Part 1 of the microform edition of the office files, consisting of special correspondence, speeches, legislative and press conference memo-randa, does offer some additional interest.

Historical Information Virginians for Dulles VFD was a citizen action group established in to reduce airport nuisances for northern Virginia citizens--including noise and air pollution--by rerouting airline traffic from Washington National Airport in Arlington County, Virginia to Dulles International Airport in Loudoun County, Virginia. VFD board leaders included S. Through the s and early s, VFD campaigned to curb airline activities at Washington National by altering flight patterns, restricting night flights, and banning excessively noisy stretch-jets. In addition to corresponding with politicians, airport authorities, and other citizens action groups, VFD initiated a legal battle against National Airport authorities that would last for nearly a decade. The defendants filed a notice of compliance with the court order on February 1, and the motion was withdrawn. In Virginians for Dulles changed their name to Greater Washington Citizens for Dulles GWCD and continued to pursue litigation against Washington National Airport on other legal grounds, such as airline safety, antitrust, and actions constituting a taking of property. The records included in this collection end in when GWCD appears to have ceased its activities and disbanded. Scope and Content The collection contains minutes and meeting agenda; correspondence between Virginians for Dulles VFD board members, lawyers, politicians, and airline officials; legal briefs from civil suits filed by VFD against the Federal Aviation Administration and Washington National Airport; audiotapes; and various financial and administrative documents of VFD. Also included are newsclippings, plans for Metropolitan Washington-area airport policy and reports on environmental impact, pamphlets and memoranda from various citizens action groups concerned with aircraft noise and pollution, Federal Aviation Administration newsletters and press releases, and transcripts of testimony before the Civil Aeronautics Board and the Aviation Subcommittee of the US House Committee on Public Works and Transportation. The series also contains documents deriving from other citizen groups committed to mitigating aircraft noise, traffic, and pollution in the metropolitan Washington region. Court Proceedings contains trial notes and transcripts, legal briefs, memoranda, testimony, and correspondence pertaining to civil suits filed against Washington National Airport and the Federal Aviation Administration FAA by Virginians for Dulles VFD and other like-minded groups in the Metropolitan Washington region. Documents pertaining to the class-action suit against Washington National Airport, Virginians for Dulles v. John Volpe, et al. Other documents include copies of proceedings from the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County, Virginia v. Goldschmidt ; and the City of Alexandria v. Legal Reference contains notes, correspondence, and supplementary reference materials gathered by Virginians for Dulles board members and their lawyers to support litigation strategies against Washington National Airport and the FAA. Whereas the materials in Series 2 pertain either to civil cases directly involving Virginians for Dulles or to cases initiated by other plaintiffs in the same timeframe and geographic locale, the materials in Series 3 consist largely of facsimiles of older cases decided by precedents considered by VFD lawyers as prospective bases of litigation during the early s. In addition to copies of cases, this series includes correspondence and notes referring to prior VFD litigation against Washington National Airport. Reports and Comments contains reports on airport policies and procedures; informational pamphlets; detailed studies on aircraft noise and emissions; comments by Virginians for Dulles and others on FAA policy proposals; and transcripts of hearings before the Civil Aeronautics Board and the Aviation Subcommittee of the US House Committee on Public Works and Transportation. Prominent documents in this series include several draft environmental impact statements DEIS and policy proposals for Washington National and Dulles International Airports prepared by the FAA and published by the United States Department of Transportation, as well as dozens of comments on these reports by Virginians for Dulles and other citizens action groups. Newsclippings and Magazines contains newspaper articles along with a few magazines and pamphlets pertaining to airport

problems and policies, especially Washington National Airport and its impact on the community. Other newsclippings gathered by Virginians for Dulles can be found in Series 1: Subject Files, some of which were included with correspondence between VFD board members and their lawyers. Audiotapes contains 6 reel-to-reel tapes. The other three tapes are unlabeled. Series 7, Oversize, contains oversize airport plans.

Stroup was a lawyer and Schott was the Chief Investigator for the Commission. Schott gave Stroup a deeper appreciation for marijuana and the marijuana culture. The two were motivated to start NORML following the arrest of a friend for possession of a small amount of marijuana during a traffic stop. Influenced by the pro-consumer advocacy of Ralph Nader and formed out of the progressive political environment of the late s, the two imagined NORML as a "respectable" advocate for marijuana smokers. The Commission defined decriminalization as fines for possession of small amounts of marijuana in lieu of jail time and keeping criminal penalties for sale or distribution of larger amounts. This was not the preferred strategy of all marijuana reform groups. Early on in its history there were disagreements between NORML and other groups, like Amorphia in California, on whether to decriminalize through state legislation or legalize through citizen ballot initiatives. NORML believed that ballot initiatives were expensive and not likely to pass considering the climate of the country at the time. In , five state legislatures passed decriminalization bills and the Alaska Supreme Court ruled that personal use of marijuana at home was protected by the right-to-privacy provision in the state constitution. Their annual conferences were attended by government officials, doctors, lawyers, state legislators, activists, Yuppies, Libertarians, Republicans, and Democrats. State chapters opened in dozens of states. However, their influence was not to last. During their annual conferences, NORML hosted a Saturday night party which became legendary throughout the political and media culture of Washington, D. Reflective of the permissive climate of the late s the party was a mix of conference attendees, politicians, journalists and drug dealers indulging in all manner of intoxicants. During the conference party, Dr. Paraquat was an herbicide used in Mexico to eradicate marijuana plants that was potentially harmful to smokers. This was followed by a growing backlash against the steady gains of marijuana reformers from the Right which culminated in the election of Ronald Reagan in . Following his departure, Stroup dedicated his time to criminal defense work on drug cases. Throughout the "Just Say No" s NORML struggled to stay alive, withstanding financial troubles, waning membership, disagreements over strategy, and societal intolerance for drug decriminalization and legalization. Gettman was responsible for collecting large amounts of qualitative data on U. He is best known for his attempts at petitioning the U. Government to remove marijuana from the Class 1 schedule. In the late s, following an IRS audit initiated by a U. Congressman, the Board of Directors fired the National Director and administered the organization itself. Pierre was hired in by the Board as the sole staff member and helped hire Richard Cowan, a Yale-educated, gay, quaker, libertarian, Texas oil man as the new National Director. The Board disagreed on the nature and extent of the improprieties and how to handle it. Cowan, with support from some Board members and staffers, voted to dissolve the existing Board and elect a new Board. Superior Court to nullify the new Board. What followed was a fractious legal episode that lasted several years. Pierre was chosen to lead the Foundation. Despite the aggressive anti-drug policies of the George W. Bush White House, which included equating drug use with supporting terrorism, public support for marijuana legalization continued to grow, culminating in citizen ballot initiatives in that legalized the recreational use of marijuana in Colorado and Washington state. This, combined with the election of Barack Obama and the permissive policies of his Attorney General Eric Holder, has ushered in an unprecedented era in which the end of marijuana prohibition seems within reach. Following state legalization and the ensuing "green rush" by investors, incongruities between state and federal laws, and the patchwork of state tax policies and regulations, NORML continues to advocate on behalf of the interests of the marijuana consumer.

Collins, Michael, Michael Collins Papers, Military Academy West Point , where he obtained a bachelor of science degree in Collins received an Air Force commission and, after pilot training, was assigned to Nellis Air Base for advanced training on the F Sabrejet. Upon completion of training, he was assigned to the 21st Fighter- Bomber Wing, stationed in Victorville, California and, later, France. In , Collins completed test pilot school and was assigned to Edwards Air Force Base, where he tested experimental fighter jets. In the meantime, he had married Patricia Finnegan; the couple would have three children: Kathleen, Ann and Michael. Due to the rotational basis on which astronauts were assigned to Apollo missions, Collins was originally scheduled to be a member of the Apollo 8 flight crew. His need for back surgery, however, forced his re- assignment to a later mission. The postponement placed Collins on the crew of Apollo 11 launched July 16, , the first manned mission to land on the lunar surface. His expertise and talents led to numerous requests for speaking engagements, articles and book reviews. In , he published Liftoff! Collins served on the boards of numerous organizations and corporations throughout the s and s. He became vice-president of field operations for the Vought Corporation in , then resigned to head his own consulting firm, Michael Collins Associates, in He retired from the Air Force Reserve with the rank of major general in He has received awards from eleven other countries and honorary degrees from six colleges and universities. In addition, there are small sets of personal correspondence and biographical materials. An assortment of honors and memorabilia completes the collection. Arrangement The collection is arranged in the following series: The series is arranged chronologically. From the Gemini 10 flight, the series contains an audio recording of the liftoff, transcripts of voice communications and mission commentaries, and photographs. The series also includes official post-mission reports and two Gemini 10 newsclipping scrapbooks. The series is arranged in subseries by material type. It also contains transcripts of mission commentary, flight communications, and press feeds during post-flight recovery of the command module. The series includes a number of audio recordings, which range from a pre-flight press conference to television coverage of the mission, and post-mission public appearances by the crew. Print media coverage of the mission may be found in a set of NASA Current News publications and other printed materials. The series contains approximately mission photos and a number of commemorative materials. Among the more unusual items are a collection of songs and poems inspired by Apollo 11 and a book of congratulatory letters from French civic leaders. Post-mission materials include files devoted to five- and ten-year anniversary observances of the moon landing and audio recordings relating to the Apollo program and missions 12 and Within subseries, materials are in chronological order wherever possible.
