Ruth DeYoung Kohler, Director of the John Michael Kohler Arts Center (JMKAC), has announced her decision to dedicate much of her attention in the coming years to the creation of the Art Preserve, the world's first major facility dedicated to the study of art environments and their preservation, conservation, and public presentation.

FoFS values strong, positive and transparent collaborations with several community partners and strives to provide to the public, cultural, historical and artistic resources which have the capacity to broaden our views, expand our collective and individual potentials and bring people together for the common good. To this end, the responsibilities of the Executive Director are as follows: General Communications Facilitate board meetings per year and arrange quarterly Executive and Finance Committee meetings and monthly Educational Programming Committee meetings. Coordinate and produce an Annual Report. Collaborate with other non-profit and statewide organizations to create a sense of a common good for area residents and promote the FoFS mission. Develop promotional package and ongoing communication with foundation management companies. Develop a good working relationship with all board members. Work closely with the FoFS President to identify organizational needs and facilitate board oversight. Work closely with Conservation Committee Chair to support site preservation; serve as liaison with area technicians. Expand grant support for FoFS activities and general operating support. Develop a Donor Database. Establish relationships with current Foundations that support FoFS; seek additional foundation support. With the Administrative Assistant, develop and assist in coordinating annual membership drives and fund raising efforts. Working with the Finance Committee, develop a long range strategy for fund raising and long term financial stability. Education, Programming, Events Develop and coordinate activities with area schools. Identify community needs and desires to coordinate the educational programming at the park throughout the year in accordance with the FoFS Mission. Develop advanced programming which will provide ongoing educational opportunities in specific media as well as a revenue stream for FoFS. Research other possible venues to serve area residents through introducing the arts into everyday life. Develop an annual budget and review with Finance Committee. Handle all accounts payable and receivable. Perform all payroll duties including withholdings and payments to staff, recording data for tax purposes, and overseeing payments to state and federal authorities. Cooperate fully with FoFS accountant to meet all financial and reporting obligations of the organization. Record and track all details and listservs of workshops participants, events, memberships, fund raisers, donors, donations and inventory. Respond to all inquiries in a timely fashion. Work with Administrative Assistant to develop promotional graphics and avenues of dissemination including social media. Wade House, a large Greek Revival structure built in , harks back to a time when its proprietors thought their new hometown of Greenbush would become a bustling mecca. Greenbush sat on the plank road between Sheboygan and Fond du Lac, attracting travelers who needed a place to grab a meal and hang their hats for a night. During its heyday, the room Wade House offered the amenities of the more "civilized" East. Visitors today are shown around by guides in period costumes. The inn was restored in the early s by Ruth DeYoung Kohler, through efforts supported by the Kohler Foundation, which deeded to property to the Wisconsin Historical Society. This water-powered mill cuts boards and planks from logs and replicates the one owned by Theodor Herrling, who immigrated to Wisconsin from Leipzig, Germany. The new mill, which opened to the public in , is one of a very few working, water-powered sawmills of its type in North America. View a virtual tour of the Herrling Sawmill. In , carriage maker Jacob Jung left his native country to settle in Sheboygan. In , his collection of vintage vehicles opened as a museum on the grounds of Wade House. The wagons and carriages are splendid and almost startling in their variety: Their designs are as varied as the purposes they were made to serve. Take a virtual tour of the Wesley Jung Carriage Museum. The season for Wade House runs until October 15 the annual season runs from mid-May to mid-October. Its hours through the remainder of the season are 10 a. Civil War buffs will particularly enjoy the weekend of Sept. The event is one of the largest encampments and battle reenactments in the Midwest. In addition to the battles at 2 p.
