

1: Free High / Middle School Sunday School Lessons - Season 1

Write the names of Bible characters on several index cards. As the students enter the Sunday School classroom, tape an index card to every kid's back. Instruct the students to find out who they have on their back, without actually getting the name from another student.

Book of Jude
Brad Anderson: Like us, Jude lived in an age which preferred toleration to truth, and regarded all religions as equally valid aspects of the quest for a supreme being. He calls upon his readers to reject the false teachers and to stand up for the true faith. Christian music is a very controversial issue within many churches today. Churches have split because of disagreements over the style of music the church uses or does not use. Focus is made on Church music and Personal music. This study will examine several significant actions Christians are to take toward one another to help build up the local church. As the individual members of the church implement these responsibilities, the church itself will become stronger. This series of lessons is designed to help members of a local church to recognize their responsibilities to one another and to strengthen the unity and ministry of the church as members implement these principles.

Word Contending for the Faith
Brad Anderson: The purpose of this series of lessons is to warn students about current theological trends that are a significant threat to biblical, historical, conservative Christianity. While a study on cults exposes external threats, this series focuses on internal threats posed by elements within evangelicalism. These threats are all the more dangerous because they often originate from sources that have historically been reliable. This material is designed for youth in the upper grades of high school. Young people in college and other adults would benefit from this study. The information is beyond the grasp of most junior highers. Dating is an analysis of the American dating scene from a biblical perspective with an emphasis on marriage as the sole purpose for dating. This study will focus on biblical principles and show how they apply to dating. This series of lessons seeks to explore what the Bible says about the Christian walk and to apply those principles to practical daily living. Supporters of various ideas are battling for supremacy. Some hold that all religious ideas are equally valid or equally invalid, depending on your point of view. Others assert that their ideas, and only theirs, are correct. With such contradictory and contrary ideas floating around, Christians must insure that they are committed to looking at the world through biblical and accurate lenses. This series of lessons is designed to help believers develop and maintain a Christian worldview. It will also give believers the tools to help others evaluate their worldview, remove inconsistencies and gaps in it, and replace it if necessary. This series of lessons will examine several aspects of discipleship and the disciplines of the Christian life. The goal of these lessons is to show the student what a disciple is, what discipleship is, and how to engage in the following spiritual disciplines:

The Case for Dispensationalism is an approach to the interpretation of Scripture. This course introduces the student to the topic of Dispensationalism and contrasts this system with other systems of interpretation. Throughout this study, the student is enlightened to the progressive nature of revelation among the seven dispensations. The study concludes with interpretational guidelines for understanding the Bible.

From Moses to You is divided into two sections. The first section is an overview of the inspiration, canonization, and preservation of the Bible throughout history. The second section outlines proper principles for the interpretation of the different types of literature found throughout the Bible. This material emphasizes proper hermeneutics, including a grammatical-historical-theological approach to interpretation. In this series we will be looking at several key characters from the Bible, both Old and New Testaments. The Bible presents people in all their fallen humanity-warts and weaknesses, strengths and struggles. Our goal is to learn from these examples and apply important lessons to our own lives. Christian youth especially need to know how to manage their financial resources. The Bible has much to say on the matter of money. The author outlines biblical principles related to the stewardship of money. Then he relates and applies these principles to common sense decisions related to money.

Word Learn to Discern
Brad Anderson: Learn to Discern is a series of lessons designed to help youth biblically and critically evaluate the information they receive. After studying the discernment process, the students learn how to apply it to various sources of media. Some see the church as a social club, others as a welfare agency. Churches are involved in politics, feeding the hungry, homeless

shelters, and even banks. What does the Bible say about the church? That is the question this course will answer biblically. Why examine the life of Christ in the book of Mark? Why not use the other gospels? The Gospel of Mark is a succinct, unadorned yet vivid account of the ministry, suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Mark presents the narrative in an appealing way, for he tells the Good News about Jesus Christ so simply that a child can understand it. The Person We Call God is a study of the attributes of God with an emphasis on the practical implications of each. As a result of this study, the student should have a greatly increased appreciation for the awesomeness of our God and an understanding of how such knowledge affects every aspect of life.

2: Junior High School – International Sunday School Department

junior high game: fall sports challenge Fall is just about upon us (here in the U.S.). And if you work with students, that means it is not just the season of one sport, but multiple sports.

Weighed Down Clear cup filled with water Green food coloring Rocks Chairs Before the game starts, line up two lines chairs. Space them out far enough apart that someone could comfortably stand between them. Split the group into two teams. Have each team line up behind the line of chairs. Hand the first player in each line a bucket, and have run through the line of chairs by weaving in and out going around each chair and then run back through the line, carrying the bucket. Once they get back, they give the next person in line the bucket. Before the next person in line can go, they have to add a rock to the bucket. Before the next person can go, they have to add two rocks to the bucket. The next player adds three, the next adds four, etc. This continues until the last player is carrying the bucket with all the rocks in it while running through the line. The first team to complete the challenge wins! Teach – Jealousy I have to say, you guys got slower and slower as that game went on. Because more and more weight was being added to what you had to carry. Who here has ever been jealous of someone else? So let me ask you a question: When you were jealous, did you feel happy? Jealousy tends to suck the happiness out of your life. Another question for you: You feel uneasy and uncomfortable, not peaceful. Jealousy causes you to stop focusing on the good things in your own life, and it makes peace nearly impossible. Does that sound like something you want to happen to you? It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. Those are two of the most important things! Sadly, jealousy is a part of life. The good news is this: God has blessed us, right? I think we can all agree with that. He continues to bless us. He gives us gifts, and family, and friends. How do you think that makes Him feel? So instead of spending time being jealous of others, spend time focusing on all the good things in your life. Spend time being thankful to God for everything He has blessed you with. Jealousy usually starts by comparing yourself to other people. So focus on being content with who you are and what you have. You can do this by relying on your relationship with God. He loves you more than anyone else ever could. And do you know what else? He created you exactly the way you are! So lean into that. Instead of comparing yourself to others, rely on your relationship with Him and His love for you to find contentment with who you are. Jealousy comes from selfishness. If you were selfless, jealousy would be impossible! And you would be happy for them whenever something good happened to them. If you want to overcome jealousy, this is a great place to start. Try to worry about yourself less and others more. Try to think about yourself less, and think about others more. But living a life overwhelmed with jealousy, being stuck and having rotting bones? Next time you feel jealous, talk to God about it. Seriously, He wants to hear from you! The next time you start to envy something that someone has, or become jealous over an opportunity that someone else got, just start praying! Ask Him to help you be less selfish and more selfless. Ask Him to help you focus on Him instead of your feelings of jealousy. Get out water and food coloring. A little bit of jealousy is natural, right? So you just ignore it. Move the food coloring a little closer to the cup. But you convince yourself that being a little jealous is fine. But then, at practice, you notice how good at acting Jessica is. And you start to get more jealous. Then, all of the sudden, everything about her makes you jealous – her hair, her clothes, the way your teacher seems to really like her. You start to not appreciate your own things because hers seem so much better. Squeeze the food coloring into the cup. Now, can we separate that food coloring back into just one thing? Is it possible to move it to just one part of the cup? Jealousy never turns out good. It eats away at you. It harms you and your relationship. It steals your happiness, love, and peace. That verse says it leads to rotting bones! Does that sound like something you want in your life? Small Group Discussion Questions 1. What are some of the things you find yourself being jealous over the most? What do you think about the Bible verse that compares being jealous to rotting bones? Does that make you think differently about jealousy? When you focus on being thankful for what you have, is it harder to be jealous of others? Why do you think that is? Are you content with your life and the things in it? Why or why not? Do you think that you would be less jealous if you were content with yourself and your life? We talked about how being selfish leads to jealousy, and being selfless makes jealousy go away. What are

Do you think He wants to hear about it? Do you think that comparing yourself to others is what leads to you being jealous of them? Do you want to stop comparing yourself to others? Who would want that? I need two volunteers to come stand up here. Now, volunteer two really wishes they had a better singing voice. God gave you the talents and gifts that you have for a reason.
