About Praising God By Betty Miller One of the most important keys that will make it possible for us to walk in kingdom living is our expression of praise. Praise is the will of God, and heaven overflows with it. And a voice came out of the throne, saying, Praise our God, all ye his servants, and ye that fear him, both small and great. And I heard as it were the voice of a great multitude, and as the voice of many waters, and as the voice of mighty thunderings, saying, Alleluia: Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honor to him: In 1 Thessalonians 5: In every thing give thanks: This verse does not mean that we are to thank God for bad things and tragedies that come our way. It means that we are to remain joyful no matter what is happening in our lives because we have the Lord, and in Him we shall overcome no matter what the devil is trying to do to us. The Lord does not want us to thank Him for the bad things that happen to us because He did not send them. He is not the author of evil. It is the will of God for us to rejoice no matter what comes. It is not the will of God to receive evil things as from Him. It is an insult to God to thank Him for accidents, sickness, tragedy, etc. He does not send those things to us, the devil does. We are told to resist the devil, and submit to God James 4: Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. If he can get people to believe it is from the Lord, he has an easier time convincing them of his next lie, that God has failed them and deserted them. He just attacks different areas to get at different people. Our prayers should be in an attitude of praise even in the midst of our trials. Show me what I need to do, Lord. Show me the door that I have opened to the enemy. I resist him in the name of Jesus, and I command him to leave with all of his oppression and attacks. Jesus, You are the Lord of my life, and I submit to You and will never deny You no matter what happens. They begin to question God and even become mad at Him. We can even open the door for the enemy to come against us by not having a cheerful and rejoicing heart. We may complain and gripe to God about our plight in life instead of using the weapons He has given us to overcome the devil. One of the greatest weapons is our weapon of praise. Sacrifice of Praise David in writing the Psalms expresses many praises to the Lord. Psalm 34 is a typical psalm of praise: I will bless the Lord at all times: My soul shall make her boast in the Lord: O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord, and he heard me, and delivered me from all my fears. We are to bless Him when things go wrong, too. We are to boast in the Lord even when all looks bleak. I trust You, Lord, no matter what I see with my natural eyes. I am looking through the eyes of faith, and I believe You are sending my answer. I love You, Lord, no matter what happens. If we wait until we feel like praising God, we may never do it. Our spirits desire to praise God because of His nature in us. However, the soulish part of us resists that desire, until our carnal minds have been completely renewed in this area. That is why it is important to go ahead and praise God to a point beyond our soulish feelings until we press on into the spirit. We will then sense a real joy, and praise will come forth. Psalm is a wonderful praise psalm: Bless the Lord, O my soul: Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: The Lord executeth righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed. What kind of benefits do we receive from the Lord? He forgives our sins, heals all our diseases, shows us His love and kindness, is merciful toward us, gives us good things to eat, restores our youth and strength, delivers us from oppression and judges us righteously. We have so much to praise God about because He is a wonderful and loving Father! Healing and Deliverance Through Praise Praise is a wonderful method we can use to bring healing and deliverance to our souls and bodies! Many people are depressed today; one of the quickest ways to receive deliverance from depression is to praise God. We must make our souls bless the Lord when we are not feeling well. It will bring liberation and healing. I will extol thee, O Lord; for thou hast lifted me up, and hast not made my foes to rejoice over me. O Lord my God, I cried unto thee, and thou hast healed me. O Lord, thou hast brought up my soul from the grave: Sing unto the Lord, O ye saints of his, and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness. Singing praises can bring us up out of that pit. Music plays an important part in a worship service and we have all experienced how our hearts have been lifted by singing and worshipping in church. We do not have to wait until we go to a service to receive this

same benefit. We can worship out of our hearts wherever we are. They sang and praised God, and the Lord did their battling for them. They won the battle without a sword even being drawn. And when he had consulted with the people, he appointed singers unto the Lord, and that should praise the beauty of holiness, as they went out before the army, and to say, Praise the Lord; for his mercy endureth forever. And when they began to sing and to praise, the Lord set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah; and they were smitten. It can also be helpful to listen to gospel music when we are fighting a spiritual battle. It will liberate our spirits, too. When we praise and bless God, we find that other people around us respond to that spirit of praise also. Conversely, when we complain and grumble, we exude that kind of spirit and drive people away from us because no one wants to be around a pessimist. Lonely people filled with self-pity have not found the key of praise in their lives. They lack the joy of the Lord and do not make good companions. As we rejoice in God, we spread a spirit of joy to others. If we complain about things, it works against us. No one wants to be around someone who causes them also to get into a bad mood. Let us all bless and praise God and conquer the enemy in this important area. The overcomers in the book of Revelation are praisers, and they sing a new song before the throne. The hundred forty-four thousand seen here are representatives of the tribes of Israel. One of these tribes is the tribe of Judah. Praise is a heavenly characteristic, and if we are to be overcomers, we too will strive to possess this quality. That is, praise that is based on true accomplishment. In this way, we support the growth of intrinsic motivation and inspire our students to greater accomplishment. Which is not only confusing to students, but it strips your praise of any real meaning. How you give praise can also have an effect on its power and impact. What follows are three such examples. The wordless fist bump. Often, the less overt and demonstrative your praise, the more meaningful it will be. There is power in acknowledging true accomplishment with the smallest, simplest gesture. It gives it a weightiness and significance, as if the work or improvement is too sacred to make a big deal out of. This is the idea behind the wordless fist bump. Let them revel in it a beat or two before inserting yourself into the narrative. When the time feels right, approach calmly and, while making eye contact, hold out your fist so they have to reach to bump it. Then move on quickly without waiting for further response. When the student knows what prompted your praise, there is no reason to say anything at all. Although smiling is perfectly okay, a more determined look can sometimes give the moment that secret sauce that shakes them down to their shoes. The smile and nod from across the room. I love leaving notes for students. I have former students who still have notes I wrote to them more than 20 years ago. The key is to use special stationery post-its are a no-no and write in your most careful, delicate handwriting. Fold it crisply, secure it privately with a piece of tape, and speak from the heart. Make your words direct, specific, and keep exclamations and smiley faces to a minimum. Again, the lack of frivolity adds depth and dignity to the gesture. The more meaningful and cherished it is to the student, the more it will rev their intrinsic motivational engine. I love your essay! Which is a powerful thing. Noticing improvement, hard work, or success beyond what your students have done before, and simply noting itâ€”the pure truth of itâ€”can be profoundly meaningful to them. But it takes a keen eye, a soft touch, and a willingness to hold back, just a little, in order to create the perfect moment. Eusebius McKaiser 10 Oct There is something awkwardly religious about politicians seeking our forgiveness, a kind of plea to be absolved of their political sins. The problem is that he cannot be forgiven without full disclosure of how we have been wronged. All we know is that Nene popped into the Saxonwold Shebeen for a cup of tea, or possibly six cups of tea. But why would you want the nation to forgive you for such a minor infraction? Some relate to what happened when he was chairperson of the Public Investment Corporation PIC, an important institution that is meant to look after public money, including by making prudent investment decisions. There are also questions to be answered regarding what the meetings with the Guptas were about. In fact, we can now reasonably even speculate about how Nene became minister of finance in the first instance. Was he captured by the Guptas? Did he do their bidding? Did they ask his former political boss to appoint him? And what happened during his tenure as deputy finance minister when he also had oversight of the PIC? Did Nene Jr deal with the Guptas? He does not deserve forgiveness unless there is a full disclosure about these and related questions. Besides these questions, there are several lessons that we, as voters and active citizens, need to learn. First, it is important to adopt healthy scepticism € not to be confused with cynicism € when it comes to politicians. We should never assume a politician is wholly virtuous or incapable of wrongdoing. We are a country desperate for heroes and this sometimes leads us to lower our critical faculties when it comes to politicians whom we have decided are not capable of being corrupted. There is nothing praiseworthy about doing your job. Admittedly, we have become so used to politicians looting or ignoring public interest and their constitutional duties that we want to give someone an award for simply doing what they should be doing. That is what he was appointed to do. There is nothing extraordinary about a minister getting on with his job. And, yes, I understand the context in which the temptation to praise him arises. In the context of rampant corruption and a captured state, this kind of pedestrian job performance seems praiseworthy. But we dare not lower our expectations of civil servants and their political principals. The leadership bar must be set higher than that. The same goes for the act of resigning. It was the right thing to do, and could even have come sooner. What else did he lie about? What else did he not disclose to President Cyril Ramaphosa or to us citizens? Why did he choose silence for so long while you and I were coming to grips with the details of the shadow state and the subversion of our constitutional democracy? It is mind-boggling that some people are tempted to give Nene a round of applause. That tells us a lot about our desperate need to hold on to our belief that some people are virtuous. Second, this brings me to a lesson we need to learn about the dichotomy between good and bad. We think that we can neatly divide politicians into good and bad people. Sometimes bad people can do good things. For example, it is very possible that Nene was already captured € we will have to wait for further investigations to run their course € by the time he refused to sign the Russian deal. The Russian deal may well not have been convenient for some people Nene was connected to. My point is that imputing an honourable motive to Nene for refusing to sign the deal is, at this stage, a little hasty. He did the right thing. We are yet to learn whether he did the right thing for the right reasons. Time € and investigations € will tell. Do not forget that it is not only the Russians but also the Chinese who are interested in getting their proboscises into the South African state. All the pieces of the state capture puzzle are not yet in place. Third, we need to learn a lesson about the centrality of political accountability. Our democracy will not survive if we do not have a culture of entrenched political accountability. We did well to design oversight mechanisms at the dawn of democracy. These include the Chapter Nine oversight bodies, legislation to protect whistle-blowers, robust and independent media, multiparty democracy and a judiciary that does its work without fear or favour. We cannot be glib about these features of our democracy that act as a bulwark against the abuse of power. But, despite them, we endured a shadow state for a long time. That tells us, although formal accountability mechanisms matter, there is ultimately no substitute for a culture of accountability. It must be part of the political fabric of democracy. If you have a culture of political accountability then, for

example, political resignations will not strike you as praiseworthy but as necessary. You will then regard the politician who resigns when exposed for a lie as a pariah rather than a hero. We need to grapple with the question of how we can deepen political accountability beyond the formal mechanisms we built into our democracy in Nene is not the only person who needs to go. There is a bunch of constitutional delinquents in his Cabinet who serve at his behest.
