12 Amazing Authors Who Died Far Too Young December 6th, Everyone eventually falls into the chilling embrace of the Grim Reaper, but some manage to leave behind legacies fondly remembered by more than just friends and family.

However short their life spans, these actors, writers, musicians, and leaders all managed to make their mark on history in a big way. King Tut Born c. 1361 BC, died 1352 BC, age 39. King Tutankhamun was a pharaoh in the 18th Egyptian dynasty more than 3,000 years ago. He died at 19 years old. From what we know, the cause of death was likely an infected leg. Known as one of the greatest military leaders in human history, Alexander of Macedonia led his armies across Persia on a campaign that lasted over a decade. He was never defeated in battle, and the empire he created was the largest that the world had ever seen at that time. However, his life of unending conquest and battle took its toll: He died of malaria at age 32. He eliminated political rivals and forced parents to watch their own sons be executed. Eventually, he declared himself to be a god, and the people of Rome had had enough. He was assassinated by a group of guards in 41 AD well before his 29th birthday. Joan of Arc Born c. 1412, died May 30, 1419, age 27. Captured by the English a year later, she was convicted of heresy and burned at the stake. Christopher Marlowe Baptized February 26, 1564, died May 30, 1593, age 29. He was killed in a fight with three men over the bill at an inn. The name Mozart is up there with names like Einstein and Michelangelo as someone who represents the very peak of their field. In his early thirties, his mental and physical health began deteriorating, and he died at age 35 of uncertain causes. John Keats Born October 31, 1795, died February 23, 1821, age 25. Keats contracted tuberculosis in 1819, and died just two years later. It would be her only successful work before she died of tuberculosis in 1862. Billy the Kid Born November 23, 1859, died July 14, 1881, age 21. An icon of the Old West, Billy the Kid was an infamous outlaw and gunfighter. Born in New York City, he headed west at a young age and began his career of violence and bloodshed. He was said to have killed 21 men, one for each year of his life. He was hunted down and shot by Sheriff Patrick Garrett in 1881. Billy the Kid, left Stephen Crane Born November 1, 1897, died June 5, 1902, age 25. A Girl of the Streets are both considered to be classics. He died of tuberculosis in 1902. Advertisement 33 and Bonnie and Clyde were a famous gangster couple who operated at the height of the Great Depression. Eventually, they were betrayed by a friend and killed in a shootout with police in 1934. James Dean Born February 8, 1931, died September 30, 1955, age 24. He died in a car crash in 1955. Buddy Holly Born September 7, 1933, died February 3, 1959, age 25. If you like rock and roll in any of its forms, Buddy Holly might be to thank. Ritchie Valens Born, May 13, 1943, died February 3rd, 1959, age 16. Valens was just 17 when he died along with Holly and The Big Bopper. Stuart Sutcliffe Born June 23, 1941, died April 10, 1956, age 14. However, he would leave the band in 1962, never even recording in studio with them and seeing none of their success. He died from a cerebral hemorrhage in 1966, before the Beatles had even charted a single hit. The guy with sunglasses Marilyn Monroe Born June 1, 1926, died August 5, 1962, age 36. Monroe died of a drug overdose in 1962. The coroner explained that this was likely because she was an addict, and as such, her body would have digested the pills faster. Sylvia Plath Born October 27, 1932, died February 11, 1962, age 29. Plath is also remembered for her troubled marriage to poet Ted Hughes and her struggles with depression; she committed suicide in 1962. Brian Epstein Born September 19, 1934, died August 27, 1967, age 32. He died from a drug overdose a year later. Otis Redding Born September 9, 1941, died December 10, 1967, age 26. Known as the King of Southern Soul, Otis Redding was an early legend of rock and roll, popular with both black and white audiences. He died in a plane crash, along with four members of his backup band, in 1967. Yuri Gagarin Born March 9, 1934, died March 27, 1968, age 34. Gagarin was the Russian cosmonaut who famously became the first person to travel to space in 1968. His flight lasted just minutes, and he travelled around the Earth at 27,000 kilometers per hour. He died in a plane crash before he could return to space again. Bruce Lee Born November 27, 1940, died July 20, 1973, age 32. Maybe the most popular martial artist ever, Lee brought Chinese martial arts to Hollywood cinema with movies like Fists of Fury and Enter the Dragon. Lee died in 1973 from an unexpected reaction to pain killers. Nick Drake Born June 19, 1948, died November 25, 1974, age 26. Unfortunately, Drake never lived to see his music appreciated. He died from an overdose of his antidepressants in 1974, which most people believe to have been a suicide. Sid Vicious Born May 10, 1957, died February 2, 1979, age 21. Perhaps nobody embodied the band more than Vicious, their troubled bass player. In late 1978, his girlfriend Nancy Spungen was found dead of a stab wound on the floor of their hotel room.

Though released on bail shortly after, he entered a downward spiral, and was found dead from a drug overdose a few months later. Ian Curtis Born July 15, , died May 18, , age He committed suicide by hanging in His story was dramatized in the movie Control. Bob Marley Born February 6, , died May 11, , age He helped introduce the world to the genre, and was perhaps the first international superstar to come from outside the developed world. He died of cancer in at just 36 years old. Terry Fox Born July 28, , died June 28, , age Diagnosed with cancer at age 18, Fox had his right leg amputated as a result. He made it thousands of miles, but unfortunately before he could make it through the province of Ontario, his cancer returned and he was forced to stop. He died in hospital a little over a year later, and has since become a Canadian national hero. Brandon Lee Born February 1, , died March 31, , age In , he was cast in the film adaptation The Crow comic books, and during filming he was meant to be shot at by a gun with blanks. However, due to complications with a prop gun, Lee was accidentally shot. He died from his injuries shortly after. River Phoenix Born August 23, , died October 31, , age He died from a drug overdose outside the famous Viper Room in West Hollywood in Tupac Shakur Born June 16, , died September 13, , age Tupac was one of biggest names in the gangsta rap scene of the nineties. He was closely involved in gangs in his early life, which inspired his music but which also created tensions for him as his fame grew. Born May 21, , died March 9, , age He was discovered by Puff Daddy in the early nineties, and would go on to record some of the most popular rap music ever created. Princess Diana Born July 1, , died August 31, , age The mother of Prince William and Prince Harry and the onetime wife of Prince Charles, Princess Diana was a hugely popular figure in the British Commonwealth in her lifetime, and was known for her humanitarian efforts. There is little evidence of his exact birth place. His father first worked as a hostler [6] at the stables attached to the Swan and Hoop Inn, an establishment he later managed, and where the growing family lived for some years. Keats believed that he was born at the inn, a birthplace of humble origins, but there is no evidence to support his belief. The small school had a liberal outlook and a progressive curriculum more modern than the larger, more prestigious schools. The young Keats was described by his friend Edward Holmes as a volatile character, "always in extremes", given to indolence and fighting. However, at 13 he began focusing his energy on reading and study, winning his first academic prize in midsummer Frances remarried two months later, but left her new husband soon afterwards, and the four children went to live with their grandmother, Alice Jennings, in the village of Edmonton. She appointed two guardians, Richard Abbey and John Sandell, to take care of them. Keats lodged in the attic above the surgery at 7 Church Street until Historically, blame has often been laid on Abbey as legal guardian, but he may also have been unaware. It seems he did not. Money was always a great concern and difficulty for him, as he struggled to stay out of debt and make his way in the world independently. Oft of one wide expanse had I been told That deep-browed Homer ruled as his demesne; Yet did I never breathe its pure serene Till I heard Chapman speak out loud and bold: Within a month of starting, he was accepted as a dresser at the hospital, assisting surgeons during operations, the equivalent of a junior house surgeon today. It was a significant promotion, that marked a distinct aptitude for medicine; it brought greater responsibility and a heavier workload. He felt that he faced a stark choice. Now, strongly drawn by ambition, inspired by fellow poets such as Leigh Hunt and Lord Byron , and beleaguered by family financial crises, he suffered periods of depression. Among his poems of was *To My Brothers*. There he began "Calidore" and initiated the era of his great letter writing. On his return to London, he took lodgings at 8 Dean Street, Southwark, and braced himself for further study in order to become a member of the Royal College of Surgeons. Keats immediately changed publishers to Taylor and Hessey on Fleet Street. Within a month of the publication of *Poems* they were planning a new Keats volume and had paid him an advance. In later years, Woodhouse was one of the few people to accompany Keats to Gravesend to embark on his final trip to Rome. It was a decisive turning point for Keats, establishing him in the public eye as a figure in what Hunt termed "a new school of poetry. What imagination seizes as Beauty must be truth. Keats had spent a great deal on his medical training and, despite his state of financial hardship and indebtedness, had made large loans to friends such as painter Benjamin Haydon. By lending so much, Keats could no longer cover the interest of his own debts. Both John and George nursed their brother Tom, who was suffering from tuberculosis. The house was close to Hunt and others from his circle in Hampstead, as well as to Coleridge , respected elder of the first wave of Romantic poets, at that time living in Highgate. In a letter to his brother George, Keats wrote that they talked about "a thousand things, Some biographers suggest that this is when tuberculosis, his "family disease," first took hold. Keats "refuses to give it a name" in his letters. The winter of 1819, though a difficult period for the poet, marked the beginning of his *annus mirabilis* in which he wrote his most mature work. According to Brown, " *Ode to a Nightingale* " was composed under a plum tree in the garden. Keats felt a tranquil and continual joy in her song; and one morning he took his chair from the breakfast-table to the grass-plot under a plum-tree, where he sat for two or three hours. When he came into the house, I perceived he had some scraps of paper in his hand, and these he was quietly thrusting behind the books. On inquiry, I found those scraps, four or five in number, contained his poetic feelings on the song of our nightingale. With biting sarcasm, Lockhart advised, "It is a better and a wiser thing to be a starved apothecary than a starved poet; so back to the shop Mr John, back to plasters, pills, and ointment boxes". The dismissal was as much political as literary, aimed at upstart young writers deemed uncouth for their lack of education, non-formal rhyming and "low diction". They had not attended Eton , Harrow or Oxbridge and they were not from the upper classes. *Agnes*, and *Other Poems*, was eventually published in July It received greater acclaim than had *Endymion* or *Poems*,

finding favourable notices in both *The Examiner* and *Edinburgh Review*. It would come to be recognised as one of the most important poetic works ever published. He writes that he "frequented her rooms" in the winter of 1819, and in his letters to George says that he "warmed with her" and "kissed her". The themes of "The Eve of St. Agnes" and "La Belle Dame sans Merci" perhaps revised for her as a declaration. It was a work in progress which he continued until the last months of his life, and the poem came to be associated with their relationship. Darkness, disease and depression surrounded him, reflected in poems such as "The Eve of St. Agnes" and "La Belle Dame sans Merci" where love and death both stalk. In September Keats left for Rome knowing he would probably never see Brawne again. After leaving he felt unable to write to her or read her letters, although he did correspond with her mother. In 1820, more than 12 years after his death, she married and went on to have three children; she outlived Keats by more than 40 years. Rome[edit] During Keats's stay in Rome, he displayed increasingly serious symptoms of tuberculosis, suffering two lung haemorrhages in the first few days of February. Hunt nursed him in London for much of the following summer. At the suggestion of his doctors, he agreed to move to Italy with his friend Joseph Severn. On 13 September, they left for Gravesend and four days later boarded the sailing brig *Maria Crowther*, where he made the final revisions of "Bright Star". The journey was a minor catastrophe: When they finally docked in Naples, the ship was held in quarantine for ten days due to a suspected outbreak of cholera in Britain. Keats reached Rome on 14 November, by which time any hope of the warmer climate he sought had disappeared. My stomach continues so bad, that I feel it worse on opening any book yet I am much better than I was in Quarantine. Then I am afraid to encounter the proing and conning of any thing interesting to me in England. I have an habitual feeling of my real life having past, and that I am leading a posthumous existence". Despite care from Severn and Dr. James Clark, his health rapidly deteriorated. The medical attention Keats received may have hastened his death. Clark eventually diagnosed consumption tuberculosis and placed Keats on a starvation diet of an anchovy and a piece of bread a day intended to reduce the blood flow to his stomach. He also bled the poet: Then in Rome he tried again As a result Keats went through dreadful agonies with nothing to ease the pain at all. He repeatedly demanded "how long is this posthumous existence of mine to go on? Keats was coughing up blood and covered in sweat. On first coughing up blood, he said "I know the colour of that blood! It is arterial blood. I cannot be deceived in that colour. That drop of blood is my death warrant. Severn writes, Keats raves till I am in a complete tremble for him [66] His last request was to be placed under a tombstone bearing no name or date, only the words, "Here lies One whose Name was writ in Water. Describing the site today, Marsh wrote, "In the old part of the graveyard, barely a field when Keats was buried here, there are now umbrella pines, myrtle shrubs, roses, and carpets of wild violets". He may have possessed an innate poetic sensibility, but his early works were clearly those of a young man learning his craft. His first attempts at verse were often vague, languorously narcotic and lacking a clear eye. First stanza of " To Autumn ", [81] September By the time of his death, Keats had therefore been associated with the taints of both old and new schools: Marked as the standard-bearer of sensory writing, his reputation grew steadily and remarkably. Ridley claimed the ode "is the most serenely flawless poem in our language. These early writings coloured all subsequent biography and have become embedded in a body of Keats legend. The idealised image of the heroic romantic poet who battled poverty and died young was inflated by the late arrival of an authoritative biography and the lack of an accurate likeness. Most of the surviving portraits of Keats were painted after his death, and those who knew him held that they did not succeed in capturing his unique quality and intensity. August John Keats: It was directed by John Barnes. He is the companion and sidekick of the protagonist. During the 19th century, critics deemed them unworthy of attention, distractions from his poetic works. Eliot described them as "certainly the most notable and most important ever written by any English poet. From spring, however, there is a rich record of his prolific and impressive skills as letter writer. They glitter with humour and critical intelligence. What shocks the virtuous philosopher, delights the camelion [chameleon] Poet. It does no harm from its relish of the dark side of things any more than from its taste for the bright one; because they both end in speculation. Penlighten remembers and salutes some famous writers who died young. Penlighten Staff Last Updated: Apr 9, People living deeply have no fear of death. Death is inevitable, and perhaps, the only certainty that life holds for us. The illustrious writers and poets featured here, had their lives extinguished a little too soon. But remarkable as they all were, they did manage to leave a lasting imprint on the world with their literary gems. This Penlighten article chronicles the events leading up to their final days. Things took a dramatic turn after his death from tuberculosis at the age of 25, and till date, Keats remains a much-appreciated English poet and writer of all time. He spent a significant part of his brief life working as a war correspondent, first in Cuba, and later in Greece. He spent the final years of his life in England, battling financial difficulties and failing health. Crane passed away at the age of 28 in a Black Forest health resort, as a victim of tuberculosis. Shakespeare claimed to have been influenced heavily by Marlowe, and rose to prominence following his sudden death. During his lifetime, Marlowe was accused of blasphemy and spying, and was even arrested for the same. He was stabbed to death ten days later, having lived for a mere 29 years. His death came as a shock to his admirers and contemporaries, when his vessel capsized off the Sardinian coastline, a few days before his 30th birthday. Anne chose to write under a pen name, Acton Bell, and wrote a volume of poems, along with two novels. Her last novel, *The Tenant of Wildfell Hall* is considered to be an iconic novel to have highlighted feminist ideals. Poor health besieged her throughout her life, and she died aged 29 of pulmonary tuberculosis. Her only novel, *Wuthering Heights*, which was written under the pen name Ellis Bell is considered to be a classic piece of English literature. She died of tuberculosis at the age of 30, having steadfastly refused any medical treatment through the course of her illness. I do it exceptionally well. I do it so it feels like hell. I do it so it feels real. I guess you could say I have a call. Plath garnered considerable praise for her literary endeavors, *The Colossus and Other Poems* and *Ariel*. The young man had gone through some bumps in his life and was just starting to turn it around, and then, tragically, he died an accidental death. She's looking for something fairly short (under 10 lines), modern, nothing too literary, and something that celebrates the immortality of family love.

As far back as ancient times, animals have been used to represent and critique our human behavior. I think Lucie was part animal. Certainly, she was feral. She believed that in a prior life she had been a lynx, a small lynx. And in this life, she was an ailurophile—“or lover of cats. In her poems, there is always the lingering possibility of death. I suspect that Lucie understood from an early age that, as humans, we are finite. In the English language, there is no other poet doing what Lucie did. The Oxford English Dictionary was her Bible, and Lucie refreshed the English language with her radiantly original poems. This summer, I visited her grave at Mount Auburn Cemetery in Cambridge, Massachusetts several times, and a thick coat of grass already sparkles over her. I find it almost unbearable to absorb her loss. Sometimes, to keep her alive, I repeat a list of words with her name embedded in them: I loved her poems and cannot believe there will be no more. I am moved by the supreme confidence expressed in his introduction to his treatise. That connection between the animal world and our own—a connection that feels more tenuous every minute—yields profound revelations about human beings, and especially about sex. It is in part about a body navigating a city; it is also about a mind attempting to navigate both what it means to be here on earth and what it means to be at all. Are sex and death the only rafts out of here? Where did we think we were going? My son is sleeping on the couch with all the lights on. Nothing bad can happen. How long does it take? Ultimately, I think Barnett is getting at the humanness of questioning, the way in which the act of questioning speaks to the longing inside each of us. Is there such a thing? The result is a book that champions the human spirit of inquiry, and argues that inquiry is an impulse toward communion with a community, even as it also suggests that the same community is the very context within which we come to understand our loneliness, which is both the answer to and the relentless riddle of our inner lives. I believe that it is one of the best story collections published in the late twentieth century. The first is a tweet of Joan Didion photoshopped behind a Blink Fitness reception desk, and needs almost no words. No one is offended. No one decries sexism. British poet John Keats' poetry was met with a lukewarm response in his lifetime, but has since become revered for its imagery and philosophy. Keats contracted tuberculosis in , and died just two years later.

Share4 Shares Many great writers have lived for only a short time but have left behind them a great legacy in literature. This is a list of ten of the great writers who have died before their time. For the sake of keeping order in the list, I am only including writers that died under the age of 30.

Stephen Crane Died aged 29 Crane was an American novelist, poet, and short-story writer, best known for his novels *Maggie*: While alternating bohemian student life and explorations of the Bowery slums with visits to genteel relatives in the country near Port Jervis, N. Y. He became a better writer with *Write Good or Die* at Amazon. With her sister Emily, she invented the imaginary kingdom of Gondal, about which they wrote verse and prose the latter now lost from the early 19th century until she took a position as governess briefly in 1811 and then again for four years, 1815–1819, with the Robinsons, the family of a clergyman, at Thorpe Green, near York. There her irresponsible brother, Branwell, joined her in 1812, intending to serve as a tutor. Like her sisters, she fell ill with tuberculosis toward the end of 1817 and died the following May.

John Keats was educated at Repton School in Derbyshire. After a visit to China he studied painting at the Goldsmith School of Art. In 1817, while still at school, he was severely injured in a cycling accident that left him an invalid for the rest of his life; but he continued painting, exhibiting frequently at the Leicester galleries, and writing. He died of spinal tuberculosis.

Charles Radiguet died of typhoid, his body wasted by dissipation and alcoholism. In 1919 Toole was posthumously awarded the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. Toole committed suicide on March 26, 1942, after disappearing from New Orleans, by putting one end of a garden hose into the exhaust pipe of his car and the other into the window of the car in which he was sitting. The suicide note he left was destroyed by his mother, who made conflicting statements as to its general contents. He was buried at Greenwood Cemetery in New Orleans.

At first considered slow in learning, Chatterton had a tearful childhood, choosing the solitude of an attic and making no progress with his alphabet. He learned to read far in advance of his age but only from old materials, music folios, a black-letter Bible, and muniments taken by his father from a chest in the Church of St. Andrew. Though literally starving, Chatterton refused the food of friends and, on the night of August 24, 1770, took arsenic in his Holborn garret and died. The rest of the novel describes his search for her and for the house and the mood of wonderment he knew there. Its outstanding quality is evocation of an atmosphere of otherworldly nostalgia, against a realistically observed rural background.

Sylvia Plath Died aged 30 Sylvia Plath was an American poet and novelist whose best-known works are preoccupied with alienation, death, and self-destruction. Plath published her first poem at age eight. She entered and won many literary contests and while still in high school sold her first poem, to *Seventeen* magazine. She entered Smith College on a scholarship in 1955 and was a cowinner of the *Mademoiselle* magazine fiction contest in 1956. Despite her remarkable artistic, academic, and social success at Smith, Plath suffered from severe depression and underwent a period of psychiatric hospitalization. She killed herself with gas from an oven at the age of 30. She was an English novelist and poet who produced but one novel, *Wuthering Heights*, a highly imaginative novel of passion and hate set on the Yorkshire moors. She died of tuberculosis at the age of 37.

Arthur Rimbaud Died aged 37 French poet and adventurer who won renown among the Symbolist movement and markedly influenced modern poetry. As a boy he was a restless but brilliant student. By the age of fifteen he had won many prizes and composed original verses and dialogues in Latin. Verlaine, who was married, promptly fell in love with the sullen, blue-eyed, overgrown 5 ft 10 in, light-brown-haired adolescent. They became lovers and led a wild, vagabond-like life spiced by absinthe and hashish. They scandalized the Parisian literary coterie on account of the outrageous behaviour of Rimbaud, the archetypical *enfant terrible*, who throughout this period continued to write strikingly visionary verse. Rimbaud stopped writing at the age of 17. After living in Africa for many of the following years, Rimbaud developed right knee synovitis and subsequently a carcinoma in his right knee. He died in Marseille at the age of 35.

John Keats Died aged 25 Keats was an English Romantic lyric poet who devoted his short life to the perfection of a poetry marked by vivid imagery, great sensuous appeal, and an attempt to express a philosophy through classical legend. In the summer of 1819 Keats went on a walking

tour in the Lake District of northern England and Scotland with his friend Charles Brown, and his exposure and overexertions on that trip brought on the first symptoms of the tuberculosis of which he was to die. When Keats was ordered south for the winter, Joseph Severn undertook to accompany him to Rome. They sailed in September, and from Naples they went to Rome, where in early December Keats had a relapse. Faithfully tended by Severn to the last, he died in Rome. Known as a playboy, reports claimed Christina was always trying to keep up with Roussel, with whom she was infatuated by. In , Christina was found dead in her Argentina home. The heiress was discovered by her maid in the shower, and while rumors of suicide soon surfaced, autopsy reports showed Christina died of a fatal heart attack. Christina was 37 years old. Monroe had humble beginnings growing up in foster homes, then landed a gig as a model, leading her to a career in acting. Monroe married three times, and was also romantically linked to several high profile men including, President John F Kennedy, Frank Sinatra , Robert F. Kennedy, and Marlon Brando.
