In property law, alienation is the voluntary act of an owner of some property disposing of the property, while alienable is the capacity for a piece of property or a property right to be sold or otherwise transferred from one party to another.

What is alienable land? Alienable land in property law is land that has the capacity to be transferred to by mortgage or by deed. Property is generally deemed to be alienable unless there were restrictions placed on it when it was acquired by the owner. Contrast the related legal principal of fee tail or an entailed estate. Under common law the recipient of the estate by primogeniture could not sell it or freely give it away during his life nor after his death by will. The estate was said to be entailed. Fee tails were intended to keep the family land intact and in the family line, generally through the male line. An alien receipt number is the number that is found on your passport. So a person from China who is living in Canada is an alien, unless that person has obtained Canadian citizenship. Similarly, a person from Canada living in China is an alien unless Chinese citizenship has been obtained. Because of the popularity of certain kinds of fiction, the concept of an "alien from outer space" has been shortened in common speech to just "alien. Aliens of this sort have not been detected, although many scientists believe it likely that they exist at great distances from us. Who was the first alien to land on earth? No verifiable evidence has ever been presented to indicate that any alien has ever landed on earth. However, complex organic molecules have been shown to exist in meteorites, so some of the origins of organic life could be called "alien". It has also been suggested that life itself was brought to earth by asteroids or meteorites see exogenesis and panspermia, making all life inherently "alien". These hypotheses have no evidence backing them, of course, and are not really useful. In science, the simplest explanation that fits the facts is preferred. Alienation is common among teenagers. It can also be a side effect of: Teens can often feel isolated from their parents, teachers, and peers. They may feel anxious about their social skills or physical appearance. Teens can even feel isolated from their own identity. This can happen as they discover themselves and think about their future. Adolescent alienation is only considered a symptom if it accompanies other disorders, such as a phobia or a personality disorder. Parental causes Parental alienation is a term that broadly describes negative, alienating behaviors displayed by a parent, like not being present. Parental alienation syndrome describes a psychiatric disorder in children, particularly in the context of divorce. Rejection of a parent has multiple factors. These can include interactions from both parents and feelings of vulnerability from the child. This is not the same alienation that a child may feel toward a parent who is abusive, particularly if the child severs ties with that parent as an adult. How is alienation treated? To treat alienation, the cause must be identified. People who experience psychological pain because of alienation may benefit from seeing a mental health professional. Gaining a feeling of empowerment may also help a person battle alienation. For adolescents, a sense of purpose is an asset. But searching for that purpose can induce stress. Researchers suggest that parental support can help teens who experience alienation due to feelings of purposelessness. Research also shows that a strong parent-child relationship can help a child cope with bullying. This is another possible cause of alienation during childhood. Feeling alienated can lead to many different social problems that include:
