This study involves attention to what drives human behavior altruism or self-interest , the effect of institutions and rules on individual and group behavior, and how institutions transform and are transformed by individuals. In contrast to hierarchical frameworks, polycentrism removes government from the focal point of ultimate knowledge and authority. In his book, *The Intellectual Crisis in Public Administration*, [15] Ostrom outlines his observation of a breaking down of the intellectual foundation of public administration as formulated by Woodrow Wilson, [16] concisely, the concentration of power centers in government and the separation of the will of the state policy from administration. He noted increases in citizen involvement in decision processes and the broad diffusion of power. A democratic administration has a more heterogeneous, "bottom, up" character in contrast with ordered, trickle-down hierarchies. Ostrom considered the hierarchical order, accountable to a single center of power, less capable of serving the diverse needs among citizens and coping with diverse conditions, and less cost efficient than a polycentric administration. Fragmentation of authority among decision centers within a jurisdiction and the overlapping of jurisdictional authority are key to advancing human welfare and a stable political order. The earth, the moon, the planets, and the sun have continued to move in relation to each other in patterns that have remained stable for millennia of millennia. It is we as human beings who, by virtue of our intellectual vision of that reality, can think differently about relationships with reference to day and night, the tides of the oceans, the phases of the moon, the seasons of the year, the wandering stars, and other heavenly bodies. These ideas opened a host of new opportunities and today make ventures in space possible. How we think profoundly effects what we see and do. We need to look critically at the way we think. The only way we can do this is to become aware that there may be other ways of thinking about familiar problems. Until this possibility is taken seriously and we begin to explore what would be implied by using different conceptualizations and computational logics to address familiar problems in a different way, we cannot critically assess habituated ways of thinking. In my own experience, what I Ostrom have referred to as the work of contemporary political economists has better enabled me to understand the way that multiorganizational arrangements in Intellectual Crises and Beyond overlapping jurisdictions could function as viable systems of order in the governance of metropolitan areas, the operation of public service industries, the organization of public economies as essential complements to market economies, and the functioning of a highly federalized system of administration. Instead of being solely dependent upon the command and control structures of a bureaucracy, coordination can be attained by processes of cooperation , competition, conflict, and conflict resolution occurring among multiple independent public jurisdictions. Such an approach enables one to understand how systems of public administration can be put together in different ways other than relying primarily on the principles of bureaucratic organization, which had been accepted as the core organizing concept in the traditional teachings of American public administration. I had been nurtured on the "behavioral" presuppositions of "modern" scholarship and had earlier read The Federalist and Democracy in America with puzzlement about their "gems of wisdom" and "penetrating insights " about American society. It took a paradigm shift grounded in the work of political economists for me to appreciate that the writings of Hamilton, Jay, Madison, and Tocqueville were thoroughly grounded in the use of theory as an analytical tool for thinking about the constitution of order in human societies. Reasoned analyses were being articulated, not flashes of insights or intuitions. As a student, I Allen benefited from these insights linking the political economy of metropolitan governance with these much earlier ideas about institutional design and political culture. Concepts like polycentricity informed my thinking about the pacts, covenants, charters, and constitutions comprising federal systems that invariably developed from the ground up. In thinking about Intellectual Crises and Beyond the meaning of federalism for self-governance and democracy, the covenant idea has taken center stage. Covenants, as we shall detail below, demand reciprocity and an orientation to perpetuity in relationships that, it follows, tend toward increasing equality and responsibility among the parties who enter these voluntary agreements. Covenant-based political relations, orfoederal systems taking foederal, the Latin term for covenant , require polycentric arrangements that institutionalize the conditions of limited and shared authority necessary to actualize the normative aim of selfgovernment. Given the covenantal roots of American federalism, such insights were second nature to constitutional framers including James Madison and early constitutional analysts like John Adams.
