Anybody familiar with Picasso will identify many familiar aspects in this work: I personally have had several opportunities to view this masterpiece in the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. A direct encounter with this Picasso is both astounding and humbling. Instead, he took his own work as the center of the creative universe. And, along with his drawing, Claude has such a calm, inward focus, as if his sketch is an extension of his confidence and tenderness. My sense is Claude can represent Picasso returning to his own youthful vision of what it means to be a creative artist. The pure, white, empty space contrasts with the rest of the picture and is also its prime subject. The trick is made plausible purely by the painted shirt, shorts and boots. Sculpture such as this is not intended as a mimetic representation of reality; rather, it sets out to play with the basics of visual experience. And deception is the fundamental principle of this art. With this sculpture, through his visual genius and creative magic, Picasso captures the very essence of fluid movement in an accomplished player on the field. Picasso is showing us his power. He can make a world out of nothing. Hence, for instance, the new graphic works which, when successful, articulated lifelong fascinations in a succinct and impeccably judged manner. All of the etchings are precise records of carefully-observed scenes, using just a few dabs and strokes, quickly but perfectly done. What is left unpainted speaks with such subtle power. At core he was an intellectual artist. In a real sense, Picasso transferred ideas into art, and created unified harmonies of idea and artwork, form and content, which are fundamentally traditional in nature and highlights his classical character. I know, I know. He gave a new vitality to art even as he preserved the creative presence outside the museums of its history. For this reason he became the pre-eminent figure in 20th-century art. In his austere use of colour and sometimes doleful subject matter – prostitutes and beggars are frequent subjects – Picasso was influenced by a trip through Spain and by the suicide of his friend Carlos Casagemas. Starting in autumn of he painted several posthumous portraits of Casagemas, culminating in the gloomy allegorical painting *La Vie*, now in the Cleveland Museum of Art. The Rose Period [27] is characterized by a lighter tone and style utilizing orange and pink colours, and featuring many circus people, acrobats and harlequins known in France as saltimbanques. The harlequin, a comedic character usually depicted in checkered patterned clothing, became a personal symbol for Picasso. Picasso met Fernande Olivier, a bohemian artist who became his mistress, in Paris in . The generally upbeat and optimistic mood of paintings in this period is reminiscent of the – period i. When someone commented that Stein did not look like her portrait, Picasso replied, "She will". Their older brother Michael Stein and his wife Sarah also became collectors of his work. Picasso painted portraits of both Gertrude Stein and her nephew Allan Stein. Eventually Leo Stein moved to Italy. Kahnweiler was a German art historian and art collector who became one of the premier French art dealers of the 20th century. He was among the first champions of Pablo Picasso, Georges Braque and the Cubism that they jointly developed. Formal ideas developed during this period lead directly into the Cubist period that follows. Both artists took apart objects and "analyzed" them in terms of their shapes. In , Picasso was arrested and questioned about the theft of the *Mona Lisa* from the Louvre. Apollinaire in turn implicated his close friend Picasso, who had also purchased stolen artworks from the artist in the past. Afraid of a conviction that could result in his deportation to Spain, Picasso denied having ever met Apollinaire. Between and , Picasso began a series of paintings depicting highly geometric and minimalist Cubist objects, consisting of either a pipe, a guitar or a glass, with an occasional element of collage. Maurice Raynal suggested "Crystal Cubism". Picasso included declarations of his love for Eva in many Cubist works. Picasso was devastated by her premature death from illness at the age of 30 in . Braque and Derain were mobilized and Apollinaire joined the French artillery, while the Spaniard Juan Gris remained from the Cubist circle. During the war, Picasso was able to continue painting uninterrupted, unlike his French comrades. His paintings became more sombre and his life changed with dramatic consequences. During the spring of , Apollinaire returned from the front wounded. They renewed their friendship, but Picasso began to frequent new social circles. As part of his first duties, Rosenberg agreed to rent the couple an apartment in Paris at his own expense, which was located next to his own house. This was the start of a deep brother-like friendship between two very different men, that would last until the outbreak of World War II. Khokhlova introduced Picasso to high society, formal dinner parties, and other dimensions of the life of the rich in s Paris. The two had a son, Paulo Picasso, [42] who would grow up to be a motorcycle racer and chauffeur to his father. Picasso took the opportunity to make several drawings of the composer. *Les Demoiselles* was reproduced for the first time in Europe in the same issue. He did at the time develop new imagery and formal syntax for expressing himself emotionally, "releasing the violence, the psychic fears and the eroticism that had been largely contained or sublimated since ", writes art historian Melissa McQuillan. This large canvas embodies for many the inhumanity, brutality and hopelessness of war. Otherwise it would be better if he wrote them out in so many words! The public who look at the picture must interpret the symbols as they understand them. After the victory of Francisco Franco in Spain, the painting was sent to the United States to raise funds and support for Spanish refugees. This exhibition lionized the artist, brought into full public view in America the scope of his artistry, and resulted in a reinterpretation of his work by contemporary art historians and scholars. He was often harassed by the Gestapo. During one search of his apartment, an officer saw a photograph of the painting *Guernica*. Between and he wrote over poems. Largely untitled except for a date and sometimes the location of where it was written for example "Paris 16 May ", these works were gustatory, erotic and at times

scatological, as were his two full-length plays *Desire Caught by the Tail* and *The Four Little Girls*. She was 40 years younger than he was. Picasso grew tired of his mistress Dora Maar ; Picasso and Gilot began to live together. Eventually they had two children: Claude Picasso , born in and Paloma Picasso , born in . In her book *Life with Picasso*, [57] Gilot describes his abusive treatment and myriad infidelities which led her to leave him, taking the children with her. This was a severe blow to Picasso.

A week after the exhibition opened, they were removed and returned. As a replacement, Picasso loaned works from his own collection, including a Portrait of Madam Z. Death of Henri Matisse. The exhibition later transferred to Munich, Cologne and Hamburg, until April Picasso bought a large villa in Cannes, La Californie, built in The artist celebrated his 75th anniversary at the Galerie Madoura with the potters from Vallauris. In Moscow, Ilya Ehrenburg organised an exhibition of works belonging to Russian collections. Started a series of sculptures assembled from pieces of recovered wood. Pen, brush and Indian ink on vellum writing paper, 27 x 21 cm. Started to produce linocuts. Vallauris Chapel, decorated with the murals War and Peace, was officially inaugurated and the place was converted into a national museum. Produced linoleum cuts on Mediterranean subjects. Picasso married Jacqueline Roque in Vallauris at an intimate wedding. They moved to Mougins in June. Celebrated his 80th birthday in Vallauris. Picasso awarded the Lenin Peace Prize for the second time. Continued to produce his sheet metal busts. Produced some 70 portraits of Jacqueline using different techniques including painting, drawing, pottery and engraving. The artist started the prolific series of the Painter and His Model, which he continued throughout the year. Death of Georges Braque. Death of Jean Cocteau. Picasso began a very close collaboration with brothers Aldo and Piero Crommelynck, who moved their intaglio studio to Mougins, to produce etchings. The final version, made of steel and measuring 20 metres tall, was inaugurated in Introduced new themes into his painting: In November, the artist underwent surgery for an ulcer at the American Hospital in Neuilly and spent his last time in Paris. Series of black and colour illustrations in a notebook MP featuring figures, erotic drawings and burlesque scenes, or graphically commenting on the large Ingres painting Jupiter and Thetis. The exhibition unveiled a number of sculptures produced by the artist to the general public.
