*The Wit and Wisdom of Mark Twain: A Book of Quotations (Dover Thrift Editions) Paperback is a 55 page inexpensive introduction to Mark Twain's wit and wisdom.*

First published in 1906, the work is presented as a monologue by Jean-Baptiste Clamence, a Parisian lawyer who has moved to Amsterdam to become a "judge-penitent". I will return to this term later. Clamence has become bitterly cynical about judges, law, and justice, and has taken to womanising, drinking, and generally driving himself into the ground through hard living. The story is clearly a philosophical work, rather than a novella incorporates the stolen panel "The Just Judges" of the Van Eyck painting, The Mythical Lamb also known as the Ghent altarpiece. The panel was actually stolen in 1568 and is missing to this day. Needing no introduction but having one anyway , Mark Twain aka Samuel Langhorne Clemens, was a novelist, literary critic, short story writer, essayist, lecturer, joker, pontificator and all round commenter on the great theatre that is life. I know this from experience. He has no clear idea of his story; in fact he has no story. He merely has some people in his mind, and an incident or two, also a locality, and he trusts he can plunge those people into those incidents with interesting results. So he goes to work. To write a novel? No "that is a thought which comes later; in the beginning he is only proposing to tell a little tale, a very little tale, a six-page tale. But as it is a tale which he is not acquainted with, and can only find out what it is by listening as it goes along telling itself, it is more than apt to go on and on and on till it spreads itself into a book. I know about this, because it has happened to me so many times. By that time you begin to clearly and logically perceive what it is you really want to say. Fiction has to make sense. Forgive quickly, kiss slowly. Laugh uncontrollably and never regret anything that makes you smile. The world owes you nothing. It was here first. So throw off the bowlines. Sail away from the safe harbor. Catch the trade winds in your sails. This will gratify some people and astonish the rest. But this wrongs the jackass.
