She continued at the newspaper until , when she moved to Richmond, Virginia with her first husband, Charles Cornwell married in , who enrolled at the Union Theological Seminary. Her initial book would never take off, but while working for the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, and also the Richmond Police Department, as well as a chance meeting with Dr Marcella Farinelli Fierro, she would eventually get to writing the first book in the Dr Kay Scarpetta series of books, Postmortem, which was eventually published in , after a string of rejections for three other novels she had written. Cornwell based the story on a real-life case which had occurred in Richmond three years prior to the publication of Postmortem. Between the years of and , Cornwell wrote one book in the Dr Kay Scarpetta series a year, with The Last Precinct the 12th book in the series published in . She then picked up the Kay Scarpetta series again in , with the publication of Blow Fly, and then again wrote one book per year in the series, except for , which was the year At Risk was published, the first book in her Win Garano series.
