This year is the 65th anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy; prepare for big crowds especially from June 1 to This museum, south of Ste. Mere-Eglise, is a hit with enthusiasts as every display case shows incredible attention to detail. It also has a remarkable selection of D-Day paraphernalia for sale both original items and replicas.
