

**1: D. L. Moody's Child Stories Related by Him in His Revival Work - Logos Bible Software**

*These stories, written and told over a century ago by the famous evangelist, Dwight L. Moody, still powerfully communicate the tree R's of salvation: Ruination by the fall, Redemption by the blood, Regeneration by the Holy Spirit.*

Moody takes no secondary place. One has but to study the history of the Church to learn the value of religious awakenings in general, and he who states that their effect upon the Church is not helpful makes a statement which cannot be supported by the facts. I once heard Mr. Moody say that when some one in the City of Boston had criticized the meetings he had held, he determined that he would go back to the city and call for all those who had been converted in his meetings to be present at a service which he would announce. The great building was filled to over, flowing and at least ten years after his services had closed he had the joy of hearing literally thousands give testimony to the fact that he had led them to Christ. Moody was especially adapted to his work, first, because he was pre-eminently practical in this practical age. He was most direct in his speech; every one knew exactly what he meant; there was no mistake in his utterance. His energy was literally boundless; day and night and night and day he toiled, never seeming to be weary. His earnestness and enthusiasm were contagious and wherever he found an audience dull and lifeless he had only to speak to them a few minutes until they were ready to do anything that he might command. He preached to larger crowds than any man in his generation, and yet it was ever his object and aim to reach the individual rather than the people in a mass. He was a born organizer, and in this century which has been specially distinguished for its progress in organization he took high rank. There was nothing remarkable about the first service except that it was formal and cold. And when the after-meeting was called, there was a most remarkable manifestation of the power of God, and it was the beginning of a great and memorable work of grace. One of the members of that church went home to tell an invalid member of the family, that two Americans, by the names of Moody and Sankey, had conducted services in the church that day. The invalid burst into tears, and reaching for her purse took out a piece of an English newspaper, which contained the large announcement that Dwight L. Moody and Ira D. Sankey were being greatly used of God in Chicago. So she had read it and had cut it out of the paper, and from that moment began to pray that God would send those two men to her church. I have heard Mr. Moody relate the incident myself and then say: It has been estimated that he preached to millions. It is safe to say that he must, under the power of God, have led hundreds of thousands to a decision. Moody of East Northfield is dead. At that moment I shall be more alive than I am now; I shall have gone up higher, that is all, out of this old clay tenement into a house that is immortal -- a body that death cannot touch, that sin cannot taint; a body fashioned like unto His glorious body. Moody may well have been the greatest evangelist of all time. In a year period he won a million souls, founded three Christian schools, launched a great Christian publishing business, established a world-renowned Christian conference center, and inspired literally thousands of preachers to win souls and conduct revivals. He traveled across the American continent and through Great Britain in some of the greatest and most successful evangelistic meetings communities have ever known. His tour of the world with Sankey was considered the greatest evangelistic enterprise of the century. It was Henry Varley who said, "It remains to be seen what God will do with a man who gives himself up wholly to Him. Two great monuments stand in the indefatigable work and ministry of this gospel warrior -- Moody Bible Institute and the famous Moody Church in Chicago. Moody went to be with the Lord in Dwight Lyman Moody was born in the town of Northfield, Mass. He was the sixth of seven sons who, with two daughters, made up the family of Edwin and Betsy Holton Moody. The father had acquired a little farmhouse and a few acres of stony ground on a hillside just without the limits of the town, but the whole was encumbered by mortgage. Moody worked as a stonemason when the opportunity was afforded, using his leisure time to till his farm. The burden of his responsibilities proved too heavy; reverses crushed his spirit; and, after an illness of only a few hours, he died suddenly at the age of forty-one years, when Dwight was only four years old, leaving a large family unprovided for. When Dwight was about six years old, an old rail fence one day fell upon him. He could not lift the heavy rails. Exhausted by his efforts, he had almost given up. Moody has related, seems to have made so profound an impression upon his youthful mind that its influence

in preparing his heart for the Gospel message cannot have been slight. He himself has related the story in these words: He was weeping, and he told me a strange story, which I have never forgotten. He said when he got settled in life, and his ambition to get money was gratified, it would be time enough then to seek the kingdom of God. He went from one village to another and got nothing to do. He felt very uncomfortable, and when the meeting was over he could not get that sermon out of his mind. Wilbur Chapman An evangelist with a heart to train other young men and women to share the life-changing Gospel message, Dwight Moody started the Bible Institute in Chicago that bears his name. At this critical period in his life, young Moody became a shy and silent attendant at the Congregational Church. At first, the evangelical preaching of the pastor, Dr. Kirk, was distasteful to him, and the raw scholar looked unpromising to his teacher, Mr. Kimball laid his hand on the his shoulder and spoke a few kind words to him. Then he asked him the direct question, "Will you not give your heart to Jesus? He sought and found Jesus as his Saviour, and resolved to consecrate himself to the service of his God. Henceforth life was a new revelation to him. I never loved the sun before. And when I heard the birds singing their sweet songs, I fell in love with the birds. Like the Scotch lassie who stood on the hills of her native land breathing the sweet air, and when asked why she did it, said, I love the Scotch air. His interest in church work continued as he joined the Plymouth Congregational Church. He rented four pews there to provide lonely boys like himself a place of worship. Then he joined the mission band of the First Methodist Church, visiting and distributing tracts at hotels and boarding houses. Here he met wealthy dry goods merchant John V. Farwell, who later would be a great help. He also worked out of the First Baptist Church where he was later married. The prayer revival that was sweeping the nation in also contributed to his enthusiasm for the things of God. Discovering a little afternoon Sunday School on the corner of Chicago and Wells he offered his help. He was told there were already nearly as many teachers as students so he began recruiting. The first week he brought in eighteen students, doubling the Sunday School! Soon his recruiting overflowed the place. Long before the birth of microphones, radio, television or the Internet, Dwight Moody personally preached to huge crowds that totaled over 10,, people in his lifetime. He withdrew to the shores of Lake Michigan in the summer of and taught children, using pieces of driftwood as chairs. He was dubbed "Crazy Moody" about this time, but respect came through the years as the title slowly changed to "Brother Moody," "Mr. Moody," and finally, "D. A visiting preacher reported his favorable impressions The use of prizes, free pony rides and picnics along with genuine love for children soon produced the largest Sunday School in Chicago, reaching some 1, weekly. Moody supervised, recruited, and did the janitor work early Sunday morning, cleaning out the debris from a Saturday night dance, to get ready for the afternoon Sunday School. Friends believed he could have become a millionaire had he concentrated his efforts in business. This decision was prompted by the following incident. A dying Sunday School teacher had to return east because of his health and was greatly concerned about the salvation of the girls in his class. The next night the girls gathered together for a farewell prayer meeting to pray for their sick teacher. This so moved Moody that soul-winning seemed to be the only important thing to do from then on. He made a vow to tell some person about the Savior each day, even though it eventually meant getting up out of bed at times. Dwight Moody has done mighty deeds for the Lord that our generation has not his equal. With the advent of the Civil War, Moody found himself doing personal work among the soldiers. He was on battlefields on nine occasions serving with the U. At the Battle of Murfreesboro in January, , under fire, he went among the wounded and dying asking, "Are you a Christian? A vacant saloon was cleaned, rented and fixed up for Sunday evening services with the Sunday School continuing at North Market Hall until it burned in Then Kinzie Hall was used for a year. It began February 28, with twelve members. This was the official beginning of what is now known as Moody Church. He preached Sunday evenings until a pastor, J. Harwood, was called in and served until , during which time Moody served as a deacon. He had a part in erecting the first Y. That year he also held his first revival campaign in Philadelphia. He also wanted to meet Spurgeon and Mueller. On this trip, while they sat in a public park in Dublin, Evangelist Henry Varley remarked, "The world has yet to see what God will do with, and for, and through, and in, and by, the man who is fully consecrated to Him. *CHILD STORIES. "Little Moody." I remember when I was a boy I went several miles from home with an older brother. That seemed to me the longest visit of my life.*

When kids or even teens walk around the house in a huff in order to get their way, that means someoneâ€™ probably one or both parentsâ€™ is still reacting to it. The behavior will continue as long as you continue to react to it. Most kids are eventually able to do this most of the time. But some kids persist in sulking. Remember, the behaviors kids tend to continue are the behaviors that are meeting their needs. And until your child learns other, more effective ways of communicating, it will probably continue. So at first, bring it to their attention. If you want to say something to me, figure out a better way to say it. After having the conversation with your child about other ways they can express themselves, I would ignore the behavior completely. If they behave oppositionally or defiantly because of your requests, then deal with that behavior. So, allowing your child to be in a sulky mood and not responding to it is the best way to get out of it. Let it die by neglect. In fact, like plants, a lot of these behaviors do die from neglect. If you water them and nourish them, they continue to grow. How to Reduce that Whining in Your Ear Whining is another annoying way kids have of expressing themselves. People blame others for their emotional state regularly. Now, the emotional state that accompanies whining is usually that of feeling sorry for yourself. All of this contributes to the level and intensity of the whining. Attention-Seeking Behavior in Young Children: They get to complain about something once, and afterwards they have to write about it in their journals. At the end of the ten minutes and it has to end on timeâ€™ use a little egg timer , everybody goes their way. Your child gets another chance tomorrow during complaint time or whatever you choose to call it. This will help extinguish the constant whining. By the way, when you establish a complaint time or whining time , your child will have to work to find things to complain about. And if they do complain, you can tell them to write it in their journals or save it for the complaint time tomorrow. Whenever any behavior is more pronounced with one parent, it means that the behavior is working better with that parent. You and I are not happy all the time. As adults, most of us have strategies to deal with the plethora of other emotions we face each and every day. We can combat sadness, tiredness, and things like hunger well, at least some of us can! This is a perfectly normal part of every day life, but sometimes it happens at a photo session. This can spell disaster if not handled well before and after the shoot. Before There are plenty of things that go through all of our minds before a shoot. From clothing or styling to light and composition, the photographer has their work cut out for them on a family shoot. Aside from that, though, there are things you can do to make sure that your session goes well. For me, my sessions are about authentic emotions and having children express themselves for who they are. To that end, there are some things I like to make clear to families before the session. Dylan Goldby Learn how to take great portraits of the entire family! Rushing children from school to a shoot or just before their sports game in the afternoon are also never ideal times for the shoot. Next, I always like to make sure that everything possible has been done at home to make sure the children arrive to the shoot in a good mood. I always ask that parents be in a forgiving and relaxed mood for the day. Rushing to get the kids out the door and scolding them for things they normally do agitates the children before a shoot. For one day, we can let them run just a little bit wild without damaging the human being they will become. Giving them that extra slice of freedom allows them to be themselves during the shoot. Dylan Goldby Finally, I always try to meet the children a few days before the shoot. That way, they are in control of the meeting and can get to know me when they are ready. This is why I have the parents allow them more freedom than usual on the day of the shoot. I also ask that the parents refrain from discipline during the shoot unless one of the children is actually putting themselves in danger or damaging our location – this rarely, if ever, happen. I also take this upon myself. This can be a fine line to balance on, but one that allows the children to be who they are for the hour or two I have them. Sometimes, as we all do, a child might just wake up on the wrong side of the bed. They may stub their toe getting out of the car or have had a fight with a sibling on the way over. These things cannot be avoided and thus must be dealt with on the shoot. The first step in doing this is to identify the problem. What is it that is irking this poor human in front of your camera? That will give you some go-to ideas for being able to bring them back to the shoot. The second step is to take your time. A little psychology and persistence will bring even the most defiant soul onto your side. Do not allow the parents to intervene with promises of rewards or threats of punishment. This may work for one frame, but it will not carry throughout your session. It will only serve to confuse them about whose side everyone is on and who really cares about how they feel. Much of my work is done with the adoptive community in Seoul, and I can tell you that sometimes you just need to roll with the punches. Sometimes grieving is more important than a couple of happy photographs. These things can be hard as well. Sometimes, nothing that you or the parents can say or do will bring a child back down to where you need them to be. You have two ways of approaching a situation like this. The first is that you can roll with the punches. There are times when a controlled situation simply will not be possible and you need to be willing to shoot what you have available to you. Let the parents know that you feel this is the best approach and switch to documentary mode. You may just find that this results in better images than you could have imagined. Dylan Goldby The other is that you can offer a reschedule. This can go both ways as sometimes a child will remember their first experience and a second session will not prove any better. However, I have found that sometimes just giving the child a breather and getting back to things hours, days, or weeks after can help to let them be much more relaxed for the session. In Conclusion The actual shoot day for a family session can be far more complex than the preparation at times. However the session goes, you need to be equipped with the skills to produce quality images. I hope these have been helpful!
