

1: Book Review: The Mysterious Island by Jules Verne | Owlcation

The Mysterious Island (French: L'Île mystérieuse) is a novel by Jules Verne, published in The original edition, published by Hetzel.

Caught in a storm, the balloon had flown some seven thousand miles in five days. The balloon falls near an uncharted island, and Harding, together with his dog, Top, is washed overboard. Once its load is lightened, the balloon then deposits the other travelers on the shore of the island. The next day, Herbert, Pencroft, and Spilett take stock of their resources, which consist of the clothes they wear, a notebook, and a watch. They suddenly hear Top barking. The dog leads them to Captain Harding, who, having been unconscious, is at a loss to explain how he arrived at a place more than a mile away from the shore. When Harding gets stronger, the group decides to consider themselves colonists rather than castaways, and they call their new home Lincoln Island. Harding finds on the island samples of iron, pyrite, clay, lime, coal, and other useful minerals. The colonists make bricks, which they use to construct an oven in which to make pottery. Eventually, they make iron and steel tools. Under the brilliant direction of Harding, who seems to know a great deal about everything, the colonists work constantly to improve their lot. After discovering a cave within a cliff wall, they plan to make this their permanent residence; they call it Granite House. They make a rope ladder up the side of the cliff to the door of the cavern, which they equip with brick walls, furniture, and candles made from seal fat. One day, Pencroft finds washed up on the beach a large chest containing many useful items, including books, clothes, instruments, and weapons. On another occasion, the colonists return to Granite House to find that their home has been invaded by orangutans, who suddenly become terrified by something and begin to flee. The colonists kill all but one, which they domesticate and call Jup. They domesticate various animals, use a stream to power an elevator to Granite House, and make glass windows. They build a boat designed by Harding and name it the Bonadventure. As they are sailing it, they find a bottle with a message, saying that there is a castaway on nearby Tabor Island. Pencroft, Spilett, and Herbert sail to Tabor Island, where Herbert is attacked by a strange wild man. Pencroft and Spilett succeed in capturing him and take him

A little while ago, I picked up The Mysterious Island mainly because it was one of the only books by Jules Verne that I knew almost nothing about. I took great care not to learn in advance what made the island so mysterious or really, anything about the plot at all.

Plot summary[edit] The plot focuses on the adventures of five Americans on an uncharted island in the South Pacific. During the American Civil War , five northern prisoners of war decide to escape, during the siege of Richmond, Virginia , by hijacking a balloon. They name it "Lincoln Island" in honor of their president, Abraham Lincoln. With the knowledge of the brilliant engineer Smith, the five are able to sustain themselves on the island, producing fire, pottery, bricks, nitroglycerin , iron, a simple electric telegraph , a home on a stony cliffside called "Granite House", and even a seaworthy ship, which they name the "Bonadventure" in honor of Pencroff, the driving force behind its construction. They also manage to figure out their geographical location. The group finds a message in a bottle directing them to rescue a castaway on nearby Tabor Island , who is none other than Tom Ayrton from In Search of the Castaways. On the return voyage to Lincoln Island, they lose their way in a tempest but are guided back to their course by a mysterious fire beacon. After some fighting with the protagonists, the pirate ship is mysteriously destroyed by an explosion. Six of the pirates survive and kidnap Ayrton. When the colonists go to look for him, the pirates shoot Harbert, seriously injuring him. Harbert survives, but suffers from his injury, narrowly cheating death. The colonists at first assume Ayrton to have been killed, but later they find evidence that he was not instantly killed, leaving his fate uncertain. When the colonists rashly attempt to return to Granite House before Harbert fully recovers, Harbert contracts malaria and is saved by a box of quinine sulphate, which mysteriously appears on the table in Granite House. After Harbert recovers, they attempt to rescue Ayrton and destroy the pirates. They discover Ayrton at the sheepfold, and the pirates dead, without any visible wounds. Having escaped the Maelstrom at the end of Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea , the Nautilus sailed the oceans of the world until all its crew except Nemo had died. Now an old man with a beard, Nemo returned the Nautilus to its secret port within Lincoln Island. Nemo had been the mysterious benefactor of the settlers, providing them with the box of equipment, sending the message revealing Ayrton, planting the torpedo that destroyed the pirate ship, and killing the pirates with an "electric gun". On his death bed Captain Nemo reveals his true identity as the lost Indian Prince Dakkar, son of a Raja of the then independent territory of Bundelkund and a nephew of the Indian hero Tippu-Sahib. After taking part in the failed Indian Rebellion of , Prince Dakkar escaped to a desert island with twenty of his compatriots and commenced the building of the Nautilus and adopted the new name of "Captain Nemo". Nemo also tells his life story to Cyrus Smith and his friends. Before he dies, he gives them a box of diamonds and pearls as a keepsake. Afterwards, he dies, crying "God and my country! Jup the orangutan falls into a crack in the ground and dies. The colonists, forewarned of the eruption by Nemo, find themselves safe, but stranded on the last remaining piece of the island above sea level. They are rescued by the ship Duncan, which had come to rescue Ayrton, but were redirected by a message Nemo had previously left on Tabor Island. The purported translator, W. However, it is now known that the translator of Mysterious Island and his other Verne novels was actually his wife, Agnes Kinloch Kingston, who had studied on the continent in her youth. The Kingston translation changes the names of the hero from "Smith" to "Harding"; "Smith" is a very common name in the UK and would have been associated, at that time, with the lower classes. In addition many technical passages were abridged or omitted and the anti-imperialist sentiments of the dying Captain Nemo were purged so as not to offend English readers. This became the standard translation for more than a century. In the Stephen W. White translation , words appeared first in the columns of The Evening Telegraph of Philadelphia and subsequently as an Evening Telegraph Reprint Book. In the 20th century two more abridged translations appeared: Kravitz also translated Shipwrecked Family: The Grafton was wrecked near New Zealand on the Auckland Islands on 3 January , where the crew of five survived for 19 months before obtaining rescue. Plot[edit] It has been years since the events of the first movie. Seventeen-year-old Sean Anderson Josh Hutcherson is caught by the police after a brief chase on his dirtbike which ends with him driving into a swimming pool while trying to evade them. Minutes later, his stepfather Hank Dwayne Johnson arrives when a police officer Stephen Caudill , who is friends with Hank tells him that Sean has illegally broken into a remote satellite research center, and that he has talked Mr. McGillicutty the owners of the swimming pool out of pressing charges. Wanting to bond with his stepson, the next day Hank helps Sean decipher the code of Jules Verne characters which lead to three books: Hank manages to convince Liz to let both of them go in search of the island, in the slight hope of proving Sean wrong, that there is no so-called mysterious island there. They arrive in Palau where they need transportation to travel to this dangerous part of the ocean. The crew discover tiny elephants and giant butterflies , which are the first creatures they come across on the island. The group decides to explore further into the island. He has a working radio, but due to the positioning of the communications satellite it will be two weeks before they can call for help. The next morning, Alexander leads the group to the lost city of Atlantis , which is periodically submerged in the ocean for extended times, and he also calculates that the island sinks once every 70 years. They decide to go to that cave through the heart of the island. They mount giant bees in order to fly over a high ridge and make up time, but encounter large birds spectacular bee-eaters , to be specific that try to devour the bees. The next morning, the water has risen greatly and Hank deduces that the island will sink in a matter of hours, not days. Alexander also finally calls Hank by his preferred name, as up to that point he only called him "Henry", and the family makes up. Meanwhile, Kailani and Alexander find Gabato and convince him to escape with them instead of trying for the golden volcano. They head towards the shore as the island begins to suddenly and violently rip itself apart. The golden volcano starts to erupt violently, pouring lava all over the area. Sean and Hank use a harpoon to get an electrical jump start from the electric eel swarming around them and they are able to power the machine, just in time to pick up the others who had fallen into the water. As they clear the dangers, Kailani finally kisses Sean for his bravery. Six months later, Kailani and Gabato are well off. Gabato is now running the most popular tourist attraction on Palau providing tours aboard the Nautilus and Kailani is attending college. Kailani goes to visit Sean on his birthday. Hank replies "What could possibly go wrong?"

Thoughts About The Book " The colonists start with nothing then steadily work their way up the technology tree Verne came really close to crossing the believability line there and it was amusing at times. A couple of the projects they undertake seemed over the top and unnecessary but paid off in the end. The amount of scientific detail was about right for me. The chemistry parts were kind of dry I enjoyed following the colonists as they explored the island and developed their new home. The mystery was engaging and the action really picked up going into the last third of the book. The ending was good but disappointing. It explained the sources of all the mysteries but gave little info on how they happened. It also breezed through the final fate of the colonists. Given some of the lengthy scientific explanations earlier in the book I expected more detail. It really needed more pages. Writing Style This book was written in French over years ago, so I expected the writing style to be different. The most noticeable thing is that Verne hypes up his characters in very dramatic terms. They appear almost superhuman in their personality traits and abilities. Some descriptions are clearly exaggerated beyond belief How do you exclaim something said in a murmur? You get used to it after a while and it almost becomes a running joke. Verne has a very effective narrative style. He engages the reader directly with questions and creates a sense of conversation This version of the book also includes the illustrations over 70 from the original publishings. The most helpful is the map of Lincoln Island at the front of the book. Each chapter heading is a list of highlights of what will happen during the chapter. It gives away pieces of the story so I ignored them after the third or fourth chapter. Gideon Spilett - A seasoned journalist and fearless world traveler. His knowledge of plants and animals helps the colonists. Pencroff - A sailor in constant search of a tobacco plant on the island. His first question whenever a new animal is discovered is "can we eat it? He learned how to climb a rope ladder while on the island. It was fun to ponder what life would be like stuck on an uncharted island. What decisions would I make at each point in the story? Would I know how to make pottery from scratch? Or even think to try? Verne wrote the characters with a very positive and confident yet humble attitude that is inspiring and refreshing. There be pirates in this story! About halfway through the book, Verne has the colonists discussing the world eventually exhausting its supply of coal to power modern industry and transportation.
