Sudden Death in Cats Question: She found her cat dead this morning, on his favorite place like he was only asleep. The evening before, he was normal and acted as usual, nothing suspicious. We already agreed on the suggestion of poison being impossible. What could it be, he was vaccinated and in good shape. Please help her, she hates that uncertainty! Kindest regards, Anna Answer: Anna- The most common causes for sudden death in cats are cardiomyopathy and heartworm disease. Both of these disorders can cause death with almost no warning at all. We have had a client whose cat went to jump from the couch to a chair near it and landed in the chair, dead. This cat had about four heartworms in the pulmonary arteries when we did a post mortem examination. As far as our client could tell, her cat was normal right up to the time that it died. Other clients have had similar experiences with cats who have had cardiomyopathy, although none quite this dramatic. It seems odd that these disorders can be serious enough to cause death while not causing any warning symptoms but it really seems to be the case at times. Cardiomyopathy is probably the leading cause of anesthetic deaths in cats and most of the time the affected cats have no signs that are detected prior to the anesthetic crisis. There are many other possible problems, though. Cats probably occasionally are born with defects that can lead to sudden death, such as aneurysms that may suddenly rupture. Toxin exposure sometimes occurs without the cat owner being aware of it. Application of a dog flea control product containing permethrin sometimes results in accidental poisoning, although most cats do show clinical signs prior to the time that they die with this particular toxic exposure. Sometimes, there are signs of a serious illness that are subtle enough that veterinary clients, or even veterinarians, miss them. Toxoplasmosis, feline infectious peritonitis, feline leukemia virus, hemobartonellosis, liver failure, chronic kidney failure and other diseases usually cause recognizable symptoms but in rare instances there are not clear-cut clinical signs and death appears to occur suddenly. The only really good way to try to figure out the cause of a sudden death is a post-mortem examination. For people who are really bothered by not knowing what happened, making plans to have a post-mortem examination in advance of the time when their pets die can provide answers, which is comforting in the long run for many people. Hi there, I am a subscriber. I found your article interesting on young vets getting out of school. I really think pet health insurance that is available here in Canada is a "godsend". I have two questions. They are healthy and strong and eat quite a bit now. However, last night when I went to go feed them, one was very limp and seizing. I feed them every 3 hours and the 3 hours previous she had been absolutely fine and was even playing with her brother. When I rushed her into an animal emergency clinic, they decided to euthanize her as she was obviously very ill. I am very upset as I care for all the little creatures that I foster, and just wondered what you thought could have happened. I was too upset last night to ask the Doctor, but the spca staff said that this just happens sometimes. There are several possible causes of sudden death in young kittens but in the three to six week age range the most common causes of death are reported to be the infectious diseases. The most common parasitic problem causing death at this age is probably toxoplasmosis. It is usually necessary for the mother to become infected during the pregnancy for the kittens to develop signs this early but that has been documented to occur and is supposed to be a pretty common cause of kittens seizing and developing rapidly fatal pneumonias in the neonatal period. Our experience with this is that usually more than one kitten in the litter is affected but that it can be a small percentage of the litter. Roundworm migrations can cause seizures and death but I think the kitten is a little young for this effect. The most common bacterial cause of death in this age range may be Bordetella infection, although I am not sure of that. It is supposed to be pretty common in shelter environments and can cause rapidly developing pneumonia in kittens in the 3 week to 8 week old age range. It would seem likely that some of the other kittens would be infected but there can be variations in the immune status of kittens in the same litter, making it possible for

only one kitten to show signs. Mycoplasmal pneumonia and chlamydia can occur in young kittens, as well. Viral illness is also possible. Feline herpes virus, calicivirus and feline leukemia virus are all possible problems in this age range. Panleukopenia feline distemper can also occur in kittens this young but it has become uncommon to see this disease, probably due to the vaccination of so many more cats than in the past. Since several of these illnesses are pretty common in shelter situations and since it is difficult to raise orphaned kittens and for cost considerations, it is unusual for people to pursue post mortem examinations to determine a specific cause when kittens in this age range die, so there are likely to be other problems that occur that we do not have much information about. He showed no signs of any illness. He was in his Sherpa bag, we were bringing him back home from our Summer place and he started to struggle. We stopped to check why he was moving around and I put my hand on the back of his neck and he let out a cry and went limp. It took all of 30 seconds. Needless to say, my husband and I are devastated and we felt so helpless. We got him to our vet within 10 minutes, but it was clear he was already gone. The vet seem quite confident in saying that it would have to have been some sort of heart condition that had gone undetected and it was the only explanation. Just a little background - Chad traveled with us almost every weekend - he loved to be with us and would get into his bag to go the country willingly and would sit quietly during the entire trip. Sometimes he would like to sit on my lap and watch the passing scenery. He adapted immediately to the new environment - he was never skittish or restless - he basically took over and sometimes it seemed he was annoyed when we were back in the City - he loved the freedom of all the windows to look out of. When he took him outside into the yard - he was never out of our sight for even a second. He usually would sit on the dock with us and just watch life. He was not at all interested in chewing any plant life, and was very picky about his food and never picked up any thing off the floor to eat, etc. Obviously, one of my fears was poisoning, but the vet told me he would certainly have shown some signs of sickness if that were the case; i. I noticed he was limping. Because it seemed related to my touching his back, I was alarmed. I had a diabetic cat who eventually went limp in his back legs due to infection. I took him to his vet and had him examined and had x-rays. I made it clear what had precipitated his problem and expressed concern that he hurt his back. I had a friend, who is a vet who is also holistic and a chiropractor examine him, and after a full exam seemed to think that the limping was possibly his hip and suggested I take him to an orthopedist. I then took him to Animal Medical Center in New York to a orthopedic surgeon recommended to me as one of the best. This surgeon suggested that his problem was not bad enough to warrant surgery and he should be rested and do a "wait and see". That seemed like the right thing because within days he was perfectly fine - no limp - jumping around again and playing like a kitten. But if three doctors examined him and no one detected a problem with his heart, how could I have known? Is sudden cardiac arrest a reality, or did I do something wrong? After his "knee" problem, his vet suggested he trim down - he was getting close to 12 pounds. Was this a mistake? His weight was still a healthy 11 pounds. The two most common causes of sudden death in cats, in our practice, are cardiomyopathy and heartworm disease. So I would be most suspicious of a heart problem, too. I do think that the limping seen a little over a month ago could have been due to a blood clot but it is also entirely possible that it was not. Unfortunately, not all cats with cardiomyopathy have heart murmurs. I read an post on the Veterinary Information Network by Dr. Kittleson, who is a well known authority on cardiomyopathy about a sudden death in a cat that he had done an ultrasound exam on one month previously that did not show cardiomyopathy. On the post-mortem exam it was possible to diagnose the condition, though. The prognosis for cats whose cardiomyopathy shows up due to blood clots causing obvious problems is poor, even with treatment. Most cats with this particular presentation for cardiomyopathy live less than a year after diagnosis and most live fewer than five or six months. It is a tough condition to diagnose and a tough condition to treat. I tried to check and see if British Shorthairs were prone to cardiomyopathy but I did not find any literature suggesting this was the case. This is a condition that makes veterinarians feel pretty helpless, too. In cats that do not develop heart murmurs, there may be no clue, or only very subtle clues, that a heart problem exists. It is a frustrating and humbling disease for veterinarians so I know that it must be even more frightening and

He was purring one moment and the next he let out a blood-curdling scream, then died. Lisa- Real "sudden death" is an unusual occurrence. As you noted, it can happen in cats infected with heartworms. It is also reported to occur in cats as the result of cardiomyopathy. This disorder can be very insidious and may not be detected prior to death.

In the course of , Powles asked Disraeli to write three anonymous pamphlets promoting the companies, [38] which John Murray, another heavy investor in the boom, then published. Lockhart Murray had had ambitions to establish a new morning paper to compete with The Times. The new paper, The Representative , promoted the mines and the politicians who supported them, particularly Canning. Although Disraeli impressed Murray with his energy and commitment to the project, he failed in his key task of persuading the eminent writer John Gibson Lockhart to edit the paper. The journey encouraged his self-consciousness, his moral relativism, and his interest in Eastern racial and religious attitudes. They conditioned his attitude toward some of the most important political problems which faced him in his later years—especially the Eastern Question; they also coloured many of his novels. Contarini Fleming was avowedly a self-portrait. Disraeli remarked, "it is quite impossible that anything adverse to the general measure of Reform can issue from my pen. The Whigs derived from the coalition of Lords who had forced through the Bill of Rights in , and in some cases were their actual descendants, not merely spiritual. The Tories tended to support King and Church, and sought to thwart political change. A small number of Radicals, generally from northern constituencies, were the strongest advocates of continuing reform. The other great party, the Whigs, were anathema to Disraeli: He began to move in Tory circles. She was having an affair with Lyndhurst, and began another with Disraeli. Lyndhurst was an indiscreet gossip with a fondness for intrigue; this appealed greatly to Disraeli, who became his secretary and go-between. Disraeli stood as a Radical for the last time in , unsuccessfully contesting High Wycombe once again. He possesses all the necessary requisites of perfidy, selfishness, depravity, want of principle, etc. I do not use it as a term of reproach; there are many most respectable Jews. But there are, as in every other people, some of the lowest and most disgusting grade of moral turpitude; and of those I look upon Mr. Disraeli as the worst. He has just the qualities of the impenitent thief on the Cross, and I verily believe, if Mr. Disraeli now, and as the lineal descendant of the blasphemous robber, who ended his career beside the Founder of the Christian Faith, I leave the gentleman to the enjoyment of his infamous distinction and family honours. His Vindication of the English Constitution, was published in December His targets included the Whigs, collectively and individually, Irish nationalists, and political corruption. The English nation, therefore,

rallies for rescue from the degrading plots of a profligate oligarchy, a barbarizing sectarianism, and a boroughmongering Papacy, round their hereditary leaders—the Peers. The House of Lords, therefore, at this moment represents everything in the realm except the Whig oligarchs, their tools the Dissenters, and their masters the Irish priests. In the mean time, the Whigs bawl that there is a "collision! Back-bencher[ edit ] In the election in July , Disraeli won a seat in the House of Commons as one of two members, both Tory, for the constituency of Maidstone. He had broken off the relationship in late , distraught that she had taken yet another lover. He was a loyal supporter of the party leader Sir Robert Peel and his policies, with the exception of a personal sympathy for the Chartist movement that most Tories did not share. His motives were generally assumed to be mercenary, but the couple came to cherish one another, remaining close until she died more than three decades later. They held that the landed interests should use their power to protect the poor from exploitation by middle-class businessmen. Before the Reform Act , the working class did not possess the vote and therefore had little political power. Although Disraeli forged a personal friendship with John Bright , a Lancashire manufacturer and leading Radical, Disraeli was unable to persuade Bright to sacrifice his distinct position for parliamentary advancement. When Disraeli attempted to secure a Tory-Radical cabinet in , Bright refused. The best-known of these stances were over the Maynooth Grant in and the repeal of the Corn Laws in . However, the young MP had attacked his leader as early as on Ireland and then on foreign policy interventions. In a letter of February , he slighted the Prime Minister for failing to send him a Policy Circular. Peel hoped that the repeal of the Corn Laws and the resultant influx of cheaper wheat into Britain would relieve the condition of the poor, and in particular the suffering caused by successive failure of potato crops in Ireland—the Great Famine. Disraeli stated, in a letter to Sir William Miles of 11 June , that he wished to help "because, from my earliest years, my sympathies had been with the landed interest of England". However, he would take office with a group of men who possessed little or no official experience, who had rarely felt moved to speak in the House of Commons, and who, as a group, remained hostile to Disraeli on a personal level. In the general election , Disraeli stood, successfully, for the Buckinghamshire constituency. As a practising Jew he could not take the oath of allegiance in the prescribed Christian form, and therefore could not take his seat. Lord John Russell, the Whig leader who had succeeded Peel as Prime Minister and like Rothschild was a member for the City of London, proposed in the Commons that the oath should be amended to permit Jews to enter Parliament. The Tories and the Anglican establishment were hostile to the bill. One who was not yet an MP, Lord John Manners , stood against Rothschild when the latter re-submitted himself for election in . The measure was voted down. Possession of a country house, and incumbency of a county constituency, were regarded as essential for a Tory with ambitions to lead the party. Disraeli and his wife alternated between Hughenden and several homes in London for the rest of their marriage. At the start of the next session, affairs were handled by a triumvirate of Granby, Disraeli, and John Charles Herries —indicative of the tension between Disraeli and the rest of the party, who needed his talents but mistrusted him.

Pilgrim Fathers The village of Scrooby , England circa , home to the "Saints" until Plymouth Colony was founded by a group of English Puritans who later came to be known as the Pilgrims. They began to feel the pressures of religious persecution while still in the English village of Scrooby , near East Retford , Nottinghamshire. In , Archbishop Tobias Matthew raided homes and imprisoned several members of the congregation. Scrooby had been an agricultural community, whereas Leiden was a thriving industrial center, and the Separatists found the pace of life difficult. The community remained close-knit, but their children began adopting the Dutch language and customs, and some also entered the Dutch Army. The Puritans also were still not free from the persecutions of the English Crown. English authorities came to Leiden to arrest William Brewster in , after he published comments highly critical of the King of England and the Anglican Church. Brewster escaped arrest, but the events spurred the congregation to move farther from England. They had declined the opportunity to settle south of Cape Cod in New Netherland because of their desire to avoid the Dutch influence. They sought to finance their venture through the Merchant Adventurers , a group of businessmen who principally viewed the colony as a means of making a profit. Upon arriving in America, the Pilgrims began working to repay their debts. They had intended to leave early in , but they were delayed several months due to difficulties in dealing with the Merchant Adventurers, including several changes in plans for the voyage and in financing. The congregation and the other colonists finally boarded the Speedwell in July in the Dutch port of Delfshaven. List of Mayflower passengers Speedwell was re-rigged with larger masts before leaving Holland and setting out to meet Mayflower in Southampton, England , around the end of July The term was also used for many of the indentured servants. Further disagreements with the Merchant Adventurers held up the departure in Southampton. A total of passengers finally departed on August 5â€™90 on the Mayflower and 30 on the Speedwell. The leakage was partly caused by being overmasted and being pressed too much with sail. The Speedwell was found to be unseaworthy; some passengers abandoned their attempt to emigrate, while others joined the Mayflower, crowding the already heavily burdened ship. Later, it was speculated that the crew of the Speedwell had intentionally sabotaged the ship to avoid having to make the treacherous trans-Atlantic voyage. More importantly, the delays meant that everyone had to spend the entire winter on board the Mayflower off Cape Cod in what could only be described as squalid conditions. The Mayflower departed Plymouth , England on September 6, with passengers and about 30 crew members in the small, foot-long ship. There were many obstacles throughout the trip, including multiple cases of seasickness and the bending and cracking of a main beam of the ship. One death occurred, that of William Button. They attempted to sail south to the designated landing site at the mouth of the Hudson but ran into trouble in the region of Pollack Rip, a shallow area of shoals between Cape Cod and Nantucket Island. With winter approaching and provisions running dangerously low, the passengers decided to return north to Cape Cod Bay and abandon their original landing plans. The resulting map completely omits most of the New England coast. Frenchman Samuel de Champlain had explored the area extensively in He had specifically explored Plymouth Harbor , which he called "Port St. Louis," and made an extensive and detailed map of it and the surrounding lands. The native Patuxet village upon which the town of Plymouth was later built was shown by Champlain as a thriving settlement. The epidemic has traditionally been thought to be smallpox, [21] but a recent analysis has concluded that it may have been a lesser-known disease called leptospirosis. Popham Colony , also known as Fort St. George, was organized by the Plymouth Company unrelated to Plymouth Colony and founded in It was settled on the coast of Maine and was beset by internal political struggles, sickness, and weather problems. settlement named "New Plimouth. They discovered remains of a European fort and uncovered a grave that contained the remains of both an adult European male and a Native American child. The Pilgrims did not have a patent to settle this area; thus, some passengers began to question their right to land, complaining that there was no legal authority to establish a colony. In response to this, a group of colonists drafted and ratified the first governing document of the colony, the Mayflower Compact, while still aboard the ship as it lay off-shore. The intent of the compact was to establish a means of governing the colony, though it did little more than confirm that the colony would be governed like any English town. It did, however, serve the purpose of relieving the concerns of many of the settlers. It was modeled on the church covenants that Congregationalists used to form new congregations. It made clear that the colony should be governed by "just and equal laws," and those who signed it promised to keep these laws. The immigrants finally set foot on land at what became Provincetown on November 9. The first task was to rebuild a shallop, a shallow draft boat that had been built in England and disassembled for transport aboard the Mayflower. It would remain with the Pilgrims while the Mayflower returned to England. On November 15, Captain Myles Standish led a party of sixteen men on an exploratory mission, during which they disturbed a Native American grave and located a buried cache of Indian corn. He was the first English child born to the Pilgrims in the New World. The shallop was finished on November 27, and a second expedition was undertaken using it, under the direction of Mayflower master Christopher Jones. Thirty-four men went, but the expedition was beset by bad weather; the only positive result was that they found a Native burial ground and corn that had been intended for the dead, taking the corn for future planting. A third expedition along Cape Cod left on December 6; it resulted in a skirmish with local Native Americans known as the "First Encounter" near modern-day Eastham, Massachusetts. The colonists decided to look elsewhere, having failed to secure a proper site for their settlement, and fearing that they had angered the local Native Americans by robbing their corn stores and firing upon them. The settlement would be centered on two hills: Also important in choosing the site was that the prior Native villagers had cleared much of the land making agriculture relatively easy. Fresh water for the colony was provided by Town Brook and Billington Sea. There are no contemporaneous accounts to verify the legend, but Plymouth Rock is often hailed as the point where the colonists first set foot on their new homeland. The colonists elected to retain the name for their own settlement, in honor of their final point of departure from England: Bacon On December 21, 1620, the first landing party arrived at the site of Plymouth. Plans to build houses, however, were delayed by bad weather until December 22. As the building progressed, 20 men always remained ashore for security purposes while the rest of the work crews returned each night to the Mayflower. Women, children, and the infirm remained on board the Mayflower, and many had not left the ship for six months. The first structure was a common house of wattle and daub, and it took two weeks to complete in the harsh New England winter. In the following weeks, the rest of the settlement slowly took shape. During the winter, the Mayflower colonists suffered greatly from lack of shelter, diseases such as scurvy, and general conditions onboard ship. Thus, only seven residences and four common houses were constructed during the first winter out of a planned 50.

The men of the settlement organized themselves into military orders in mid-February, after several tense encounters with local Indians, and Myles Standish was designated as the commanding officer. By the end of the month, five cannons had been defensively positioned on Fort Hill. On March 16, 1621, the first formal contact occurred with the Indians. Samoset was an Abenaki sagamore who was originally from Pemaquid Point in Maine. He had learned some English from fishermen and trappers in Maine, [35] and he walked boldly into the midst of the settlement and proclaimed, "Welcome, Englishmen! They also learned that one leader of the region was Wampanoag Indian chief Massasoit, [36] and they learned about Squanto Tisquantum who was the sole survivor from Patuxet. Squanto had spent time in Europe and spoke English quite well. He also knew that the Pilgrims had taken some corn stores in their landings at Provincetown. He had returned to New England in 1619, acting as a guide to explorer Capt. Robert Gorges, but Massasoit and his men had massacred the crew of the ship and had taken Squanto. Only four adult women were left alive for the Thanksgiving. Brownscombe The autumn celebration in late 1621 that has become known as "The First Thanksgiving" was not

known as such to the Pilgrims. That event probably occurred in July and consisted of a full day of prayer and worship and probably very little revelry. The original festival was probably held in early October and was celebrated by the 53 surviving Pilgrims, along with Massasoit and 90 of his men. Three contemporaneous accounts of the event survive: For the first few years of colonial life, the fur trade was the dominant source of income, buying furs from Native Americans and selling to Europeans, beyond subsistence farming. William Bradford was elected to replace him and went on to lead the colony through much of its formative years. On July 2, a party of Pilgrims led by Edward Winslow who later became the chief diplomat of the colony set out to continue negotiations with the chief. The delegation also included Squanto, who acted as a translator. After meals and an exchange of gifts, Massasoit agreed to an exclusive trading pact with the English; thus, the French were no longer welcome, though they were also frequent traders in the area. Squanto remained behind and traveled throughout the area to establish trading relations with several tribes. It was reported that he was found by the Nauset, the same group of Native Americans on Cape Cod from whom the Pilgrims had unwittingly stolen corn seed the prior year upon their first explorations. The English organized a party to return Billington to Plymouth. The Pilgrims agreed to reimburse the Nauset for the corn which they had taken in return for the Billington boy. This negotiation did much to secure further peace with the Native Americans in the area. Massasoit, Squanto, and several other Wampanoags had been captured by Corbitant, sachem of the Narragansett tribe. A party of ten men under the leadership of Myles Standish set out to find and execute Corbitant. While hunting for Corbitant, they learned that Squanto had escaped and Massasoit was back in power. Several Native Americans had been injured by Standish and his men and were offered medical attention in Plymouth. They had failed to capture Corbitant, but the show of force by Standish had garnered respect for the Pilgrims and, as a result, nine of the most powerful sachems in the area signed a treaty in September, including Massasoit and Corbitant, pledging their loyalty to King James. Two ships followed shortly thereafter carrying sixty settlers, all men. They spent July and August in Plymouth before moving north to settle in modern Weymouth, Massachusetts at a settlement which they named Wessagussett.

American football[ edit ] Sudden death has been perceived as a particularly poor fit for gridiron football because the process gives an inherent advantage to the team who starts with possession of the ball: All organized forms of American football have abolished pure sudden death for overtime as of the season. Most levels of the game, including high school football and college football , never used it, instead either allowing ties to stand or using alternatives like the Kansas Playoff. The National Football League was an exception; the league used pure sudden death in its playoffs beginning in and in regular season matchups starting in , finally modifying its process for playoffs in and then regular season games in National Football League[ edit ] Originally, all National Football League games tied at the end of regulation time ended as a tie. Late in the season, NFL President Carl Storck announced that sudden death periods would be authorized for any playoff game needed to decide either division title. It was emphasized that this did not apply to the final championship game, which would crown co-champions in the event of a tie. Sudden death overtime was finally approved for the NFL championship game in [2] and remains in effect now. The game ended as a tie if neither team scores in overtime. When a team gets near the end zone , it typically tried to kick a field goal. An overtime game can also be won by scoring a touchdown in such an event, the extra point is not attempted. This usually happened on a play that began with field position far enough away from the end zone to make a field goal difficult if not impossible, but it can also result from a team choosing not to attempt a field goal until reaching fourth down, even if the team enters an easy field goal range; this strategy only works if the team can maintain possession of the ball and does not fumble the ball away, throw an interception or lose enough yardage to back out of field goal range. Only thrice has an overtime game been won by a safety. In recent years, sportscasters have referred to such scoring plays as "walk-offs," as both teams can walk off the field after the play. Since the 2011 playoffs, in the post-season, each team was allowed at least one possession to score in overtime, unless the team receiving the kickoff scored a touchdown or if the defensive team scored a touchdown or safety on the same possession. True sudden death rules applied if both teams have had their initial possession and the game remains tied. This rule did not actually come into use during the playoffs, with the first overtime game under the new rules not occurring until , with the Denver Broncos scoring a long touchdown on their first play from scrimmage against the Pittsburgh Steelers. This rule was adopted for the start of the regular season. It was adopted to counter the criticism that the outcome of overtime games was very frequently decided by the coin toss, as the team which won it usually attempted only enough offensive action to maneuver into field goal range and seldom made a real effort to score a touchdown. In the regular season, games still tied after one full overtime period will continue to be allowed to end in a tie. For information on games that have taken a long time under sudden death, see Overtime. Arena football[ edit ] In arena football , each team is allowed one overtime possession in the first overtime, after which whoever is ahead is the winner. If the score is still tied, however, true sudden death rules apply thereafter. This rule was implemented in the season ; prior to this, the league used extra time , a fixed seven and one-half minute extra period; if the game was still tied at this point, it was recorded as a tied game. This was later changed to a fifteen-minute maximum modified sudden death as above, but with a definite conclusion after one overtime period, again a tied game being recorded if the score was still equal. Only one tied game was recorded under each of the two prior overtime rules. Since the beginning of the season, all Arena football games, both regular season and playoff, have been played to a victorious conclusion. Any succeeding overtime periods are true sudden death periods. An exception is applied to second game of the semifinal series, provided one team wins the first game and the second game ends with the two-game aggregate score tied, the game will continue with a standard overtime even if the score of the second game is not tied. football. Important matches were traditionally resolved by replaying the entire match, however in the era of television and tight travel schedules this is often impracticable. Replays are still used in some major competitions like the FA Cup. In many matches, if the score is tied after the full 90 minutes, a draw results; however, if one team must be eliminated, some form of tie-breaking must occur. Originally, two minute halves of extra time were held and if the teams remained equal at the end of the halves, kicks from the penalty mark are held. To try to decrease the chances of requiring kicks from the penalty mark, the IFAB, the world law making body of the sport, experimented with new rules. The golden goal rule transformed the overtime periods into sudden death until the periods were over, where shootouts would occur. As this became unpopular, the silver goal rule was instituted, causing the game to end if the scores were not equal after the first minute period as well as the second. The silver goal has also fallen into disrepute so UEFA Euro was the last event to use it; after which the original tie-breaking methods were restored. The main criticism of golden goal is the quickness of ending the game, and the pressure on coaches and players. Once a goal is scored, the game is over and the opponent cannot attempt to answer the goal within the remaining time. Therefore, teams would place more emphasis on not conceding a goal rather than scoring a goal, and many golden goal extra time periods remained scoreless. In NCAA collegiate play in the United States, however, sudden death, adopted in for all championship play in addition to regular season play, remains. If the teams are still tied after the initial allocated number in the penalty shoot-out, the game goes to sudden-death penalties, where each team takes a further one penalty each, repeated until only one team scores, resulting in the winning of the game.

Badminton[ edit ] In badminton, if a set is tied at all, golden point is played; whoever scores this point wins it.

Baseball and softball[ edit ] Baseball and softball are not true sudden-death sports, but they have one comparable situation. In the final scheduled inning typically, in professional and advanced amateur leagues the ninth inning, but usually the seventh for youth leagues and softball, and the sixth for leagues for subteens such as Little League, if the visitors complete their turn at bat and still trail the hosts, the game ends. If the visitors lead or the game is tied, the hosts take their "last ups" at bat. If the final scheduled inning ends in a tie, multiple extra innings are played with the same implications as the final scheduled inning. The ability to bat last is an advantage of being the home team. It is said that "visitors must play to win; hosts need only play to tie" because tying forces an extra inning. A tied game in the bottom of the final scheduled inning puts pressure on the visitors. For example, with a runner on third base and fewer than two outs, the visitors cannot afford even to get certain types of out that would let the game-ending run score after the out. A scoring play that ends the game is called a walk-off, because after the runner scores the winning run everyone can walk off the field. A walk-off home run is an exception to the rule stated above; the game does not end when the winning run scores, but continues until the batter and all runners score provided they run the bases correctly.

Basketball[ edit ] Basketball does not traditionally employ sudden death to decide games; it instead uses multiple five-minute overtime periods to determine the result of games tied after regulation play. The entire overtime is played; if the game remains tied, this procedure is repeated. The NBA Summer League, a developmental summer league, employs sudden death basketball after the first overtime. In the first sudden death professional basketball game, Devin Ebanks hit a game winner with 45 seconds elapsed for the D-League Select team, beating the summer league Atlanta Hawks. Although sabre bouts rarely go to full-time, the same time frames apply. Matches are also timed three minutes for a poule match, and three periods of three minutes for a DE. If neither fencer has reached five or 15 points within the time limit, the leading fencer is deemed the winner. However, if the fencers are tied after the allotted time, one minute of extra time is added. Before resuming the bout, one fencer is randomly awarded "priority". The first fencer to score a valid hit within extra time wins the match; if no valid hits are scored within the time, that fencer with priority is declared the victor. In the normal course of a match, there is a de facto sudden death situation if both fencers are tied at four or 14 touches each. The final hit is called "la belle". The fencers may salute each other before playing for the final point.

Golf[ edit ] In individual match play, players level after the regulation 18 or 36 holes will play extra holes in sudden death. In team tournaments, players may gain half a point each for a tie rather than play sudden death; this is

the case in the Ryder Cup , for example. In the Presidents Cup , there was provision for a single-player sudden death shootout if the entire competition ended in a tie. When this came to pass in , the tiebreak was unfinished at dusk. Modern considerations such as television coverage and the tight travel schedule of most leading golfers have led to this practice being almost entirely abandoned, and in all but the most important tournaments, the champion is determined by sudden death. All players tied after the completion of regulation play are taken to a predetermined hole, and then play it and others in order as needed. Through and last used in , the U. Open had an hole playoff at stroke play on the day after the main tournament, with sudden-death if needed after 18 holes. A two-hole aggregate playoff is used since , followed by sudden-death if needed. The PGA Championship introduced the sudden-death playoff to the majors in [10] and used it seven times through Sudden death is used if a tie exists at the end of the scheduled playoff. Ice hockey[ edit ] Sudden-death overtime has traditionally been used in playoff and championship games in hockey. Currently, the NHL, American Hockey League , and ECHL also use the sudden-death system in their regular seasons, playing a five-minute overtime period when the score is tied at the end of regulation time. In , the AHL reduced the teams to four players each during the five-minute overtime. But any two-man advantage is administered with five-on-three play rather than four-on-two. By the NHL went to the three-on-three format. In the SPHL , a class A minor league, the overtime is three-on-three, with the team that would be on the power play given a fourth, and a fifth attacker respectively instead, and any penalty in the final two minutes results in a penalty shot instead of a power play. If neither team scores during this period, the teams use a penalty-shot shootout, consisting of three players in the NHL or five players in the minor leagues, to determine the winner. In the NHL, if no team wins this shootout, a 1-by-1, sudden-death shootout ensues. No player may shoot twice until every non-goaltender on the bench has taken a shot. During championship playoffs, however, all games are played to a conclusion resulting in a victory for one team and a loss for the other. These are true sudden-death games, which have gone on into as many as six additional full minute periods with five players, instead of the five-minute period with at least three players. IIHF hockey uses a penalty-shot shootout for gold medal games if neither team scores after one minute, sudden-death overtime period. The shootout is decided in best-of-5 rounds, then round by round in other words, if one team scores in the 6th round or beyond and the other fails, the game ends, unlike most professional leagues , and players can shoot as many times as the team desires first 5 rounds are done in order, then reversely thereafter; may use new or same players. Judo[ edit ] In the case of a tie in competition judo , the match proceeds to Golden Score, another form of Sudden Death. Sudden Death in competition Judo consists of a 5 minute long match, during which the first competitor to achieve a score is awarded the match. Penalties in Judo award points to the other competitor, making fair-play of absolute importance. Mixed martial arts[ edit ] In mixed martial arts competitions that consist of an even number of rounds, a type of sudden death is sometimes used in the event that each competitor wins an equal number of points. This is not a true sudden death that ends on the first point scored, since MMA competitions do not generally score individual points. Rather, it is a final round of combat, the winner of which is declared the winner of the match. This particular rule, known as "Sudden Victory", has been commonly seen in previous seasons of the reality television show The Ultimate Fighter when the competition has consisted of two rounds. This happens in the case of a double knockout or double countout. In the United States, Sudden Death rules occurs mainly in an Iron Man match when there is a tie after the time limit have expired.

Many situations require that you take action now to avoid financial problems later. Natural Disasters Wherever you live, there is always the risk of floods, fires, and other natural disasters that could result in the destruction of your home. Prepare yourself so that if such situations occur, you can minimize the impact. All sales receipts and contracts should be systematically filed for easy access when reporting a claim. Theft Theft of personal belongings can occur in an instant. Your purse could be stolen from your office at work, or your camera from your vehicle. Are you prepared for this? Do you have a list of all your credit card numbers on file, with the necessary contact information, so you can quickly report stolen cards before they are used unlawfully? Or do you at least have your most recent credit card statements, with account numbers and company contact information, where you can quickly get to them to make your report? Sudden Illness Contingency plans also may be needed for sudden injury or illness. If you were incapacitated, who would handle your affairs, and how would that person gain access to your important documents? Would they have durable power of attorney to act on your behalf? By making these plans ahead of time, you ease the stress your loved ones must face. Contingency Plans And what if, while traveling out of town or overseas, you discover you need to sell your stock? Prepare for your trip by leaving a durable power of attorney and by giving a trusted person access to your stock certificates so that he or she can sell the stock for you in a timely manner. This way you avoid having to cut your trip short. Also, in these troubling times of terrorism, a loved one might need your dental records in order to provide a positive identification of your remains; this might also be necessary in case of mechanical problems on an aircraft or structural failure of a building which results in your death. Tax Records Organizing your tax records not only makes tax preparation much easier, it also is essential in preparing for an audit. Supporting documents—such as bank statements, cancelled checks, credit card receipts and statements, and all other receipts and official information on income, losses, and deductions—should be available at all times. Consider going over this information with an accountant to explore possibilities for lowering your taxes in future years. Vaults are made of concrete and they protect the container from ground collapse. While not required, most people also purchase a memorial marker or monument for the gravesite. There are several types of cemetery space to consider: A single plot intended for the burial of one person or one urn. Double or companion plot: A double plot may be two single plots side-by-side, or one that is double depth. With a double depth plot, a second deceased is buried on top of the first. A space that is large enough for multiple family members. A smaller space that designed for burial of a cremation urn. Depending on the cemetery and the type of plot you purchase, it may be possible for multiple urns to be buried in the space plot. Above-ground burial options for a casket or cremation urn: Some people prefer to have the option of having their remains be entombed above ground level. This may be an attractive option if you live in a low lying area and you are uncomfortable about the possibility of flooding. With above-ground burial you have several options: A mausoleum is a building designed to house the casket. There are several types. A private mausoleum may be a standalone building that is reserved just for you or your family. A community mausoleum is a larger structure that houses the remains of those who purchase space inside. A variety of personalization options will be available depending on the location you choose. Community Mausoleum a community, usually climate-controlled building, where families can select the location and level of crypt and personalize crypt plates and crypt markers Lawn Crypt: A lawn crypt is a structure that is built above ground, normally with a drainage system below the structure. Grass is planted over the structure so that it blends into the environment. The casket is placed inside the crypt. A columbarium is a building or wall structure that is designed as a series of niches to hold cremation urns. If you prefer a less traditional burial, there are a variety of options. *For deaths that occur at home, it's important to know who to call. If your loved one is a hospice patient, call the hospice agency to report the death. A hospice nurse will come to the home and pronounce the death.*

I felt numb and felt hopeless. I was only 21 years old at the time. Just finished my midwifery course just two weeks gone and this happened. Everything happened so quickly that there was no time to think and plan things. I suppose with sudden death, the grief is so unbearable but you have to try and carry on. It was not easy at all. Expected deaths due to illness are easier to cope with than sudden deaths I think because at least you have time to say your goodbyes to them before they die but with sudden death it is unexpected to happen. It is harder to cope with suicide victims and sudden deaths of any kind. When my mother took her own life which left me and the family devastated for life, I did not know how I would cope. I was the eldest in the family of six children, four boys and two girls. In my culture, if you are the eldest, you automatically assume responsibility when your mother dies or your father dies come to that. I was not prepared for the responsibility in front of me at the time. Two weeks before my mother committed suicide, I graduated as a midwife. I was so happy. My father and mother came to my graduation day and they were both very proud and happy that I have finished my two-year course midwifery and I will be able to get a job and will be able to help them in return. That was my plan. I began to worry about how would I cope doing what my mother used to do everything for us. But no time to worry, I just got on with it. It was really hard work but I had to do it. I did not know how to care for blind people then like I do now but somehow managed. I was not prepared for that situation at all. I had to forget all about my dreams and future plans because my family needs me most. My father just got on as well with the day to day job to provide for us and drowned his sorrows in his work. Because with situations like this, it can either take someone into a negative place or positive place. I was being pulled into two directions. I wanted to just go away and leave my siblings, blind grandfather and dad but I could not do that. I do care about them so much even now. They were the reasons why I am here now. Instead of focusing on my future plans, I decided to take good care of my family. I thought at the time, when my sister grows up a little then that is the time I am going to leave them and find a job. When my sister was seven years old, my father suggested that I should go abroad and work. I did not like to go away from them but again I had no choice, it was the only way I could earn some money for us. Of course by then I have forgotten what I learnt in midwifery so I decided to try my luck working abroad. I worked in Kuwait for five years then came to work in England after that. I am still working in England now. Photo of us This is me with my two brothers and our youngest sister with a beige cap. Her asthma is so bad sometimes that she is gasping for breaths at nights. She always said that, it would be better if she is dead because she thought she is a burden to the family especially to my father who was the sole breadwinner at the time. My mother also worked in the farm and took care of us at the same time. But I was wrong, I should have listened more to my mother when she mentioned about killing herself. My mother has low self esteem and always think that she is not a good mother. But to me, she is the best mother I ever had. She did love us in her own way. She even thought my father was having an affair but I know my father is not doing anything like that to upset us. Clearly my mother is depressed or have mental illness that no one in our family knows about it until she killed herself. I wish I knew more about depression or mental illness in those days, maybe I could have saved her life. Her asthma was also bad at that time, she was coughing badly and even has become more breathless. She drank the rat poison that they kept for the farm one evening when our father was at work, it was at night time. My mother was taken to the nearest clinic in our village but did not make it. The rat poison was so strong that it killed her quickly. I did not have any choice. We were all devastated by her sudden death. I have to look after my young siblings including my blind grandfather and my father too. I never imagined that I could cope but having no choice, I had to face it. I love my family so much and I always put them first. My father went back to work as a miner and I looked after everyone in the house, my blind grandfather, my younger brothers and three-year old sister.

My brothers were attending primary school at the time so I had to prepare their packed lunches every morning and helped them with their home works. We had to fetch water from the well to cook our food and wash our dishes. I had to grow up so quick. It was hard to be a mother and a sister to them as well. Somehow I managed to do what my mother used to do for us but it was very hard indeed. My mother was really great in her own way. I still miss her. I was too busy looking after all my loved ones but I did it with all my love for my family. I still miss my mother though but we have a loving step-mother now who looks like our mother and she loves us all. They really look like twins but not identical. My father remarried after a few years had passed and she is a wonderful loving step-mother who loves us unconditionally. My stepmother got asthma too but she is not suicidal like my mother. Tips on how to deal with sudden death My tips on how to deal with sudden death: Not easy but as time goes by, it gets easier. Talk to other people and ask for guidance on how to cope if you are overwhelmed. Have a good cry when you feel like crying. It is a part of the grieving process. It helps lighten your mood and move on. Talk to a trusted friend who can understand what you are going through. My friend helped me a lot. I think she was very depressed at the time but I did not know the meaning of depression in those days. I wish that I know a lot more about mental illness or depression then maybe I could have saved her but there are things we only learn after something happens. I only understood the meaning of depression when I experienced it myself but because of what happened to my mother, I was determined to live and find ways to get out of depression. Also if I hear anyone saying they are depressed or they want to die, they should be listened to. A lot of people suffer with depression due to different reasons but they are not getting enough help they need.
