Even a fool, when he holdeth his peace, is counted wise: In the multitude of words there wanteth not sin: Everyone wants to be heard, yet very few know how to listen. When someone goes on and on we listen with bored inattention, enduring until the end. In order to hold a conversation, you need to know when to let go. Learn to be patient and wait for the other person to finish speaking before you take your turn. Resist the urge or tendency to dominate the conversation. While the other person is speaking, instead of listening they are formulating their thoughts for the next opportunity to speak. Ironically, I have found that the secret of being heard hinges upon hearing; simply learning to truly listen. If you want to be heard learn to be a good listener—listen intently. When people sense that you are truly listening to what they are saying, most of the time they will return the courtesy. Truly understanding what needs to be said, is one of the most important rules of communicating. To avoid being misunderstood communicate clearly, honestly and effectively; learn to listen carefully and intently—practice being a good listener. It not only matters what you say but more importantly what the other person understood you to say or mean. Just as silence is more than the absence of sound, listening involves more than understanding words. Observe the non-verbal signals being sent out by the speaker. Make an effort to understand the emotional as well as the intellectual meaning of what is being said. Sometimes countenance speaks as loud as words; in order to truly hear learn to pay attention to body language and tone. While standing in the back of the funeral parlor with a group of fellow fireman I noticed Bill, a member of our house, walk up to the front row and sat down next to Jack. After about fifteen minutes or so Bill put his arm around Jack and gave him a hug. When Bill returned to the rear of the room I asked him what he said that had such a positive effect. More importantly than learning to listen to one another, is that we learn to listen to the Lord. Before we can truly listen to one another we must first learn to listen to the Lord. If we, as followers of Christ, are to share real wisdom, it must come from the Lord; true wisdom is born out of a relationship with God. If we speak less, what we speak will be more powerful.

How to Know God is Speaking to You By Contributor ; Updated September 29, If you are a Christian, one of the most important lessons that you can ever learn is how to know when God is speaking to you. If that is how you feel God speaks, you will never hear Him speak. Back in the biblical days, God had to speak audibly from the outside, because He did not live on the inside of the bible prophets and characters just yet. The reason He did not live on the inside of them is because these were "pre-Jesus" days. However, after Jesus came, died, and was resurrected, God was then able to come and live on the inside of us. God on the inside of us is called his Holy Spirit. In the following scripture Jesus was speaking to His disciples: But you know and recognize Him, for He lives with you [constantly] and will be in you. As stated in the intro to this article, during the days before Jesus walked in the earth, God spoke to His servants from the outside. In the above scripture, Jesus was telling His disciples that He had to leave them and return back to heaven. Jesus was the voice of God to the disciples. When Jesus spoke, it was God himself speaking. However, He assured them that after He left, He would have God send them someone else, another person, to take His place as one who comforts and speaks to them. Jesus told the disciples that the Holy Spirit would live on the inside of them and would always be with them. His Spirit lives in you. Many Christians pray and expect Jesus or God to mysteriously answer them from the outside. They are missing it. Jesus is not going to speak to you audibly. God is not going to speak to you audibly. Be sure that you understand that the answer comes from within. When God speaks from without you will know it. But to know how He speaks from within requires knowledge and discernment. It was His Holy Spirit who lives on the inside of you, speaking to you the mind of God concerning your situation or concerning a matter. And they later gave their reasoning for not going on that day. They said, "Something told me not to go. Be advised that this knowing is not called intuition. It is actually a person. And the person is God, through His Holy Spirit that lives on the inside of you. God speaks to you from within. Knowing that God speaks from within is only a small bit of how to know when God is speaking to you. Once you hear that voice, or that thought, from within you must discern the source. Where is the voice coming from? I will attempt to clarify. God speaks in two ways. It is your biblical roadmap and foundation for "All Things God. A Rhema Word is when God speaks to you outside of you reading the bible. A Rhema Word can be His voice speaking to you from within, or it can be Him speaking through another person to you. You learn His nature. You learn His ways. You are able to learn some of His patterns. And when He putteth forth His own sheep, He goeth before them, and the sheep follow Him: And a stranger they will not follow Ask Him for confirmation that He has spoken to you. When you do this, God will send another person along, or you can be watching television That is your confirmation. I must warn you however that the more you grow in your walk with God, the less He will give confirmations. It a sign of maturity. But when you are first starting to know God intimately and learn His voice, He will gladly give you confirmations. You should do whatever He has told you to do. If you fail to do what He has spoken to you, that is called rebellion. Many people like to call it free will. The reality is that it is free for a moment, but it will cost you in the end. Read the story of Jonah in the bible. Because Jonah chose to disobey God, He became swallowed up into the belly of a great fish. When God speaks to you, He is speaking to give you counsel or comfort regarding matters that you are facing in your life. He will tell you what to do. He will tell you what not to do. He will give you an "unrest" or "uneasiness" on the inside when you are about to do something that you should not do. That uneasiness is God speaking to you, trying to warn you ahead of time. Because He lives on the inside of you, you will feel what He feels. If you feel uneasy about something, take that as a warning. When God is leading you to do something, there will be a peace in your spirit about it, because God is the God of Peace. He is not the God of confusion and He is not the God of disorder. When something is of God, there will be peace and order. Not only will God speak to you and counsel you on what you should and should not do in business or personal decisions, He also speaks

to you and tells you what you should and should not do regarding your character and personality. For example, someone may treat you unfairly. God will speak to you and tell you to forgive that person. Someone may cut you off in traffic and you flip them "the bird. If you choose to ignore His voice, then what He will do is allow the same situation to come around again, only this time through a different person. For example, you are in line at the grocery store, and you have been praying and asking God for more patience. The clerk is as slow as molasses. You begin to become impatient. You hear that thought, still small voice saying, "Be Patient. Then finally you have to open up your mouth and say something to the lady standing in front of you, "Man. I wish they would get more clerks in the store. So the test comes around again, until you pass it God speaks to you about you. We are with One who finds a path already tracked out, for it makes us perfectly independent of circumstances. There is an infinite variety in the paths God makes, and He can make them anywhere! He is the Judge of all the earth; and he is right as well

as sovereign in his judgment. He must be obeyed; his law is inexorable; it cannot be broken without making the breaker of it even in one jot or tittle worthy of death. When the Holy Spirit opens the eyes of the soul it sees this. Conviction of sin is just the sinner seeing himself as he is, and as God has all along seen him. Then every fond idea of self-goodness, either in whole or in part, vanishes away. The things in him that once seemed good appear so bad, and the bad things so very bad, that every self-prop falls from beneath him, and all hope of being saved, in consequence of something in his own character, is then taken away. He sees that he cannot save himself; nor help God to save him. He is lost, and he is helpless. Doings, feelings, strivings, prayings, givings, abstainings, and the life, are found to be no relief from a sense of guilt, and, therefore, no resting-place for a troubled heart. If sin were but a disease or a misfortune, these apparent good things might relieve him, as being favorable symptoms of returning health; but when sin is guilt even more than disease; and when the sinner is not merely sick, but condemned by the righteous Judge; then none of these goodnesses in himself can reach his case, for they cannot assure him of a complete and righteous pardon, and, therefore, cannot pacify his roused and wounded conscience. The way of approach is not for us to settle. God has settled it; and it only remains for us to avail ourselves of it. He has fixed it on grounds altogether irrespective of our character; or rather on grounds which take for granted simply that we are sinners, and that therefore the element of goodness in us, as a title, or warrant, or recommendation, is altogether inadmissible, either in whole or in part. To say, as some inquiring ones do at the outset of their anxiety, I will set myself to pray, and after I have prayed a sufficient length of time, and with tolerable earnestness, I may approach and count upon acceptance, is not only to build upon the quality and quantity of our prayers, but is to overlook the real question before the sinner, "How am I to approach God in order to pray? Were you from this moment to cease from sin, and do nothing but good all the rest of your life, it would not do. Were you to begin praying now, and do nothing else but pray all your days, it would not do! Your own character cannot be your way of approach, nor your ground of confidence toward God. No amount of praying, or working, or feeling, can satisfy the righteous law, or pacify a guilty conscience, or quench the flaming sword that guards the access into the presence of the infinitely Holy One. That which makes it safe for you to draw near to God, and right for God to receive you, must be something altogether away from and independent of yourself; for, yourself and everything pertaining to yourself God has already condemned; and no condemned thing can give you any warrant for going to him, or hoping for acceptance. Your liberty of entrance must come from something which he has accepted; not from something which he has condemned. I knew an awakened soul who, in the bitterness of his spirit, thus set himself to work and pray in order to get peace. He doubled the amount of his devotions, saying to himself, "Surely God will give me peace. He set up family worship, saying, "Surely God will give me peace. At last he bethought himself of having a prayer meeting in his house as a certain remedy. He fixed the night; called his neighbors; and prepared himself for conducting the meeting, by writing a prayer and learning it by heart. As he finished the operation of learning it, preparatory to the meeting, he threw it down on the table saying, "Surely that will do, God will give me peace now. Peace poured in like a river. No grounds of peace or elements of reconciliation can be extracted from himself, either directly or indirectly. His one qualification for peace is, that he needs it. It is not what he has, but what he lacks of good that draws him to God; and it is the conscienceness of his lack that bids him look elsewhere, for something both to invite and embolden him to approach. It is our sickness, not our health, that fits us for the physician, and casts us upon his skill. No guilty conscience can be pacified with anything short of that which will make pardon a present, a sure, and a righteous thing. Can our best doings, our best feelings, our best prayers, our best sacrifices, bring this about? Nay; having accumulated these to the utmost, does not the sinner feel that pardon is just as far off and uncertain as before? In all false religion, the worshipper rests his hope of divine favor upon something in his own character, or life, or religious duties. The Pharisee did this when he came into the temple, "thanking God that he was not as other men.

I was supposed to be listening for his voice, but mostly all I heard was silence. Get a Free eBook: Do you want to grow closer to God in your prayer times? Click here to download the free devotional. The silence pointed to a deeper frustration. All my life I had struggled with this problem: How Most of Our Prayer Times Look As a teenager, my mom would ask me the same question every morning at the breakfast table: My devotions were dry, routine affairs. What a contrast with, say, a date with my girlfriend. Our conversations had a momentum all their own. How discouraging that the relationship that was supposed to be the most exciting and wonderful in my life had become a check on my to-do list. I remember the first time I heard his voice. It was years later; I was desperate. I had been betrayed by someone very close to me and I needed to know that God cared. I asked him if he would share with me what he thought of me. The next thing that happened changed my life forever. God spoke inwardly to me in a way that might as well have been audible. I was a junky, ruined for anything that smacked of a tame, compromising faith. We would ask the Lord questions, then listen, and he often spoke. As so often happens, her heart was touched by what she experienced, particularly by one family for whom her team built a home. They painted it green. Before leaving, she took a picture of herself with that family in front of the home. In the spring of , she returned to Matamoros on an AIM project. One day, she asked the Lord what he wanted her to do. Then she waited and listened. There may be a million people living here. I have no idea where that house isâ€”how in the world would I ever find it? She looked up and down the first streetâ€”no green house. She felt ridiculous, but knew she must obey. She saw a girl walking down the street, so she approached her. Christianity is a personal faith. God wants to talk to us. He wants to guide us, but we have to listen. How to Listen to God How do you listen to an all-powerful but invisible God? The Bible has a lot to say about it. Over and over God interacts with people in a variety of ways. Our God is endlessly creative in how he communicates with them. God spoke to Daniel through visions, Balaam through a donkey, Peter through a rooster, and of all things, he spoke to Moses out of a shrub. We need to learn how to listen. If they heard him clearly, then the figure would be percent. Frankly, almost everyone struggles to hear God and many people have never heard him. But it does require some discipline to find a quiet place and to allow some time just listening. Perhaps the hardest part of listening prayer is clearing your mind. Set aside at least half an hour to start. When you are ready, quiet yourself. If stray thoughts come through your mind, write them down on a separate piece of paper. Ask the Lord to speak to you through it in a way that you can understand. Then write down your question for prayer. This is where you wait and listen. God may direct you to another passage of Scripture. He may share a tender word. Whatever you feel he may be saying to you, write it down. Ask him to confirm anything he shared with you. It also helps fine-tune your spiritual ears to better hear him. Use two different pens. I like to use the first color to record my thoughts and the second pen to record what I sense God is saying. Just let them come out so you can focus. God may give us different degrees of confidence in what he has said. We therefore need to humbly admit our fallibility. Get someone you trust to check your impression and to confirm it or not. Does it exalt Christ? Scripture is our authority. God does not contradict himself. I was on a school bus full of jabbering, yelling kids. My son was in the back of the bus. There were 20 rows of children making noise between us, but as I listened, in the back, I could make out the distinctive voice of my boy. He promises that we, his sheep, will hear it. The more you pause and listen for his voice, the more you will find that your ears tune in to itâ€”you become familiar with it. It just requires your listening. With all the Bible verses about joy in the Scriptures, it seems as if joy is one of the main functions of everything related to God. It even says that joy is with him in his dwelling place. The angels announcing the birth of Christ spoke of the joy that was coming with that birth.

Praise may seem like an esoteric religious custom, but actually it is one of the most natural things in the universe. If we had the ears to hear, we would recognize a chorus of praise all around. Praise Him, all His angels; praise Him, all His hosts! Praise Him, sun and moon; praise Him, all you stars of light! Not only that, but Jesus pointed out the praise potential of rocks! When the Pharisees told Jesus to rebuke the people who were shouting His praise during His triumphal entry into Jerusalem, Jesus said: Throughout the whole creation, praise comes naturally. But with humans, it seems a little harder. We want to know why. So, why does God want us to praise Him? Does it make God feel more important to have us praise Him? Perhaps an analogy can help clear up this misconception. He was already the most important being in the universe, and He owned everything already. Nothing we can do changes that. And when you consider the abuse that God receives from human beings every day, creating human beings looks like a bad deal for God. The praise He gets today is far outweighed by the curses and profanity hurled at Him. He asks us to praise Him for our benefit. The benefits of praising God What does praising God do for us? Here are just a few of the benefits: Praising the all-powerful Creator God gives us perspective. When we are stuck staring down at the mire of troubles, remembering the God who can pull us out can be reassuring and comforting. Focusing only on the physical things that can be shaken leaves us unstable. But focusing on the spiritual things gives us a firm foundation that cannot be shaken Hebrews Praising God helps us to get to know His characteristics—it helps us build a closer relationship with Him. Praising, blessing and honoring God helps us to become more like Him. He wants us to be His children, thinking and acting as He does. And He is a God who honors and blesses and praises 1 Samuel 2: This barely scratches the surface of the benefits—to us—of praising God. Knowing why should lead us to want to know more about how the Bible teaches us to praise. Here are three ways to praise God that are pleasing to Him: Study and meditate on praise The Bible is filled with examples of people and angels praising God. We can study, think about and learn from these prayers, poems, songs and shouts. Psalm , for example, gives us abundant food for thought and fodder for praise. Our Bible study and meditation then inform our next step. New Testament, , p. As the many prayers in the Bible show, this should be a major theme of our prayers, not just a four-word summary. What should we praise God for? Some aspects of praise would be common to all people: Other aspects of praise will be personal to our own situation, such as thanking Him for specific blessings, healings and help. The prayers and psalms of the Bible can give us ideas and samples of appropriate praise. Praise in song Praise should be a daily part of personal prayer. But the Bible is also filled with examples of communities of people joining together in praise of God, often in song. And the use of music in worshipping God continued in the New Testament era. Singing praises to God remains a vital part of the worship services for the Church of God today. Many examples show praise spontaneously breaking out when good things occur and during joyful celebrations. As we saw earlier, praise should be a vital part of our daily prayers. To pursue joy with your whole life is to honor the One who has given you life. Pursuing joy in God is very different from just enjoying His gifts. Most of us know how to enjoy His gifts, but the pursuit of joy actually transforms us. His word and our pursuit, His power and our surrender, The creator of joy can put His joy inside of us, HE can create what we cannot manufacture. The more we approach God for this transformation, the more of God we will encounter. God desires that we find our joy, happiness, peace and purpose in Him. When we have done so â€” HE is glorified! John Piper â€” we must fight for joy. We must fight for the relationship that God has called us to. Fight to become the woman filled with joy. Fight sin and countless distractions. Even fight against the ones who discourage you, so the pursuit of joy becomes your priority. What the Bible has to say about joy: Joy comes from God Joy was created in the character of God.
