This ennobled branch of the House of Howard stems from the noted naval commander and politician Lord William Howard , senior son of Thomas Howard, 2nd Duke of Norfolk from his second marriage to Agnes Tylney. His successor son was better known to history as Charles Howard, 1st Earl of Nottingham , after being granted that title in He was Lord High Admiral from to and served as commander-in-chief of the English fleet against the Spanish Armada in He predeceased his father relatively young so is not considered to have succeeded as third Baron Howard of Effingham. He was childless and was succeeded by his half-brother, the third Earl. On his death in the earldom became extinct. The barony descended to the most senior male first cousin twice removed downwards , who became the fifth Lord Howard. He was the great-grandson of Sir William Howard d. His eldest son, the sixth Baron, died childless and was succeeded by his younger brother, the seventh Baron. He was a prominent military commander. His grandson, the third Earl, served under William Pitt the Younger as Master of the Mint from to and was Governor of Jamaica from to He died childless and was succeeded by his younger brother, the fourth Earl. The barony descended to a third cousin, the eleventh Baron. Lord Howard of Effingham was a General in the Army. He represented Shaftesbury in Parliament as a Whig from to The titles descended from father to son until the death of his grandson, the fourth Earl, in He never married and was succeeded by his first cousin, the fifth Earl. He was the son of Captain the Hon. Frederick Charles Howard “ , second son of the second Earl. His eldest son, the sixth Earl, died childless in He was succeeded by his nephew David, the seventh Earl and as of present holder of the titles. He is the son of the Hon. An offshoot of a great and numerous family whose destiny intertwined with that of England, the Howards of Surrey County were Anglicans who were neither as wealthy, politically potent, nor as notorious as their distant relatives, the Catholic Howards of Norfolk County. His parents enjoyed the prosperous existence of the well-connected rural gentry, which assured him and his younger siblings a comfortable rise to adulthood. Howard matriculated at Magdalen College, University of Oxford, in , but like many young gentlemen of the time he did not pursue serious scholarship. He remained for one year, making valuable acquaintances that could advance him in later years. He soon thereafter became a justice of the peace for the county and a deputy to the lord lieutenant. Although the wedding was a marriage of convenience that linked two gentry families in a time-honored way, the marriage turned into a deeply loving one, and he was a doting father to their five daughters and three sons, of whom one daughter and two sons survived to adulthood. King Charles II Howard might have remained in obscurity but for the death on April 26, , of his cousin Charles Howard, third earl of Nottingham and fourth baron Howard of Effingham, which left him heir to the barony of Effingham. As a new baron, Effingham received little in the way of additional land or income, but he gained a visible presence at court. Virginia Aerial View of Jamestown Effingham jumped at the prospect. When he sailed for Jamestown late in November he left behind his children and his wife, who was recovering from the recent birth of their eighth child. They greeted the new governor with a mixture of caution and hope. Nothing deterred himâ€™not the fierce opposition of the House of Burgesses, not repeated bouts of kidney stones that nearly killed him, not even the death of his beloved wife, who joined him in Virginia in the autumn of and died on August 13, Effingham gave his royal masters what they wanted most, a diminished General Assembly and the return of the office of governor-general to its central place in colonial administration. Following a prolonged struggle Effingham disqualified one of the leaders of the resistance, Robert Beverley , from serving in any public office. He also dismissed another of the resistance leaders, Philip Ludwell , as a member of the Council of State. In Effingham seized an opportunity to appoint the clerk of the House of Burgesses, depriving the legislators of the appointment of their own clerk. Later Years Ill health afflicted Effingham throughout the five years he resided in Virginia. He vacationed in New York in the summer of prior to attending a major conference with the Iroquois at Albany and again in the summer of before another conference with the Iroquois at the same place. His poor health compelled Effingham to return to England early in Effingham took his seat in the House of Lords on May 3, , and was reappointed governor by the new king and queen in They had no children. His marriage and his physical condition worked against his return to Virginia, which explained his willingness to accept the appointment of Francis Nicholson as lieutenant governor to preside in Jamestown during his absence. Effingham resigned his commission by February Dogged by illness, Effingham signed a new will on December 20, , and died on March 30, He remains for one year and does not take a degree. They will have five daughters and three sons, of whom one daughter and two sons will survive to adulthood. April 26, - Charles Howard, third earl of Nottingham and fourth baron Howard of Effingham, dies. His heir is Francis Howard, who becomes the fifth baron Howard of Effingham. February 10, - The newly appointed royal governor, Francis Howard, fifth baron Howard of Effingham, arrives in Virginia, his ship anchoring in the York River. They will have no children. June 3, - Francis Nicholson is appointed lieutenant governor of Virginia, where he will govern in the absence of Governor Francis Howard, baron Howard of Effingham. February - Francis Howard, fifth baron Howard of Effingham, resigns his royal commission as governor of Virginia. December 20, - Francis Howard, fifth baron Howard of Effingham, signs a new will. March 30, - Francis Howard, fifth baron Howard of Effingham, dies.
