The geographic south pole of the earth is contained in this continent. It is made of large permanent glaciers that surround the South Pole. This is one of the most uninhabitable places on earth. With a very small population of less than residents, Antarctica is the least populated continent on earth. It is also home to very few plant and animal species. Antarctica is also the coldest landmass on earth and much of this continent is made of permanent glaciers. Antarctica is the fifth largest among the seven continents. It is actually double the size of the whole of Australia. It is known to be the driest, coldest, and also the windiest continent. It has the highest elevation among all the continents, and is considered to be a complete desert. The temperature here is known to have reached degrees as well. Only cold adapted organisms have the capacity to survive in this continent. Due to the hostile environment and the lack of resources, this continent was largely neglected and isolated. It is also the most populated continent on earth, home to an estimated population of around 4. This large population makes it an important part of the world economy. **Asia** Asia is located mostly in the northern and eastern hemispheres of the earth. This continent is known for the large size, dense settlements, and also the vast area of barely populated regions. The boundaries of Asia are not very clearly defined. There is actually no geographical separation as such between Asia and Europe. The two continents form a large landmass which is popularly called Eurasia. The continent is known for its vast diversity in terms of culture, environments, ethnic groups, economics, historical background, and also the government systems. **Australia** The continent of Australia is a single country continent. It is the sixth largest country by total area, and is also the smallest of all the seven continents. Because of its size, and isolated location, it is also called as island continent. Covering an area of square kilometres, Australia lies in the Indo-Australian Plate. This continent is surrounded by Indian Ocean and Pacific Ocean. Australia is one of the least populated continents and is rich in biodiversity. The Great Barrier Reef, which is the largest coral reef in the world, is in Australia. It extends over kilometres in the north east cost of Australia. Officially known as the Commonwealth of Australia, the country is an Oceanian country. It comprises the whole of Australia, the island of Tasmania, and also a large number of other smaller islands. Australia was mainly inhabited by the indigenous Australians for around 40, years before the British first came to settle here. They had over language groups then. Today, Australia is one of the wealthiest countries in the world, and a well developed one too. It is the 12th largest economy in the world, and has the fifth-highest per capita income in the world. It is ranked among the highest in terms of provisions like quality of life, education, health, economic freedom, and also the protection of political rights and liberties. **Europe** Europe is the second smallest continent in the world. It comprises the westernmost peninsula of the giant Eurasian landmass. Europe is home to almost 50 countries and is the third most populated continent in the world after Asia and Africa. Russia is the largest country in Europe and Vatican City is the smallest. Europe is divided from Asia by the watershed divides of the Ural and Caucasus Mountains, the Ural River, the Caspian Sea, black sea and the waterways connecting black sea and Aegean Sea. Europe is bordered by Arctic Ocean in the north side, Atlantic Ocean on the west

Most of the population in this country is concentrated near the eastern or western coasts. The far south regions and the interior regions are just sparsely populated. The western part is dominated by the mighty Andes Mountains. The eastern part ahs got both highland regions and also lowlands. The major rivers flowing through the continent like Parana, Amazon, and Orinoco flow in this part. After being colonised for long periods in history, Spanish and Portuguese came on to become the most spoken languages here. Western traditions are followed in several parts. Each country is made up of states, and each state is made up of cities and counties. The continents are surrounded by oceans. These large bodies of water are located between the seven continents. As you explore this web site, pay close attention to the shapes of each continent. When viewing the continents, relate the continents with something you are familiar with to help you remember the images. To locate the continents, you would need to use a map or a globe. There are several different ways to locate the continents using these references. You can find the location by using prepositional phrases, cardinal directions, the location in relation to the hemispheres, and using the distance scale. On this site we will not go into detail about using a distance scale. However, it is helpful to know that the distance between continents can be determined using this scale in miles or kilometers. Refer to the following graph to determine the location of each continent in relation to the other continents. Below, I have given a detailed description of the concepts dealing with finding a location a map. Understanding a Map and a Globe All seven continents have their own specific location on maps and globes. Maps and globes are very useful tools that enable each of us to locate different places on Earth. These two tools are very similar because they both show us Earth, but in two different ways. They allow us to view our land on both a round surface and a flat surface. There is an horizontal line located on a map and a globe that divides the Earth in half. This line is called an equator. It can not be seen from the air. Everything that is above the equator is closer to the North Pole, and everything below the equator is closer to the South Pole. The prime meridian is a line perpendicular to the equator. It divides the earth in half vertically. Understanding Cardinal Directions A compass rose shows the four cardinal directions and the directions in between. North, south, east, and west are the major directions. Northwest, southwest, northeast, and southeast are the directions in between. When you are facing north, east is the direction to your right, west is to your left, and south is behind you. Understanding the Hemispheres The hemispheres of the earth basically tell you what half of the earth different land masses Ex. The Northern Hemisphere is the half of the earth north of the equator, and the Southern Hemisphere is the half of the earth south of the hemisphere. The Western Hemisphere is the left vertical half of the earth west of the prime meridian, and the Eastern Hemisphere is the right vertical half east.
