Quebec Those of you who research in Quebec know that religious records play a much more important role here than in the other provinces. It comes as no surprise that Quebec has the largest Catholic population in Canada. You can also browse the over 1 million images by town, and then parish. This collection not only has Catholic records, but the many forms of Protestant, Othodox, and some Jewish records as well. It covers the years Also on Ancestry is the Tanguay Collection. It is a little cumbersome to navigate, but can help you to fill in gaps. Please note however, that the Tanguay Collection has been known to contain errors. You should look at it as more of a guiding tool, than as absolute proof for the life event. They also have many smaller collections that cover various areas and years. There are both Catholic and Protestant records here. Some of their collections are free, while some you need to pay. Along with many other genealogical record sets, they also have records for both Catholic and non Catholic parishes. Some collections are online, while some are not. The majority of the site is in French, but they do have an English link, and your internet browser should be able to translate as well. Library and Archives Canada also has some religious records available that pertain to Quebec. Ontario Now while Quebec has always been predominately Catholic, Ontario on the other hand has from the outset been a stronghold for the Protestant faiths. As they themselves stated, it was a hard task to complete, and may be prone to errors. I found a baptism for one of my step brothers that took place in Ottawa in in this collection. The Registration Act of required that all clergy report marriages to the government within 30 days of the event. The registers cover the years , and are mostly Baptist, Presbyterian and Methodist marriages. As with any transcription, you should use these as a guide to finding the original record. There are links to the various collections that will help you to research your Metis lines. The OGS has many branches across Ontario. Each branch has put out publications on transcriptions of church records. Smith was taken sick with la grippa a week before her death and they started at once to break it up, but to no avail, and on Friday morning pneumonia set in and she continued to grow worse till death summoned her on Sunday morning at 4: The news came as a severe shock as few knew of her serious illness. Alvira Nickerson was born at Bethany, Mo. She was married to William L. To this union were born six children, two having died in infancy, and four survive three daughters and one son are left with the husband to mourn the loss of a kind mother and devoted wife. Besides her own family she is survived by five brothers, and two sisters, and an aged father and mother. All were present at the funeral except two sisters, Mrs. Dennis Schaffer of Fowler, Colorado and Mrs. George Yonker of Hayes County, the latter being sick in bed from the sudden shock. Ernest and Harry Smith brothers-in-law of Mrs. Smith came from Edgar to attend the funeral. Let us gather up the elements of the life of the departed one and weave of them a picture for the walls of memory. Her life was a rare jewel. She was ever ready to lend a helping hand in time of need - both in acts of kindness and in words. She ran the journey of life in about thirty-eight years. It is a path marked with kindness and cheer. She was a very faithful member of the Royal Highlanders in which order she carried one thousand dollars insurance. The order had charge of the burial ceremonies. Kinsinger and Quigley rendered several very beautiful songs. It was one of the largest attended funerals ever held in Hayes Center, the capacity of the church was inadequate to all who had come to pay their last respects to the departed. She was laid to rest in the silent city on the hill. The floral wreath of carnations and lilies was furnished by the Royal Highlander lodge. Well may her relatives cherish her memory as a precious legacy and we would fain to say a word of comfort to the stricken ones, we can but let our tears flow in sympathy with theirs and paint them to the promise. No sweeter memory can live in any heart than the memory of their untiring devotion to the dear one who has just departed. The waves of sorrow break upon our every shore, and we cannot but hope that friends as true may gather around each one of them should sorrow invade their homes. To the broken hearted mother and sorrowing brothers we extend the sympathy of one who highly honored him. Funeral services were held at the home on Sunday afternoon. Sister Orcott delivering a very impressive sermon and interment took place at the cemetery on the Ridge where he was laid to rest beside his father. May the Lord bless you all and spare you such sorrow is our sincere wish. Ready and Jas Clark left for Riverton the same evening. A telegram was received here Monday morning that the old gentleman had died. Frank Roe took Jas and Dick Ready to McCook the same evening where they boarded a train to be present at the funeral of their father. Ready was well known to the most of our citizens who will learn of his death with regret. For months the deceased had been a patient sufferer with a malady that baffled the best medical skill. The writer had known the deceased but two short years, and yet in that time we had learned to admire him for certain rugged traits of character which he possessed. His was a determined and unflinchable course along lines he held to be just and right. In the battles for the uplifting of humanity, he was always found in the front ranks.
