Get to Know the Romance Lovers Book Club This group reads widely across the genre, enjoying romances that dip into science fiction, historical fiction, and westerns—they also discuss two books a month. Watch out for these cats! The Romance Lovers Book Club is a little over five years old. She posted the book club on Meetup. We had six people at the first meeting, five of whom still attend regularly. These are always romance novels occasionally a science fiction, mystery, or other book with strong romantic elements. Reading widely across the genre has introduced us to lots of new authors and many of us buy the rest of the books in a series after reading one for the book club. We are a great example of how wonderful the romance community is. We also have a book swap. When, where, and how often do you meet? We meet at 7 p. How does your group make its reading selections? Jennifer picks out all of the books. A few times a year, we will discuss themes the group would like to read and members offer up suggestions. They often include non-British historicals, Christmas novels, science fiction romances, secretary tropes, and Westerns. Jennifer queries NoveList and Twitter for book suggestions, she checks reviews and book availability books have to be available for the library to purchase and have to be in print and picks books that fit the theme. Which book did your group collectively like the most this past year? We probably most liked *Firelight*, by Kristen Callihan. Which is the most divisive book your group has read? YA and new adult books are often divisive for us, with some readers really liking the over-the-top alpha hero and some readers hating him. Motorcycle club romances often induce a similarly lively discussion. How do your group discussions work? Generally, Jennifer starts off the discussion for one of the books and everyone chimes in. If the discussion gets too loud and separated into too many side discussions, Jennifer will bring the group back together with a question. The group members are fantastic about including new members in the discussion and giving backstory when our discussion veers off into comparisons of past groups. ### 2: Online Book Club for Readers

*This book had an interesting premise, with the protagonist, a 15 year old southern girl from a conservative Baptist household, getting a hold of a box of romance novels, which she uses to start a book club.*

This year, I am taking a break and find I really miss it. I love the discussion and camaraderie that come from a good book club meeting. So it was with pleasure and curiosity that I went to a meeting of the Romance Novel Lovers book club at a nearby local library. Jennifer is a big fan of romance novels and thought running an evening book club at her library would be a great way to introduce readers to the genre. Currently her book club has 27 readers, although on any given meeting they meet once a month there are usually around eight to ten members. Jennifer picks all the books and they discuss two each time they meet. The two books usually share a common theme and she picks books easily found at the library or in paperback. She posts the schedule on Meetup. In both books the protagonists are married but separated. Those who came to the book club that night were women ranging in age from around 30 to All but one of them had finished both books. We met in a conference room at the library where Jennifer works. Everyone was there, sitting around the table, by a little after 7 p. Jennifer began by asking the group what they thought of Not Quite a Husband. Most of the group really enjoyed it and spent some time talking about how interesting the setting was. Most of the book takes place in what is now Pakistan, but was then colonized India. It was interesting to hear how readers felt about the heroine and hero, Bryony and Leo. Listening to the differing perspectives on why they were the way they were and whether or not either was truly capable of great love made me rethink my perception of the leads in the book. While I love Sherry Thomas, this had not been my favorite of her books largely because I found Bryony and Leo to both be fairly unsympathetic characters. We talked about all aspects of the book plot, setting, pace and, fairly humorously, sex. I came out of the discussion really wanting to read the book again hearing about how others saw it made me aware of parts I had missed or glossed over. Several had read and loved the first book in the series, The Madness of Lord Ian Mackenzie , and found this sequel to be a disappointment. Others felt the book was a fun read but not particularly believable. Everyone felt the sex scenes were a bit over the top. In both books, the couples are childless and in Not Quite a Husband appear to never have children. We talked about how unusual that is in romance in general especially in historical romance. I was engrossed and I plan to go back next month. I think it would be great if there were. I thought I might start on Facebook create a virtual book club and see where it leads.
