It is true that the Romans since Julius Caesar had used a solar calendar with the year beginning January 1, yet they had no single system of regularly-numbered years. Often this did not correspond with the regular calendar year. To add to the complication, the Jews followed a lunar calendar. The ecclesiastical or sacred year began on the first day of Abib or Adar, later Nisan, which was the month when Israel was delivered from Egypt Exod. Since the beginning of the month was determined by the phases of the moon, the first day might fall by our calendar from early in March to early in April. The civil year began on the first day of the seventh month Tishri. The festivals and the reigns of Jewish kings were calculated from the beginning of the sacred year, while other matters, including the reigns of foreign kings, were reckoned by the civil year. Moreover, a lunar year of twelve months fell short of the solar year by ten or eleven days. The Jews met this difficulty by adding a thirteenth month at the time of the vernal equinox once in about three years seven times in nineteen years. While Biblical writers frequently made statements from which chronological inferences may be drawn, their data cannot be interpreted accurately. It is evident, then, that many of the events of the NT must be dated approximately rather than precisely. Chronology of the life of Jesus A. David organized the priests into twenty-four divisions or courses, sixteen of which were composed of descendants of Eleazar, and eight of descendants of Ithamar 1 Chron. These courses were to function according to a fixed chronological order. Luke implies that John the Baptist, who was six months older than Jesus cf. So far there seems to be no historical evidence for the date when the division of Abijah served. Luke states that Jesus was born while Joseph and Mary were at Bethlehem in compliance with the demand that every man be registered in his native city. Some scholars object that no extra-Biblical evidence exists for a census by Quirinius P. Sulpicius Quirinius, governor of Syria. Sentius Saturninus b. Quintilus Varus b. Events of the reign of Augustus were, in general, poorly documented. He should also have known when an event so soul-shaking to the Jews as a Rom. It is conceivable, in view of the poorly documented reign of Augustus, that Quirinius may have been governor in Syria for only a few months, with the census falling at that time. The synoptists, however, assign the crucifixion to the fifteenth of Nisan with the sabbath falling on the sixteenth. The Duchess of Edinburgh with her children. From left to right: Within her family, she was always known as "Ducky". At the time of her birth, she was 10th in the line of succession to the British throne. Her godparents included her paternal grandmother Queen Victoria , who was represented by a proxy. The Duke was taciturn, unfaithful, prone to drinking and emotionally detached from his family. She was shy, serious and sensitive. In the judgment of her sister Marie: The two sisters would remain very close throughout their lives. Victoria was dark and moody while Marie was blond and easy-going. Prince Alfred became heir presumptive to the duchy when his older brother, the Prince of Wales later Edward VII , deferred his Saxon succession rights in favour of his younger brothers. Alfred and his family therefore moved to Coburg in Their mother immediately began attempting to "Germanise" her daughters by installing a new governess, buying them plain clothing, and having them confirmed in the German Lutheran church, even though they had previously been raised as Anglicans. She was also suspicious of the morality of the Romanov men. When her teenage daughters were impressed by their handsome cousins, their mother warned them that the Russian grand dukes did not make good husbands. Her visit to her grandmother Queen Victoria at Balmoral Castle in the autumn of coincided with a visit by her cousin Prince Ernest Louis of Hesse , heir apparent to the grand ducal throne of Hesse. Both were artistic and fun loving, got along well and even shared a birthday. The Queen, observing this, was very keen for her two grandchildren to marry. Together Victoria and Ernst had two children, a daughter, Princess Elisabeth of Hesse and by Rhine , whom they nicknamed Ella, born on 11 March , and a stillborn son, born on 25 May Victoria and Ernst proved incompatible. Elisabeth, who physically resembled her mother, preferred the company of her father to Victoria. Their unwritten rule was that anyone over thirty "was old and out. Victoria and Ernst cultivated friends who were progressive artists and intellectuals as well as those who enjoyed fun and frolic. She avoided answering letters, put off visits to elderly relations whose company she did not enjoy, and talked to people who amused her at official functions while ignoring people of higher standing whom she found boring. The young couple had loud, physical fights. The volatile Victoria shouted, threw tea trays, smashed china against the wall, and tossed anything that was handy at Ernst during their arguments. She enjoyed flirting with him at the balls and celebrations that marked the coronation. Her marriage to Ernst suffered a further blow in , when Victoria returned home from a visit to her sister Queen Marie of Romania and reportedly caught Ernst in bed with a male servant. She did not make her accusation public, but told a niece that "no boy was safe, from the stable hands to the kitchen help. He slept quite openly with them all. Ernst, who had at first resisted the divorce, came to believe it was the only possible step. I only tried for her sake. If I had not loved her so, I would have given it up long ago. Tsar Nicholas wrote to his mother that even death would have been better than "the general disgrace of a divorce. Elisabeth blamed Victoria for the divorce and Victoria had a difficult time reconnecting with her daughter. Ernst wrote in his memoirs that Elisabeth hid under a sofa, crying, before one visit to her mother. Ernst assured the child that her mother loved her too. Elisabeth responded, "Mama says she loves me, but you do love me. As a senior member of the navy, Kirill was sent on active service to the front in the Russo-Japanese War. His ship was blown up by a Japanese mine while entering Port Arthur and he was one of the few survivors. Sent home to recover, the Tsar finally allowed him permission to leave Russia and he left for Coburg to be with Victoria. And I was now within visible reach of fulfillment of the dream of my life. Nothing would cheat me of it now. I had gone through much. Now, at last, the future lay radiant before me. She was named after both her grandmothers and nicknamed "Masha. Victoria and Kirill, who had hoped for a son, were disappointed to have a girl, but named their daughter after her father. Nicholas II reinstated Kirill after deaths in the Russian imperial family promoted Kirill to third in the line of succession to the Russian throne. She decorated, gardened, and rode and also enjoyed painting, particularly watercolors. As Kirill became a keen auto racer, the couple often took trips by car: Victoria dreaded the long Russian winter with its short days, and she traveled

abroad frequently visiting her sister Marie in Romania and her mother in the south of France or in Coburg. Victoria and her husband had a close relationship with their daughters, Maria and Kira. The family was spending the summer of on their yacht in the Gulf of Finland and were in Riga when the war broke out. Kirill, for his part, was also in Poland, assigned to the naval department of Admiral Russin, member of the staff of Grand Duke Nicholas Nikolaevich, commander in chief of the Russian army. The Tsar denied their request. Twice during the war Victoria visited Romania, where her sister Marie was now queen, volunteering aid for war victims. Victoria returned to Saint Petersburg in February Kirill had been appointed commander of the Naval Guards, quartered in Saint Petersburg, so he could be with his family for some time. Although publicly loyal to the Tsar, Victoria and Kirill began to meet in private with other relatives to discuss the best way to save the monarchy. Revolution[ edit ] At the end of the "February Revolution" of , Tsar Nicholas II was forced to abdicate and political turmoil followed. We personally are losing all, our lives changed at one blow and yet we are almost leading the movement. During this period Victoria, almost 41 years old, discovered she was again pregnant, which worried her because of her previous miscarriages and difficult pregnancies. Kirill led his naval unit to the Provisional Government on 14 March , which was obliged to share headquarters with the new Petrograd Soviet , and swore loyalty to its leadership, hoping to restore order and preserve the monarchy. It was an action which later provoked criticism from some members of the family, who viewed it as treason. Close to despair Victoria wrote to her sister Marie of Romania that they had "neither pride nor hope, nor money, nor future, and the dear past blotted out by the frightful present; nothing is left, nothing. They chose Finland as the best possible place to go. Although a territory of the Russian Empire, Finland possessed its own government and constitution, so in a way it would be like being in Russia and not being at the same time. The Provisional Government permitted them to leave, though they were not allowed to take anything of value with them. Exile[ edit ] Grand Duchess Victoria Feodorovna with her husband and their three children. After two weeks in Haiko, the family moved to a rented house in Porvoo where, in August , Victoria gave birth to Grand Duke Vladimir Kirillovich of Russia , her only son and the heir to the dynasty. They hoped that the White Russians would prevail. They gradually ran out of supplies and had to beg for help from family. In July , Victoria wrote to her first cousin, Crown Princess Margaret of Sweden , begging her to send baby food so she could feed Vladimir. She "looked aged and battered and has lost much of her beauty, which is not astonishing considering all that she has gone through. In the following years the exiled family divided their time between these two places. She was likely unaware of the most sinister aspects of the Nazi Party. She encouraged his dreams of restoring the monarchy in Russia and becoming Tsar. In the mids the German government established relations with Moscow and the presence of Kirill and his wife, pretenders to the Russian throne, became an embarrassment. They bought a large house on the outskirts of the town and gave it a Breton name, Ker Argonid, Villa Victoria. The resort town of Saint-Briac was a favorite spot for retired British citizens who wanted to live well on a limited income. Victoria made friends among the Britons as well as the French and other foreign residents of the town. Though at first her manner could seem haughty, residents soon discovered that Victoria was more approachable than her husband. Their friends treated them with deference, curtsying or calling them by their imperial titles. She would not let him attend school because she was worried about his safety, and because she wanted him to be brought up as Romanov grand dukes were prior to the revolution. Instead, she hired a tutor for him. She also refused to let him be educated for a future career. We were proud of them. Family and friends arrived, but nothing could be done. When her closest sister reached her bedside Victoria was asked if she was glad Marie had come, to which Victoria haltingly replied, "It makes all the difference. Queen Marie eulogized her sister in a letter after her death: She carried tragedy within her â€” she had tragic eyes â€” always â€” even as a little girl â€” but we loved her enormously, there was something mighty about her â€” she was our Conscience. Her husband was intensely lonely after her death. The marriage of their daughter, Kira, to Louis Ferdinand, Prince of Prussia , in was a bright spot for Kirill, who saw it as the joining of two dynasties. However, Kirill died just two years after his wife. Few there are who are fortunate in having such a woman as the partner of their lives -- I was one of those privileged.

Topsy the elephant 4 January Topsy was executed by poisoning, electrocution, and strangulation. A second film of the electrocution was recorded and preserved. It may have been the first time death was ever captured in a motion picture film. This event was later dubbed the Great Molasses Flood. Some attributed his death to the so-called curse of the pharaohs. Mary Hardy Reeser , 67, was found "virtually cremated " in her otherwise relatively unharmed apartment in St. Petersburg , Florida, leaving a left foot in an undamaged black satin slipper, a shrunk portion of her skull and part of her spine. The FBI report at the time stated that she had apparently fallen asleep while smoking, setting fire to her acetate nightgown, housecoat, and chair. Gareth Jones , an actor, died of a heart attack between scenes of a live television play, *Underground*. Army specialists John A. Legg were killed by a water hammer explosion during maintenance on the SL-1 nuclear reactor in Idaho. Nick Piantanida , a skydiver, died four months after an attempt to break the record for the highest parachute jump; his suit had depressurized causing brain damage. Georgy Dobrovolsky , Vladislav Volkov and Viktor Patsayev , Soviet cosmonauts, died when their Soyuz spacecraft depressurized during preparations for re-entry. Basil Brown, a year-old health food advocate from Croydon , England, died from liver damage after he consumed 70 million units of Vitamin A and around 10 gallons 38 litres of carrot juice over ten days, turning his skin bright yellow. After watching the " Kung Fu Kapers " episode of *The Goodies* , a man named Alex Mitchell laughed continuously for 25 minutes and then fell dead on his sofa from heart failure. Tina Christopherson died when she fanatically drank 4 gallons 15 litres of water a day to combat stomach cancer. Robert Williams , a worker at a Ford Motor Co. David Grundman, shooting at cacti with his shotgun near Lake Pleasant , Arizona, was crushed when a 4 feet 1. Tennessee Williams , an American playwright, died after accidentally choking on a plastic bottle cap which he was using to ingest barbiturates. Dick Wertheim , a tennis linesman, died after a ball struck him in the groin and he fell out of his chair. Jimmy Ferrozzo, a bouncer, died in Condor Club , San Francisco while engaging in sexual intercourse with his girlfriend Theresa Hill on a grand piano that was lowered from the ceiling by a hydraulic motor. Ferrozzo accidentally activated the lifting mechanism which pinned him against the ceiling leading to his suffocation. Thomas, owner of a wool mill in Thompson, Connecticut , died of suffocation after falling into a machine in the wool mill and becoming wrapped in yards meters of wool. A male flight instructor and a female student, Carl Beauford Terry and Linda Varnar Keath, [] were killed when the Piper PA Seneca airplane they were flying crashed, believed to have been caused by the two people having sex in the cockpit of the plane. Brandon Lee , year-old film actor, martial artist, and son of Bruce Lee , was accidentally shot to death by co-star Michael Masee while filming a scene for *The Crow* , as the result of an improperly-loaded prop gun. Hoy threw himself against the window, which indeed did not breakâ€”but it popped out of its frame. Gloria Ramirez , 31, died from kidney failure related to her cervical cancer. While treating her, several of the hospital staff became ill, suffering from loss of consciousness, shortness of breath and muscle spasms. Shortly before dying, Ramirez was allegedly covered with an oily sheen, which smelled of fruit and garlic. When drawing her blood with a syringe, nurses noticed it had a smell similar to ammonia and there were unusual particles floating in it. Jeremy Brenno, 16, was killed on a golf course when, frustrated, he struck a bench with a 3-wood golf club. The shaft broke, bounced back at him, and pierced his heart. Karen Wetterhahn , a professor of chemistry at Dartmouth College , died ten months after a few drops of dimethylmercury landed on her protective gloves. Although Wetterhahn had been following the required procedures, the material permeated the gloves and her skin within seconds. Jonathan Capewell, 16, died from a heart attack brought on by the buildup of butane and propane in the blood after excessive use of deodorant sprays. Betty Stobbs, 67, died after delivering a bale of hay to her sheep. The starving sheep rushed Stobbs, who was on her motorcycle. In the ensuing scuffle, Stobbs was knocked down into a deep ravine near Durham, England. While she survived the fall, her motorcycle landed on her, killing her instantly. Bernd Brandes , a German engineer from Berlin, was willingly slaughtered so that he could be

butchered and eaten by aspiring cannibal Armin Meiwes. Brandes had responded to an internet advertisement which Meiwes had placed for this purpose. In prison, Meiwes became a vegetarian. Brian Douglas Wells , a pizza delivery man from Erie, Pennsylvania , was killed by an explosive collar around his neck, as part of a bank-robbery scheme. Phillip Quinn, 24, from Kent , Washington, was killed when a lava lamp he was heating on a stove exploded, with a shard piercing his heart. Kenneth Pinyan died from injuries caused by anal sex with a stallion.
