

1: What does the second commandment teach us? | www.enganchecubano.com

Answer: The Ten Commandments are recorded in the Bible in Exodus and Deuteronomy. The second of those commandments, in its entirety, is this: "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth."

What does the second commandment teach us? You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand [generations] of those who love me and keep my commandments. Below is a simplified version of a paraphrase of the second commandment given by a Bible scholar: Do not think of Me in such a way. I am not limited and finite. Nothing can thwart Me in My purpose. Nothing in the visible realm can capture who I am and what I am like. In one sense, every visible thing reflects My nature and wisdom; for all of it is My handiwork. But in another sense, nothing in the visible realm is like Me; nothing can adequately represent who I am. I am too big to be understood in terms of any finite thing in the natural order. Do not, therefore, think of Me as a God who can be represented in terms of one finite image. If you do so, then it will not be Me, Yahweh, you worship; it will be some other god of your own imagination. I am a jealous God. I, Yahweh, the all-powerful, transcendent God, am the One you must worship. You must not worship the shrunken deity of your imagination. This is also what Jesus taught: The only way to know the truth of who God is, is for Him to reveal Himself to us. God revealed Himself to the Israelites through the 10 commandments. They could tell that God was holy, righteous and good. Anything that takes the place of God in our lives is an idol. Idol worshippers are self-centered. They seek to gratify themselves and have no thought of God. We need to obey not only the second commandment but also all the other commandments of God. They keep us connected with God and also keep us out of trouble with ourselves, family, friends, and neighbors. God knows what is best for all of us and He wants all of us to be at peace with Him and live in peace and harmony with one another. How does this Bible passage speak to you? The Ten Commandments (Hebrew: עשרת הדיברות, Aseret ha'Dibrot), also known as the Decalogue, are a set of biblical principles relating to ethics and worship, which play a fundamental role in Judaism and Christianity.

The Ten Commandments are Thomas Watson Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth: Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image. In the first commandment worshipping a false god is forbidden; in this, worshipping the true God in a false manner. Whose is this image and superscription? But the commandment forbids setting up an image for religious use or worship. All ideas, portraitures, shapes, images of God, whether by effigies or pictures, are here forbidden. Take heed lest ye corrupt yourselves, and make the similitude of any figure. God is to be adored in the heart, not painted to the eye. Thou shalt not bow down to them. God forbids such prostrating ourselves before an idol. The thing prohibited in this commandment is image-worship. To set up an image to represent God, is debasing him. If any one should make images of snakes or spiders, saying he did it to represent his prince, would not the prince take it in disdain? What greater disparagement to the infinite God than to represent him by that which is unite; the living God, by that which is without life; and the Maker of all by a thing which is made? God is a spiritual essence and, being a Spirit, he is invisible. Ye saw no manner of similitude on the day that the Lord spake with you out of the midst of the fire. How can any paint the Deity? Can they make an image of that which they never saw? Quod invisibile est, pingi non potest [There is no depicting the invisible]. Ye saw no similitude. If the workman be better than the work, and none bow to the workman, how absurd, then, is it to bow to the work of his hands! It is more so to bow down to an image of God, when God himself is everywhere present. The images of God, our Saviour, the Virgin Mary, are of all others the most dangerous; therefore the greatest care ought to be had that they stand not in temples and churches. Image-worship is expressly against the letter of Scripture. Ye shall make no graven image, neither shall ye set up any image of stone to bow down unto it. Neither shalt thou set up any image; which the Lord thy God hateth. Confounded be all they that serve graven images. Do we think to please God by doing that which is contrary to his mind, and that which he has expressly forbidden? Josiah, that renowned king, destroyed the groves and images. Constantine abrogated the images set up in temples. The Christians destroyed images at Baste, Zurich, and Bohemia. When the Roman emperors would have thrust images upon them, they chose rather to die than deflower their virgin profession by idolatry; they refused to admit any painter or carver into their society, because they would not have any carved state or image of God. When Seraphion bowed to an idol, the Christians excommunicated him, and delivered him up to Satan. The Church of Rome is reprov'd and condemn'd, which, from the Alpha of its religion to the Omega, is wholly idolatrous. Romanists make images of God the Father, painting him in their church windows as an old man; and an image of Christ on the crucifix; and, because it is against the letter of this commandment, they sacrilegiously blot it out of their catechism, and divide the tenth commandment into two. Image worship must needs be very impious and blasphemous, because it is giving the religious worship to the creature which is due to God only. It is vain for Papists to say, they give God the worship of the heart, and the image only the worship of the body; for the worship of the body is due to God, as well as the worship of the heart; and to give an outward veneration to an image is to give the adoration to a creature which belongs to God only. My glory will I not give to another. The Papists say they do not worship the image, but only use it as a medium through which to worship God. Ne imagini quidem Christi in quantum est lignum sculptum, ulla debetur reverentia [Not even to a statue of Christ is any reverence owed, since it is only a piece of carved wood]. Who has required this at your hands? The Papists cannot say so much as the devil, Scriptum est: What heathen has been so simple as to think gold or silver, or the figure of an ox or elephant, was God? These were emblems and hieroglyphics only to represent him. They worshipped an invisible God by such visible things. To worship God by an image, God takes as done to the image itself. One of the Popish Councils affirmed, that we might learn more by an image than by long study of the Scriptures. What profiteth the graven image, the

molten image, and a teacher of lies. Then see what lessons this book teaches. It teaches lies; it represents God in a visible shape, who is invisible. For Papists to say they make use of an image to put them in mind of God, is as if a woman should say she keeps company with another man to put her in mind of her husband. But did not Moses make the image of a brazen serpent? Why, then, may not images be set up? Make thee a brazen serpent. There was also a special use in it, both literal and spiritual. Because Moses made an image to heal them that were stung, is it lawful to set up images in churches to sting them that are whole? Nay, that very brazen serpent which God himself commanded to be set up, when Israel looked upon it with too much reverence, and began to burn incense to it, Hezekiah defaced, and called it Nehushtan, mere brass; and God commended him for so doing. But is not God represented as having hands, and eyes, and ears? Why may we not, then, make an image to represent him, and help our devotion? Though God is pleased to stoop to our weak capacities, and set himself out in Scripture by eyes, to signify his omniscience, and hands to signify his power, yet it is absurd, from such metaphors and figurative expressions, to bring an argument for images and pictures; for, by that rule, God may be pictured by the sun and the element of fire, and by a rock; for he is set forth by these metaphors in Scripture; and, sure, the Papists themselves would not like to have such images made of God. If it be not lawful to make the image of God the Father, yet may we not make an image of Christ, who took upon him the nature of man? Epiphany, seeing an image of Christ hanging in a church, brake it in pieces. But how shall we conceive of God aright, if we may not make any image or resemblance of him? We must conceive of God spiritually. Set the eyes of your faith on Christ-God-man. He that has seen me, has seen the Father. Take heed of the idolatry of image-worship. Our nature is prone to this sin as dry wood to take fire; and, indeed, what need of so many words in the commandment: It concerns us, therefore, to resist this sin. Where the tide is apt to run with greater force, there we had need to make the banks higher and stronger. The plague of idolatry is very infectious. They were mingled among the heathen, and served their idols. It is my advice to you, to avoid all occasions of this sin. John the divine would not be in the same place where Cerinthus the heretic was. As looking on a harlot draws to adultery, so looking on the popish gilded picture may draw to idolatry. Some go to see their idol-worship. A vagrant who has nothing to lose, cares not to go among thieves; so such as have no goodness in them, care not to what idolatrous places they come or to what temptations they expose themselves; but you who have a treasure of good principles about you, take heed the popish priests do not rob you of them, and defile you with their images. Though Solomon was a man of wisdom, his idolatrous wives drew his heart away from God. The people of Israel entered into an oath and curse, that they would not give their daughters in marriage to idolaters. For a Protestant and Papist to marry, is to be unequally yoked 2 Cor 6: Mingle wine and vinegar, the vinegar will sooner sour the wine, than the wine will sweeten the vinegar. It is provoking God, because it reflects much upon his honour, as if he were not wise enough to appoint the manner of his own worship. He hates all strange fire to be offered in his temple. A ceremony may in time lead to a crucifix. They who contend for the cross in baptism, why not have the oil, salt, and cream as well, the one being as ancient as the other? They who are for altar-worship, and will bow to the east, may in time bow to the Host. Take heed of all occasions of idolatry, for idolatry is devil-worship. If you search through the whole Bible, there is not one sin that God has more followed with plagues than idolatry. The Jews have a saying, that in every evil that befalls them, there is unciā aurei vituli, an ounce of the golden calf in it. Hell is a place for idolaters. For without are idolaters. Senesius calls the devil a rejoicer at idols, because the image-worshippers help to fill hell. That you may be preserved from idolatry and image-worship. Whence does the popish religion get ground? Not from the goodness of their cause, but from the ignorance of their people. The wife that loves her husband is safe from the adulterer; and the soul that loves Christ is safe from the idolater. Though it is true, there is nothing in an image to tempt for if we pray to an image, it cannot hear, and if we pray to God by an image, he will not hear, yet we know not our own hearts, or how soon we may be drawn to vanity, if God leaves us. Therefore pray that you be not enticed by false worship, or receive the mark of the beast in your right hand or forehead. Pray, Hold thou me up, and I shall be safe.

3: Deuteronomy 10 CEV - The Second Set of Commandments - Moses - Bible Gateway

Below is a comparison of both readings of the Ten Commandments. The first as personally spoken and written by the finger of God and is found in Exodus and the second which was written down and spoken by Moses and is found in Deuteronomy

These 10 beneficial laws were given by the Creator God to show us how to live a better life now and please God forever. There are only slight differences of emphasis in the accounts. Both versions are listed below, along with a list of the commandments in short form. The numbering of the commandments on the first three lists below reflects the numbering used in much of the Christian world, though Catholics, Jews and others use various numbering systems as shown below that. You shall not make idols. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet. The 10 Commandments List in Exodus You shall have no other gods before Me. For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments. In it you shall do no work: For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. You shall not make yourself a carved image nor any likeness of that which is in the heavens above or on the earth below or in the water beneath the earth. You shall not prostrate yourself to them nor worship them, for I am the Lord, your God. Six days shall you work and accomplish all your work; but the seventh day is Sabbath to the Lord, your God; you shall not do any workâ€”you, your son, your daughter, your servant, your animal, and the stranger within your gatesâ€”for in six days The Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them, and He rested on the seventh day. Therefore, The Lord blessed the Sabbath day and sanctified it. Learn more about the 10 Commandments by studying each commandment and committing to strive to obey them. 4: Ten Commandments

The Second 10 Commandments. 1. Thou shalt not worry, for worry is the most unproductive of all human activities. 2. Thou shalt not be fearful, for most of the things.

This adds powerful emphasis to the subject of the 10 Commandments in the Bible. You shall not make idols. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet. What are the 10 Commandments? Laws that show us how to love God gave humanity the Bible to reveal His way of life—His way of love. And the second is like it: The 10 Commandments expand on these two great commandments, with the first four commandments telling us how God wants to be loved, and the last six commandments showing how to demonstrate love for other people. God created these laws and they reflect His thinking. Disobeying the 10 Commandments shows a lack of love for God and our fellow humans. Jesus taught that obeying the 10 Commandments is essential for entering into eternal life Matthew. Because God created these laws and they reflect His thinking. Commandment breaking causes suffering and broken relationships. God, in His love and mercy, will not allow someone who refuses to obey these good laws to have eternal life. And, as we mentioned, sin causes suffering. Its eventual result is death: Sadly, every human being has sinned and disobeyed the 10 Commandments Romans 3: It is only because of the mercy of God that Jesus Christ was willing to pay our death penalty for us. Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Christians are given access to the power of God through the Holy Spirit to combat the temptations to sin Acts 2: The 10 Commandments in the New Testament A full list of the 10 Commandments is given twice in the Old Testament Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5 , and each commandment is mentioned many more times. But some have argued that obeying the 10 Commandments would not be required of Christians if they are not listed in the New Testament. Still, all of the 10 Commandments are mentioned in the New Testament, and as a group they are called:

In the second commandment God was telling Moses that He is different from these so-called 'gods'. Below is a simplified version of a paraphrase of the second commandment given by a Bible scholar: "Do not think of Me like the rest of the nations think of their supreme god, finite and limited.

The purpose and meaning of the Second Commandment The Second Commandment goes to the heart of our relationship with our Creator. What is the proper way to worship the only true God? It deals with several crucial questions: How do we perceive God? How do we explain Him to ourselves and to others? Idols are representations of false, nonexistent gods but may we use pictures or other images that represent the true God? Above all, what is the proper way to worship the only true God? In the First Commandment we learned that it is wrong to allow any created thing, including a human being, to become more important to us than our Creator. The Second Commandment differs from the First in that it explains that in our worship, we must not reduce God to a likeness of a physical object. Doing so is unquestionably unacceptable to God. Yet God did create on earth a likeness of Himself in humans. To make any representation of Him distorts and limits our perception of what He is really like and so damages our relationship with Him. Of all things on earth or in the heavens, only living human beings realistically reflect a reasonable likeness of the living God. In the same way, as a human, Jesus Christ was in the image of His Father. Not only did God make humans in His image, He created us to become even more like Him. Being like God and developing His own character in us is what our existence is all about. That is why a clear understanding of the purpose of the Second Commandment is so important. I will tell you what I am like! It is important that you correctly understand that I will accept no representations of Me. We also need to know how we are destined to become even more like Him. God gives us creative and leadership abilities that parallel His own, although on a vastly smaller scale. We alone of His material creation have real mind power. Our minds can reason, analyse, plan and visualize the future. We create literature, art, music and poetry. We design and build. We can organize, manage and supervise things, creatures and people. We are, in limited ways, much like God. But in other areas we as humankind are far from being like Him. Our character tends to weakness. Our relationships with each other leave much to be desired. Our spiritual understanding is limited and often flawed and distorted. Our perceptions are often inaccurate. We are biased in our opinions. We harbour prejudices and are quick to engage in conflicts. In all these spiritual areas, we fall far short of being like God. Though God has given us limited abilities and characteristics similar to his own, we need much development and fine tuning before we become like Him in nature and character. The time is coming when God will transform those who have become like Him in heart and mind from a physical to a spiritual existence. Paul described to the church in Corinth how this will happen. Being like God is our destiny providing we surrender our lives to Him in obedience to His Commandments. God requires accountability This brings us to the latter part of the Second Commandment: But God expects those who worship Him in truth and understanding to demonstrate their love for Him by keeping His Commandments from the heart, not by going through useless rites in front of any object. We are not to worship God with images and meaningless rituals. That means that we have to learn and grow 2 Peter 3: We must apply this revealed knowledge in our lives. Only those who do what they learn they should do are true worshipers of God Romans 2: It is becoming like Him internally. We allow Him to spiritually fashion us into His likeness. We honour and praise Him by the way we live. Even if we knew exactly what God looks like, which we do not know, we could not design icons that would portray the many facets of His character revealed to us through His Word. At some times God acts with gentleness and mercy and at others with great wrath and power. He does not want us to perceive Him as frozen in one trait of personality or character to the exclusion of His many other traits. He asks that we read about Him, learn what He is like and emulate Him. After writing the Ten Commandments on tablets of stone, God explained why He wanted no images used in worship of Him. Depictions of deities engraved and painted on walls, pottery and other articles are included among the forbidden and idolatrous objects Numbers By associating human fertility with the natural forces their idols represented such as the sun, rain and soil, they developed fertility rites that included sexual orgies

and temple prostitution. Immorality became the focus of their temple worship. They initiated young females into womanhood by enlisting them to serve as honoured temple prostitutes. Males were expected to frequent the temple brothels in worship of their local deities. Immorality and degeneracy were dressed in religious garb and considered virtues. This is why idolatry and immorality are so frequently linked in the Bible. Paul wrote about the problem: That the idol is any thing, or that which is offered in sacrifice to idols is any thing? By blinding most of mankind Revelation Remember why we were created The Second Commandment is a constant reminder that we only, of all created things, are made in the image of God. Only we can be transformed into the spiritual image of Christ who came in the flesh as the perfect spiritual image of our heavenly Father. This Commandment protects our special relationship with our Creator who made us in His likeness and is still moulding us into His spiritual image. The Second Commandment reminds us that God is far greater than anything we can see or imagine. We must never let that knowledge be pushed aside by the use of some image or likeness in our worship of God.

6: 10 Commandments List - Life, Hope & Truth

American King James Version — as the preamble to the Ten Commandments, Judaism regards it as the First Commandment and Exodus Exodus 3 You shall have no other gods before me. 4 You shall not make to you any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the.

Like the first commandment, it belongs to the virtue of religion and more particularly it governs our use of speech in sacred matters. God confides his name to those who believe in him; he reveals himself to them in his personal mystery. He must keep it in mind in silent, loving adoration. He will not introduce it into his own speech except to bless, praise, and glorify it. Are these feelings of fear and awe Christian feelings or not? I say this, then, which I think no one can reasonably dispute. They are the class of feelings we should have — yes, have to an intense degree — if we literally had the sight of Almighty God; therefore they are the class of feelings which we shall have, if we realize His presence. In proportion as we believe that He is present, we shall have them; and not to have them, is not to realize, not to believe that He is present. Preaching and catechizing should be permeated with adoration and respect for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. They must be respected in justice. Blasphemy is contrary to the respect due God and his holy name. It is in itself a grave sin. Taking an oath or swearing is to take God as witness to what one affirms. As Creator and Lord, God is the norm of all truth. Human speech is either in accord with or in opposition to God who is Truth itself. A false oath calls on God to be witness to a lie. Perjury is a grave lack of respect for the Lord of all speech. Pledging oneself by oath to commit an evil deed is contrary to the holiness of the divine name. Discretion in calling upon God is allied with a respectful awareness of his presence, which all our assertions either witness to or mock. An oath, that is the invocation of the divine name as a witness to truth, cannot be taken unless in truth, in judgment, and in justice. When an oath is required by illegitimate civil authorities, it may be refused. It must be refused when it is required for purposes contrary to the dignity of persons or to ecclesial communion. This can be the name of a saint, that is, of a disciple who has lived a life of exemplary fidelity to the Lord. Parents, sponsors, and the pastor are to see that a name is not given which is foreign to Christian sentiment. It demands respect as a sign of the dignity of the one who bears it.

7: What Are the 10 Commandments? - Life, Hope & Truth

Differences in teachings and interpretation[change change source] These commandments are translated from ancient Hebrew to Basic English , so the exact words chosen may not mean to us exactly what they meant to the Hebrews. There are a variety of interpretations of these commandments: It was done by Michelangelo. It shows an image of God. One understanding on the commandment to not make "any image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above" is as from Roman Catholicism: The Eastern Orthodox Church has a very similar position. Eastern Orthodoxy teaches that the incarnation of an invisible God as a visible human, Jesus, makes it alright to worship images see Iconoclasm. But, for Jews, Muslims, and most other Christians that violates the commandment. The Amish forbid any sort of image, such as photos. Sabbath day Main articles: Sabbath and Shabbat Jews honor the Sabbath Shabbat from sundown on Friday until the appearance of three stars in the sky on Saturday night, the seventh day of the week on the Jewish calendar. Most Christians honor the Sabbath on Sunday to remember the Resurrection of Jesus on the first day of the week on the Jewish calendar. Some conservative Christians are "Sabbatarians" most of these follow the Reformed traditions. Others believe that the Sabbath remains as a day of rest on Saturday, while Sunday as a day of worship, in reference to Acts Also, Jesus appeared to his followers on the "first day of the week" while they were in hiding. The Seventh-day Adventist Church , and some others, believe that the custom of meeting for worship on Sunday originated in paganism , specifically Sol Invictus and Mithraism in which sun god worship took place on Sunday. Married relations To "be false to the married relation", called adultery , is when a married person has sexual relations with a person other than his or her spouse. Having sex without marriage is fornication and is a sin, King James Bible the original unchanged English version. Older Protestant translations of the Bible, those based on the Vulgate and Roman Catholic translations usually translate it "Thou shalt not kill ". Jewish and newer Protestant versions tend to use "You shall not murder ". There are different opinions as to which translation is more faithful to the original. The many examples in the Old Testament of killing sanctioned by God, are quoted in defense of the view that "murder" is more accurate.
