

## 1: Chapter 2: Presuming

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Joe Fortino and Luis Mitre were the first deputies to reach the home. Klaver in the driveway, upset and perspiring. In , the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recorded only eight suicides among children that age across the country “ and the incidence has remained steady ever since. By age 14, the numbers jump to well over suicides a year. Bob Winter, the Santa Clara County sheriff at the time, said he never had reason to believe otherwise. Winter is retired now and living in the Sierra foothills. He was a friend of mine. Klaver was a reliable deputy who was confident and needed little supervision, the former sheriff said. And, he emphasized to Egge, Josh was just To him, Egge seemed unmoved. But Egge told me years later that, of course, he found the violent death of a boy so young alarming. Who was the witness? No, not at all. You would have thought he would have scratches, a broken jaw or something like that. If that was a put on, he certainly convinced me. What happened to the rope? But investigators are supposed to contemplate the unthinkable: A fit of rage during an argument? A need to keep something silent? A punishment gone too far? An accidental killing staged as a suicide? After I went over the basics of the Klaver case “ the custody dispute, the child abuse findings, the close ties among deputies “ Geberth was appalled: What could raise more red flags than that? That was especially striking when I learned this: And a crucial item apparently was thrown away or never booked into evidence “ the rope from which Josh was found hanging. The rope was missing? What did that mean? There were no photos of the rope “ and no details about a chair found under the meat rail “ but plenty of questions. But the width of the rope was missing too. Was the rope strong enough or pliable enough for a year-old boy to tie a sturdy knot and jump? How was it possible for the coroner to reach a conclusion without it? And then there was the most fundamental question of all: How could it have disappeared? I asked Fortino, one of the first deputies to arrive that night. He never saw the body or the rope. Getting details was the job of Luis Mitre, Fortino said, the beat cop responsible for writing the report. What would the autopsy reveal? Egge remembers things differently. He said he had responded to countless unattended deaths, including suicides, that became a matter only for the coroner. How did the coroner perform the autopsy without it? I pulled out a copy of the two-page autopsy report from my growing file and found a signature for Dr. When he got down to the autopsy, however, he was surprised that the rope was missing. It is standard procedure for the rope to stay with the body to match the rope burns on the neck. He also jotted down other unexplained marks: I prosecuted a man for sexual assault when the coroner said it was a SIDS sudden infant death syndrome case. How is the coroner going to know that? There was no gallows as such, but rather a stout vertical wooden pole or post of about meters height with a metal hook or eye bolt at the top to which a rope noose was attached. There was either a ladder or steps up to a small platform at the back of the pole for the executioner to stand on. At the signal they were now jerked downwards by the assistants thus tightening the noose. This jerk combined with the thinness of the cord typically caused a carotid reflex and led to rapid unconsciousness. Late 19th century Austrian hangman, Josef Lang, considered this method to be far more humane than American style standard drop hanging and claimed that no criminal suffered for more than a minute with his method. It is unclear when pole hanging ceased although it was definitely in use until after the end of World War II and was used on various war criminals. This film clearly demonstrates how pole hanging worked and does not give the impression that Frank struggled after suspension. There are also photos of the execution of Serbs by the Austrians during the war. Milada Horakova female who was convicted of treason by the communist regime in Czechoslovakia suffered this death when she was hanged on 27th of June. They were executed under British occupation jurisdiction but it would seem that pole hanging returned for the last few executions carried out under Austrian jurisdiction. The last took place on the 24th of March when Johann Trnka was hanged for murder. It is not known whether Hungary continued to use pole hanging or a more conventional gallows. Where the standard drop proves inadequate to break the neck or cause unconsciousness, the prisoner seems to suffer a more cruel death than where little or no drop is used. The force generated by a drop of 5 or 6 feet is very considerable and does great damage to the skin, muscles and ligaments of the neck but does not necessarily induce asphyxia any sooner. This description of a hanging at San Quentin prison in California is from Clinton Duffy who was the warden there from to and relates to the execution of Major Raymond Lisemba on May 9th, "I observed also that he urinated, defecated, and droppings fell on the floor, and the stench was terrible". Some of them threw up. When he was taken down and the cap removed, "big hunks of flesh were torn off" the side of his face where the noose had been, "his eyes were popped," and his tongue was "swollen and hanging from his mouth. Here is an official government photograph of a long drop hanging in Kuwait. The hyperflexion of the neck caused by the British style eyelet noose is self evident. It takes between a half and three quarters of a second for a person to reach the end of the rope after the trap opens, depending upon the length of drop given. This leads to a number of factors, all of which can cause death. Typically the neck is constricted by as much as five inches from its original circumference. In some of the photos of Kuwaiti hangings the leather or rubber washer is visible on the rope and one can get a good idea of the amount of constriction of the neck, as it was against the eyelet before the hanging and is designed not to move. Fractures of the hyoid bone and larynx typically occur which on their own can prove fatal as breathing is severely restricted or prevented. The normal cause of death is given as comatose asphyxia. Some slight movements of the limbs and body may occasionally occur but are almost certainly due to muscular reflexes. In most countries cessation of heartbeat is the definition of death that is used in judicial hanging. The typically occurs within minutes after the drop. This time is very variable, however, with credible official reports of from minutes for cessation of heartbeat to have occurred. This time is often implied as length of suffering in newspaper reports of executions, but this is incorrect. The recordings show a rise in pulse rate initially and then a diminishing and weakening of it over time [Click here for print out](#). Again there had been fracture dislocation of the neck vertebrae. It is thought that brain death will occur in around six minutes through lack of oxygen, irrespective of when the heart stops. Experiments were carried out by F. Buckland, the assistant director of pathology, British Army of the Rhine, on Nazi war criminals executed by the British at Hameln prison in Germany after World War II and these found, that although the prisoners were rendered unconscious by the drop the heart could continue to beat for up to 25 minutes after execution. This created a problem

because it meant that it would take far longer to carry out the batches of executions if each prisoner had to be left on the rope for an hour. It was thus proposed that the medical officer present would inject 10cc of chloroform into the prisoner 30 seconds after the drop had been given. It was found that if the chloroform was injected directly into the heart it immediately stopped beating and if injected intravenously into the arm the heart would stop in seconds. This procedure was first used at the execution of 10 men and three women on the 13th of December. On the 8th of March Albert Pierrepoint hanged eight men at Hameln and it was decided not to inject chloroform. The prison doctor listened to their hearts with a stethoscope in the normal way and recorded his results. These showed that it took between 10 and 15 minutes for audible heart beats to cease. On the 15th of May a further ten executions were carried out and this time the condemned were wired up to an electrocardiograph, which recorded the electrical activity of the heart. It showed that impulses were produced for a further ten minutes; taking the total time to 25 minutes. A human heart has a sinoatrial node which is located in the upper wall of the right atrium. In settlements such as Carlisle, Norwich, and Nottingham, corporations town governments provided music and artillery salutes. Even less is known of how the occasion was first commemorated by the general public, although records indicate that in the Protestant stronghold of Dorchester a sermon was read, the church bells rung, and bonfires and fireworks lit. Gunpowder Treason Day, as it was then known, became the predominant English state commemoration. Some parishes made the day a festive occasion, with public drinking and solemn processions. Between and he ruled without Parliament, and he seemed to support Arminianism, regarded by Puritans like Henry Burton as a step toward Catholicism. Although Royalists disputed their interpretations, Parliamentarians began to uncover or fear new Catholic plots. Effigies of Fawkes and the pope were present, the latter represented by Pluto, Roman god of the underworld. Unlike the old system of religious feasts and State anniversaries, it survived, but as a celebration of parliamentary government and Protestantism, and not of monarchy. In response, accompanied by a procession of about 1,000 people, the apprentices fired an effigy of the Whore of Babylon, bedecked with a range of papal symbols. On 17 November, anti-Catholic fervour saw the Accession Day marked by the burning of a large effigy of the pope—his belly filled with live cats "who squalled most hideously as soon as they felt the fire"—and two effigies of devils "whispering in his ear". Two years later, as the exclusion crisis reached its zenith, an observer noted that "the 5th at night, being gunpowder treason, there were many bonfires and burning of popes as has ever been seen". While the earlier ban on bonfires was politically motivated, a ban on fireworks was maintained for safety reasons, "much mischief having been done by squibs". This sketch is from an issue of *Punch*, printed in November that year. Its celebration in Northern Ireland remains controversial, unlike in Scotland where bonfires continue to be lit in various cities. At some point, for reasons that are unclear, it became customary to burn Guy Fawkes in effigy, rather than the pope. In *The Times* reported instances of children "In Guildford, gangs of revellers who called themselves "guys" terrorised the local population; proceedings were concerned more with the settling of old arguments and general mayhem, than any historical reminiscences. In an effigy was burnt of the new Bishop of Exeter Henry Phillpotts, a High Church Anglican and High Tory who opposed Parliamentary reform, and who was also suspected of being involved in "creeping popery". A local ban on fireworks in was largely ignored, and attempts by the authorities to suppress the celebrations resulted in violent protests and several injured constables. The sign reads "Penny for the Guy" in Welsh. On several occasions during the 19th century *The Times* reported that the tradition was in decline, being "of late years almost forgotten", but in the opinion of historian David Cressy, such reports reflected "other Victorian trends", including a lessening of Protestant religious zeal—not general observance of the Fifth. The sale of fireworks was restricted, [43] and the Guildford "guys" were neutralized in , although this was too late for one constable, who died of his wounds. Further riots occurred in , but there were no more bonfires in Cathedral Close after Gathering wood for the bonfire increasingly became the province of working-class children, who solicited combustible materials, money, food and drink from wealthier neighbours, often with the aid of songs. Most opened with the familiar "Remember, remember, the fifth of November, Gunpowder Treason and Plot".

I Remember Back When. Holding hands in public then was an intimate gesture between a boy and a girl. Doors unlocked at night meant trust in your fellow neighbors. There was no need to compare car insurance rates , you knew your neighbor would look out for you. Do you remember when these were popular? Check out I remember when. Thanks to Wanda Sears for sending it to me I can still picture her wiping the clothes line off with a wet rag to rid the line of dirt and bird crap. The clothes would be hung with wooden clothes pins that clipped the clothes to the line. After she hung the clothes up she would prop the line with a line pole and the clothes would just blow in the summer breeze. I had to go to the doctor and have an x-ray and my arm was put in a sling. They were really popular in the 30s, 40s, and 50s but families continued to use them during the 60s. Many folks still use them today. They are considered antiques now. How did we survive? I had 2 sisters and a brother, mom and dad and my grandmother fighting over one bathroom. The milkmen were the kings of 4am delivery. I remember the glass milk bottles that were delivered to your front door before you were even out of bed. The only person that heard the milkman arrive was the dog. You left your empty bottles on the front porch with a note inside the bottle telling the milkman what you wanted that day. I also remember that the milkmen wore white uniforms and drove those funny looking trucks. I also remember the breadman who not only brought bread to the door but all the sweet goodies he tempted you with. The one we had was the Omar bread company. Most boys had paper routes. What I hated most was the inclement weather. Boys hair could not be over the ears and they could not wear duck tails that was prevalent during the 50s and 60s. Shirt tails had to be tucked. Darn Many got away with it especially if they had decent looking legs. We got our last minute necessities at the corner market or neighborhood store. In my neighborhood we even had a place to buy meat over the counter which is not too common today. I remember you could run a bill at the store and pay on payday which many took advantage. This was before credit cards became popular. Back then you had a store credit card or gasoline credit card only. I think Mastercard began somewhere in the mid to late 60s. Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. Introduction Shabbat begins at sunset on Friday evening and ends Saturday night when three stars are visible in the sky 25 hours. On Shabbat we remember that God created the world and then rested from His labors. The commandment to observe the Sabbath comes from the Fourth Commandment, of course, which actually spans three pesukim verses and is by far the longest of the Ten Commandments. In its entirety the commandment reads: Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. And He ceased on the seventh day from all the work that He had done. And God blessed the seventh day and declared it holy, because on it God ceased from all the work of creation that He had done. On the seventh day of creation, God ceased shevat from His melakhah creative activity, and blessed that time by setting it apart i. Acknowledging God as Creator Jewish thinking regards the Sabbath as a testimony that God alone is the Creator of the universe and secondarily as a sign or memorial of the redemption from Egypt Deut 5: According to Maimonides, God first commanded that we believe in His existence and then instituted the sign of Shabbat as a perpetual testimony that He alone is the unique Creator of all things. It is sometimes argued that the Sabbath was given to Israel when the Torah was revealed to Israel at Sinai, and therefore has no applicability to the Church today. This is incorrect for a variety of reasons, not the least of which is that Abraham himself was said to have observed all of the mitzvot commandments, chukkim ordinances and torah law of the LORD before it was revealed to Moses see Gen. Zachor - "Remembering" Shabbat The word translated "remember" zachor means more than merely recalling something past, but suggests actively focusing the mind upon something in the present. But what are we to "remember"? Rambam states that zachor implies a positive commandment whereas the parallel commandment in Deut 5: Zachor then means "You shall call to mind," and Shabbat is therefore understood to be the climactic day of the week from which every other day of the week is to be regarded. Thus there is no "Sun day" but rather Yom Rishon the first day toward the Sabbath; there is no "Moon day" i. According to midrash Mechilta; Shavuot 20b, both zachor and shamor were uttered in a single utterance when the Ten Commandments were revealed. This comes from drash on Psalm Kadosh connotes the sphere of the sacred that is radically separate from all that is sinful and profane. As such, it is lofty and elevated Isa. The idea of the holy kadosh therefore implies differentiation: The holy is singular, awe-inspiring, even "terrible" or dreadful see Neh. As the Holy One hakadosh, God is utterly unique, distinct, sacred, and "set apart" as the only One of its kind. He alone is worthy of true worship and adoration, since He alone is peerless, without rival, and stands in relation to the world as Creator and Lord. Holiness, then, implies more than an abstract or indifferent "metaphysical" separation as is suggested by various forms of dualism, but rather separation from that which is mundane chullin, banal, common, or evil. In other words, holiness implies absolute moral goodness and perfection. It is impossible that the Holy One could condone sin, since this would negate the distinction between the sacred and profane and thereby undermine the nature of holiness itself. The Holy is in opposition to the profane and therefore the LORD must hate and oppose that which violates the sacred. The Sabbath day is considered separated from other days of the week by esteeming it as holy. It is to be marked by shabbaton, resting from the usual cares and concerns of this world. Studying, resting, and enjoying time for reflection are therefore appropriate for this day. Avodah and Melakhah Six days you shall labor and do all your work This part of the commandment implies something that might be overlooked, namely, that we are commanded to work during the days of the week before Shabbat. The phrase "do all your work" also suggests that there is nothing left to do, nothing hanging over your head, so to speak, so that you are free to rest and experience the holiness of the day. Note that this verse clearly connects the seventh day of creation with the weekly Sabbath. No Melakhah you shall not do any work According to Rabbinical Judaism, melakhah work refers 39 types of

actions based on the activities necessary for the erection of the Mishkan Tabernacle and its contents. These 39 categories of work are called the Avot Melakhah, the fathers or primary categories, since they are the foundation, the original source for all secondary types of melakhah which are similar and derived from them. In general, melakhah refers to activities that are intentionally based for yielding a desired outcome or action. Thus the actions of the angels melakhim are not necessarily based on labor avodah , but rather on fulfilling certain commandments from God. It should be noted, however, that the Mashiach Yeshua did not agree with this definition of the sages. One must sacrifice mitzvot for the sake of man rather than sacrifice man "for the sake of mitzvot. We must remember that He was the One who gave the Torah to Moses in the first place! No, Yeshua affirmed the true meaning of Shabbat with the things that He did. His critics accused Him of breaking the Sabbath laws, but this must be understood in reference to the "traditions of men" and additions to the teaching of the Torah. He healed on Shabbat because healing is a form of being freed from labor, which is a central message of the meaning of the Sabbath. No one is excluded from this blessing, including your children, your servants, your animals, or converts to the faith. There is no second-class citizenry in relation to being part of the created order. All people, from the Kohen Gadol at the Temple to the lowliest of servants, stand in relation to God as entirely dependent and radically contingent based on His good pleasure.
