During ancient times, it was believed that the third finger on the left hand held a vein that ran directly to the heart. Putting a ring on this finger was to keep the love within, never allowing it to flow out from the finger. Not all cultures wear a wedding ring on the left hand, but starting with King Edward VI in , placing the wedding band on the left hand become a tradition among English-speaking people. The Color White Pure, virginal, and innocent defines the color white, making it asymbolic choice for a bride to wear at her nuptials. The color white, however, is a recent tradition. In the past, women wore their Sunday best or made a dress that could be worn repeatedly. When Queen Victoria wed Prince Albert in , she donned a white dress, making it the official color to wear for weddings. Since then, white dresses abound at weddings, but the symbolism changed to mean happy and joyous. Japanese women wear white wedding kimonos called shiro-maku, meaning white and pure. The symbolism is much like the western culture of wearing a white bridal gown. Wearing the color white is not a marriage symbol throughout the world. In China, brides wear rich reds that symbolize joy. Indian brides wear red dresses adorned with patterns, embroidery and sequins. Wedding Flowers Once upon a time, brides carried flowers with meanings. Just as roses represent love, other botanicals have meanings, too. The language of flowers, a sometimes-complex way of lovers talking without saying a word, was also a way to create symbolic bouquets. Certain flowers and herbs are associated with weddings more than others. Orange blossoms represent everlasting life and bridal festivities. Lavender represents devotion; rosemary, remembrance; sage, domestic virtue; tulips, the decoration of love; and violets, faithfulness. Together, this smattering of flowers and herbs can add symbolism to the wedding bouquet. Each item symbolizes a good-luck token for the bride. Blue garters often take care of this part of the wish for the bride. Throwing Rice Tossing some form of food at the bride and groom is a universal symbolic gesture. Rice, which symbolizes a full pantry and fertility, came to America via the Orient. Times have changed, and rice is seldom thrown at weddings due to the danger to birds and wildlife and the possibility of someone slipping and falling. Now other items stand in for symbolic representatives of food or rice: Doves Whether a pair of doves are released at an appropriate moment or just kept in a gilded cage, there is a reason brides choose to include doves as part of the wedding ceremony: Doves also represent peace, love, innocence, devotion and purity"everything a marriage should be. Japanese Cranes Japanese weddings often include symbolic cranes in the form of origami. The crane, like the dove, mates for life, sharing the task of nest-building and caring for the young. Cranes represent peace, happiness and eternal youth. If you have the ill fortune to be married while the hands move downward, you will lose your happiness. Almonds Italian brides and grooms brought the tradition of five almonds to America. The almonds, called confetti, represent the bitter with the sweet. When guests receive five almonds, each represents one of five symbols: Jump the Broom The ancestors of African-Americans often did not choose to come to America and, once here, were forbidden to marry. When a couple fell in love, they jumped over a broom to symbolize their commitment to one another. This tradition lives today as couples jump the broom at the end of a wedding ceremony or at the reception. Unity candle The lighting of the unity candle is relatively new as far as marriage symbols go. Believed to have begun in the s,

the popularity of the unity candle grew in the last 40 years. A large pillar candle sits between two lit tapers, representing the bride and groom. At a designated point in the wedding ceremony, the couple each takes a taper and, together, they light the larger candle in the middle, blowing out their separate tapers. The symbolism behind this new tradition is that the couple leave their past behind to venture into the future together. Every culture and country claims its own wedding symbols, often steeped in historical or religious significance. Within every symbol lies a story that may hold more meaning for one couple than it does for another. Instead, she says, Buddhist symbols and elements are infused into the customs of whichever country the couple is from. Does the wedding ring have any religious significance? Religious significance of the ring Like many other pagan symbols , the ring has been adopted into Christian ceremonies and rites. There is no biblical reference decreeing the wedding ring as a requirement. The requirement is that people promise to love one another, and the ring is used to symbolise this. Bar-code, tattoo and Q-code Christians could just as easily use a written contract, tattoo a bar-code on the forehead, or any other long-lasting sign. But it was handy in the early days to simply adopt an existing and familiar identifier the ring to show that an agreement had been made. In addition to the wedding band, rings are used as powerful symbols in other parts of the Church. Peter in a boat casting his net, is worn by the Roman Catholic pope. A bishop wears a ring to signify his union with the Church. And that gives us a clue to the significance of the ring in a Christian ceremony: Just as one might be worn today by bishops but not priests , the ring was worn by leaders as a symbol or seal of authority. The symbol of authority is also used in a Christian wedding ceremony. The ring-giving symbolises one person transferring their authoritative rights to the other person. It is given as a token that one person is also transferring their valuable property to the other. And it is given as a symbol that one person promises to love the other. For most people, there are no magical, supernatural or even religious connotations to this. Love is above those things anyway. The Catholic Church introduced the ring into the ceremony in the Middle Ages. Protestants started using the ring a little while after the Catholics. In , the wedding ring finger changed from right hand to the left hand for Protestants but Catholics continued to place the ring on the right hand. The ring is not obligatory but today, almost all married Christians. These are rings worn as a sign of authority or privilege Gen. More like a type of bread, the bride was hit over the head with the cake to make her fertile. Wedding guests were encouraged to gather the pieces of cake as they fell and keep them for good luck. Symbolism of Groomsmen Groomsmen were required in the middle ages because many weddings required an actual kidnapping of the bride in order for the ceremony to take place. The groomsmen would steal the bride from other tribes or clans and bring her forcibly for the groom to marry. Another interpretation is that the groomsmen were recruited by the groom to help defend his bride from such kidnappings. White Gowns, Bouquets, and Veils White wedding gowns became the rage during the reign of Queen Victoria of England, and white was thought to represent modesty and purity for the bride. A wedding tradition as common as the white gown is the bouquet, carried today for aesthetic purposes. Originally, though, wedding bouquets included herbs such as rosemary and lavender, along with garlic, to ward off evil spirits and mask body odor. Orange blossoms were also popular, and represented fertility. Wedding veils were used by Roman and Greek brides as part of the arranged marriage process. The veils were used so the groom could not view the bride before the wedding and refuse to marry her if he did not like her looks. Another interpretation is that the veil helped conceal the bride so evil spirits would not know whom to curse. Something old was a tie to your life prior to marriage. Something new represented the joining in marriage to a new spouse. Borrowing something from a currently wedded couple was thought to provide the new bride and groom good luck in their marriage. Something blue worn by the bride represented purity and fidelity. Tossing Rice and Tying the Knot Tossing rice was a tradition started during pagan festivals as a wish for bountiful harvests. If the crops had been plentiful, grains such as wheat were thrown and if the crops had been bad, rice was thrown instead. The wedding guests also threw the rice to encourage high rates of fertility since it took many children to work the land. Tying the knot refers to the ancient Roman custom of unmarried women wearing a chastity girdle closed with a series of knots. The groom would have to untie all the knots to consummate the marriage. Symbolism of Wedding Rings The practice of wearing wedding rings is thought to have started with the Egyptians in BC. The first rings were made of braided hemp and Romans later constructed their wedding rings of iron. Doves and Weddings Doves are meant to represent peace and new beginnings. The dove held an olive branch that showed everything was not destroyed and in fact there was dry land and trees sprouting new life. In the Muslim world , there are colorful, cultural variations from place to place. All Muslim marriages have to be declared publicly and are never to be undertaken in secret. For many Muslims, it is the ceremony that counts as the actual wedding alongside a confirmation of that wedding in a registry office according to fiqh , in Islam a wedding is also viewed as a legal contract particularly in Islamic jurisprudences. However, most Muslim cultures separate both the institutions of the mosque and marriage, no religious official is necessary, but very often an Imam presides and performs the ceremony, he may deliver a short sermon. In Islam, polygyny is allowed with certain religious restrictions, despite that an overwhelming majority of Muslims traditionally practice monogamy. This ritual is still practiced widely among rural Chinese; however, young people in larger cities, as well as in Taiwan, Hong Kong, Malaysia and Singapore, tend to practice a combination of Western style of marriage together with the tea ceremony. When the bride leaves her home with the groom to his house, a "Good Luck Woman" will hold a red umbrella over her head, meaning, "Raise the bark, spread the leaves. Other relatives will scatter rice, red beans and green beans in front of her. The red umbrella protects the bride from evil spirits, and the rice and beans are to attract the attention of the gold chicken. A Good Luck Woman making the tea says auspicious phrases to bless the newlyweds and their families. The newlyweds also present tea to each other, raising the tea cups high to show respect before presenting the tea to each other. The attendants receiving the tea usually give the bride gifts such as jewelry or a red envelope. The newlyweds kneel in front of their parents, serving tea to both sides of parents, as well as elder close relatives. Parents give their words of blessing and gifts to the newlyweds. Humanist weddings[edit] Many traditions and rituals have origins in religions and are still performed by religious leaders. Those having a secular wedding often want to maintain the symbolic meaning of some customs since they have become an essential part of the culture independent of religion. In order to satisfy these needs, secular ceremonies have started to be carried out by humanist officiants worldwide. The demand for humanist wedding has been growing since then and in HSS won a legal battle and their ceremonies are now authorized by the Registrar General of Scotland. Humanist celebrants are able to perform valid civil marriages and civil partnerships in the Republic of Ireland. Secular weddings are becoming more popular in Ireland due to a declining influence of the Catholic Church. A civil wedding is a ceremony presided over by a local civil authority , such as an elected or appointed judge, Justice of the peace or the mayor of a locality. Civil wedding ceremonies may use references to God or a deity except in UK law where readings and music are also restricted , but generally no references to a particular religion or denomination. They can be either elaborate or simple. For the film, see Destination Wedding. Not to be confused with an elopement, a destination wedding is one in which a wedding is hosted, often in a vacation-like setting, at a location to which most of the invited guests must travel and often stay for several days. This could be a beach ceremony in the tropics, a lavish event in a metropolitan resort, or a simple ceremony at the home of a geographically distant friend or relative. During the recession of , destination weddings continued to see growth compared to traditional weddings, as the typically smaller size results in lower costs. From onwards, there is an increase in destination weddings that are hosted in exotic places like Indonesia, Maldives, India, and Pakistan. Double wedding[edit] A double wedding is a double ceremony where two affianced couples rendezvous for two simultaneous or consecutive weddings. Elopement[edit] Elopement is the act of getting married, often unexpectedly, without inviting guests to the wedding. In some cases, a small group of family or friends may

be present, while in others, the engaged couple may marry without the consent or knowledge of parents or others. While the couple may or may not be widely known to be engaged prior to the elopement, the wedding itself is generally a surprise to those who are later informed of its occurrence. Handfasting[edit] A handfasting is an old Pagan custom, dating back to the time of the ancient Celts. A handfasting was originally more like an engagement period, where two people would declare a binding union between themselves for a year and a day. The original handfasting was a trial marriage. Christian Wedding Image Source: Subtle and elegant, Christian weddings are a vision in monochrome, but the scenario is a little different as far as Christian weddings in India. Although the basic essence of the rituals is the same as that of a traditional Christian wedding, a host of ethnic Indian rituals have impacted almost all communities throughout the country. They are a fascinating blend of the minimal Hollywood style Christian wedding we see in the movies with adherence to pre and post wedding rituals that are essentially very Indian. Right from the wedding attires to the bridal jewelry, Indian Christian weddings are quite distinct from what we imagine. Matchmaking Matchmaking is prevalent in the Indian Christian communities and just like any other community in the country, arranged marriages are quite pervasive. Matches are generally arranged within the specific denominations of Christianity that either the bride or the groom belongs to. Once a preferred match is settled, the families meet and if everyone is satisfied, then the talks proceed. Very often than not, there is a courtship period, where the bride and the groom get to know each other. In some cultures in south India, this moment is sealed with discussion of dowry and presenting each other with Betel leaves and betel nut. It may be a somber and small affair with just close friends and relatives participating, or it may be a gala bash where acquaintances are invited for a fun-filled exciting evening. Traditionally, the groom is to present a ring to the bride and he places it on her left ring finger. This ritual symbolizes the betrothal of the girl to the groom. The rings have to be blessed by the priest either at the church or at the engagement venue. Nowadays sometimes, the bride also offers a ring to the groom which he wears on his right hand ring finger. The groom also gifts his bride-to-be with other gifts such as clothes, perfumes, handkerchiefs etc. The two families mingle with each other at a party following the ritual. The engagement is generally followed by a courtship period before the actual wedding date is fixed. The engagement is also announced at local churches and sometimes in the local newspapers also. Mostly young cousins and friends of the bride decide on a day and take the bride out for a merry night. It is a tradition for the bride to have a pink cake served to her companions where she has hidden a silver thimble. The friend of the girl who is served the piece of cake with the thimble is believed to be the next one getting married. Bachelor Party – A similar event to the bridal shower is arranged for the groom by his male friends and cousins. Although, it is purely western concept, it is gradually gaining popularity in India. It generally takes place a day before the wedding. The concept is for the groom to enjoy his last day as a bachelor. It may be a party where women are strictly not allowed and men of the family strengthen their male bonding. It is becoming more and more popular to arrange for an away trip for the bachelor in weeks prior to the wedding. Typical favorite include going for some adventure sport like hiking, climbing or trekking. For the typical adrenaline junkies, there is bungee jumping, skydiving, surfing or even diving. In other instances the group might go to a beach house and enjoy a few days of sun and surf away from the wedding buzz. It is similar to the Haldi ceremony of the Hindu weddings and takes place on the eve of the wedding day. It involves the bride and the groom taking a ritualistic bath in their respective homes. Oil drops are poured on ears and on the head, followed by coconut juice or roce which is rubbed on the head, face, hands and feet. The whole ceremony is followed by a roce prayer and then dinner with drinks. They usually wear a black or white suit depending on the theme of the wedding. He wears a white shirt and has a boutonniere on the left lapel of his jacket. Contrary to popular concept, the bride does not always wear a white frothy gown. In most Indian Christian communities in the south, sarees are preferred as wedding attires instead of a gown. Goan and Konkani Christians prefer wearing gowns than sarees. These sarees are generally silk ones with heavy gold zari threadwork paired often with a gold brocade blouse. These sarees can be white or gold or beige in color. Kerala Christian brides often wear the simple white Kasavu sarees with broad golden borders paired with white or golden blouse. They may or may not pair it with a veil. The beautifully pleated sarees are paired with gold and often diamond jewelry. If the bride chooses to wear dresses, then they wear dresses made from silk,

satin or taffeta with crochet work, paired with a long white veil. The veil is often pinned to the head where the bride mostly sports an up do with a tiara. The bride generally carries a bridal bouquet which may be fully white or may have colorful flowers in them. Similar to the bride, the bridesmaids may wear sarees or dresses in different colors that are mostly not white. Their outfits are generally color coordinated to set off the bridal outfit beautifully. The priest is to bless the bridal dress before it is handed over to the bride. The bride gets ready in her house and sets off for the church in a car sent by the groom with some of her friends, generally bridesmaids. **The Wedding Mass** – Preceding the actual wedding ceremony, a wedding mass is held in most Indian Christian weddings especially in Roman Catholic orders. During the mass, prayers and hymns are performed by the priest. The program starts with an opening prayer which the guests can join in. Following the opening prayer, the Bible is read both from the New as well as the Old Testament. Next part of the program is singing the Psalm, either by the guests or the church soloist. This is followed by the priest rendering the sermons. **The Wedding Vows** – After completion of the wedding mass, the priest starts the actual marriage rituals by uttering the Opening remarks where he gives a short speech about virtues of marriage and in some cases about the bride and groom. The bride and groom then are asked to utter the vows of marriage. In India, the vows are mostly decided by the priest and the couple just utters them after him. **Solemnizing of the Marriage** – The marriage is solemnized by first exchanging wedding rings. These are mostly simple gold wedding bands that are placed on the left hand ring finger of both the bride and groom by each other. Thali is essentially akin to the Mangalsutra, having a leaf-shaped pendant with the symbol of the cross embedded on it, which is strung on a gold chain. The Matrakodi or the Wedding Saree is handed over by the groom to the bride, which she has to wear over her head. Next the bride and groom are blessed by the priest and declared Husband and Wife. They hold hand together and march down from the dais to seek blessings from the elders. **Post-wedding Rituals Reception** - After completion of the wedding ceremony, the couple exits the church amid excited cheering and showering of confetti by the guests. The newlywed couple, along with all the invitees, moves to a banquet hall to attend the wedding reception. There may or may not be speeches from the best man and maid of honor, but there is always cutting of the wedding cake by the bride and groom who feed each other the first two pieces before it is distributed among the guests. Sometimes, there is a live band or DJ present to encourage the guests to dance.

7: What Do Various Wedding Symbols Really Mean?

The Celtic Christian church used it to represent the Holy Trinity, but other cultures used the symbol too and each attached its own meaning to it. Below, we take an in-depth look at the Trinity knot and outline its history as well as analyzing what it meant to the various cultures that adopted it as a symbol. The Trinity knot consists of three corners, some designs also include the circle in the center. It has also been found on carved stones in Northern Europe dating from the 8th century AD and on early Germanic coins. The legendary Book of Kells, believed to be from the early 9th century, also bears the Trinity knot symbol amongst its other decorative artwork. The Triquetra is deemed to be the simplest knot which may come as a surprise to those of you who believe it is a complex design! Along with other Celtic knotwork design, the Trinity knot enjoyed a golden age which lasted until the Norman Invasion whereupon this form of artwork went into decline. Celtic knotwork was essentially kept alive during the dark period due to patronage from Gaelic aristocrats. By the 15th century, knotwork once again became seen as part of a political and cultural identity and symbols such as the Trinity knot once again began to adorn weapons and jewelry. Yet instances of the Trinity knot being used as decoration significantly reduced from the period of the Jacobean Rebellion in the mid 18th century. What Does It Mean? One of the great things about the Trinity knot is its versatility; it has been used as a symbol in a variety of religions and even today, it has new significance. In its original form of vesicae pisces, it incorporates the fish which is a popular Christian symbol. Occasionally, you may see the Trinity knot enclosed within a circle as a means of emphasizing unity or eternity. Christians believe the Triquetra began with monks who brought the symbol with them along with their faith when converting the Celts. Yet many historians believe original knotwork symbols such as the Trinity knot are Celtic in origin. However, at least one eminent historian believes the Trinity knot is not related to the Holy Trinity at all. The Christians used the knot to symbolize the Holy Trinity and added a circle to represent eternal life. He goes on to say that any symbolism held by the Triquetra probably comes from the pagan era where it more than likely had an affinity with the Triskele. The mother as a goddess is representative of creation, the maiden is representative of innocence and the crone is representative of wisdom. It is also representative of the forces of nature earth, fire and water and the three interlocking circles are symbolic of female fertility. Other Possible Meanings According to the Celts, the most important things in the world came in threes; three domains earth, sea and sky, three elements, three stages of life etc. It is also possible that the Triquetra signified the lunar and solar phases. During excavations of various archaeological sites from the Celtic era, a number of Trinity knot symbols have been found alongside solar and lunar symbols. In The Modern Era As is the case with a lot of Celtic symbolism, the Trinity knot has been assigned a host of new meanings in the modern age. One of the best known uses of the Triquetra comes from the hit TV series Charmed, featuring three sisters who happen to be witches. The Triquetra has also been used in several more TV shows and can be seen on clothing lines, the cover of CDs and on a host of other ornate artistic designs.
