In chapter 18, however, He begins to describe the nature and quality of the relationship that those in the kingdom should have with one another. The fact that the disciples ask the question, "Who is the greatest? Jesus points towards the objective of their conversion: No dependence on achievement, power or greatness but a quiet, innocent trust in God. One who is truly great in the kingdom seeks no glory for self but rather glory for God. The emptier one is of self, the more God can fill that person with His greatness, wisdom, love and power. The greatest are those who are unaware of their greatness. Not only are the greatest like children, but they must also treat others in the kingdom, who are themselves meek and vulnerable, with respect as Jesus would have them do. Those who belong to the kingdom do not manipulate or despise others an easy temptation towards those who are childlike. Warning about offenses 6but whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to stumble, it would be better for him to have a heavy millstone hung around his neck, and to be drowned in the depth of the sea. For it is inevitable that stumbling blocks come; but woe to that man through whom the stumbling block comes! It is better for you to enter life with one eye, than to have two eyes and be cast into the fiery hell. He demonstrates, by this severe warning, how precious these are and consequently how important they should be to us, evangelistically. This passage also suggests that the very young can believe, and all we do while they are young either contributes or destroys the innate ability to trust and believe in God a child has, and a child-like believer wants to have. Jesus recognizes the various dangers in the world but specifically points out those who are a direct cause of stumbling the word "stumble" refers to a trap that pierces and kills the animal who touches the bait. This is also a warning about personal weaknesses and sins that can be a cause for self to stumble. Jesus says that these things must be removed at all costs. The Lord reinforces the idea that those who are least in the kingdom children and child-like ones are truly precious because even the mighty angels who behold the face of God minister to these little ones. Parable 12"What do you think? If any man has a hundred sheep, and one of them has gone astray, does he not leave the ninety-nine on the mountains and go and search for the one that is straying? This answer instructs them in several ways: The direction of their development if they wish to become greatest in the kingdom least are most. The care they should exercise in not destroying these. The value that these have before God. Angels minister to them, and there is joy in heaven when one who has been lost is found. This last point is where the parable of the lost sheep fits in. Matthew uses this passage as a bridge to the next section about practical conflict management within the kingdom when offenses do occur. Direct Confrontation There are a variety of ways that individuals deal with personal conflict. Some plot revenge and others torture with the silent treatment. People offended revert to anger, gossip, even slander as a way of responding to a personal offense or insult. In this section Jesus outlines the way personal conflict should be resolved in the kingdom. Procedure 15"If your brother sins, go and show him his fault in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother. Note that the objective is to win the brother, not the argument. To win back the one who has offended you, not to prove that you are right. When we are sinned against, we want to be validated and comforted, but Jesus says we must first make an effort to renew fellowship with the offending party. Of course, there needs to be real sin against us, and not just an issue of annoyance or opinion. The offence must be a true sin, and one that directly threatens to destroy the bond of fellowship within the assembly. To reprove means to convict or show the offending person the wrongness of the act. If there is no response to a direct person-to-person approach then make sure that the offence is recognized and has been witnessed by two or more brethren. This is done to assure the brother that this matter is not a personal vendetta

but an effort to deal with a serious wrong witnessed by others verse If this fails, bring the matter before the church. At this point there is no New Testament example, teaching or inference as to how the church is to deal with this person. Certainly to continue to exhort and encourage him to repent in a collective way would be right verse 17a. If this fails to bring a proper response, the person is then to be disfellowshipped no longer considered a faithful part of that assembly, verse 17b. Gentiles and tax collectors were not considered part of the assembly of Jesus, and out of the sphere of His promises and blessings. The brother who fails to respond to the church is also out of the kingdom. Note that Jesus places the church as the highest authority in this matter. This leads us to conclude that there is no authority or overseeing body that is higher than local congregation.

Authority 18 Truly I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven. In other words, if the church forgives a brother, then his sins are forgiven in heaven loose, if he refuses to repent, then he will be out of the assembly on earth, and his sins will remain bind as they will be in heaven also. When the church acts according to His word and will He is there with them, whether in a small two or more or large group. When the church gathers to obey and honor Christ, He is with them to answer their prayers in all matters.

Basis for Maintaining Relationships: Unconditional Forgiveness Jesus prepares us for life in the kingdom by describing how precious it is and how difficult it is for sinful people to grow in love and faith. This section deals with the practical side of daily life within the kingdom. He warns against causing someone to fall away from the kingdom because of what we do. He instructs on how to be reconciled when there are offenses and what to do with those who cause those offenses. Finally, He establishes the attitude of heart that we all need to have if we are to avoid causing others to fall or falling ourselves: The old standard 21 Then Peter came and said to Him, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me and I forgive him? Up to seven times? Jesus establishes the matter beyond the legal requirement by setting forth a new attitude, not just a new number. Seven times seventy meant a number beyond count. The new attitude is a forgiving heart, and a willingness and readiness to forgive whenever called upon to do so. Jesus tells the parable of the unjust steward 23 "For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his slaves. The servant could not even pay the debt he owed but was forgiven nevertheless, as well as the result and punishment reserved for those who were not prepared to forgive others the debt he originally owed was put back on him when he refused to forgive someone else. Summary My heavenly Father will also do the same to you, if each of you does not forgive his brother from your heart. Lessons about the kingdom There will be offenses against you in the kingdom. When this happens, be prepared to: Not be the one who causes them. Deal with those who do offend you in a Christian way when it happens. Forgive others readily and graciously when you are offended because in the measure you forgive others, God will forgive you and others will forgive you too.

I find that to be unacceptable. Why run as an Independent? What would an Independent AG look like for voters? The biggest difference it would be for voters would be a re-emphasis on the actual job. So many times, the parties identify this position as one in which to put candidates forward who they hope will potentially run for governor someday. The job requires partnering with local law enforcement , so one of my first priorities is after meeting the staff and figuring out where we are with various investigations, I would endeavor to travel to every one of the counties in the state and meet with the local officials there to talk about what resources do they lack? So what you would see from Chris Graveline being the Attorney General is an emphasis on where can we help with violent crime in our urban cities? Where can we help in fighting the opioid crisis? A re-emphasis on consumer protection. Would you say that you lean more liberal or conservative in your personal beliefs? I mean, are there things that I agree with the Republican party? Are there things I agree with the Democratic party? Have I voted for Republicans before? Have I voted for Democrats before? Why should they trust that I can do this? I have 20 years of experience of doing this. I have been a public servant my entire career. I have a proven track record of accomplishments of handling large investigations. I believe that anyone who takes a look at my record will see that I am an even-handed, fair prosecutor who uses innovative means to accomplish the goal. Dana Nessel has talked about aggressively doing the same against the Trump administration. What kind of process would you use to make those decisions? And he laid out three principles. And what he meant by that is, does it affect a number of people within the state and not just an issue of local concern. Two, will it set sound legal precedent? And three, does it vindicate some important interest within the state of Michigan? I would use those same three principles in determining whether I joined lawsuits and whether to bring lawsuits on behalf of the state of Michigan. Now that you will be on the ballot, what are you hoping to accomplish with the suit as it progresses? Now the lawsuit will go back to the district court here in Detroit and we will seek to have the preliminary injunction turned into a permanent injunction. At that point, the court will determine whether her ruling applies to all independent candidates going forward. Over the last decade, I think many voters have expressed, how did we get here? How do we get to the place where we have to pick between the lesser of two evils, whoever the two parties put up? This law is one of the ways we get there. Then the people in the center have to figure out who they dislike less and vote for that person. Attorney Barbara McQuade was an early supporter of yours and political observers have said you likely would split votes with Democrat Dana Nessel. Would you have any regrets if you help to put Republican Tom Leonard in office? And hopefully I take a lot of votes away from Tom Leonard. I think the argument that this should be a nonpartisan office is the best of the arguments when you take a look at what the role of the Attorney General should be. If you take a look at my resume, of the three candidates, I think I have the strongest resume. I think I can appeal to both Democratic voters and Republican voters. I think my background is unique: I grew up in mid Michigan, I married into a farming family, I still bale hay every summer. I think those are all attributes that can appeal to Republican voters. I have worked in the city of Detroit as a prosecutor. I understand urban issues. My last five years, I spent every day trying to think of ways to drop the homicide rate in the city of Detroit. I think that has a lot of appeal to Democratic voters as well. Line 5 and the Flint water crisis are two issues that would likely fall into the lap of the next Attorney General. How would you tackle these issues? And does an Attorney General really have the power to shut Line 5 down? I can say this, I think that the amount of money spent by bringing in the outside prosecutors is way too much money. I would have preferred to see the Attorney General, if he decided that conflict-free counsel was necessary, that he reach out to another

county prosecutor within the state and ask that county prosecutor to actually do the investigation. The Attorney General can revoke the easement. I believe federal law also applies in the federal Pipeline Safety Act. I think you have to get in and see all the facts.

In this ten-stanza poem, Zhu Xi illustrates views of Mount Wuyi, a place very significant to him personally and also to his philosophy. In the first stanza, he describes his estate, and in the following nine stanzas he portrays different bends along the river that he chose for their uniqueness and beauty. The painting is an illustration of the poem. Canping Rock, mentioned in the first line, is the craggy, layered rock with the connected bridge in the foreground det. A thatched-roof cottage can be seen on the lower riverbank at bottom right; although, according to the poem, its door is closed all day, in the painting it is open, welcoming guests. Visitors can be seen on two boats det. The accuracy of the image as it relates to the description in the poem is reinforced by the identifications, in red ink, of the specific topographical features. Both paintings have very similar brushstrokes, shading, and mountain forms. Another painting of the subject includes a inscription by the famous Korean philosopher Yi Hwang in the colophon at the end of the handscroll fig. In the colophon of the comparative painting and also in an essay, Yi Hwang wrote that there were numerous paintings of the Nine Bends of Mount Wuyi in circulation at that time. According to Yi, he personally commissioned several artists to paint the subject and provided them with models from which to copy, although he admitted he was not satisfied with many of them. In the sixteenth century, Neo-Confucian doctrines prevailed in Korea, and accordingly, Zhu Xi was highly esteemed by leading scholars of the day such as Yi Hwang and his pupil, Yi Yi One result of this respectful emulation of Zhu Xi by Korean scholars was their interest in dwelling amidst extraordinary natural surroundings to cultivate philosophical ideas.
