

## 1: Books by Laurel Burch (Author of Laurel Burch Quilts)

*The many devoted fans of Laurel Burch's art are drawn to her whimsical creatures rendered in richly saturated colors. In Laurel Burch Quilts: Kindred Creatures, the artist's followers will find 12 projects based on her endearing, instantly recognizable designs.*

As I grew, so grew my passion to create, and to share. Through my art myths emerged, stories came alive, kindred spirits connected. The purpose of my art is to inspire living from the heart. I want to create gifts that celebrate life in the most intimate and precious ways possible, for ourselves and for each other. My paintings have become the most intimate expressions of all that is most precious to me. Who can deny that we share a connection with all living creatures? And what better way to celebrate that connection than through creating a work of art? I invite you to interpret my designs while creating quilts of your own. My mother, who was a wonderful seamstress, was a magician with needle and thread, fabrics, and ribbons, and it was her sharing of these materials with me that began my love affair with sewing. While Mom expanded her sewing skills, I began to develop my painting more. I called them my Global Spirit dresses. I feel such a kinship with quilters, as they share the same passion for fabric and color. Someday I hope to put down my paintbrush and pick up a needle and thread, and try my hand at doing exactly what you love to do: I love the fact that the possibilities are endless, the materials quilters use so rich and varied. Thank you for this wonderful opportunity to share my colorful world, and bring kindred creatures together through my art and your own. Her use of bright, saturated color and attention to the smallest details will draw you in and unleash your creativity. We highly recommend that you give some of the painting and other embellishing techniques a try. Be sure to refer to pages before you begin. Begin by taking the book to the nearest copy center and have the patterns you want to use enlarged or reduced to any size you are comfortable with. Ready-to-use pullouts are offered at the back of the book for the most detailed quilts—Carlotta in the Secret Garden and Kindred Creatures. Because of the large variety of shapes used in both of these quilts, they offer many opportunities to show off your favorite fabrics and decorative stitching. You can also apply this no-sew technique to the other projects in this book. The true beauty of these projects is that there are so many ways to add your personal touch. Using fabric paints you can paint on details and layers of color—including metallic touches—or you can embellish with machine stitches. Quilters who own an embroidery machine will find that these quilts are great canvases for any stitch they can create. All of the black lines in the patterns indicate individual shapes that need to be cut out. The tinted lines indicate areas to be embellished with painting or stitching. Fabric generously donated by Robert Kaufman Company. First pin or baste the tear-away stabilizer to the back of the piece. In layered areas such as the eyes, satin stitch around each layer after all of the individual layers have been fused together, but before fusing to the final background. The collar Mariah is wearing should be made as a separate layer. Yellow is used as a base for the flowers and leaves. The red flower in the center is one piece of fabric. Outline the flower petals with satin stitching in gold metallic thread. After the leaves are fused to the background, use black thread and a straight stitch to add the veins, and a fine black permanent pen to make the dots. Top and bottom inner borders: Cut one 23" x 29" rectangle. If you are going to paint, cover your workspace to protect it. Back the piece with tear-away stabilizer, then satin stitch around all of the raw edges. Add the whiskers using black thread and a narrow zigzag stitch. Use the eraser end of a fat pencil and gold fabric paint to stamp the dots on the black border strips. Add the black inner side borders, then the top and bottom borders. Press seams toward the border. Add the teal outer side borders, then the top and bottom borders. Press seams toward the borders. Layer your quilt top with the batting and backing. Pin or thread baste the layers together. Quilt a diamond pattern in the teal border. Bind or finish as desired. Please note that instructions are for a small wallhanging, not a pillow. These can also be painted on; see the photo on page Chain stitch the antennae using two strands of gold embroidery thread. Top and bottom outer borders: Cut one 24" square. Stem-stitch the wing spirals with one strand of metallic gold embroidery thread, or use a gold metallic fabric pen for this detail. Add the turquoise inner top and bottom borders, then the side borders. Layer your quilt top with the batting and backing, and quilt as desired. Cut one 11" blue square. Cut flutter-bye shapes in the colors of your choice. Cut

one 11" lime green square. Cut one 11" fuchsia square. Cut two strips 3"-wide x 37" for the sides and two strips 3"-wide x 17" for the top and bottom. Cut one 21" x 46" rectangle. To prepare the background squares, first cover your workspace to protect it, then stamp dots on the background squares using the end of an eraser on a chunky pencil and fabric paint. Let paint dry completely. Cut all flutter-bye shapes and fuse in place, then lightly draw in details that will be painted or stitched later, such as antennae and curves on wings. Pin or baste the tear-away stabilizer to the back of each block. Satin stitch around all the raw edges before sewing the flutter-bye blocks together. Note that some shapes are outlined with two colors, usually along the outer edge—stitch the inner color first, then the outer color. Add the black inner side borders to each block, then the top and bottom borders. Add the second colored side borders to each block, then the top and bottom borders. Press toward the sashing. Add the black outer side borders, then the top and bottom borders. Add any decorative beading after you have finished the quilting. A suggested plan for the quilting is to stitch around each flutter-bye, the wing shapes, and the bodies. Stitch in-the-ditch along the inner edge of the narrow black border and along the outer edge of the flutter-bye borders.

It offers 37 thrilling different applique cats in a variety of poses. It includes chapters on creating "Catty Clothes" and tablecloths, pillows, and even a cat Christmas tree skirt! Templates are for machine applique, but can be hand stitched too. Com reports that the book is out of print. It also tends to pop up in other sewing catalogs now and then.
