Believe it or not, the concept of marriage as a relationship based on love developed in human society only within the last two or three centuries, and it has become widespread only within the last half century or so. And more importantly, we can learn a great deal about how to live here on earth so that we can experience real, eternal marriage in heaven. Yes, there is marriage in heaven. Though it may get a little detailed and technical at times, that is necessary in order to dispel the myths and misunderstandings about marriage and the afterlife that have been rampant in Christianity for nearly two thousand years now. Is There Marriage in Heaven? Yes, some people did love their marital partner. But that was considered a pleasant add-on, not something critical to the purpose or success of a marriage. Today, however, millions of men and women do experience a deep inner connection with their partner. And for these people, the idea that their marriage relationship will come to an abrupt end at death can cause great pain. After I had already written the first draft of this article to follow up on a conversation with a reader named Foster starting here , I received a Spiritual Conundrum from a reader named Nita, in which she said: I am widow and a believer in Jesus Christ. I am so lonely without my husband of 38 years, we did everything together, even in the ministry. Will we be together in heaven? Jesus told the religious leaders that there will be no marriage in heaven. I miss my husband so much, my life without him has been turned upside down. Many tell me move on with my life and find someone else. He was my soulmate. Please help me understand! I still trust God and love him. For people who have experienced true spiritual marriage or who long for it the common Christian belief that there is no marriage in the afterlife creates a deep wound in the heart. And Christianity is supposed to heal wounds, not inflict them. It is told three times in the Bible: Here is the fullest version of the story, which occurs in the Gospel of Luke: Some of the Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus with a question. Now there were seven brothers. The first one married a woman and died childless. The second and then the third married her, and in the same way the seven died, leaving no children. Finally, the woman died too. Now then, at the resurrection whose wife will she be, since the seven were married to her? But those who are considered worthy of taking part in the age to come and in the resurrection from the dead will neither marry nor be given in marriage, and they can no longer die; for they are like the angels. The quotation in the next heading is from the Matthew version. Jesus had just silenced the rival Pharisees, with their trick question about paying taxes to Caesar see Matthew They had formulated an even more elaborate word trap for Jesus. They told an over-the-top hypothetical tale about one woman who married seven brothers in a row under the law of levirate marriage more on that in a minute , none of whom fathered a child with her before they died one by one. She herself survived them all and died childless. It was meant to force Jesus into admitting that there is no afterlife. You see, the Sadducees were the biblical literalists of their day. And yet, unlike men, who could have multiple wives under the law, a woman could not have multiple husbands at the same time. And he referred them to the words of God speaking to Moses himself at the burning bush: This law was not unique to the ancient Hebrews. It was fairly common in the cultures of that time and continues to be practiced to this day in some tribal cultures around the world. If brothers are living together and one of them dies without a son, his widow must not marry outside the family. The first son she bears shall carry on the name of the dead brother so that his name will not be blotted out from Israel. He will not fulfill the duty of a brother-in-law to me. And while that may be true, that is not the reason stated in the Hebrew Bible for the practice. Rather, as you can see in the above passage, its purpose was to produce a son for the deceased man so that his name and lineage would not end, but would continue. With the biblical background under our belt, we can now look at one of the major reasons that Jesus did not actually say what traditional Christians think he said about marriage and the afterlife. Here are some definitions from standard dictionaries: Anthropologists say that some

type of marriage has been found in every known human society since ancient times. Historically, those rights have included sexual rights, property rights, rights to children born of the union, rights of inheritance granted to those children, and so on. This general form and view of marriage has, as pointed out in the third definition, existed in every known human society since ancient times. Including the ancient Jewish society in which Jesus lived. The whole point of the law of levirate marriage was to ensure that this function of marriage, seen as essential in that society, would be carried out. When a man married a woman, and a woman was given in marriage to a man, he and she were entering into that formally recognized, contractual-type relationship, in which they secured various legal and property rights, and their children were given rights of inheritance and property as well. See, for example, this commentary by Ben Witherington. The people of this age marry and are given in marriage. What do these things have to do with marriage? Marriage, as they saw it—and as many people even today still see it—is a legal and social contract whose purpose has to do with offspring, property rights, and certain other legal and social rights and privileges. The whole point of this particular law of Moses was to provide offspring for a man, to continue his name and inherit his property after he died. But what if there were no such thing as death? What if a man or woman never died? In the resurrection, Jesus is saying, there is no death. This means that all of your marriage laws such as the law of levirate marriage, whose purpose was to provide for children, property, and inheritance, have no purpose in the afterlife. In short, Jesus is saying: And that, my friends, is why the Sadducees were so wrong. Of course, they were wrong about there being no resurrection and no afterlife. Their earthly, human, legal, property-based ideas about marriage betrayed a complete ignorance of the realities of the afterlife, and of spiritual life in general. And the reality is that vast numbers of people even today still think about marriage in these same earthly, materialistic, and legalistic terms. Jesus is also telling present-day people who think this way: Marriage as you understand it does not exist in heaven. In the afterlife, there is no need for all of the legal and social rights and privileges conferred by marriage contracts and ceremonies. The history of marriage Believe it or not, marrying for love is a fairly recent concept. Even a few hundred years ago, the idea of marrying for love would have sounded strange and ridiculous, if not dangerous to society. I invite you to read the excellent book, *Marriage, a History*: In this book, Ms. Coontz looks at the institution of marriage throughout history. As surprising as it may sound to many people today, up until less than a century ago marriage was almost entirely about property, inheritance, business, and procreation—and in the nobility, about preserving royal bloodlines. Love had very little to do with it. If a married couple were lucky enough to actually love one another, that was just an added bonus. Divorcing because there was no love in the relationship would have been seen as downright silly. The simple fact of the matter is that throughout most of human history, people did not seek love in marriage. Instead, they sought out marital partnerships that would be advantageous for childbearing to continue and strengthen the lineage of the family and clan, for increasing and solidifying the family wealth, property, and business, and for establishing social status and privilege. Even today, in many parts of the world and in much of human society, marriage is still primarily a social, legal, and business matter. That is the sort of marriage Jesus was talking about. If he had tried to talk about what many people today have come to think of as marriage—as a relationship based on love, an inner connection, and shared moral and spiritual values—his audience would have been totally confused. But those who are considered worthy of taking part in the age to come and in the resurrection from the dead will neither marry nor be given in marriage. They are talking about the act of getting married, not the state of being married. And that is a perfectly valid, though somewhat limited, interpretation of what Jesus said. But he was saying much more than that. He was saying that spiritual marriages—the kind that do exist in heaven—are made on earth, not in heaven. See, for example, Jeremiah 3: So it would be very strange if there were no marriage in heaven, and if angels were sexless beings, as traditional Christian churches commonly teach. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate. God created male and female to be joined together as one. And just as God is not the God of the dead but of the living, so everything God does is not temporary, but eternal: I know that everything God does will endure forever.

I will betroth you to me in righteousness and in justice, in steadfast love and in mercy. But each has his own gift from God, one of one kind and one of another. To the unmarried and the widows I say that it is good for them to remain single as I am. For I tell you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven. But if her husband dies, she is free to be married to whom she wishes, only in the Lord. So guard yourselves in your spirit, and do not be faithless. For it is better to marry than to burn with passion. Let the one who is able to receive this receive it. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate. Seek and read from the book of the Lord: Not one of these shall be missing; none shall be without her mate. For the mouth of the Lord has commanded, and his Spirit has gathered them. He has cast the lot for them; his hand has portioned it out to them with the line; they shall possess it forever; from generation to generation they shall dwell in it. The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom like the crocus; it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. Where do private interests such as those on Wall Street or in the drug industry stop and Washington begins? Chapter 15 is all about the FDA, and we thought our readers would enjoy this searing behind-the-scenes look at just how deeply the US Food and Drug Administration has enmeshed itself with the pharmaceutical industry: Big Pharma and FDA: This is still the more revealing name. Drug companies devote themselves to inventing non-natural molecules for use in medicine. Because molecules previously occurring in nature cannot, as a rule, be patented. It also requires having the right people on your side. Drug companies know that they must hire former FDA employees to assist with the process. They also hire leading experts as consultants, some of the same experts who may be called on by the FDA to serve on its screening panels. Pharmaceutical companies bury clinical trials which show bad results for a drug and publish only those that show a benefit. The trials are often run on small numbers of unrepresentative patients, and the statistical analyses are massaged to give as rosy a picture as possible. The bad behavior extends far beyond the industry itself. Drug regulators, who do get access to some of the hidden results, often guard them jealously, even from academic researchers, seeming to serve the interests of the firms whose products they are supposed to police. The regulator sent back 68 pages in which virtually every sentence was blacked out. Medical journals frequently fail to perform basic checks on the papers they print, so all sorts of sharp practice goes uncorrected. Many published studies are not written by the academics whose names they bear, but by commercial ghostwriters paid by drug firms. Doctors are bombarded with advertising encouraging them to prescribe certain drugs. Just since , 75 people have been charged with trying to profit from inside information about drug approvals or company mergers related to patentable drugs. Others with larger resources to invest have made much larger sums. The people you should have been able to trust to fix [the] problems have failed you. Only FDA-approved drugs can be prescribed within government programs such as Medicare. The FDA will also discourage, and often ban, substances that might compete with approved drugs. When anti-depression drugs based on extending the life of a hormone, serotonin, inside the body were approved, the Agency promptly banned a natural substance, L-Tryptophan, that increased serotonin, even though the natural substance was much cheaper and had long been available. Many years later, after the anti-depression drugs were well established, Tryptophan was finally allowed back, but under restrictions that made it more expensive. In general, the FDA maintains a resolutely hostile stance toward supplements. It will not allow any treatment claims to be made for them, no matter how much science there is to support it, unless they are brought through the FDA approval process and thus become drugs. The answer is obvious: This FDA policy prevents millions of Americans from hearing about food or supplement remedies that are safer and cheaper than drugs. It hurts the poor and the middle class. But, ironically, it also hurts the rich, even the crony capitalist rich. A national magazine ran a profile of a Wall Street billionaire sitting in his gigantic Connecticut mansion, popping acid blockers for a stomach problem that tormented him. He was totally unaware of research suggesting that most such ailments stemmed from too little acid, not too much, and that a few simple tablets containing hydrochloric acid, one of the cheapest supplements, would probably end his pain. Why did the billionaire not know this? The answer could not be simpler: So there the billionaire sits in his great mansion, unable to enjoy it because of intense stomach pain. Drug companies and the FDA are not alone in wishing to suppress supplement alternatives to hyper-expensive patented prescription drugs. They have allies among both politicians and doctors. One such study, published October 10, , by University of Michigan researchers, purported to show that taking supplements could shorten your life. It caused a media feeding frenzy, with headlines everywhere. The problem was that this study, like its predecessors, was junk science. The women in the study were asked every six years what they had taken. They were supposed to remember what they had taken for the six-year period. The reports did not have to be specific: Who knows what was taken or even if it was taken? It could also be synthetic or natural. What was behind this? The AMA seems worried about

competition for its brand of medicine, which focuses almost exclusively on conventional drugs and surgery. The AMA and its affiliates also have a tight relationship with drug companies, and depend on them for financial support in many forms, not just journal advertising. Both the AMA and drug companies thus seem determined to trash supplements and those giving advice on supplements. How does the media fit into this? Since prescription drug advertising was made legal, the major media have come to depend on it for survival. Without it, most of the companies, already financially hard pressed by internet competition, would face potential bankruptcy. Are all supplements safe? The World Health Organization recently recommended that governments put extra calcium in the public water supply. This is a very bad idea. Genuine medical research suggests that calcium should only be taken with important co-factors such as vitamin D and K2. These help get the calcium into the bones, where it is needed, and keep it out of the heart and circulatory system. As with anything else, good information and common sense are needed to make the best use of supplements. The FDA also helps patent drug companies fight off competition from generic post-patent drug sellers. Smith describes the process: Generic drugs are generally much cheaper than patent-protected brand name drugs. But they are still quite expensive, especially given that the active ingredients often cost the manufacturer only a few pennies. And in many cases, there are no generic versions available even after the patent on the brand name drug has expired. Here is how the FDA prevents generic drugs from appearing and also keeps the prices of those that do appear high. Bioequivalence A major element driving up the cost of generic drugs is bioequivalence testing. If a company wants to manufacture a generic drug, be it a prescription drug like finasteride or an over-the-counter drug like ibuprofen, it must file an Abbreviated New Drug Application ANDA with the FDA, even if it is manufactured by others already. For drugs that are difficult to synthesize, this requirement is important. For most drugs, however, the raw material can be purchased, often from the identical supplier that provides it for the branded drug. To show bioequivalence, the company typically needs to perform human studies that take nearly two years. Other Obstacles Foot dragging: Pharmacy chains get money from drug manufacturers to push their name brands instead of generics. A bill in an earlier Congress HR would have made transparent exactly how much money the pharmacies are receiving from pharmaceutical companies to promote drugs still under patent, but it died in committee. By paying competitors to delay their challenges to the patent, they are ensuring an exclusive market for themselves and the ability to charge whatever they wish. Such a bill should allow supplement companies to produce and sell generic drugs. It should also eliminate the red tape including human trials that is needlessly preventing generic competition and thus artificially preserving patent drug profits. Sometimes the FDA or other branches of the federal government deliver opportunities to drug companies, not just protect them from potential competition. For example, federal researchers may develop a chemical which is then licensed to a friendly drug company. Or federal agencies will pay for drug research, or hire drug companies to conduct research. Medical marijuana represents another example of how federal agencies assist major drug companies. So long as this was mainly supplied by small time growers and protected by state law, the Drug Enforcement Agency and FDA were unremittedly hostile. But when major drug companies became interested, federal agencies shifted to helping carve out a new monopoly for them. In effect, then, drug companies are not really private companies competing in an open market. It should not be surprising, therefore, that drug companies spend millions on political lobbying and campaign contributions. Many politicians rely on these campaign contributions and thus have a vested interest in maintaining the drug cartel, even though needlessly high drug costs contribute to soaring medical costs. Sometimes the relationships are hard to follow. For example, a powerful senator like Majority Leader Harry Reid D-Nevada may seem to be at odds with Pharma, but then collect plentiful campaign contributions from drug companies when facing a close race. The drug companies are not only interested in rewarding friends; they also want to keep critics from converting rhetoric into action. The same principle applies to President Obama. A more typical case is former Senator Chris Dodd of Connecticut. He sat on the Senate committee overseeing health and for a time was expected to be its next chairman. In addition, his wife, Jackie Clegg, was paid well, both in cash and stock, to serve on two drug company boards. As noted in an earlier chapter, Dodd and his wife also benefited from a preferential mortgage rate provided by a company, Countrywide Financial, at the heart of the sub-prime home lending scandal that contributed to the

Crash of The result of all this is that drug companies, ostensibly regulated by the government, have come to rely on the regulators and politicians to feather their mutual nest. This sounded impressive, but it was just a slap on the wrist for the giant drug company. But Merck continued partnering with and selling to government without any interruption or even question. As government takes over more and more of medicine, through Medicare, Medicaid, Obamacare, and regulatory agencies such as the FDA, it must itself bear more and more monopoly inflated drug costs. Much of this is financed by borrowing from China and other countries, or more recently, by printing money. Not surprisingly, the Chinese have shown themselves to be apt pupils of the crony capitalist US medical system. Among other devices, they have taken to issuing indiscriminate domestic drug patents, so that US firms find it increasingly difficult to enforce their own US patents in China.

If we do not respond biblically, we may end up being co-opted into accepting these changes as necessary and good. Our goal is to do exactly what the series title suggests. We want to explain clearly what God says about marriage, the family, same-sex marriage, moral purity, hope for change, and Christ-like love. In order to arrive at the truth, we need to ask the right questions first. We ask simply for a fair hearing, nothing more. Take notes, jot down your questions. And most of all, check everything I say by the Word of God. The Word of God must be our ultimate authority. Marriage itself is made in heaven, but not every marriage is made in heaven. Not every marriage is a good idea. Here are two verses to consider as we begin: These verses offer a very positive framework for us to consider. Marriage is good and honorable, and deserves our support. Let every husband regard his wife as a gift from God, and every wife regard her husband the same way. Marriage and the Glory of God Before going further, I should tell you that this is not a sermon about how to have a happy marriage. Those are worthwhile sermons, but not for today. Our subject is more foundational than that: What should we think about marriage? Marriage is of supreme importance because it is the first institution created by God. Marriage is the foundation of the family and the cornerstone of civilization. Marriage is what God says it isâ€”not what man says it is. Our marriages will not flourish unless we follow the divine blueprint. Let me offer a further thought that may be new to many of you: Marriage is of central importance because it is one of the key ways in which God displays his glory in the world. God intends that your marriage display something of his character to the world. That leads us in some surprising directions: Until we grasp this, we will never have a proper foundation for thinking Christianly about marriage. Marriage is a window in time through which the world grasps a glimpse of eternity. A Paganized Culture Marriage today is in crisis in our society. There are many causes, including materialism, secularism, greed, and rampant selfishness. Many young people have seen so much divorce, they doubt that a lifelong marriage is possibleâ€”or even desirable. The current debate over same-sex marriage is not the problem. And it is not new. Check out the Old Testament. Read the history of ancient Greece and Rome. The problem today is that Christians have been sleeping while the world has changed around them. We treat holy things as lowly, and lowly things as holy. No wonder there is such enormous confusion about marriage and the family. The world has no idea what to think about sex. On one hand, the world corrupts it into the most degrading form possible. On the other hand, the world elevates sex and begins to worship it as the highest expression of human experience. Both extremes are equally wrong. And despite the controversy and confusion, marriage endures as a human institution because there is something in us that craves the companionship of a husband or wife. Here is the proof: Most people will be married at some point in life. And nearly everyone wants to be married. Many people so greatly desire marriage that they get married again and again and again. Leaving aside any other judgments, that demonstrates the truth of what God said in Genesis 2: Back to Eden With that as background, we turn now to Genesis 2, the most basic passage in the Bible about marriage. If this were all we had, it would be more than enough to teach us what we need to know about marriage. Before jumping into the text, please note these two points about the context: That is, the first marriage took place in paradise, in the Garden of Eden. It shows us what marriage is meant to be as it comes from the hand of the Creator. He meets her because God orchestrates every part of their relationship. God takes the initiative to show Adam his loneliness v. She will make up what is lacking in him, and together they will be stronger than if they were apart. Adam learns about loneliness by naming the animals vv. As Adam names the animals, God is preparing him for marriage. He is teaching him to

be a leader. The power to name is the power of authority. He is also teaching Adam that humanity stands above the animal kingdom. God was also training him to be a lover. As Adam surveyed the animals he saw Mr. And so it went throughout the animal kingdom—always male and female. But where in all creation could he find a counterpart for himself? God was creating within Adam a gnawing hunger for a life partner, a hunger God would soon meet in the creation of Eve. Adam is not ready for Eve until he sees his own incompleteness. God brings the woman to the man vv. Note how God takes the lead in all that happens. He puts Adam to sleep, then he takes a rib from his side, then he fashions Eve, then he brings her to Adam. God is the author of the first marriage, and he is intimately involved in every aspect. That is precisely what happened in Eden. God was the father of the bride and he personally brings her to Adam. There was no courtship and no dating. The first marriage was an arranged marriage. God himself performed the first ceremony as minister, father and witness. Adam recognizes Eve as similar but different v. He created a partner for Adam—“like him, from him, yet different. The Hebrew words tell the story. Adam is flat on the ground, just beginning to awake from the divine anesthesia. As he opens his eyes, he sees the Lord and next to him a beautiful, blushing creature looking at him in wide-eyed anticipation. Not a rabbit or a porcupine. Who or what is she? She looks like him. In these two verses we find the four essential components of Christian marriage: Cleaving means being glued together so tightly no force can tear you apart. Transparency means having a relationship built on such trust that you can let down the barriers and allow another person to know you deeply—“body, soul and spirit. A healthy, happy marriage is as close to heaven as we will get on earth. In marriage there is true equality and true difference. Woman is not less than man, nor is man greater than woman. But the man is not the woman, and the woman is not the man. Both are made in the image of God, yet they are very different from each other. Two women cannot do this.

This proverb, 'marriages are made in heaven', means that 'good marriages have a divine element to them'. The suggestion is that 'a marriage goes beyond human love and includes spiritual love as well.

No moral relativism here. November 15, at 8: We can develop them, and allow them to grow, and then trust them to guide us when we need it. Nor should we trust a flabby conscience. And we should all remember what St. Ignatius says about conscience this is a paraphrase: To him for whom the conscience is weak, the devil seeks to weaken it, making us accept more and more in our lives. To him for whom the conscience is strong, the devil seeks to more it all the more particular, so that the sin of scrupulosity may creep in, and we might lose the ability to pursue virtue as we grow in self-loathing. For some their conscience says follow whatever the RC Church says and they should do just that. If it is something else then they should follow that path. Tolerance that encourages people to stay in a place that could compromise their immortal souls is not charity at all. An atheist or agnostic might indeed find a compatible partner through such a service. However, for many atheism and agnosticism are transient states "Thank God" and the formation of relationships on that basis might diminish the chance that they would eventually come to faith. It is true charity to hope and pray that those who do not presently believe will someday receive the grace of faith, not that they will continue to be comfortable in their unbelief. What about people like St Cyprian, who excommunicated the Pope, and died a martyr. Is it relativism to suggest that it would be better for an atheist to do what he really thinks is right than to pretend to be a Catholic and thus become hypocrite based on social pressure, or some other reason than thinking Catholicism is true? Lewis acting rightly when he received confirmation and communion in the Anglican church, and recited the creeds, even though he was an atheist? Or should he have followed his conscience rather than trying to avoid conflict with his father? There is a basic point all are missing here. The moral law was established by god and given to man in the form of divine revelation. It is implanted on the hearts of all men to know the truth. All men have free will to accept the graces given to them by god, and God gives ALL men the graces needed to be saved. The issue is made complex because man has free will and can reject the graces given. This leads men into a variety of errors. The inflection point for Jews and Protestants today is the time when Jesus came. The Jews could not accept Jesus as the Messiah, while Protestants later on could not accept that Jesus left a shepherd on earth to guide the flock. There are more than 60 old testament prophecies that clearly tell a reader who the messiah is. If a person rejects that, there is nothing you can do for them, except pray they open their heart to the truth. If all of the miracles and obvious good fruits of the Catholic church do not convince a non Catholic it is the true Church established by God, it is for reasons of sin or bad will. In my own family, on one side I have two relatives who were ArchBishops in Europe, and many ordained clergy including nuns and priests. I can only conclude there were many devout and pious relatives in my family and my present family could now be the beneficiaries of their prayers and sacrifices based on the fact my family has been so richly blessed. My confessor says it is in part because those who accept the graces given to them by God are given more. And to those who reject the graces, God will not send more. That makes sense, since society at large sees that it is wrong to keep giving people money who will not work and will waste it. In time, the lack of grace then blinds us to all things holy and good. This is not a debate about whether there is salvation outside the Catholic church please, not again!. What I said was: Such a person would, however, be bound to conform their conscience at least to what they knew of natural law. The clearest sign of an undeveloped conscience is that it seldom bothers you. The point I was trying to make, and that you avoided addressing, was that the human conscience must be conformed to the truth. When mankind fell and we are fallen, his conscience fell with him. November 15, at 9: Let us say that God knows the entirety of the truth, because duh God is Truth. The Church knows all of the revealed Truth, because God told Her all about it. The well-formed conscience knows a pretty good chunk of what truth God taught the Church, and certainly knows all of the truth which we absolutely must know for salvation "plus other bits which are just cool and helpful. A poorly-formed conscience knows bits and pieces of the truth, which if not correctly aligned, will lead its possessor astray. It is also necessary that the possessor keep trying to seek the truth and

educate his conscience, as well as letting God have input. Does this make sense? November 15, at That is the job of our intellect and will. We give the assent of faith, and then train our conscience to conform to it. The job of the conscience is to remind us of what we believe, not to form those beliefs. The conscience is not a map, though it can be a map light. We will be held responsible at the judgement if we allow our conscience to atrophy, when we might have been able to strengthen it had we taken the trouble. It is a part of the intellect, the part used when we engage in moral reasoning. See the Catholic Encyclopedia article on Conscience. Maybe I was painting with too broad a brush before, but we are getting into an area more technical than I am used to. In other words, it is not some magical intuitive impulse that sits in judgement on our moral choices, but is bound up with the intellect and the will. Moral reasoning is still reasoning, in other words.
