The New Global Student by Maya Frost is one of those books that takes what you think you know about a subject and flips it on its ear. The New Global Student argues that this path is not the only path – in fact, Frost argues that there is a much better way to help your children transition into the latter stages of their education. So why should they grow if all that matters is that A? So many students today stress themselves out over taking tons of AP classes and getting a great SAT score. Frost argues that both of these have less value in terms of getting into college than you might think. With B- students taking the courses and sometimes passing, the material may be at a somewhat lower level than before. On top of that, students are now taking three or four AP courses at once. As a result, many colleges are eliminating the credits they offer in exchange for AP courses. What does matter, then? How can a student stand out? Frost points towards the IB, which provides a rigorous plan of study available in many different nations that, upon completion, is accepted and often considered quite valuable for college admission. Meet the New A Student: Artful, Advanced, Atypical, and Adventurous Frost argues quite well, with a pile of anecdotes that a well-balanced student is incredibly well served by spending time abroad during their high school experience. Such an experience provides a huge deal of personal growth, vastly improves personal awareness, and demonstrates on college applications that a student is committed to outside-the-box exploration. One good compromise – a summer-long sabbatical. Rent an apartment in a foreign nation for three months and see how things go. Engage in every activity you can while there – not tourist stops, but the way of life that people have there. Shop at their stores. The Get-Real Guide for Bold Parents The final chapter is something of a clean-up of the many issues brought up by this book. What about their safety? Each of these questions has a very reasonable answer. As for the criticism, such study abroad programs actually vastly improve chances of college acceptance and of growing a student to the point where they can really take advantage of college. Why not let a student spend a year working hard at a job or for a non-profit in between high school and college, learning what it actually means to earn a paycheck and make ends meet and what the value of a college education actually is. Under the new GI Bill Transfer ability Rules for the Forever GI Bill, benefits can be transferred again if the originally designated dependent dies, and benefits can also be transferred by the recipient, if the service member who gave the benefits to them dies. This update goes live August 1st, , but also applies retroactively to any deaths that occurred on or after August 1st, Obviously, this caused problems for all sorts of military personnel, especially those who wanted to transfer their benefits to their young children, unborn but planned children, or spouses or even future spouses, or who simply wanted to work for a while before going back to school. The update went live immediately when President Trump signed the Bill, but it only applies retroactively to people with a discharge date on or after January 1st, In fact, even Purple Heart recipients had to serve for at least 3 full years in order to qualify for full GI Bill benefits, which obviously led to some terrible situations in which people brand new to the military got injured early in their service contract, and were denied GI Bill benefits! Fortunately, this terrible situation has been fixed, and anyone who has received a Purple Heart will now be eligible to receive the full package of GI Bill education benefits, which they so rightfully deserve. This update went live immediately upon signing of the Forever GI Bill, and is being applied retroactively, so anyone who received a Purple Heart since September 11th, is now eligible for the full GI Bill education benefits. US News reported that 1, service personnel were directly impacted by this update. This update goes live August 1st, BAH is Also Being Updated to Reflect Your Actual Location The old GI Bills calculated BAH rates based on where your school was located, which was a big deal for anyone taking classes online, or through some sort of distance learning program sometimes this calculation made for higher rates, other times it made them lower. The new Forever GI Bill will use your actual location to determine your BAH rate, calculating the BAH based on wherever you attend classes, rather than the main campus location for your school. This update goes live August, , and like the previous BAH change, only applies to new service personnel. The Forever GI Bill expands access to education benefits by allowing all Reservists called to active duty under sections a or b to be eligible Reservists called to duty by a Governor in response to a major disaster or emergency, or Reservists called to duty by the DoD in support of a combatant command , where in the past, only Reservists who were called to active duty by Presidential Order as a response to a national emergency were able to receive benefits. This update also applies retroactively, to all Reservists, and going back all the way to August 1st, , which is huge, since many Reservists have been called to duty under these conditions since then, and will now finally have access to awesome education benefits that they deserved in the first place! This is a terrible change, but one of those that was forced by Congress, who claimed that the Forever GI Bill was too expensive. This update is going live on August 1st, Creation of the High Technology Pilot Program This is a much-needed update to eligibility conditions which will allow military education benefits to be applied toward NON-DEGREE programs, like coding training programs or boot camps, IT certifications and other technology-related courses or certification programs. This Pilot program is set to run for 5 years, and will involve the VA contracting directly with schools and programs to make their offers available to military personnel, and the VA is going to make the program more attractive for schools by offering them higher tuition rates and payments based on their program graduation rates, and the rate at which graduates find a job in their field. This update goes live on August 1st, This update went live as soon as President Trump signed the Bill. Independent Study Programs Are Now Covered Instead of only allowing GI Bill benefits to be applied to degree-seeking programs, the Forever GI Bill also expands eligibility for benefits to be used on independent study programs, though these are limited to certain types of programs or schools. Currently, you can use your Forever GI Bill benefits to pay for costs associated with attending a technical education school, or a post secondary vocational school.
