The diverse research interests of our faculty are reflected directly in our educational programs. We jointly offer with our colleagues in The Henry Samueli School of Engineering an undergraduate degree in Computer Science and Engineering, as well as the graduate program in Networked Systems. Our department collaborates with many other institutions in the United States and abroad, and its doors are always open to a multitude of visitors and collaborators from all corners of the globe. Undergraduate Major in Computer Science The Computer Science major emphasizes the principles of computing that underlie our modern world, and provides a strong foundational education to prepare students for the broad spectrum of careers in computing. This major can serve as preparation for either graduate study or a career in industry. Students receive a solid background in low-level architecture and systems; middle-level infrastructure, algorithms, and mathematical foundations. This is a highly flexible degree that allows students to explore a broad range of topics in modern computing. In order to achieve some focus in their upper-division studies, students are required to satisfy the requirements for one of the nine specializations described below. This specialization focuses on fundamental computational techniques, including their analysis and applications to topics in computer vision, computer games, graphics, artificial intelligence, and information retrieval. Topics include data structures, graph and network algorithms, computational geometry, probabilistic algorithms, complexity theory, and cryptography. Architecture and Embedded Systems. Students in this specialization will build upon a strong foundation in software and hardware and learn how to design networked embedded systems, and efficient computer architectures for a diverse set of application domains such as gaming, visualization, search, databases, transaction processing, data mining, and high-performance and scientific computing. This specialization introduces students to the interdisciplinary intersection of biology and medicine with computer science and information technology. Students who complete the specialization will understand biomedical computing problems from the computer science perspectives, and be able to design and develop software that solves computational problems in biology and medicine. This specialization allows students to acquire a well-rounded knowledge of computer science that may be tailored to their individual interests. Students choose 11 upper-division computer science courses, including two project courses. This specialization will appeal to those who are interested in a broad education in computer science, or who wish to create their own unique specialization not found in the current list of other specializations under this major. This specialization is intended to prepare students for working with and developing a wide variety of modern data and information systems. Topics covered by this concentration include database management, information retrieval, Web search, data mining, and data-intensive computing. This specialization will introduce students to the principles underlying intelligent systems, including topics such as representing human knowledge, building automated reasoning systems, developing intelligent search techniques, and designing algorithms that adapt and learn from data. Students in this specialization will use these principles to solve problems across a variety of applications such as computer vision, information retrieval, data mining, automated recommender systems, bioinformatics, as well as individually designed projects. This specialization focuses on Internet architecture, Internet applications, and network security. It also encourages students to learn about operating systems, databases, search, programming, embedded systems, and performance. This specialization deals with principles and design of systems and software. It emphasizes the interaction between software and the computing infrastructure on which it runs and the performance impact of design decisions. Elective topics include networking, security, graphics, and databases. This specialization encompasses the digital capture, processing, synthesis and display of visual data such as images and video. This specialization includes computer vision, image processing, and graphics, and covers such topics as the representation of 3D objects,

visual recognition of objects and people, interactive and photo-realistic image rendering, and physics and perception of light and color. The Department also offers a joint undergraduate degree in Computer Science and Engineering, in conjunction with The Henry Samueli School of Engineering; information is available in the Interdisciplinary Studies section of the Catalogue. See the Undergraduate Admissions section. Junior-level applicants who satisfactorily complete course requirements will be given preference for admission. Applicants must satisfy the following minimum requirements. Have a cumulative GPA of 3. One year of computer programming courses in an object-oriented or higher-level programming language. Introduction to computer science courses do not meet this requirement. One course in advanced data structures One course in machine organization and assembly language both topics must be covered One course in software engineering One course in discrete mathematics One course in Boolean algebra One course in linear algebra NOTES: Additional computer science courses beyond the two required are strongly recommended, particularly those that align with the major of interest. Guide to Manuscript Materials: This record book contains lists of the baptized children, members, probations, pastors, stewards and leaders meetings, stewards, presiding elders, missionaries and sextons. The list includes death dates of members, members who were expelled, withdrew or were removed. There are a number of missing pages. This is a collection of funeral home and cemetery records from Hamblen County, Tennessee. Item one consists of records from the St. Paul Presbyterian Church, including Clerks of Session, April 11, ; Elders, ; Deacons, ; Trustees; ; Membership list ; and, a cemetery survey of St. Item two contains records of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Dover, which was organized December 12, and date to January 25, Records date from to January 7, John Terrill Majors Papers, Addition, John Terrill Majors Papers, Addition, , primarily consists of correspondence, photographs, scrapbooks, and various football-related items from the University of Tennessee and the University of Pittsburgh. A large portion of the collection is letters from fans during his tenure as head football coach at the University of Tennessee. The collection contains numerous photographs of Majors, focusing on the years , as well as numerous football related materials such as programs, plays, media guides, and game day materials. There are no restrictions on this collection. Camp Scrapbook, Grainger County, Tennessee, []- It was started as a New Deal program in the s, utilizing the C. Land was purchased in Grainger County to develop a C. Camp in with plans to create a game propagation program. The facilities included quail and wild turkey hatcheries, a brooder building, and growing pens. This collection includes newspaper clippings, photographs, correspondence and several newsletters. In the scrapbook, some of the captions were written in ink that has faded, making them difficult to read. One-volume diary containing entries by Edward Dudley Tarpley and his son, Thomas. He was born September 21, , in Rutherford County, Tennessee. The family moved to a farm in northwestern Bedford County the following year. Edward worked on the family farm and as a dry goods clerk for his brother-in-law, J. Edward returned home from the Kansas Territory in November Except for two extended journeys, Edward remained in Bedford County until From November to March , he worked in Mississippi building a cotton gin. He also spent April and May visiting relatives in West Tennessee. From there, he traveled north by boat to Jefferson City, Texas. Throughout the spring and summer, he trekked by steer wagon and stagecoach to Texas, stopping along the way to visit friends and family. He began working for Mr. Shaw, building a mill, gin house, and shed. The Shaws kept Tarpley on as an overseer. It is unknown whether Tarpley was s slave overseer, but a Sarah A. Shaw of Lockhart Caldwell, County , Texas, appeared in the federal census as owning 34 slaves. In , he worked for John Josey as a millwright until he was drafted by state troops in September. In February , he reported to Gonzales, Texas. During a day furlough, Tarpley went to Austin, Texas, to get a detail as a miller. He remained at the mill until he was ordered to join a company or be conscripted again in July. He spent time in Matamoros and Bagdad, Mexico, describing the towns, his work, and his adventures on the road. When he arrived in New Orleans on April 22, , he wrote that the city was draped in black for President Lincoln. The president had been murdered just a week before. Tarpley sailed to Memphis, Tennessee, and arrived just after the horrific explosion of the SS Sultana. Upon his return to Bedford County, Edward visited friends and relatives and corresponded with friends in Texas. He returned to Texas in October , and to Gonzales in December. The following spring, Tarpley went home and found his father unwell. After the travels he described in his diary, Tarpley returned to Bedford County. He died on July 20, , of apoplexy after the mill was destroyed by arson. Tarpley October 3, Ocotber 30, , used the diary between March 1, , and April 3, He wrote of daily life and work on the family farm, visits with family and friends, and the numerous church services that he attended. He recorded household expenses between and , business expenses incurred from to , and weather conditions from to The last two pages contain a record of the distances that he traveled in The

booklet was printed for the family. This transcription includes information about the family and was filmed along with the original journal. Also included are membership lists and attendance records. They consist of account information. The Northcut store was originally across the street from the Beersheba Springs Hotel but has been moved to the heart of Beersheba Springs. The store is now known as The Beersheba Market. There are two Laura Barnes Hunerwadel scrapbooks dating and They contain photographs relating to the Barnes and Hunerwadel families, as well as newspaper clippings, greeting cards, and letters to Mrs. There are also photographs of the Hege, Hunerwaldel, Plumacher, Kershaw, and Baumgardner families, no date. National Archives RG TSLA maintains negative copy and permission to duplicate 4 reels, 35mm. The fourth roll is from the records of Captain Frederick E. Prime and is the index and list of non-payment rolls of persons employed on Fort Pickering, Memphis, Tennessee. The Beersheba Springs Historical Society subject files consists of several individual families histories and photographs for the Creighton, Green, King, Pease, Savage, and Tate families. Also included are numerous Grundy County records which include cemeteries, census records, newspaper clippings, court records, history notes, schools, churches, birth, marriage, and death records. There are two ledgers included in the collection: Beersheba Springs Hotel Company, , and, H. There are also several items concerning the Beersheba Springs Historical Society, such as financial records, newspaper clippings, and newsletters. This collection is the personal journal of Moses Fisk ca , early Tennessee surveyor, educator and politician, who resided in the upper Cumberland region. The journal consists of notes on land laws and legal matters, statistics, currency exchanges among neighboring states, and miscellaneous data. Most of the information in this journal is written in a form of personal shorthand, or cipher. The key is given on the back page of the ledger. Originals are located in the Library of Congress, Washington, D. The Records of the First and Downtown Presbyterian Churches in Nashville, Tennessee, is composed of assorted church histories, church records, correspondence, magazines, newspaper clippings, bulletins, directories, postcards, tracts, receipts, sermons, wills, Sunday School records, scrapbooks, meeting minutes, statistical reports, financial records, membership lists, biographical sketches, blueprints, church registers, photographs, glass negatives and guest books. A large portion of this collection relates to the First and Downtown Presbyterian Churches of Nashville, Tennessee; however, some items relate to various other Presbyterian churches in this area and the Presbyterian General Assembly. Work on the first church building was started in and finished in It was a colonial style, brick church and it held about people. On the front steps of this church, Andrew Jackson was presented a ceremonial sword by the State of Tennessee for his victory at the Battle of New Orleans. A fire on January 29, , destroyed this structure and work was started on a second church building. The second structure was completed in The second church building was done in the classic Greek style and seated 1, people. This church building hosted the gubernatorial inauguration of James K. On September 14, , the second church building was destroyed by fire. The third church building was built in with seating for about 1, individuals. During the Civil War, the Union Army used the building as a hospital. In , the church bell was purchased and donated by Adelia Acklen Cheatham. In and , flood victims came to the church for shelter. In , members of First Presbyterian Church voted on whether to move the church to land it had purchased in the Oak Hill area. The members voted against the move, fearing that the historical downtown building would be torn down to make way for a parking garage, and started a campaign to raise money to purchase the downtown building. They succeeded and purchased the historical structure. In , the Downtown Presbyterian Church was formed. This microfilm consists of a report by the Army Corps of Engineers on disinterment and reinterment of burials in cemeteries in the Pool area. This collection, containing five volumes, consists of scrapbooks made by the Tennessee Historical Committee under the direction of State Librarian and Archivist, John Trotwood Moore. The scrapbooks contain clippings from Tennessee newspapers, ca. This is a collection of genealogical research materials regarding the descendants of Thomas Brown of Jackson County, Tennessee. Students whose cumulative grade-point average is 2. CEEGE will attempt to notify students of any cancellations in course offerings. It is therefore important for students to register early and notify CEEGE of any changes to your address, phone number or e-mail. A student will be placed on academic probation if at the end of a term the overall grade-point average is below 2. If a student is on academic probation and achieves a grade-point average below 2. The student must demonstrate the ability to maintain the minimum grade-point average for CEEGE in order to be reinstated. Some certificate programs also require an application. See the individual certificate program websites for application procedures and deadlines. For students not enrolling in degree programs, registration in individual courses requires no formal application to the university. Transcripts or high school diplomas are not required to enroll, and there are no California state residency requirements. Registration in this manner does not constitute admission to HSU. See registration procedures p. Credit card refunds are in the form of a credit on account. Some courses offer CEUs for relicensing or professional development purposes. CEU credit cannot be applied toward degrees. One CEU is awarded for each 10 hours of instruction each hour of instruction equals 0.
