At the same time, author Frederick J. Murphy makes his work accessible to critical Biblical study beginners by the clarity of his presentation of the developmental stages of apocalypticism, its vestiges in current belief and practice, and by the side bars, boxes, charts, illustrations, and very useful bibliographies found in each chapter. It would make an excellent textbook in a variety of courses. The whole book would serve well in a course on ancient apocalypticism. Chapters 1-3, would be excellent reading in an introductory course on the Hebrew Bible or Second Temple Judaism. Chapters 4-6, would work well as readings in an introduction to the New Testament. This introduction is indeed comprehensive and does justice to the phenomenon of Jewish and Christian apocalypticism against the background of its founding documents, and it will be useful for graduate students as well as postgraduate students who do not specialize in the field of apocalypticism. This portion of the book also contains much that would count as standard introductory material on the New Testament in general. Indeed, I know of no other book quite like it in scope and detail. For those new to the topic, this book will serve as a resource to which they will repeatedly return. It has clearly been written with beginning students in mind. This is a book that can be recommended enthusiastically. The book has a three-pronged focus: Illustrations, charts, diagrams, conclusions at the end of every chapter, and a helpful glossary enhance the pedagogical value of this volume. Several Christian ministries promote the idea that the earth is less than 10,000 years old, which they say comes from the Bible. In reality, the Bible makes no claim as to the age of the earth, although it does establish a minimum age. History of the age of the earth As indicated earlier, the Bible does not fix the age of the earth, contrary to the claims of Answers in Genesis. Archbishop Ussher took the genealogies of Genesis, assuming they were complete, and calculated all the years to arrive at a date for the creation of the earth on Sunday, October 23, B.C. There are a number of other assumptions implicit in the calculation. The first, and foremost, assumption is that the genealogies of Genesis are complete, from father to son throughout the entire course of human existence. The second assumption is that the Genesis creation "days" were exactly hours in length. It turns out that both assumptions are false. Incomplete genealogies Biblical Genealogies Although Archbishop Ussher assumed the Genesis genealogies were complete, it is clear from the rest of the Bible that those genealogies were telescoped some names were left out for the sake of brevity, which is common in biblical genealogies but rare in modern genealogies. Similarly, the key genealogical terms such as "son" and "father" have much broader meanings in Hebrew than their corresponding English words. The Hebrew word translated "son" can also have the meaning of "grandson," "great grandson," "descendant," etc. Having a proper understanding of biblical genealogies is a prerequisite to attempting to address the Genesis genealogies. By cross referencing the biblical genealogies with other events dated in the Bible, one can find instances where numerous genealogies were telescoped, resulting in the exclusion of numerous generations of individuals. When examining individual genealogies, one can find examples where individuals are excluded or added to the lists found in Genesis. The fact that the genealogies of the Bible are given symmetrically where the numbers of generations in each group are identical lends credence to the argument that they are representative of generations found throughout human history. More information about the biblical genealogies can be found in our article, The Genesis Genealogies: Length of creation days Most people who read English translations of the Bible assume that the English words have the same meaning as the original languages in which the Bible was written Hebrew and Aramaic for the Old Testament, and Greek for the New Testament. In fact, the original biblical languages contained many fewer words than modern English, which means that the words in those languages had more different meanings. Although many Christians claim this makes the days exactly hours in length, the Hebrew word translated "day" in English actually has three literal translations; the daylight portion of a hour day, a hour day, and a long, unspecified period of time as in "day of the dinosaurs". The intended meaning of the word should be determined from the context. Although some Christians claim the days of creation are exactly hours in length, it is apparent from the literal reading of the Genesis 1 text that this is not so. Two days stand out, in particular. On the third day, God created the plants. Then God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees bearing fruit after their kind, with seed in them, on the earth"; and it was so. And the earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing fruit, with seed in them, after their kind; and God saw that it was good. Instead of creating a world filled with full-grown plants, God actually created seeds and planted those. We understand this from the word "sprout," 8 which refers to God allowing the earth to produce plants through germination sprouting. The Hebrew word *dasha* tells us that God used processes identical to what we see on the earth today. Plants sprouted, grew to maturity, and produced seeds. Several kinds of plants are described. The Hebrew word *deshe* 9 refers primarily to grasses; the word *eseb* 10 refers primarily to herbs and the words *peri* 11 *ets* 12 refer to fruit trees. Some Christians claim that God could have sped up the process so that it all this sprouting and growing happened within a period of

hours. However, the text clearly states that the land produced the vegetation and trees. Conjecture about what God could have done to speed up the process have no biblical support and directly contradict what the text actually says. Since fruit trees take several years to mature and produce fruit, the third "day" must have been at least several years long. The sixth day was also a very busy "day". Since it would seem likely that more of the earlier genealogies are missing, the estimate is likely low, probably being more in line with the biblical 40, years. From a scientific standpoint, I would place the creation of Adam as the first modern human Homo sapiens sapiens , corresponding with the explosion of sophisticated tool making, art, and religious worship in Europe, about 50, years ago. Therefore, the time that humanity has existed on earth is in the tens of thousands of years rather than thousands of years. The days of creation can be shown to be longer than ordinary calendar days, with at least two of the days being years long or longer in addition to the seventh day, which is a minimum of thousands of years long. So, although the Bible may give us an approximate date for the creation of human beings, we can only guess at how long the other creation "days" are. The absolute age of the earth has been most accurately measured through radioactive decay of its rocks. So, the oldest known rock formations have been dated to 4. Meteorites from the solar system that have landed on the earth have been dated to 4. Radioactive decay Radioactive Table of Elements There are over elements in the periodic table right. The atomic number which defines each element is a function of the number of protons positively charged , which is exactly balanced by the number of electrons negatively charged. The number of neutrons each consisting of a proton and electron, being charge-neutral within each atom is usually about the same as the number of protons, although some elements can exist in different forms called isotopes based upon different numbers of neutrons. A fundamental physical law, called the weak nuclear force, determines the stability of atoms that contain differing numbers of neutrons. Some isotopes are somewhat or very unstable and decay in a predictable way and at a predictable rate. Depending upon the isotope, this decay can occur in several different ways. One form of radioactive decay consists of a neutron decaying into a proton and electron, which is ejected from the nucleus. In other forms of radioactive decay, a proton combines with an electron to form a neutron, resulting in its atomic number decreasing by one. Still another form of radioactive decay results in the emission of an alpha particle two neutrons and two protons , which lowers the atomic number by 2 and mass by 4. Both the original amount of an element and its decay products can be measured to determine the age of the sample. Isotopes and the age of the earth The important thing about radioactive decay is that it provides us with clocks that allow us to determine the ages of various materials on the earth.

The stability of a particular isotope determines its "half-life," the amount of time required for half of the atoms to decay. Half-lives of isotopes vary from billions of years or longer to fractions of a second. The existence of certain isotopes on the earth give us a minimum age for the earth. It is significant that there are over unstable isotopes, although the vast majority of those do not exist naturally on the planet. It turns out that every isotope other than those which are products of other radioactive decay or are formed today with a half-life less than 80 million years do not exist. An earth that was only tens of thousands of years old would be expected to contain isotopes with half lives less than thousands of years long. Some young earth creationists have attempted to get around the radioisotope problem by claiming that the half-lives of radioactive elements were shorter in the past. However, since the half-lives of radioisotopes vary over many orders of magnitude, this would require that God would have had to have changed pre-fall or pre-flood physics to adjust the decay rates of individual isotopes more or less compared to others. Needless to say, creationists who propose such special pleading have never produced any kind of coherent scientific model for how this contrived idea might have been accomplished. In addition, the Bible tells us that the physics of the universe are constant and "fixed,"²² suggesting that such special pleading is incongruent with biblical theology. As stated previously, the oldest rock formations are just over 4. Since the moon has no measureable tectonics, its oldest rocks date from 4. With the assumption that all the solar system bodies were formed at the same time,²³ scientists have dated meteorites to determine the age of the solar system. Using different isochron methods, the dates for all these meteorites fall in the same rangeâ€”from 4.

Sample of what is presented in one of the Gospels The Gospels are presented as matter-of-fact, "this is how it was. One typical example is the account in Luke, chapter 8, where Jesus brings a little girl back to life. Notice the details and clarity in its reporting: As Jesus was on his way, the crowds almost crushed him. And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years, but no one could heal her. She came up behind him and touched the edge of his cloak, and immediately her bleeding stopped. When they all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the people are crowding and pressing against you. In the presence of all the people, she told why she had touched him and how she had been instantly healed. Then he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Meanwhile, all the people were wailing and mourning for her. But he took her by the hand and said, "My child, get up! Then Jesus told them to give her something to eat. Her parents were astonished, but he ordered them not to tell anyone what had happened. If it were fiction, there are portions of it that would have been written differently. And in writing fiction, would Jesus have ordered the parents to be quiet about it? You would expect the healing to make a grand point. People do react oddly. And Jesus had his own reasons for not wanting the parents to broadcast this. The best test of the Gospels authenticity is to read it for yourself. Does it read like a report of real events, or like fiction? If it is real, then God has revealed himself to us. Jesus came, lived, taught, inspired, and brought life to millions who read his words and life today. What Jesus stated in the gospels, many have found reliably true: Those living in the Jerusalem region were witnesses of Jesus and well aware of his ministry. If you would like to know more about Jesus, this article will give you a good summary of his life: How the books of the New Testament were determined. The early church accepted the New Testament books almost as soon as they were written. The other New Testament writers had immediate access to Jesus as well: James and Jude were half-brothers of Jesus who initially did not believe in him. Peter was one of the 12 apostles. Paul started out as a violent opponent of Christianity and a member of the religious ruling class, but he became an ardent follower of Jesus, convinced that Jesus rose from the dead. The reports in the New Testament books lined up with what thousands of eyewitnesses had seen for themselves. For example, the Gospel of Judas was written by the Gnostic sect, around A. The Gospel of Thomas, written around A. These and other Gnostic gospels conflicted with the known teachings of Jesus and the Old Testament, and often contained numerous historical and geographical errors. Soon after, Jerome and Augustine circulated this same list. These lists, however, were not necessary for the majority of Christians. By and large the whole church had recognized and used the same list of books since the first century after Christ. As the church grew beyond the Greek-speaking lands and needed to translate the Scriptures, and as splinter sects continued to pop up with their own competing holy books, it became more important to have a definitive list. Historians confirm what the Bible says about Jesus. Not only do we have well-preserved copies of the original manuscripts, we also have testimony from both Jewish and Roman historians. The gospels report that Jesus of Nazareth performed many miracles, was executed by the Romans, and rose from the dead. Christus [Christ], from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of one of our procurators, Pontius Pilatus From Josephus, "we learn that Jesus was a wise man who did surprising feats, taught many, won over followers from among Jews and Greeks, was believed to be the Messiah, was accused by the Jewish leaders, was condemned to be crucified by Pilate, and was considered to be resurrected. Even the Jewish Talmud, certainly not biased toward

Jesus, concurs about the major events of his life. From the Talmud, "we learn that Jesus was conceived out of wedlock, gathered disciples, made blasphemous claims about himself, and worked miracles, but these miracles are attributed to sorcery and not to God. Yet ancient historians Jews, Greeks and Romans confirm the major events that are presented in the New Testament, even though they were not believers themselves. Does it matter if Jesus really did and said what is in the Gospels? For faith to really be of any value, it must be based on facts, on reality. If you were taking a flight to London, you would probably have faith that the jet is fueled and mechanically reliable, the pilot trained, and no terrorists on board. Your faith, however, is not what gets you to London. Your faith is useful in that it got you on the plane. But what actually gets you to London is the integrity of the plane, pilot, etc. You could rely on your positive experience of past flights. But your positive experience would not be enough to get that plane to London. What matters is the object of your faith -- is it reliable? Is the New Testament an accurate, reliable presentation of Jesus? We can trust the New Testament because there is enormous factual support for it. On the website, "The Lying Pen of Scribes," scholars and scientists have identified more than 70 purported Dead Sea Scroll fragments that have surfaced on the antiquities market since Kipp Davis, an expert on the Dead Sea Scrolls at Trinity Western University in Canada, was one of several academics who has tried to warn Christians, including the Green family, about the forgeries. Evangelicals and others whose faith motivates them to collect artifacts should be very careful with antiquities dealers eager to pique their interest in supposedly ancient scraps of scripture. Scholars have theorized that forgers write on top of ancient scraps of papyrus or leather, making the scrolls appear authentic until the ink is tested. Their report, which the Bible Museum said they recently received, "further raises suspicions about the authenticity of all five fragments. But then Bedouin shepherds stumbled on the scrolls, hidden away for nearly 2, years in caves in Qumran, on the western shore of the Dead Sea. The discovery was so vast, with more than manuscripts and an estimated 50, fragments, it took six decades for scholars to excavate and publish them all. For decades, it was almost impossible for private collectors to get their hands on even scraps from the famous archeological find. But in , new fragments began mysteriously appearing on the market. The Greens bought their fragments between At the time, they were deeply involved in the antiquities trade, amassing a collection of some 40, artifacts. Some scholars accused the Greens of buying too many artifacts too quickly, without being sure exactly where they came from, or who had owned them in the past.

The Old Testament is the original Hebrew Bible, the sacred scriptures of the Jewish faith, written at different times between about 1200 and 400 BC. The Old Testament The Law The Hebrew Bible has 39 books, written over a long period of time, and is the literary archive of the ancient nation of Israel. It was traditionally arranged in three sections. The first five books, Genesis to Deuteronomy. Genesis is a book of stories, with nothing remotely like rules and regulations, and though the other four do contain community laws they also have many narratives. Some parts undoubtedly date from that period, but as things changed old laws were updated and new ones produced, and this was the work of later editors over several centuries. Sometimes, the prophets could be mime artists and dramatists, accompanying their actions by short spoken messages, often delivered in poetic form. These were the sound bites of their day, which made it easy for others to remember them and then write them down. This section also includes the last books of the Hebrew Bible to be written: Ezra, Nehemiah, and Chronicles all history books, and Daniel visions of a better world. The Letters Letters were the natural way for itinerant church leaders to communicate with their converts, and the earliest ones were written before the Gospels. With some exceptions Romans, Hebrews, they were not meant to be formal presentations of Christian belief, but offered advice to people who were working out how to express their commitment to Jesus in ways that would be relevant to the many different cultural contexts in which they found themselves throughout the Roman empire. Reading them can be like listening to one half of a conversation, as the writers give answers to questions sent to them either verbally or in writing. Paul was the most prolific writer of such letters, though he was not the only one. The Gospels The Gospels were written to present the life and teachings of Jesus in ways that would be appropriate to different readerships, and for that reason are not all the same. They were not intended to be biographies of Jesus, but selective accounts that would demonstrate his significance for different cultures. The writer of Luke also wrote the Acts of the Apostles, which tells the story of how Christianity spread from being a small group of Jewish believers in the time of Jesus to becoming a worldwide faith in less than a generation. The New Testament concludes with the book of Revelation, which begins with a series of letters to seven churches in the area of Asia Minor modern Turkey, but then offers a visionary presentation of the meaning of all things, from creation to the end of the world.
