is His revelation of redemption. It is He who draws to Himself all who are to be saved. When you present the gospel 1 Cor. He does the work, not you. As a Christian, you are to witness with truth, honesty, and integrity. As the Lord provides the opportunity, you should respond in a humble and gentle spirit 2 Tim. And in that, you should point people to Jesus. It is He alone who saves. You are the teacher, the deliverer of good news. You help them hear! These three verses should help you to gain confidence. You witness; God saves. You plant the seeds; God waters. It is His Word that accomplishes salvation. It is His gospel that is powerful. It is His Son Jesus who draws. You witness in power when you witness with the Word of God.

When talked about, criticized, persecuted, or while going through difficult circumstances, we often become self-consumed instead of gospel-consumed. We often become quiet instead of becoming even more outspoken for Christ. This is what we see with Paul and that is what we have seen throughout much of church history in the midst of persecution. On the other side, when the church has lived in comfort—free from persecution—it has often become apathetic and stagnant in sharing the gospel. Refusing to be silent, he began to preach in the jail courtyard. He not only had a large audience of prisoners, but also hundreds of the citizens of Bedford and the surrounding area would come to the prison daily and stand outside to hear him expound Scripture. He was silenced verbally by being placed deep inside the jail and forbidden to preach at all. Yet in that silence, he spoke loudest of all and to more people than he could have imagined. For several centuries, it was the most widely read and translated book in the world after the Bible. Instead, they provided opportunity for it to be extended from deep within a jail in the small town of Bedford to the ends of the earth. While his father was on his death bed, he suddenly became disturbed and tried to get out of bed. The family tried to calm him down and asked him what he wanted. One more soul for Jesus! How do your circumstances affect your witness? Are you still seeking to advance the gospel no matter your present circumstances? This is a picture of a mature Christian witness—a gospel pioneer. What experience do you have with evangelism? Describe your struggles and also the grace you have received in the area of evangelism? A Mature Witness Is Courageous and Fearless Because of my chains, most of the brothers in the Lord have been encouraged to speak the word of God more courageously and fearlessly. As mentioned previously, Acts No longer were they afraid of losing their jobs—no longer were they afraid of what people thought or of people being offended. How can we become more bold and fearless in proclaiming the gospel? Boldness is a result of prayer. Boldness in sharing our faith is a result of personal prayer and the prayers of others. Paul himself commonly asked for prayer to speak boldly. Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should. Ephesians is a prison epistle along with Philippians—something he wrote while in Rome. He essentially petitioned for others to pray for his boldness twice. It was his recognition of weakness which caused him to depend upon God and the prayers of others. He needed their prayers to preach boldly every day, even though he knew his preaching could make his situation worse. He needed prayer to be bold while sitting next to a soldier with a large sword in his hand. Just like Paul, we need prayers too. We must petition the Lord for boldness to witness, and we should ask others to pray for our boldness as well. We must do this if we are going to be fearless in whatever situation God places us. We also see this need for prayer in the book of Acts when the apostles were warned to not share the gospel any more. The apostles responded with corporate prayer and casting their cares before the Lord. On their release, Peter and John went back to their own people and reported all that the chief priests and elders had said to them. When they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly. The church was empowered to speak the Word of God boldly through prayer. Maybe, we lack boldness in our witness because we lack prayer. Maybe, we lack boldness because we are not weak enough to ask others for prayer. What else enables us to have boldness in our witness for Christ? Boldness is a result of watching and partnering with other bold witnesses. One of the wisest things we can do with our life is witness for Christ. This boldness is increased by being around wise Christians who are serious about God and serious about the gospel. Our relationships always affect our witness for Christ. They can affect it positively by helping us become bolder or

negatively by silencing us. Paul said this in Philippians while he was in prison. He called the people to follow his example which no doubt included his faithfulness in sharing the gospel even while being persecuted. Look at what he said: This includes studying faithful witnesses like Paul in Scripture and also the faithful throughout the history of the church. I have read the stories of many contemporary pastors who were deeply impressed and encouraged by the witness of Hudson Taylor, Jim Elliot, Martin Luther, and other great saints. Their lives and examples challenge us and encourage us to become bolder in our witness for Christ. Who has inspired you the most to grow in your spiritual life and to become a mature witness for Christ? A Mature Witness Encourages Others to Share Their Faith Because of my chains, most of the brothers in the Lord have been encouraged to speak the word of God more courageously and fearlessly. Paul said the things that happened to him worked out for the advancement of the gospel, and Christians becoming encouraged to spread the gospel was one of the ways God worked it out v. There, he not only preached the gospel but made a way for others to preach it. He cleared the path like a pioneer. We can be sure he did this not only by his example in prison but also by challenging the church to share their faith. We see this with Philemon whom he wrote to while also imprisoned in Rome. He prays that Philemon would be active in sharing his faith so that he could fully know the blessings we have in Christ. As you can imagine, this would have been very challenging coming from a man who was in prison for sharing the faith. While Paul was in Rome, he called the church to stand up and be pioneersâ€”he called them to be mature witnesses. Paul did this not only so the lost could hear the gospel, but because he realized sharing was important for Christians to grow. Those who do not, God cannot entrust with more. God will not give them more because they are not trustworthy. They will become like the Dead Sea which is dead because it has no ocean, sea, or tributaries to pour into. Many Christians are like this. When this happens, instead of growing, they actually start to decrease in faith. Whoever has will be given more; whoever does not have, even what he has will be taken from him. It is crucial for us to share our faith not only for others to hear but also for our faith to grow. Therefore, Paul and Christ both encouraged Christians to be faithful in sharing what they received. Pioneers of the gospelâ€”mature witnessesâ€”encourage others to share their faith. They do this by their faithful example and also by their teaching. Let us understand that we must encourage other Christians to witness as well. This is crucial for those we disciple. They cannot know every good thing, every blessing they have in Christ, if they do not share their faith. With the measure we use what God has given, he gives back. However, others do not, and therefore, they become spiritually stagnant. Are you sharing your faith so you can know every good thing we have in Christ? Are you encouraging others to faithfully share their faith? It is crucial for their spiritual growth. In what ways have you experienced spiritual growth by consistently sharing your faith and serving? In what ways have you experienced spiritual stagnation for not sharing and not serving? The former preach Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely, supposing that they can stir up trouble for me while I am in chainsâ€”! But what does it matter? The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice. Yes, and I will continue to rejoice Philippians 1: It should be noticed that Paul was not describing attacks from those in the world or even from false teachers. The attacks Paul shared about were from other peers in the gospel. They had an orthodox faithâ€”they taught Christ. However, they taught Christ out of envy and rivalry. When Paul was imprisoned in Rome, many congregations and ministers started to make pilgrimages to hear him preach and teach at his rented home which may have caused a spirit of rivalry in other ministers. They were hoping to stir up trouble for Paul as they preached to their churches. Maybe they were saying his imprisonment meant that he was not really an apostle or a godly man or that he was in sin. Possibly, it was this form of false doctrine that was used to attack Paul and his ministry in prison.

By having the privilege of introducing others to our Lord Jesus Christ. How You Can Introduce Others to Christ explains how anyone can do just that. Drawing from more than fifty years of vibrant witnessing as a way of life, Dr. Bill Bright walks you through leading you friends, neighbors, or loved ones to Christ in a prayer of personal commitment.

This is not a "hit list" but rather a "love list" -- a list of people with whom you have some influence. This list will remind you to: God will hear your prayers for them and work in their lives. Introduce them to your Christian friends. Invite them to your baptism, if that is coming up. Having them witness your commitment to Christ can be a powerful way to introduce them to God at work. Look for opportunities to share your witness. Because you are praying, the Holy Spirit will be working in their lives. Sometimes these opportunities come in the form of an extended conversation. Often they come when your friend mentions problems that are going on in his or her life. Share how God has helped you when you have been in trouble, and plant the thought that God can help them, too. Offer to pray for them. If your friend knows you care enough to pray -- and that you have a spiritual side that believes in prayer -- he or she may open up even more. As you pray, God will answer your prayer for your friend. Then, next time you see your friend, say, "How are things going since we talked? I have been praying for you. Prepare Your Testimony When God gives you an opportunity to share what Jesus has done for you, it is very helpful if you have thought ahead of time what to say. That way your testimony can be more clearly communicated. Here is the typical structure of an effective testimony: This is what my life was like before I met Jesus. Share how you used to be and problems you were experiencing. Often the person you are talking to will begin to identify with some of these same problems. This is how I met Jesus. These are the circumstances. This is how I came to the place of saying "yes" to him. These are the differences in my life since I met Jesus. Do not be afraid to admit that God is still working on you and you are not perfect. But share some of the clear changes you have seen so far. You will find it very helpful to write down your testimony -- using this outline -- on one or two sides of a page. Yes, it is work, but it will help clarify things for you. But you will find it helps to write it down and practice saying it to someone. That way, when it comes time to tell someone "for real," you will be much more comfortable in doing so. Being able to share it in just three minutes is a good goal to aim for. That will help you cut it down to the important elements. You can always elaborate, if you need to in a particular witnessing situation. You may find that when you share your testimony "live" to a non-Christian friend, it comes out differently than you had planned. God can "speak" to you through the Holy Spirit. Sometimes the Holy Spirit will put a very strong impression on your mind that you should speak to a certain person. Follow through with this. Think of yourself as the junior member of a team. The Holy Spirit is the lead player who sets up the shots. Be ready for this. Testimony and the Gospel There is an important difference between sharing your testimony with a person and sharing the Gospel or Good News with him or her. These are complementary, but different. Your testimony is what Christ has done for you. The Gospel is explaining what Christ has done for the person to whom you are witnessing. At this point you are learning to share your testimony, which prepares people to hear more. Ask your mentor or pastor to help you to learn to share the Good News itself. But for the moment, learn to share your testimony. Some Cautions Be careful about associating with old friends who will influence you to go back to your old, sinful lifestyle. It is okay to talk with them about Christ. But remember that you have an enemy who wants to tempt you to sin. Because we are sexual beings, too often our Christian love gets mixed up with other desires, and the clarity of our testimony is lost. Be sensitive to people. Because your values have changed relative to those of your friends, you will probably seem a little weird to them. But remember to love. Remember, it is the Holy Spirit who brings people to God; it is not all up to you. Love is primary here, not "success. No one expects you to. Sometimes we are very aware that people may look down on us as Christians. That is to be expected. Some looked down on Jesus and persecuted him, too. But that did not stop him from his mission. But join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God. That needs to be our central motivation when we witness to

people. I say that because it is easy to fall into wrong motivations. One of those motivations is pride. I helped a person to Christ! Another motivation can be doctrine. I have heard street preachers whose main message is how people are going to hell. But most hell-fire and brimstone preachers seem to have too much self-righteousness and judgmentalism, but too little love. The people who hear us share about Christ need to be able to sense our love for them. The Testimony of Our Lives The most powerful testimony you have is Christ working in your life to make you into a new person. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven. This is kind of a three-step process. Your lifestyle is undergoing visible transformation. It speaks for itself. Your words point to Christ, so people can understand the reason for the transformation. Unless you explain that this is Christ working in you, people will probably assume that you have "got religion" -- and miss the power of what is happened. Your explanation is your powerful testimony that points directly to Christ. Prayer Father, I pray that you will use me to help other people find you. Help my life to bring glory to you. When I am fearful of what other people might think, give me strength. Help me to share my testimony of your working in my life with whomever you inspire me to share. Let me be your witness. Memory Verse "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven. What is the difference between sharing your own personal testimony and sharing the Gospel? Why do you think a person will be interested in how you became a Christian? Who is in your world? Bill Bright reads Transferable Concept #6 - How You Can Introduce Others to Christ.

One of my responsibilities in giving leadership to Campus Crusade for Christ is to meet each year with the ministry directors of each continent. Frequently in my travels to Asia and Europe I visit with our staff and meet with thousands of pastors and laymen. On one occasion while meeting with a group of Christian leaders, I shared some of the highlights of the great worldwide spiritual harvest that is taking place today. One of the leaders interrupted me. I have not seen that kind of ministry myself. Why am I not having a more fruitful ministry? In the following pages, I want to share a biblical plan that will enable you to be fruitful in your witness for our Lord wherever you are, wherever you go, and under all circumstances. Becoming Fishers of Men But before I share this plan with you, let me call to your attention the fifth chapter of Luke which records an incident in the life of a seasoned fisherman — Simon Peter. He and his fellow workers had spent the entire night casting and gathering their nets but had not caught a single fish. Jesus observed these men as they were washing their nets and asked Peter to push out a little into the water so He could sit in the boat and speak to the crowds that were pressing around Him. When He had finished speaking, Jesus made a promise to this fisherman — a promise that I believe Peter, weary from his futile night of fishing, initially thought foolish. Jesus told Peter to go out a little further and let down his nets. If he did so, he would catch fish. A shout for help brought their partners in the other boat and soon both boats were filled with fish and on the verge of sinking. Two Important Questions There is no experience in life more exciting and spiritually rewarding than the adventure of fishing for people. But if you are also obedient like Peter, the Lord Jesus will honor you with the response of many people to your witness. All over the world, I have asked two questions of millions of Christians — young and old, rich and poor, new Christians and people who have been believers for more than half a century. I have asked these questions of some of the most wealthy and famous Christians in the world. The answers are always the same no matter whom I ask. What is the most important experience of your life? What is the most important thing that you can do to help another person? Again, the answer is always the same: Yet, how sad it is that so few Christians are sharing Christ with others. Obviously something is wrong. If you are typical of the majority of Christians today, you have never introduced anyone to Christ. You would like to do so, however, and you know in your heart that this is what God called you to do. Perhaps, like the disciples, you will leave the nets of your present student, business or professional involvements to follow Him in this great adventure of witnessing for our Lord in your Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria and to the far countries of the world. The biblical plan I want to share with you can be divided into two categories — personal preparation and taking the initiative. Steps for Personal Preparation Before you tell others about Christ, examine where you stand with God. Personal preparation is the key to becoming a fruitful Christian. If you follow these steps carefully and prayerfully, they will transform your life and witness for our dear Lord. Be Sure That You Are a Christian Millions of good, moral, religious people are active in the church but are not sure of their present and eternal relationship with God. They are not sure they will go to heaven when they die. In hundreds of our training conferences, which are attended by the most sincere and dedicated church members in each community, from ten to twenty-five percent usually indicate they either received Christ or they gained the assurance of their salvation as a result of the training. A remarkable young woman came to join our staff. My wife and I were much impressed with her and were confident she would have a great ministry for our Lord. She came from a wonderful Christian family, and had attended a Christian kindergarten, a Christian grade school, a Christian high school and a Christian college. She had even served as a counselor in several Billy Graham crusades. This attractive, dynamic, young woman demonstrated all of those qualities you would expect to find in a radiant, fruitful Christian. In speaking to the new staff during a training session, I stressed the importance of being sensitive to the needs of professing Christians who are not sure of their salvation. Rather, you should assume they are not yet Christians, and you should prayerfully counsel them and

lead them to the assurance of their salvation. Since she believed all the basic doctrines for the faith, they assumed that she was a Christian and prayed and encouraged her. Although they prayed with her, she was never sure God heard her prayer. She was so excited that she called her mother and father, my wife and others, to tell them the good news that she now knew for sure that she would go to heaven when she died. He came from a godly home. We met often for prayer. He memorized thousands of verses of Scripture and lived such a disciplined life for God that he was a constant challenge and inspiration to me. I was privileged to be the best man in his wedding. He existed on a special diet of inexpensive food for days at a time, enabling him to live on twelve to fifteen cents a day, so that he could give more money to missions. Though he had invited Christ into his life numerous times, he had never before been sure that He had actually come to be his Savior. Never before did he have the assurance of his salvation. Becoming a Christian Involves Commitment Perhaps you have never known the wonder, the joy, the assurance that Christ lives in you, that your sins are forgiven and that you are a child of God. You may have believed in Christ intellectually for years. You may be active in the church; you may be very moral, religious and godly in the eyes of your neighbors, and yet you have never experienced this new birth. Becoming a Christian involves commitment of the total person, which can best be illustrated by the marriage relationship. Many years ago, for example, I became aware of a beautiful young woman whom I thought was the most wonderful girl in the world. As we became better acquainted, we fell in love and were married. But we were not married just because we were intellectually involved and admired each other or because we were emotionally involved and loved each other. It was by an act of our wills by faith that we committed ourselves to each other as we stood one day before a minister and became husband and wife. As a result, she left her home, and I left my home, and we started a third home. As a matter of fact, I felt a little numb. Those two words which expressed the desire of our hearts consummated our long engagement of three years. My love for Vonette has grown through the years, and I have told her thousands of times since that memorable marriage ceremony that I love her. Commitment to Christ involves your entire person — your intellect, your emotions, your will. It is not enough to believe intellectually that Jesus Christ is the Son of God; not enough to know that He died on the cross for your sins and was raised from the dead; not enough to be baptized, to be active in the church, and to read your Bible and pray daily. I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in! Ask Him to come into your life. Then, on the authority of His promise, thank Him that He has come in as He promised to do. He will not lie to you. After you have received Him, never insult Him by asking Him into your life again. The rest of your life, begin each day by thanking Him that He is in your life. At the conclusion of my message, a woman who had reached her twilight years came to me in tears. She said that she had been a Sunday school teacher for forty years. I am never going to insult You again by asking You to come into my life, for now I am sure that You are already there. If you have never done so, do it now. Pause for a moment and if the following prayer expresses the desire of your heart, make it your prayer: Lord Jesus, I need You. I open the door of my life and receive You as my Savior and Lord. Thank You for forgiving my sins. Take control of the throne of my life. Make me the kind of person You want me to be. Thank You for coming into my life. The rest of my life I will thank You that You are in my life and will never leave me. Thank You that I now have eternal life as You promised. The Old Testament records that the Israelites took their animal sacrifice to the priest where it was slain and the blood was sprinkled on the altar as a covering for their sins. As a result there is no further need of a sacrifice to be made for your sins. You can add nothing to the assurance of salvation and eternal life which Christ accomplished for you on the cross. Tears and self-imposed discipline do not add anything to His complete and perfect substitutionary sacrifice which He made for you on the cross. First, you acknowledge that the sin which you have committed is wrong. No sin can enter His presence. And yet, God, who hates sin, loves the sinner. He loves you no matter what you do, but He hates your sin. Second, you acknowledge that all of your sins were paid for by Jesus when He shed His blood on the cross for you according to Hebrews chapter ten. Now, thank Christ for dying for your sins. You willingly turn from doing what displeases God and begin doing what pleases Him. Failure to acknowledge sin and judge yourself will result in divine discipline.

Because God loves His children, he chastens, corrects and disciplines those who are disobedient. That is, exhale by confessing your sin. Whenever the Holy Spirit makes you aware of sin which you have committed or are committing, be quick to confess it.

Is it legally permissible for managers to mention Bible verses when conversing with clients, or to pray for their employees? At what point does witnessing constitute harassment or does it ever? Realizing that full-time American workers spend an average of 8. But, such Christians are facing increasing opposition from employers for engaging in such witnessing activities. Far too often, employers mistakenly treat religious speech like sexual harassment and create a "zero tolerance" policy for religion that is similar to policies for sexual harassment. Religious speech and sexual harassment are worlds apart, though. Religious speech enjoys both constitutional and statutory protections that have never been granted for sexual harassment. More and more, Christians are being told that religion has no place in the workplace. Some employees have even been terminated for exercising their right to religious expression. Here are a few examples: Human Resources personnel informed him that because he was a supervisor, he could never talk about religion to another employee. This interpretation of the law was incorrect. An employee of a large retail establishment in Illinois frequently shared her faith with coworkers. Because this employee knew the laws regarding religious speech, she always made a point to ask her coworkers to tell her if they did not want to discuss religion. As these individuals learned, one key to being an effective witness in the workplace is to understand exactly what your rights are. Some important questions to consider are: When does sharing your faith constitute harassment? Are there greater restrictions on religious expression for supervisors? Do the laws vary depending on whether you are employed in the private sector or by the government? It stipulates that a company that allows employees to engage in non-work related conversations, such as those about politics, family, sports or other such topics, may not prohibit voluntary religious discussions between employees either. The water cooler and employee lunchroom are a type of public forum where citizens share ideas and interact at a variety of levels. In informal settings, such as break rooms or hallways, and at times when workers voluntarily interact about non-work issues, employees may discuss their religious views or voluntarily pray together. The same rules apply as would to any other private conversation. Other employees may not stop religious exchanges simply because they overhear a religious conversation. For example, at a large retail store in Indiana, an employee and several coworkers met informally and as privately as possible each day for a brief word of prayer before clocking in for work. They asked God to bless their supervisors and colleagues and prayed for other needs. One day, company management asked the group to stop because another employee had been offended when she saw them quietly praying. Despite clear legal protections, Christian employees often face discipline for sharing their faith. Incredibly, some employers will allow non-Christian religious expression yet forbid religious expression from Christians. For example, an employee was disciplined for sharing his Christian perspective on suicide and salvation with a coworker who had just expressed his belief in reincarnation and stated that he was contemplating suicide. The Christian was fired for sharing the hope of life found in Jesus Christ and for pleading with his coworker not to commit suicide! Limits on Religious Discussions with Coworkers While Christian employees have broad rights to express their faith to coworkers, there are two legal limitations. An employee must not allow religious discussions to interfere with work. Therefore, a Christian employee should be careful not to create even the perception that religious discussions are interfering with job performance. Also, it is easier to prove that talking about religion is the reason for discipline if the employee has a good work reputation and a clean record as an excellent, dedicated employee. If a coworker indicates directly or indirectly that she does not wish to discuss matters of religion, the Christian employee should immediately stop discussing it with her. If the Christian does not stop, he can be disciplined for harassment. This rule is legitimate. Think of this limitation in terms of "the shoe being on the other foot. This precaution does not mean, however, that every time someone who has asked you not to talk about religion walks into the room,

your conversation with others must stop. But, you should be sure not to direct the religious conversation to the employee who has objected. Religious conversations at work should take place privately and voluntarily. In fact, it may be wise to take a conversation elsewhere when a person who has objected comes on the scene, since this type of person would be most likely to press the issue. Religious Discussions with Customers

Although nothing prevents Christians from discussing faith with coworkers during free time on the job, any employer—public or private—may restrict employee conversations with clients, patients or customers about religion. On the other hand, a business owner may also choose to permit such religious conversations—and many do. The decision regarding religious conversations with clients rests with the private employer and not with the employee. We recently handled a case in which a California employer terminated an employee for engaging in a religious conversation with a client. The employee had inquired about a mutual acquaintance who happened to be a pastor. The client shared how the pastor encouraged her and her children to attend church and how excited she was to have her children learning about the Bible. A coworker reported this completely voluntary conversation to a supervisor, who fired the Christian. This termination was unlawful, because the Christian employee had never been instructed not to discuss religion with customers, and because it was the client who brought religion into the conversation.

Christian Employers Who Witness There are no limitations concerning the right of a Christian employer to witness to his customer base. In fact, many Christian employers regularly incorporate witnessing into their business practices. For example, Christian employers may place a gospel tract in outgoing mail and print Bible verses on company invoices, purchase orders or other commercial documents. They may answer the phone with Christian greetings, either on a regular basis or on religious holidays, such as Christmas. Despite the right Christian employers have to share their faith with customers, federal and state laws regulate the rights of Christian business owners to witness to their employees. Many Christian employers desire to witness to the spiritual needs of their employees, but at the same time, want to comply with employment laws to avoid being sued. It is important for Christian employers and supervisors to become familiar with their obligations under Title VII law. While Title VII law only applies to government employers and private businesses with fifteen or more employees, companies with fewer than fifteen employees may be subject to state requirements that make it unlawful to discriminate against employees on the basis of religion. Religious organizations, such as churches and ministries, are generally exempt from Title VII religious requirements. Under Title VII, business owners or supervisors are permitted to communicate their religious beliefs through their company policies and practices provided that 1 they do not give prospective or current employees the perception that employment or advancement requires workers to adopt a certain religious belief, 2 they accommodate employee objections, and 3 they do not require employees to participate in religious worship experiences. As the above examples show, there is growing hostility in modern America to religious speech at work. If you face difficulties for sharing your faith in the workplace, contact a Christian attorney who specializes in religious discrimination. Such an attorney can provide information regarding your rights and assist you if you are disciplined or terminated for sharing your faith at work.
