Selection Procedure Applications for scholarship assistance received by individual chapters of Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. Application files determined worthy of further consideration are forwarded to the Tuskegee Airmen Scholarship Selection Committee for National Competition. A scholarship selection committee, composed of several members from each Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. Region, evaluates individual applications. Using a scale of one hundred points, the committee considers academic achievement, extra curricular and community activities, relative financial need, recommendations, and both essays to competitively rank applicants. Award Payment Certification Scholarship awardees may enroll in the institution of their choice. When the required verification have been received, individual award payments, made payable to the student or parent, will be mailed by Wells Fargo Bank, Los Angeles. What he cared about was, "Will this plane get me up, let me do my job, and get me home safely? Tuskegee Airman Howard Baugh, Lt. Michael Hoyes talk about the differences in fighter technology. He talks to the ground crew and some Air Force fighter pilots and recounts what it was like to fly high-altitude, long-range bomber support missions. The NACA tested the P in its full-scale wind tunnel to extract the best performance from the new fighter design. Though the cockpits were essentially the same, he knew the P was a different kind of bird when he strapped in for the first time in Italy in the summer of But the first thing I noticed about the P was its huge 4-blade propeller. Of course, we had to steer our planes down the runway using the tail wheel. The plane always wanted to jump into the sky and it was hard to keep the tail wheel down. If the tail of the plane came up too early, you could lose control and the plane would run off the runway. It could climb faster and had much more torque," he remembers. It really kept you on your toes. But its performance was great. Most of our missions were flown at twenty-five to thirty-five thousand feet. Somehow, some of the flak still managed to find us. I had my plane as high as thirty-eight thousand feet. It still flew just great. One thousand Airmen were trained at Tuskegee, Ala. They painted the tails of their aircraft red for easy identification, thus earning the nickname "Red Tails. They never lost a bomber to enemy fighters - a record no other fighter group achieved.

While residents are welcome to park and use private vehicles and RVs at the Homes, in-house transportation is offered to local hospitals, military commissaries, exchanges and shopping. Complete eligibility rules for entrance to the Armed Forces Retirement Home can be found at www. Career military personnel have priority. Enlisted, Warrant Officers, and Limited Duty Officers with a minimum of twenty years of service at age 60, veterans incapable of earning a livelihood because of a service-connected disability incurred in the line of duty, veterans who served in a War Zone or Hostile Fire Zone and are later found to be incapable of earning a livelihood, and women veterans who served before 12 June , may be eligible. Individual members of the profession of arms are distinguished from those of other professions by the "unlimited liability" they assume in their oaths of office. While members of some professions engage in dangerous tasks daily, only members of the Armed Forces can be ordered to place their lives in peril anywhere at any time. The obligations they undertake, risking life and well-being for the greater good, are in many ways extraordinary. In , he wrote to all the regiments in the active army, asking for information on fines and forfeitures from Courts Martial. Congress

noted that "it does not ask for any contribution from the Treasury. Scott of larceny under Art. Quality of life During the 19th and most of the 20th centuries the U. Naval Home and the U. The asylum will provide a chaplain and medical care, living quarters, clothing, and food similar to a naval ration at sea , except that the "grog" ration would be replaced by tea, tobacco and pickles. The inmates would surrender any disability Navy pension to the home. They would also work at the asylum "as much as they are able". The inmates would be subject to "all the laws and rules of the naval service" and "shall be under the general government of the officers placed over them". Disabled or wounded veterans from the War of forward would be admitted. US Marines who served in Mexico and were otherwise qualified by wound or disability would be admitted. The rules at the U. Inmates would surrender any disability pension, work when able, and obey the orders of those appointed above them. Like the sailors, they were "paid" a dollar a month for spending money. The inmates referred to this as "the monthly dollar". General David Twiggs wrote that as soon as the men got their dollar they got drunk and stayed drunk until their money was gone, usually a week later, "as whiskey of a sort could be gotten for a ten cents a quart". Riggs, at the Naval Asylum, on Thursday evening. Foote later became Commodore Foote and worked closely with U. Grant at the Battle of Fort Donaldson. Alcohol was involved in the fight. White men and black men were living and working together at the Home. Reportâ€”Old Soldiers Home [There is a] known lack here of all occupation or recreation The old men well know on entering the Home that they will have literally nothing to do more than to sit around, smoke their pipes, and wait for their time to come. After two failures, men were disallowed reentry to the home. Today applicants with an alcoholic history must show evidence of a long period without alcohol. The homes have open bars that sell beer and hard liquor, but "public intoxication" is prohibited. The smoking of tobacco inside buildings on the grounds of the homes is prohibited. Outside smoking is allowed. For example, residents run the home libraries under the supervision of a professional Librarian. Many positions, such as the wood shop and bicycle shop, are run entirely by residents. Below are recreational activities available without cost: Washington Nine-hole golf course and driving range carts provided for residents , two fishing ponds for crappie, bass, bream and catfish, professionally equipped fitness center and physical fitness programs, walking trails, two extensive print, audio and video libraries, individual work areas for ceramics, woodworking, painting and other hobbies, auto hobby shop, bowling, card, game, and recreation rooms, computer center, garden plots, fully equipped seat theater for movies and live entertainment, bus tours to area attractions.
