Many of them have become citizens in their adopted countries. Although second- and third-generation Igorots who were far removed from their native origins, many of the participants were ready to trace and appreciate their origin and to reaffirm the positive values of their culture. By the 18th century, they were spelling it igorrote. Igorot is thus a general term for mountain people. What the Spaniards failed to do in years, however, the Americans did in a few decades through both hard and soft approaches. The Americans used Christianization and education to conquer the hearts and minds of the un-Hispanized Igorots. They also used their Constabulary to subdue those who resisted. The Igorots were conquerable after all. Thanks to the superiority of American ways and their means of conquest. Prejudice Despite the presence of experts in the consultation, the participants were not able to come up with a common consensus on the broader definition of the Igorot and whether ethnolinguistic groups under this broader group should be referred to as such. She said the term had been imposed on them by factors such as the media and tourism. She said it had not been part of their cultural heritage. Most Kankanaey tribes are in Mt. Province while Ibalois come from Benguet. Ifugao participants said they did not want to be called Igorots and preferred to be called Ifugaos. Those coming from Kalinga preferred to be called Kalingas. She attributes this to the continuing rise to prominence in both government and private sectors of educated people from the mountain provinces who are now willing to proclaim to one and all that they are Igorots. He cites an experience when he was visiting his hometown of Bontoc, Mt. The old man enumerated accusations of fraud, vote-buying, tampering with ballot results and the like. To this, Claver again posed a challenging question to the consultation participants: Hope But can Igorots help solve or help lead in the huge task of addressing a national problem such as corruption? Those involved in the program were ordinary people who helped guard ballots in the last elections but who realized that it is not enough to have clean elections.

The site officially was put in deferred status in 1992. In 1993, it was put in referred status, pending for the dossier to be submitted by the local authorities of Batanes. In 1994, all the documents were ready except for the dossier. UNESCO set early 1995 as the deadline for the dossier for site inscription, however, the local officials of Batanes failed to make a dossier, and thus, the site was officially taken out from referred status. Due to this, the process of nomination made in 1995 would be repeated again. The society appealed to the local government to stop the non-traditional buildings, but the local government lashed out at the society in retaliation. Numerous traditional Ivatan houses were being converted into hollow block houses for the benefit of local politicians. In 1996, the government of Batanes made a late World Heritage bid, but failed due to lack of cultural protections, lack of a holistic dossier, and the establishment of non-traditional buildings which have been approved by the provincial and municipal governments of Batanes at the time. Prompted by failures of past officials, the local governments of Batanes afterwards converged and declared a province-wide cultural and natural conservation program. The National Museum of the Philippines initiated the establishment of a branch museum in the province to preserve Ivatan heritage. Once all conservation programs are deemed successful and fulfilled, the Philippines aims to nominate Batanes again within the next decade. Three factors were cited for the lack of world heritage declarations in the Philippines, namely, 1 the lack of awareness about UNESCO World Heritage among local stakeholders, especially the indigenous communities, local governments and residents that live around these potential sites, 2 the absence of competent people who are fully aware of the processes involved in preparing and providing the correct documents for nomination as World Heritage, and 3 the lack of government funding to prepare and support these nominations, among many others. It was also noted that describing a nominated property as "unique" is the worst argument one could give for UNESCO nomination as all sites are not unique and there are always similar properties it can be compared with. According to UNESCO, the most important part of the nomination is the Comparative Analysis of the site as extensive comparison with other similar properties is vital to prove OUV and push nomination forward. Due to this, the Filipino delegations acknowledged the need to rewrite the dossier for Batanes, as it was rejected before due to many lacking information for an actual nomination to be accepted by UNESCO. Due to these findings, the Philippine government would later establish a world heritage nomination workshop series from 2000 to 2005 for the tentative sites and possible tentative sites of the country. The criticism against the project was further enlarged by social media, and a few days later, the provincial government retracted the proposal. In 2006, the faithful restoration of the sites began. The dossier for the site has yet to be completed by the local government unit and the national government. Similar dossiers are being finished by other baroque churches in the country. Once complete, the extension nomination for the Baroque Churches of the Philippines can commence in Paris. The original tentative list before the March revision enlisted 28 sites. Many of the sites removed from the list were sites hit by Typhoon Haiyan and the Bohol Earthquake in 2013. The country announced that it shall revitalize the sites removed from the tentative list first before those sites can be re-submitted in the future. In October 2014, the National Commission for Culture and the Arts announced through their official Instagram account that they shall nominate the Sugar Centrals of the Philippines and related properties of Negros Occidental to the World Heritage List in the near future. Though the site has yet to be entered in the tentative list. The nomination will be made jointly with Mexico. The meeting focused on the tornaviaje, shipyards in the Bicol region, underwater archaeology, maps and cartography, fortifications in the Philippines, food, textile, and historical dimension. Spain has also backed the nomination of the route in the World Heritage List and has also suggested the archives related to the route under the possession of the Philippines, Mexico, and Spain to be nominated as part of another UNESCO list, the Memory of the World Register. The map is constantly being updated and has aided in the cultural conservation of numerous sites throughout the country. The society identified at least 6 heritage clusters so far. The society noted that it will take several years for the nomination

to be finalized, as it was the normal timeline for a World Heritage inclusion. The second leg was administered on 15th September in Mati, Davao Oriental. The third and last leg was administered in Legaspi City, Albay on 23rd March. The government also invited the administrators of sites not included yet in the tentative list. The university also noted that they have made explorations on the geology of Puerto Princesa Underground River, Ilocos Sand Dunes, Taal Seascape, and other geo-areas that may be declared as Global Geoparks in the future. The program for world heritage site 3-D scanning will end in March, but the commission aims to further the program to include sites not yet listed as World Heritage Sites, especially those within fault lines such as Metro Manila, Negros, Cebu, Bohol, Northern Mindanao, and the Cordilleras. The site is the stronghold of Philippine eagles in Luzon, the largest island in the Philippines. The province also noted that they have sent four of their personnel to train in the United States under the US Foreign Service to hasten the declaration of the site.

The Ivatan which is dominant in the province is considered to be one of the Austronesian languages. From college level down to elementary level, the language is widely spoken. The remaining faiths are other Christian Churches. Ecology[edit] Livestock freely roaming in the green hills in Batanes An extensive survey of the ecology of Batanes [12] provided the scientific basis for confirming the need for a national park in Batanes protecting the Batanes protected landscapes and seascapes, proposed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, submitted on 15 August Although it is reportedly growing in some other places such as coasts of Luzon, Catanduanes and even Taiwan, full blossoming and fruiting are observed only in Batanes. Its fruiting capacity on the island remains a mystery but is likely due to several factors such as climate, soil and type of substratum of the island. Several species of birds, bats, reptiles and amphibians also inhabit the island; many of those are endemic in the Philippines. June Natural[edit] White sand beach at Sabtang island Sabtang Island is undisturbed and unspoiled. It has intermittent white sand beaches with steep mountains and deep canyons with small level areas sporadically found along the coastline. Itbayat Island is located north of Batan Island. Itbayat is shaped like a giant bowl. It has a dirt airstrip for light aircraft. A regular ferry runs the Batan-Itbayat route. Travel time is about four hours by falowa from Basco Seaport. Tatus or coconut crabs abound in the island surrounded by rich marine life. Di-atay Beach is a cove with multi-colored rocks and white sand ideal for picnics and beach combing. Located along the highway of Mahatao, it is 9. Songsong in Chadpidan Bay is an hour of exhilarating trek from Basco proper 3 kilometres 1. It is famous for its beautiful sunset view. Naidi Hills is walking distance from Basco. Chawa Cave is for the more adventurous. An enchanted cave with a natural salt bed whose mouth opens to the south China Sea and is accessible through the boulders of Chawa Point in Mahatao. It is 4 kilometres 2. Fishing season is marked by a festival in mid-March called Kapayvanuvana. Visitors are treated with fresh fish delicacies from the Pacific Ocean. Within the area is the legendary Spring of Youth and living cave with crystal limestone formations. The bay is nine kilometres 5. Nakabuang Cave is 5. Matarem is an extinct volcano metres 1, feet at its summit. It is eight kilometres 5. Storm-proof Stone houses in Batanes many residents during typhoon made up their already-fortified houses with wood and secured the roofs with nets and ropes. Tapangkos or covering were also installed on the doors and windows of several buildings in Batanes, including the capitol building.
