Synthetic phonics teaches children to read words by blending or combining the individual sounds of the word. Look at the examples below: What is analogy phonics? Another word for analogy phonics is word chunks or word families. With this method, a word chunk is taught first and then other sounds are added to form new words in the same family. This exponential approach to teaching phonics is a key ingredient in the Kiz Phonics program. Pre-teach the word chunk on the first slide by pointing, saying and asking children to repeat twice. Move to the next slide, which focuses on the key vowel sound. Next use the key vowel to blend and read the word family. When four of this word family is repeatedly displayed on slide, drill the word families again. Step five brings in the magic. In this step, children will see how other letters are added to the word family to read four new words. Press the mouse once for a letter to descend and join the word family. Keep doing this until all four words have been formed and read. Move to the next slide and quickly review. Quickly press your right mouse button while children repeat. Then press until numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 appear next to words. When the numbers appear, play a listening game. Tell the learners you will say a word in random order and they will quickly call out the number. They should get the colorful words right but may struggle with the sight words of the sentence. After several attempts by different students, the teacher reads the sentence correctly and asks kids to repeat. Can you show me? To encourage each child to be forgiving. Preparation Prepare small pieces of paper and write on each piece a statement such as one of the following: Someone hit you and pushed you down. Someone broke something of yours. Someone called you an unkind name. Prepare a piece of paper for each child in the class create more situations if necessary. Make the necessary preparations for any Enrichment Activities you want to use. Learning Activities Invite a child to give the opening prayer. Attention Activity Display picture , Children Quarreling. What are these children doing? Why do you think they are quarreling? How do you think they feel? What could these children say to each other to end the quarreling and make themselves feel better? This means that they should not be angry at each other anymore and they should be friends. Remind the children of the story about Matt and Travis from the previous lesson. Matt forgave Travis for taking his toys. They were still friends. Tell the story of Joseph being sold into Egypt, as found in Genesis How do you think Joseph felt when his brothers sold him to be a slave in Egypt? Explain that Joseph became an important man in Egypt see Genesis They found out that Joseph was still alive and that he was an important man in Egypt see Genesis How do you think Joseph felt to be with his brothers again? Was Joseph angry with his brothers? How did Joseph show he had forgiven his brothers? Help the children act out the story of Joseph being reunited with his brothers and forgiving them. Jesus told us to be forgiving Hold up a copy of the Bible. Explain that in the Bible, Jesus told us to be forgiving. Jesus told him that we should always be forgiving. Explain that the Bible also tells us that Jesus was forgiving. Display picture , The Crucifixion. Explain that the soldiers were very cruel to Jesus. They beat him and spit on him. Explain that Jesus forgave the soldiers. Be careful not to be too dramatic as you tell this story. Some children may be very sensitive to the idea of people hurting Jesus. Turn to Luke Even though the soldiers hurt Jesus, what did he do? What does Jesus want us to do if someone makes us feel angry or unhappy? Activity Ask the children to do everything you do. Have them follow you as you stand, stretch, smile, sit down, and fold your arms. Explain that because they did everything you did, they were following you. If you follow someone, you do the same thing that person does. When we forgive others, we are following Jesus. We are doing what he did. Jesus wants us to forgive those who make us sad or upset. Read each statement and ask questions such as the following: Has this ever happened to you? How would it make you feel? What should the person who made you unhappy or angry say to you? What should you do or say to a person who has been unkind to you or who has made you unhappy or angry? Tell about a time when you forgave someone and how you felt. Help the children understand that Heavenly Father and Jesus want us to be forgiving. Help me, dear Father, to freely forgive All who may seem unkind to me. Help me each day, Father, I pray; Help me live nearer, nearer to thee. Testimony Bear your testimony that Heavenly Father and Jesus want us to be forgiving. Encourage the children to pray and ask Heavenly Father to help them forgive others. Enrichment Activities Choose some of these activities to use during the lesson. Review the story of the prodigal son, as found in Luke Use picture , The Prodigal Son. Help the children understand that the father loved his son and forgave him. Do the following finger play. Invite the children to do the actions with you. Two little friends, one left and one right hold up both hands with fists closed , Started to quarrel and started to fight wave fists at each other. Now these little friends were not happy that day, For they had been taught the right way to play. Then one little friend hid his head down in shame lower right fist from wrist and turn away ; The other did too, for he felt just the same lower left fist and turn away also. Make a simple badge for each child to wear home. Write on each badge I can be forgiving. Tell how the hurt child forgave the other one. Explain to the children that when we forgive those who are unkind to us, we will feel happy.
