Lazy, Eager, and Explicit Loading of Related Data There are several ways that the Entity Framework can load related data into the navigation properties of an entity: However, the first time you attempt to access a navigation property, the data required for that navigation property is automatically retrieved. This results in multiple queries sent to the database â€” one for the entity itself and one each time that related data for the entity must be retrieved. When the entity is read, related data is retrieved along with it. You specify eager loading by using the Include method. You load related data manually by getting the object state manager entry for an entity and calling the Collection. Load method for collections or the Reference. Load method for properties that hold a single entity. In general, if you know you need related data for every entity retrieved, eager loading offers the best performance, because a single query sent to the database is typically more efficient than separate queries for each entity retrieved. For example, in the above examples, suppose that each department has ten related courses. The eager loading example would result in just a single join query and a single round trip to the database. The lazy loading and explicit loading examples would both result in eleven queries and eleven round trips to the database. The extra round trips to the database are especially detrimental to performance when latency is high. On the other hand, in some scenarios lazy loading is more efficient. One scenario when you should turn lazy loading off is during serialization. Serialization generally works by accessing each property on an instance of a type. Property access triggers lazy loading, and those lazy loaded entities are serialized. The serialization process then accesses each property of the lazy-loaded entities, potentially causing even more lazy loading and serialization. To prevent this run-away chain reaction, turn lazy loading off before you serialize an entity. The database context class performs lazy loading by default. There are two ways to disable lazy loading: For specific navigation properties, omit the virtual keyword when you declare the property. For all navigation properties, set LazyLoadingEnabled to false. For example, you can put the following code in the constructor of your context class: An application that performs well in development using an on premise SQL server might have performance problems when moved to Azure SQL Database due to the increased latency and lazy loading. Profiling the database queries with a realistic test load will help you determine if lazy loading is appropriate. Claim Think of a claim as a piece of identity information such as name, e-mail address, age, membership in the Sales role. The reason has to do with the delivery method. Instead, the user delivers claims to your application, and your application examines them. Each claim is made by an issuer, and you trust the claim only as much as you trust the issuer. WIF represents claims with a Claim type, which has an Issuer property that allows you to find out who issued the claim. Security Token The user delivers a set of claims to your application along with a request. Regardless of how these claims arrive, they must be serialized, which is where security tokens come in. A security token is a serialized set of claims that is digitally signed by the issuing authority. The signature is important: One of the core features in WIF is the ability to create and read security tokens. NET Framework handle all of the cryptographic work, and present your application with a set of claims that you can read. Issuing Authority There are lots of different types of issuing authorities, from domain controllers that issue Kerberos tickets, to certification authorities that issue X. This issuing authority is a Web application or Web service that knows how to issue security tokens. It must have enough knowledge to be able to issue the proper claims given the target relying party and the user making the request, and might be responsible for interacting with user stores to look up claims and authenticate the users themselves. Whatever issuing authority you choose, it plays a central role in your identity solution. The STS exposes endpoints that implement the WS-Trust specification, which describes how to request and receive security tokens. Or, in a multi-platform situation, this allows you to communicate with an STS on an entirely different platform and achieve single sign-on across all of your applications, regardless of platform.
