The officers saw the need for the formation of twelve Panzer divisions and six corps staffs with accompanying Corps troops, as only armored divisions could muster a fighting force to throw back the numerically far superior forces of the Warsaw Pact. This Defence Ministry forerunner was known somewhat euphemistically as the Blank Office Amt Blank , but explicitly used to prepare for the rearmament of West Germany Wiederbewaffnung. Plans foresaw the formation of six infantry, four armoured, and two mechanised infantry divisions, as the German contribution to the defense of Western Europe in the framework of a European Defence Community. The nucleus of army was the so-called V Branch of the Department of Defence.
