How Bagpipes Work Bagpipes are a class of musical instrument, aerophones, using enclosed reeds fed from a constant reservoir of air in the form of a bag. The Great Highland Bagpipes (GHB) consists of a bag.

Can you explain the requirements and levels? The requirements for proficiency levels seven to twelve have been devised to coincide with the PPBSO solo and pipe band grade levels. Once a student has completed all of the requirements for one of these levels, they will be capable of performing at the applicable grade, either in a pipe band or as a soloist. In the Piobaireachd Series, the requirements for the first level of proficiency has been designed to teach you everything you need to know to be able to play your first Piobaireachd " which could be used in an entry grade level solo competition. The requirements for proficiency levels two to six have been devised to coincide with the PPBSO solo grade levels. Once you have completed all of the material and tune requirements for these levels, you will be capable of performing at the applicable grade as a soloist. What will I learn from each tutor book? Each tutor book will have a paragraph included in the preliminary pages that explains the goals for that specific level and will provide an understanding of what the student can expect to be able to accomplish and what they should know when they have completed that level. Do I need to have a teacher? It is always recommended that students work with a qualified teacher. However, if the student does not have access to a teacher, this curriculum will enable a student, anywhere in the world, to successfully progress until such time as they are able to find a piping instructor. What do I need to begin my training? Each tutor book will have a paragraph included in the preliminary pages that identifies what items you will require to complete that particular level. How long does each tutor book take to finish and how long should I practice? Each tutor book will identify how much time on average: The student should dedicate for both the study and practice of each lesson It should take the student to work their way through the content of each lesson We estimate that each student should take to complete all of the requirements contained in the tutor book Is there an audio CD that corresponds with the tutor book? Yes, there is an instructional CD that corresponds with and is included with each tutor book. This CD contains audio examples of all of the practical requirements. As a training aid, the accompanying CD will: Provide audio assistance and support in helping the student to understand all of the practical aspects that are being taught Give the student a measurement tool to determine when they are playing the designated exercises or tunes at the expected standard You will find a symbol throughout each tutor book that identifies those aspects that have an audio example or track of the material being covered.

WELCOME The interest in the Highland Bagpipe Tutor Student Manual - now in its fourth edition - prompted the development of a companion manual for the instructor. The intent is not to duplicate the materials in the Student.

An update by Geoff Hore The update comments are in blue font. Cannon identified seven different editions of this famous tutor. He also mentioned a number of others with different dates but did not assign edition numbers to them. Moreover, he commented that there appeared to be many editions issued in rapid succession. The present writer has a large number of previously unknown editions and they confirm the comment above. This collection has had four major revisions: Furthermore, there have been a number of publishers throughout the life of this tutor and those identified at this time are: The question of edition numbering of this book is a vexed one. This works well when one is positive that all editions of a book are known; the bibliographer simply assigns numbers in chronological order. Cannon located about a dozen different editions but the present writer has identified more and this number is now over There is no doubt more will turn up and this has forced the abandonment of assigning edition numbers "at least for the time being. The one that Cannon calls edition I will retain that number but all other editions will be identified by its date. When we are sure that all editions have been identified the re-numbering will be carried out. The present writer has an early edition that may well predate the one Cannon thought was the first. Both editions have been inspected and although there are differences between the two it is not possible to state categorically that one came before the other. The details of these differences will be commented on when discussing the individual books. Covers missing; bound up with some other books. The two are identical except for the following: In this book page 40 is numbered. In the one above it is not. There are many alterations of grace notes but only one new tune is introduced: After Contents as per edition. The boards have been bound to the book post publication. After but before Contents as per edition it is possible that there were extra pages at the end. The rear cover is missing and possibly other pages as well. It has not been ascertained when the address Wigmore Street started to be used. The hand written date, , by J M Beckett may be the date he bought it. It is clear that there were many editions issued in rapid succession, of which this is but one example. Another dated was priced 3s. There has been much change in the music. Many of the existing tunes have been completely revised with new settings and in some cases 3rd and 4th parts added. Some tunes have been replaced with new ones and others have been moved to other parts of the book. Nearly all the books published after have a date at the top of the front cover and title-page. This shows that the Willie Ross revised versions were reprinted at two or three yearly intervals until with very little change to the content. This marriage occurred on 15 October 1 and Willie Ross was the piper for the occasion. This edition does not have January on page I as described above.

It is essential that you practise each exercise and the tunes rigorously and that equal attention is given to the exercises as to the tunes. Speed of progression from the chanter to the bagpipes will vary from student to student and will depend on a number of factors, not least, the amount of time spent practising. As an approximate guide, you should aim to have mastered about 7 or 8 simple tunes on the chanter before any of these could be attempted on the pipes. You should also have acquired a basic competence in music theory as it relates to the Highland Bagpipe and these skills combined will allow you to read and learn pipe music from other sources. Students who are already musically literate may wish to read Appendix D before commencing in order to appreciate the particular methods of notation for pipe music. Practise hard, listen carefully and you will find a world full of new possibilities waiting for you.
