It is the fourth such study to be conducted by the Japan Foundation for the United States and Canada, as part of their worldwide series of surveys on Japanese Studies. This is the first survey of the United States and Canada to have a fully searchable website of the survey results. Print directories were published for the previous three studies of the United States and Canada. This website replaces a published directory for the current study, but we have produced directory entries in pdf format for all specialists and programs that participated, and have also developed full versions of the directories in pdf format that are available for download. There are also two separate volumes for the United States and Canada that contain analysis of the survey data. Download Links at bottom of the page The website is based on the categories of information that 1, specialists, programs, and 88 libraries reported in our very extensive survey, and their directory entries as formatted for print publication. Users may browse or search by selecting from the menu of available categories to generate a list of the specialists or programs that meet those criteria. That list may be printed out along with the specifications that produced it. Clicking on the name of a program, institution, or library in the search results will bring up the full pdf directory entry, which also may be printed out or downloaded. The website does not support free, full-text searching, but offers a full range of searches using the categories of the collected data. Search results are based on data collected in and and at present there are no plans for updating the information until another complete survey is conducted at some time in the future. The information is therefore comparable to a directory of Japan Specialists and Japanese Studies Institutions in North America published in January The study collected basic information on doctoral candidates from both Japan specialists and Japanese Studies programs, and some doctoral candidates also reported themselves to the study. This information was used to produce lists of current doctoral candidates for the program listings and also to follow up on doctoral candidates reported in previous studies. The Doctoral Candidates section of the website provides searches for this limited data, but there are no formatted full entries for doctoral candidates. A small number of doctoral candidates qualified for regular entries in the Specialist directory because of their publications and professional activity. When a search produces one of these individuals, there is a link to the pdf of their full directory entry. Although the study covers the United States and Canada, in order to keep track of Japan specialists and doctoral candidates at North American institutions who move in and out of the area over time, we continue to invite the participation of specialists who are currently working outside of North America but maintain professional ties through publications and professional activity. Such persons are included in the website searches of Japan specialists, but may be excluded by filtering the search by country. Japan specialists residing outside North America are generally excluded from the analyses of the data that appear in the separate volumes on Japanese Studies in the United States and Japanese Studies in Canada, except for persons on the staff lists of North American institutions who are temporarily out of the country. There are a large number of resources, study abroad scholarships, and financial-aid options to support students pursuing an international education. Check with the study abroad office at your home institution to discuss your options. Your study abroad office may offer Japanese exchange programs. In most cases, exchange programs through your college or university will enable you to pay the same amount as your home institution. This option usually allows your financial aid to be transferred to your study abroad program if you normally receive aid. Speak with a dean, director, or professor in the Asian Studies Department at your university regarding special opportunities to study abroad in Japan. Often times, universities have scholarships or resources for students interested in a particular line of study. These special scholarships can be applied to your study abroad. For smaller colleges or universities that do not have an Asian Studies Department, try connecting with a professor of world languages and reaching out to a department at a neighboring institution. Independent funding, scholarships, and grants can be added to the financial options from your campus. There are a host of government programs that offer aid to students studying internationally. Inquire with government entities like the Embassy of Japan in the U. Many Japanese institutions also offer aid to students coming from abroad. Be sure to ask about these options when speaking with the international office, study abroad office, and scholarship office on your campus. If your home institution does not offer these resources, reach out to partnering colleges or universities to see if you can speak with a counselor. You can also research study abroad advisors online and send an email asking for resources, advice, and information. Where do you start? The Blakemore Foundation Language Grant The Blakemore Foundation Language Grant financially supports students pursuing advanced language study for one academic school year. For those who have already started their career, Blakemore offers summer programs through the Blakemore Refresher Grant.

Bridging Scholarship for Study Abroad in Japan Bridging Scholarships for Study Abroad in Japan offers semester and year long scholarships for international education at the undergraduate level. This scholarship supports American students pursuing study abroad in Japan through stipends. It is funded through donations from businesses and other organizations. The foundation aims to encourage global leadership and support students in their professional and individual goals of Asia Pacific knowledge. Students from diverse backgrounds are a focus for this non-profit organization. This Department of State sponsored scholarship serves to help students with high financial need study abroad for a semester or academic year. The program is available for American citizens studying at two-year and four-year institutions. Students can be pursuing two-year and four-year degrees from accredited institutions. This scholarship offers funds for

semester and summer long programs to American students and permanent residents with financial limitations. From beginning through advanced levels, Japanese language courses at Huron College teach all four language skills: Japanese language courses and other Japanese studies courses at Huron College equip students with the linguistic and cultural knowledge of Japan that they will require in such careers as business, law, academics, and others. As a component of the International and Comparative Studies Program at Huron, the study of Japan is enmeshed with studies in other areas that prepare students for a wide variety of careers in the international arena. Located in Hirakata City, between the business and industrial centre of Osaka and the ancient capital city of Kyoto, Kansai Gaidai University offers instruction in Japanese language, as well as a full range of courses on Japanese topics taught in English such as history, business, economics, art, literature, religion, theatre, and political science.
