A disaster can occur at any time. Even small disasters like gas leaks and small flood, can occur unexpectedly and keep you from tending your animals. Preparing ahead of time and acting quickly is the best way to keep your family and livestock safe. Plan Make arrangements for a friend or a neighbor living nearby to take care of your horse in the event disaster strikes when you are not home or cannot return home. This person should be familiar with your animal and know how to evacuate your horse and the location of your Go Bag. Locate and prearrange an evacuation site for your horse that is outside your immediate area. It is important to check the availability of alternate locations and the entry requirements. Make arrangements with these locations to accept your horse before an emergency occurs. Have a means of transportation to move your horse. This could either be your own trailer or have agreements with friends or neighbors to trailer your animal in an emergency. For example if you anticipate a flood, putting your horse on high elevation may be better than a place that is lower elevation that can easily flood. Check for alternate water sources in case a disaster creates power outages that cause pumps and automatic watering systems to stop working. Keep insurance coverage on your farm and animal current. Prepare Have enough feed, hay and water for days. Prepare a Livestock " Go Bag " for your horse. Keep trailers well maintained and in an easy accessible location. Permanently identify each animal by microchip, tattoo racehorses , tag or photograph front, rear, left and right side including the legs. Other forms of horse ID that can be utilized in an emergency consists of neck collars, leg bands, mane clip, luggage tag braided into the tail or mane, clipper shaved information on the side of the horse and permanent marker on the hooves. Have important health records and contact information together in a sealed plastic bag or document holder. Keep one copy of this information at the farm and take one with you when you evacuate. These documents should include the inventory of your animals number, ID, sex, breed and color , any veterinary and health records, Coggins test, veterinary and other important contact information. See Important Farm Contact Information. Decide to where to store feed and hay to keep it safe during disaster. Become familiar with local evacuation routes Visit your Office of Emergency Management website to sign up for automatic updates. Act Test or run your backup generator, if applicable, a few times per year and make sure that you have adequate fuel to run the generator for at least 72 hours. Practice loading your horses into trailers to acclimate them to the trailer and evacuation procedures. Review your evacuation plans for different disasters.

Animal Hoarding Animal hoarding is a widely misunderstood, complex public health issue that affects the animals and humans involved. Collecting animals is a symptom of underlying issues that cannot be appropriately addressed without also focusing on the needs of the hoarder. Hoarding situations may go unreported for fear that the people will get in trouble or that the animals will be taken away, however, early intervention allows for the best possible outcome for the animals and humans involved. Without intervention, animal hoarding situations will worsen, putting an increasing number of animals at risk. Expand to read more Animal hoarding interventions are most effective when utilizing a collaborative approach between service agencies. Long term monitoring is crucial in these cases. Overwhelmed caregivers with unaltered animals that reproduce and create a population explosion. An animal hoarder can be male or female and range in age from young adult to the elderly. There is no set number of animals that defines an animal hoarder; the ASPCA has assisted people with as few as ten animals to those with more than animals. A common theme among animal hoarders is lack of insight that their home environment may be detrimental to the health of the animals and people residing there. Cases remain open and the team actively monitors the situation once it has been stabilized to ensure that no new animals are brought into the home and that the animal hoarder stays connected to other resources. By partnering with the local veterinary community, the ASPCA makes grants directly to service providers on behalf of the animal in need, preventing surrender or euthanasia. Grants are made to cover the cost of diagnostics and treatment of acute, one-time medical conditions and injuries. Pet owners referred to this program typically want to keep their pets and can provide basic care, but are unable to afford the costs of emergency care and treatment. Many of the illnesses and injuries treated with this funding are preventable, but low income pet owners lack resources to treat them. In addition to providing a safety net for animals in need, the ASPCA takes proactive initiatives to prevent these conditions. Domestic Violence One in four women will experience some form of domestic or intimate partner violence in their lifetime. In a recent survey of women in a domestic violence shelter in Ohio, We provide connections to co-sheltering at a domestic violence shelter, as well as temporary board and foster care for pets of domestic violence survivors. Working in conjunction with domestic violence programs and legal advocacy groups, the ASPCA links the survivor to other resources and addresses the needs of the animals involved. The ASPCA also conducts outreach to domestic violence programs and advocacy groups to educate them on the link between family violence and animal abuse.
