In a strange twist, after losing a bid for reelection, Royal was shot dead by an assassin as he cleaned out his desk in the Pecos County Courthouse. The murder remains unsolved, and the bloodstained desk now sits across the street at the Annie Riggs Memorial Museum, a good place to learn more about the general history of Fort Stockton and the area. Radiation Fog, or Tule Fog as it is known in the Central Valley, develops on clear nights with light wind when the ground is moist. At night, the ground cools rapidly, which in turn cools the air near the surface. As the air cools, the moisture is condensed into tiny water droplets and fog is formed. As this process continues, the depth of the fog layer gradually increases and becomes more dense, often reducing visibility to one-quarter mile or less. The long nights of late fall and winter are ideal for this type of fog development. As the population has increased, we have seen the fog decrease. After the gold rush, many worked for the railroads and land reclamation projects in the Sacramentoâ€™San Joaquin River Delta and remained in Stockton. By , Stockton was home to the third-largest Chinese community in California. Discriminatory laws, in particular the Chinese Exclusion Act of , restricted immigration and prevented the Chinese from buying property. Only after the Magnuson Act was repealed in , were American-born Chinese allowed to buy property and own buildings. Incorporation The city was officially incorporated on July 23, , by the county court, and the first city election was held on July 31, In , the City of Stockton received its charter from the State of California. The historical population diversity is reflected in Stockton street names, architecture, numerous ethnic festivals, and in the faces and heritage of a majority of its citizens. Many Chinese were immigrating to California as workers in these years, especially for the Transcontinental Railroad. On Thanksgiving Day, Nov.
