

## 1: Residency | SLCC

*Listed below are the non-resident tuition rates for classroom credit courses for the Fall and Spring semesters. See residency requirements or talk with an advisor if you have questions about your residency status.*

Students enrolled in only Summer B must submit their residency documents by June 18. A completed packet can also be emailed to [admiss@fiu.edu](mailto:admiss@fiu.edu). A completed packet can also be emailed to [residency@fiu.edu](mailto:residency@fiu.edu). Any incomplete submissions will result in a processing delay. Please note, until a decision has been made regarding the residency reclassification, the student should consider themselves as a non-Florida resident. Depending upon the review of your affidavit, additional documentation may be required to support your claim of residency for tuition purposes. Students applying for admission or readmission are encouraged to visit their my. You do not have to submit the affidavit at the same time as the application; however, it must be completed and submitted prior to the start of classes. Since each affidavit is individually reviewed, it is in your best interest to submit the affidavit as soon as possible. Additional documentation may be required to prove your claim of Florida residency for tuition purposes, so you want to make sure that you have enough time to submit the required items prior to the deadline. Initial Classification requires two 2 Florida residency documents from the above list. Additional documentation may be required from the claimant. Appealing the denial of residency classification A student may once appeal the denial of a request to be reclassified from out-of-state status to in-state status for tuition purposes. The student will need to meet with a manager-level staff in the Office of the Registrar to discuss the decision and their options. The appeal must be provided in writing with accompanying documentation that might support reconsideration of the original decision. A committee will meet to review the appeal and its accompanying documentation. The purpose of the Residency Committee was established to enable the administrative officers at FIU to accurately classify each student as either a Florida resident for tuition purposes or a Non-Florida resident for tuition purposes and to serve as a point of appeal. The Residency Committee strives to provide fairness and equity to all students of the University in accordance with section The committee will make a determination in the case and will notify the student in writing of its final decision. We recommend that you do this as soon as you feel you are eligible to be considered in-state and strongly encourage that you submit along with your form supportive documentation. Not submitting the supportive documentation will delay this review. Guidelines of Florida Residency for Tuition Purposes coming soon. Dependent student for residency purposes? The parent or legal guardian must provide evidence to substantiate legal Florida residency: Prove legal ties to the state of Florida- Florida residency documents must be dated or issued at least 12 months before the first day of the semester for which Florida residency is sought. Florida residency documents must be accompanied with the Initial Residency Classification form. The completed Residency Affidavit with the required Florida documents can be submitted to the Office of Admissions see the chart below for review. A completed residency reclassification application accompanied by the required Florida documents must be submitted for review to the Office of the Registrar see chart below. Learn about the policies, procedures, and Florida Statutes governing the classification for establishing residency for tuition purposes. Residency refers to whether you are an in-state Florida resident or an out-of-state resident, and this classification determines your rate of tuition. Florida residents pay less in fees per credit hour than do non-Florida residents. Florida state statute Section Generally a person is considered a Florida resident for the purpose of paying taxes, voting or other legal purposes after residing in the state for a designated length of time. However, state statute specifies additional requirements for a student to be classified as an in-state resident for tuition purposes. Living in or attending school in Florida will not, in itself, establish legal residence for tuition purposes. Your initial classification is determined by the Office of Admissions when you apply to the university. Failure to provide all relevant information and required documentation in the residency section of the admission application could result in a non-Florida or out-of-state resident classification for tuition purposes. Students applying for admission should check their my. You must contact the Office of the Registrar to initiate the process. The rules are the same for all persons whether you are claiming Florida residency on your initial application or whether you are attempting to

change your residency status in hopes of qualifying for in-state tuition after you have been admitted. In-state status is only for those residents who reside in the state permanently with established legal domicile in Florida. Permanent Florida residency is demonstrated by the absence of ties to any other state and establishment of a bona fide domicile in Florida. Permanent residence is evaluated for the domicile year associated with the initial term of entry to FIU or the term for which a student is seeking reclassification. A student or claimant seeking classification as a Florida Resident must also have no legal ties to another State, continued legal ties i. To learn more please refer to the changes to Residency Classification. If you feel you have satisfied these basic qualifications, you can submit the Application for Residency Reclassification. Non-Resident Tuition Waiver Eligibility Criteria Florida law provides for FIU to waive the out-of-state fee for all students, including undocumented students, who demonstrate they: The approval of this waiver does NOT grant eligibility for financial aid, scholarships or loans from the University, the state, or the federal government.

By May 1st a first draft of the entire thesis must be completed and submitted to the thesis advisor. By the end of the spring semester the student must submit to the M. This includes an oral defense conducted plans to defend the thesis by July 15, committee includes thesis advisor, two readers and the submission of a final approved PDF of the MS thesis to the department by August 1. The diploma is awarded in August following the fifth year. Students in this program may take longer than the fifth year to complete the culminating requirement. Students must register as a non-resident if they do not complete the requirements in time for August degree conferral. Students are responsible for paying for housing, food, books, and other personal items. Students in the Accelerated Degree Program are allowed one year of non-residency status after the fifth year if there are mitigating circumstances where a student is unable to complete the 5th year at the designated time. Program Advisor Students are required to meet with the designated degree advisor and have them sign the Accelerated Degree Program Advisor Form. The signed form confirms the student and program advisor have discussed the requirements of the program. This form is also available on the Graduate Admissions website. A student seeking in-state resident tuition must be a United States citizen, have been granted legal immigrant or permanent U. Residency reclassification will not be granted to foreign nationals without proof of permanent resident, asylum, or refugee status in the United States. Students applying under the One Year Rule must: Reside be physically present in Utah for twelve continuous months immediately prior to the beginning of the semester for which they are seeking residency. Not be claimed as a dependent on the federal tax returns of any person who is not a resident of Utah. University of Utah institutional policy states that, in addition to meeting the requirements of the general rule of the law, once he or she has begun graduate school, a graduate non-resident student, except for those in the Medical or Dental programs, must earn 40 graduate level semester credit hours at the University of Utah prior to the term for which the student is seeking resident status. What are the residency reclassification application term deadlines? Applications for reclassification are accepted for all three academic terms. Students must submit the reclassification application or the certification form by the appropriate term deadline: The following documents can be used to prove physical presence: A transcript verifying enrollment in on-campus, term-length classes at a Utah college or university. Transcripts only can be used to verify dates classes were in session. The following documents cannot be used to prove physical presence: Utility bills W-2 forms Letters from friends It is your responsibility to be able to prove your physical presence in Utah for the required twelve month period. As the residency application deadlines are generally earlier than when a student meets the month rule, you will be expected to follow up with our office and continue to provide proof of physical presence for the full month period in question. It is essential that you submit your application for residency reclassification prior to the term deadline. You will be allowed to continue submitting documentation required to prove eligibility for reclassification up to the Friday of the first week of term-length classes. During the 12 continuous months I am establishing residency in Utah, can I go home to see my family during holidays or summer breaks? A student may have limited travel outside the state of Utah, but total absences during the twelve continuous month time period cannot exceed a cumulative total of 29 days, including all holiday breaks, school breaks, and summer months. Remember that until you are granted residency for tuition purposes, it is in your best interest to do all you can to present a strong case for residency reclassification. Which tax forms will I need to verify my Financial Independence? Please note that W-2 forms cannot be used to verify financial independence. What if I came to Utah for non-educational reasons? There are exceptions to the general rule of the law that will allow you to apply and qualify immediately for residency. What documents do I need to provide to prove that I have established my domiciliary ties or a permanent residence in Utah? All students submitting a Residency Reclassification Application must take overt steps to prove their intent to make Utah their permanent residence. Students applying under the Undergraduate Policy One Year Rule or Graduate Policy must demonstrate that they have relinquished domiciliary ties held in any other state and established them in Utah by the deadlines listed below, which fall before the Residency Reclassification Application deadlines. Part of qualifying for residency for tuition purposes is showing that you have established your domicile in Utah and have the intent to make Utah your permanent residence. Establishing legal ties such as a Utah driver license and relinquishing such ties from your previous domicile proves your intent to establish a permanent domicile in Utah. What if I am not registered to vote in any state and choose not to register? If you are not registered to vote in any state and do not choose to register, you must indicate your choice on your residency application. If you wish to register to vote, you may do so online with the voting office in the county in which you reside or call the voting office for other options on how to register. Do you have to be a United States citizen in order to qualify for residency for tuition purposes? You must be a U. If you are not a U. Can I find out if I will be admitted as a resident or nonresident before I apply for admission to the University of Utah? Your initial residency classification is

made in the admissions process. If you are admitted, your official letter of acceptance will tell you your residency classification. If you are coded a nonresident and feel you qualify under our state residency law as a resident, you may file a Residency Reclassification Application with the supporting documentation to show how you qualify based on the residency policy. Be sure to submit your application by or before the term deadline. Do I have to file another application with the University of Utah? The University of Utah honors the resident status determination by other Utah System of Higher Education institutions unless the student never attended the other Utah school as a resident student, or the resident classification was obtained under false pretense, or the facts at the time of the granting of residency have changed significantly. What do I need to do after I have turned in my residency reclassification application? Applications are processed in the order in which they are received. If you have not heard any response from us within four weeks of submitting your application, please contact the Office of Admissions at residency sa.

Residency Definition Resident tuition classification is determined by criteria found in Kansas statutes and regulations of the Kansas Board of Regents. Students are responsible for providing information sufficient to support their applications for resident classification. This is a general overview of the procedures and criteria used to determine resident status. For students 18 years or older residency is determined based on their ability to document clearly and convincingly that they meet the criteria established by the statutes and regulations summarized below. The residency status of students younger than 18 years is determined by the residence of their custodial parent or the parent who provided the preponderance of the support for days prior to the first day of classes. The definition of residence K. Continuous physical residence in the state of Kansas for a year prior to the start of classes. Reliance upon Kansas sources of support and 3. Intent to make Kansas your permanent home indefinitely. It is possible to change classification status while attending the University, however, you will be required to document that you have met the criteria, as outlined in K. Demonstrating that you have met these criteria while attending school can be difficult. Note - If you have lived in Kansas within the past five 5 years and were a resident for tuition purposes and plan to return to Kansas, please contact the assistant registrar. This information is available in the Residency Brochure. Application Procedures Applications for a change in resident tuition classification may be obtained from the Office of the University Registrar, Strong Hall on the Lawrence campus, Student Center for the Kansas City Campus, or a printable residency application form is available. Completed applications may be submitted to the Office of the University Registrar as early as 75 days prior and as late as 30 calendar days after to the first day of classes for the semester for which the change is being requested. All questions on the application must be answered and all supporting documentation must be attached. The documentation should be in the form of photocopies, as all information becomes the property of the University of Kansas. These are confidential records and are maintained in accordance with the University of Kansas Student Records Policy. In reviewing the application, the Office of the University Registrar will consider each individual situation as presented and assess it in relation to pertinent Kansas statutes and Board of Regents regulations. Once a decision has been made, the student will be notified in writing. The decision may be appealed. Appeals Procedure Students whose application for resident status has been denied may appeal the decision. An Appeal Form must be submitted no later than thirty calendar days after the decision has been made. To request an additional form, please email registrar ku. The Residency Appeals Committee reviews appeals of resident classification. The decision of the Residency Appeals Committee is the final determination made by the University of Kansas. International Students International students who are not citizens of the United States must meet the same criteria as a citizen in order to gain resident classification. However, intent to remain indefinitely in the state of Kansas, and the United States, generally cannot be demonstrated unless the student possesses Permanent Resident Alien status and has been in that status for twelve months prior to the first day of classes. Marriage to a U. Tuition and Fee Waivers Students who meet certain categories of criteria are eligible for tuition assessments equal to resident rates when authorized by the Kansas legislature and the Kansas Board of Regents. These privileges do not change a non-resident classification. Certain American Indians deemed residents of state for purpose of tuition and fees. Any person who is attending or who has attended Haskell University shall be deemed to be a resident of this state for the purpose of tuition and fees for attendance at any state educational institution under the state board of regents. The student needs to submit an official transcript or official enrollment verification to the Office of the University Registrar no later than 30 calendar days into the semester in which the change is being requested.
