The Day After Judgment is a fantasy novel by American writer James Blish. It is a sequel to the novel Black Easter: they have been subsequently republished in as a single book called The Devil's Day.

But he shall say, I tell you, I know you not whence ye are; depart from me, all ye workers of iniquity. There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of God, and you yourselves thrust out. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then I saw a great white throne and him who was seated on it. From his presence earth and sky fled away, and no place was found for them. And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Then another book was opened, which is the book of life. And the dead were judged by what was written in the books, according to what they had done. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire. The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen! But I will warn you whom to fear: Yes, I tell you, fear him! After the Judgment, the Righteous will go to their eternal reward in Heaven and the Accursed will depart to Hell see Matthew A soul in Purgatory will always reach Heaven, but those in Hell will be there eternally. At that time, all will be resurrected. Those who were in purgatory will have already been purged, meaning they would have already been released into Heaven, and so like those in Heaven and Hell will resurrect with their bodies. These differences may only be apparent and not actual due to differing theological terminology and tradition.

There is no need whatsoever to have read *A Case of Conscience* or *Doctor Mirabilis*, but these final two should be treated as a pair. And it is an odd pairing. *Black Easter* was a short, pungent and fantastically realistic demonology with understated portents for the Cold War. The brevity gave it weight, and the ending to that book sold the analogy more effectively than additional chapters or a sequel could have. The very existence of *The Day After Judgment* takes away some of the forcefulness of the predecessor volume. It picks up immediately after the events of *Black Easter* and considers what follows the apocalypse. This volume, however, is much more of a Cold War satire, focusing more on nationalism and ignorance and rigid militaristic impulses. I started reading that chapter with some apprehension. The scene was set for a dramatic and profound conclusion. But then Blish felt the need to deliver the climactic revelations through pages of early modern English verse. Yee whose coming fame had bodied forth a hope archaic even to this Deep That Wee should be amerced of golden Throne Since nothing else in the book had followed that style, it was an ostentatious choice that made the ending unnecessarily cumbersome. Once deciphered, one finds it contains an astonishing idea, an idea that was worth writing a book about. Unfortunately the book that preceded those final pages did not prepare for this ending, and it was instead another stylistic choice - the "ending with a flourish. To be able to mix a hard science fiction novel, in "*A Case of Conscience*" with impeccably researched *Black Magic*, and tie them together with a theological theme, supported by fascinating characters was a huge achievement. And yes, I know Blish had his flaws as a writer. He never once produced a female character who was more than a cipher, and he did churn out some true pulp. I can forgive him that, for the two outstanding series. I genuinely believe Blish, "*Cities in Flight*" and "*After Such Knowledge*" are massively underestimated even by science fiction fans. Drawing extensively from actual magical rituals, the "always-delivers" Mr Blish imagines an international arms dealer employing a real wizard to unleash all the demons from Hell onto Earth for one night of Revelations-style armageddo-fun while a Vatican rep watches on, observer-style, because the Cosmic rules the contract between God and Satan prevent him from intervening. Undeniably downbeat at the end, these two volumes skip through descriptions of magical ritual, demonic emergence and play and the arrival of the City of Dis with wit and aplomb.

Thereupon, the world will emerge with a new design on the mess and ruins of this world. The resurrection of human beings shall take place in that new world. There are also other evidences in the Quran which somehow substantiate the temporariness of this world. For example, the Holy Quran says, "We created not the heavens and the earth and all between them but for just ends, and for a Term Appointed. Many Christians think the Bible teaches us about three judgment days: It is reserved for the judgment of Christians only. Born again believers in Christ Jesus will give an account of their lives to Christ. It will occur immediately following the rapture and it is about receiving rewards rather than being punished for the sins. The rapture includes the glorification or resurrection of the bodies of believers. One of the passages pointed by those who believe in the three judgments include 2 Corinthians 5: This judgment will take place at the end of Tribulation period that is after rapture occurs. Jesus will come and take all believers into heaven at the rapture. Those who remain and survive the tribulation and believe in Christ will gain opportunity to enter the Millennium of the Messiah. This is a final condemnation of the unrighteous dead at the end of all time, after the end of the world and before the beginning of the New Heavens and New Earth. This judgment is based on passages such as Revelation Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books. Other Christians believe there will be two judgments. They claim Sheeps and Goats Judgment is the first judgment and will occur after the Tribulation period and before the Millennium of the Messiah. The second one is the "final judgment" and it is described in the Bible by passages about the Judgment Seat of Christ and Great White Throne Judgment - those speak of the same one. The final judgment will take place before the beginning of the New Heavens and New Earth. Others claim The Judgment Day will happen one time. Other Christians believe that all three of these judgments previously pointed speak of the same final judgment in Revelation This will be the time that believers and unbelievers alike are judged. For some Christians, including those who believe in "Full Preterism," the judgment day was already fulfilled in the 1st century. They believe that all or a majority of Bible prophecy was fulfilled, with some pointing that it happened by AD 70 when Jesus came in the clouds, in the Great White Throne Judgment, when Jerusalem and the Temple were destroyed. Others, including some "historicists" and "idealists," associate the judgment day to some historical events or personal experiences, taking the judgment with a non-literal approach. Some Christians believe that the book of Revelation portrays the span of church history, from the 1st century to the return of Christ. Therefore, events in Revelation are symbolically interpreted to portray literal events in the life of the Church and that Kingdom of Heaven, and judgment may take place subjectively for the individual.
