The text was right-justified by hand! One of my friends once accused me of being far more in love with places of natural beauty than I ever was with any woman. In the foreward, his second wife wrote: After one or two sorties to the Pennine Way when I was left to my own devices between the dropping off and the picking up, I had the temerity to ask if I could accompany him. He even mentions that the big feature of his second wedding was that his wife had a car! His first wife barely got 2 sentences in the memoir. Yet when he writes about the fells one of the chapters is titled, A love-letter to the fells , this is what he says: Words are inadequate to express and explain the emotion impact the fells had on me. During the making of the books they dominated my thoughts. They held me in chains I was living a double life. I was completely dedicated to the books and spent every available moment on them Domestic relationships withered and died If I was heading for the hills, and not the office, I could set forth singing, not audibly, heaven forbid; just in my heart. I was off to where the sheep were real, not human. Of interest to those who are self-publishers, Alfred Wainwright was a self-publisher as well. He did so for two reasons. The second was control: As his fame wore on, he took to more and more extreme circumstances under-which he would try to avoid people. He started hiking at dusk, and would spend the nights on the mountains pacing back and forth, since sleeping was impossible. He would then hike back down in mid-morning when the hikers would start to show up. He would even lie to people who recognized him, denying that he was Alfred Wainwright. If his ornery nature was all there was, I would not recommend this book. But what comes through in this book, page after page, illustration after illustration yes, the book is lavishly illustrated with his famous ink-drawings, frequently accompanied with the photographs he took while walking is his love of nature and his dedication to the art of walking and solitude. The book is a quick read: I picked it up this morning and finished reading it 2 hours later, but the illustrations will haunt you and draw you back to the book again and again. Certainly looking over this book has made me want to visit the Lake District again! The majority of the film was shot on a large set built on a ranch in Thousand Oaks , California [8] which was a detailed recreation of an early twentieth-century geisha district in Kyoto , Japan. Towards the end of production, some scenes were shot in Kyoto , Japan, including the Fushimi Inari Taisha the head shrine of Inari , located in Fushimi-ku, Kyoto. Post-production[edit] In post-production, one of the tasks of the sound editors was to improve upon the English pronunciation of the international cast. Reception[edit] In the Western hemisphere, the film received mixed reviews. Western box office and reviews[edit] Memoirs of a Geisha received mixed reviews from western critics. All three were already prominent actors in Chinese cinema. The film-makers defended the decision, however, and attributed "acting ability and star power" as their main priorities in casting the roles, and director Rob Marshall noted examples such as the Mexican actor Anthony Quinn being cast as a Greek man in Zorba the Greek. To some Chinese, the casting was offensive because they mistook geisha for prostitutes, and because it revived memories of wartime Japanese atrocities. In Japan, the reception was mixed. Some Japanese have expressed offense that the three main characters, Japanese geisha, were all played by Chinese actors. Others in Japan were unhappy with how the traditional role of the geisha portrayed, saying it was inaccurate and westernised. For instance, my character had to go from age 15 to 35; she had to be able to dance, and she had to be able to act, so he needed someone who could do all that. I also think that regardless of whether someone is Japanese or Chinese or Korean , we all would have had to learn what it is to be a geisha , because almost nobody today knows what that meansâ€”not even the Japanese actors on the film. Geisha was not meant to be a documentary. I remember seeing in the Chinese newspaper a piece that said we had only spent six weeks to learn everything and that that was not respectful toward the culture. To my mind, what this issue is all about, though, is the intense historical problems between China and Japan. The whole subject is a land mine. Maybe one of the reasons people made such a fuss about Geisha was that they were looking for a way to vent their anger. Relations between Japan and Mainland China were particularly tense due to two main factors: The Chinese State Administration of Radio, Film, and Television decided to ban the film on February 1, , considering the film as "too sensitive". In doing so, it overturned a November decision to approve the film for screening. During this time, Japan captured and forced Chinese women to serve as " comfort women " for their military personnel. Newspaper sources, such as the Shanghai-based Oriental Morning Post and the Shanghai Youth Daily, quoted the fears that the film might be banned by censors; there were concerns that the casting of Chinese actresses as geishas could rouse anti-Japan sentiment and stir up feelings over Japanese wartime actions in China, especially the use of Chinese women as forced sex workers.
