The building, which was designed by famed architect Birge Clark at Homer Ave. In , the Palo Alto History Museum board of directors approached the city to take over the building and agreed it would fund the seismic retrofitting and historical rehabilitation upgrades. Green said the group has a new focus on fundraising and it is making progress toward its goals. Donations have come from more than families so far, he added, including a grant from the Peery Foundation. A roomful of residents also stayed late into the night to voice their support for the history museum. In concept, the city markets the development transfers and holds the money for rehabilitating historic projects. The city approved the actual sale of transferable development rights for the Sea Scout Building in Vice Mayor Liz Kniss made a motion to approve the lease extension with the fundraising quota, which Councilwoman Lydia Kou seconded. There are parts of it that are just not sturdy anymore," she said. Staff would also give a progress report to the council in six months. If all else fails and the museum does not raise the needed money by next November, the lease of the building to another organization would not necessarily mean the end of the museum, council members said Monday. The lessee could sublease part of the building to the museum. But council members said they have already promised enough. Some council members did not fault the museum for the slow pace of fundraising. They noted that it often takes years to generate large sums of money for nonprofit projects. The history museum does have a new interim director, Laura Bajuk, who has many connections to the local community. Last week , Bajuk said the museum board is addressing funding by cultivating relationships within the corporate community that has historical, significant roots in Silicon Valley. The nonprofit is also planning fundraising parties hosted by residents in the coming months. At the start of the year, the museum hosted educational events to begin generating buzz about the yet-to-open Museum. In March, it held a screening of "Lesson Plan," a documentary about an experiment that a Cubberley High School teacher conducted in at the now-defunct school. The project simulated the rise of fascism during World War II by creating an elite social movement for students.

Homes tour offers glimpse into history By Julie Buntjer on Sep 8, at Janet and Greg Burger stand in front of their home, which will be among the featured residences in the Historic Homes Tour Saturday in Luverne. Greg and Janet Burger own one of four homes that will be open from 1 to 5 p. All four homes on the tour are located within a two block stretch of Kniss Avenue, otherwise known as U. The Palace will also be open to tour participants throughout the afternoon. In addition to the Historic Homes Tour, Luverne will also host Art Rocks, a juried fine arts show and music festival featuring local and regional artists, throughout the day Saturday in downtown Luverne. The weekend events will kick off Friday night with country music singer Michael Martin Murphey performing a concert at the Palace Theatre. Doors to the past The Burgers are looking forward to opening their home to the public on Saturday. Located at N. LaDue, a local businessman who owned a large amount of land in the area, as well as elevators in Luverne and several nearby communities. As Janet learned in researching the home, a Mr. Brown lived in the home directly to the south, and his son and daughter-in-law moved in next door. After the Browns moved from the home, it was owned for many years by the Gettmans, who raised five children there. Four of those five children, now in their 50s, visited the home this summer, and Janet treasured the stories they shared as she gave them a tour through the home. At one time, the Burgers lived in a home to the west that afforded them views of the Queen Anne-style, two-story house. Then, a job transfer took the Burgers to Montevideo for about eight years. When they returned to Luverne -- again due to a job transfer with Minnwest Bank, where Greg works -- they had hoped to buy an older home in the community. Of course, there is what some may call a drawback to owning an older home -- the necessary upkeep and repairs. There are also plans to remove the wallpapering in some areas and either replace with new paper or paint. The Burgers added their own touch by removing all of the old carpet and having the original maple flooring restored. They also removed some of the wallpapering and textured ceilings in favor of a smooth plaster-processed surface. Reconfiguring the kitchen was another big project for the Burgers, as was landscaping much of the back yard. Michele Van Dyke, administrator of LACF, said the foundation made a list of the historic homes in the community, and then began contacting home owners about taking part in the tour. She said the foundation would like to continue the Historic Home Tour again next year with a new slate of homes to be featured.
