Read with Me is a series of reading books designed to develop the confidence of young children between the ages of 5 and 7. Using familiar and new tales, the fun texts complement the child's more formal learning.

Ready to teach smarter and save time? Students attach clothespins with letters to the pictures that have the corresponding beginning sounds. There is also a recording sheet included with this activity. This beginning sounds activity is available in the Jack and the Beanstalk Literacy Packet located in the printables section below. Jack and the Beanstalk Rhyming This activity combines vocabulary development with rhyming skills. Students roll the picture cube and give a word that rhymes with the picture. They mark their recording sheet when they give a correct rhyme. If students need help generating a rhyme they can ask a friend. It includes the recording sheet and a printable picture cube you can cut out and assemble or you can print out the cards and attach them to a square box or use a pocket die. Jack and the Beanstalk Syllables This activity combines vocabulary development with syllable identification. Students identify the pictures and the number of syllables in each word, and then place them into the bag with the correct number. Jack and the Beanstalk Emergent Reader The simple text in this book is designed to support your emergent readers. Use this book to reinforce concepts of print such as words are separated by spaces, left to right and top to bottom, written words match spoken words, common sight words, and more. Jack and the Beanstalk Pocket Chart The pocket chart set will reinforce concepts of print such as left to right directionality, return sweep, one-to-one correspondence, simple sight words and more. The text in this set matches the text in the emergent reader. Make the word walls available to your students during independent writing time. Jack and the Beanstalk Read and Write Around the Room This fun activity will help reinforce letter or sight word recognition. Students locate words or letters written on the thematic cards around the room and write them on their recording sheet. Instructions for setting up and using this activity are included in the Jack and the Beanstalk Literacy Packet located in the printables section below. Jack and the Beanstalk Story Sequence Have students cut and glue the pictures from the story in the correct sequence on construction paper. Both three and four part sequence pictures are available to meet the needs of your students. While I am not a big fan of worksheets this activity can be a good tool to measure how well your students understand the sequence of the story and follow directions. advance using the chart paper; draw a picture of black beans on the top right hand side and a picture of baked beans on the top left. Have students taste the two types of beans and then write their names on the chart under the appropriate picture to indicate which bean they liked best. Discuss the results during large group and post on the wall. Cut one piece of long white construction paper hot-dog style for each student. Supply students with a bowl of dried beans and have them glue the beans on their names. Use butcher paper to cut leaves and attach to the beanstalk with a stapler or glue. If you have a drop ceiling attach a length of fishing line to the top of your beanstalk and string the line through the support bars of a ceiling panel so the beanstalk will hang from the ceiling. Make sure your fishing line is long enough to loop through the support bars and down again to the floor. You can make the beanstalk grow or fall by pulling and releasing the fishing line. Have the students water their lima beans and then watch them grow over the next few weeks! Act Out the Story Materials: The teacher can act as narrator as the students act out the story. Provide students with the props they will need to act out the story. Quick and easy costumes can be made with sentence strips using the blackline masters found in the Retelling with Headbands book located in the resources section below. Compare and Contrast Materials: Xerox copies of the front of several different Jack and the Beanstalk stories, glue stick, chart paper, markers. Xerox the front cover of several Jack and the Beanstalk books. Shrink the copies so they will all fit at the top of your chart paper. Glue the copies to the top of the chart and use the markers to make the lines for a graph. Show the students the actual books and have a discussion comparing and contrasting the stories. Have the students write their names under their favorite Jack story and review the results in large group. Post the chart on the wall for future reference. Jack and the Beanstalk Printables.
