Bryan Wood How you haul your bike from place to place is like your taste in music: It evolves over the years, can all of a sudden completely change, and people are sure theirs is the best. How you get your motorcycle from place to place falls into four camps: Why should I change my daily driver because I own a bike? Because the neighbors already look at me funny without a rape van. But then, those folks seldom need to take a sport bike to a track day or a dirt bike to the land where the pavement ends. Others typically start off as category 2 by trailering their bike behind what they already own, and then buy a truck before saying to hell with what the neighbors think and fuel economy and getting a van. For the rest of you, here are my five suggestions for each category. Trailering If you live out in the suburbs or a more rural area owning a trailer, finding a place to park it is not a big deal. My suggestion is to find a daily driver you like that U-Haul says can tow their trailer. For trailer towing, I like less sporty cars that get decent mileage. All of these put pickup trucks and vans to shame mileage wise. Most are rated for 1,1lbsâ€™ more recent ones are rated higher and get better mileage. You could tow with an Impreza WRX, but the softer ride and more relaxed cruising of the non-turbo versions are better after a long day on a bike. The extra room in back is great for tools, leathers and camping gear, and it will tow the same as the other two listed above. They are all pretty much awful, but some are less so than others. These are all the same vans and are available in a million different shapes, sizes, and weight ratings. All of them are also turbo diesel powered. If you can find a short wheelbase, low roof Sprinter for not a lot of money you have hit the jackpot for bike hauling, freeway cruising, and fuel economy. These can get 30 mpg easily, haul about four bikes and a ton of gear, and host a house party at the track. These vans were produced for a long time, so there are a lot of them out there. These even came with an all-wheel drive system from the factory, which if you can find one, it will cost way less

It is unquestionably one of the finest comets of the past two decades, but is it the best one of all? Few celestial objects excite the imaginations of stargazers and the general public like a good comet. There have been some stunners, some surprises, and a few that could have been great, but fell short. That said, it did put on a pretty good show in the spring of 1991. I viewed and photographed it from my balcony in downtown Victoria, British Columbia. Along with a group of friends and fellow observers, I set up my camera and binoculars on a grassy hill overlooking the Gulf of Nicoya, and patiently waited in the relenting tropical heat and fading twilight for a shot at glimpsing the comet. Once I was able to find the Moon in binoculars, sighting the comet was easy. In all, it was a satisfying, if not spectacular visitor. The comet as we first saw it on March 12, from Costa Rica. Photo courtesy Doug Haas. And if you live in the southern hemisphere, it likely tops your list. But I live in Canada. Even still, it was a splendid sight. During a rare break in the overcast weather, we found our way to the top of a little, snow-covered hill with a good view across a nearby lagoon towards the west. We knew that the comet was going to be a real horizon scraper. We also knew that its visibility was going to be a race between fading daylight and the comet setting. Rick spotted McNaught first when a nearby contrail from passing jet airplane caught his attention. Memorable though it was, that proved to be my one and only glimpse of this magnificent visitor. At any given time there are dozens of comets in the sky. But every now and then, one of them does something completely unexpected and ends up being a real delight. Comet Holmes photographed in Perseus on December 8, 1991. On that night the comet was roughly 1-degree across. At best, it had the potential to become a decent telescopic sight, though nothing to wake the neighbours over. My first encounter with Holmes came on the night of October 25th, the day after the flare-up was first noted. Even in twilight and under the light of a full Moon, Holmes was a conspicuous naked-eye object in Perseus. In a telescope, it looked like a pale yellow snowball with a star-like nucleus. Only a few nights later, the comet was distinctly non-stellar even to the unaided eye. And this was just the opening act! Comet Holmes photographed on successive nights as it grew larger. The same telescope and camera was used for each image. Night after night I looked in on Comet Holmes and watched it grow larger and larger, and eventually, fainter and fainter. Over the following weeks and months, it continued to expand and eventually transformed itself from an intensely bright dot, to a big blob, to a mere haze so diaphanous and insubstantial that you could scarcely see it at all. And in this case, that was a good thing! Comet Holmes and gibbous Moon were photographed within minutes of each other on November 21, 1991, with the same equipment. On that night, the comet appeared larger than the Moon. Sadly, some of this excitement led to a tragic suicide cult and a lot of poor science reporting in the mass media. One reason Hale-Bopp was so widely noted was because it was so long in coming. American amateurs, Alan Hale and Thomas Bopp, first sighted the object in July 1995, and right away speculation began that it had the potential to be something really special. For backyard astronomers, it felt like having to wait nearly two years for Christmas! I got my first look at Hale-Bopp while attending the Mt. How many comets can one expect to see naked eye from indoors under the light dome of a major city? And as impressive as the comet was from downtown, it was breathtakingly awesome under dark skies. Comet Hale-Bopp setting, April 1, 1997. I fondly remember making treks to a dark-sky site north of Vancouver halfway to Whistler to photograph the comet and soak in the view. Hale-Bopp had an intensely bright nucleus and two bright, distinct tails. Our observing spot was next to a railway line that saw very light traffic at night. But there was one train that came through pretty much once every evening. One night, while observing Hale-Bopp, we heard the unmistakable rumble of a distant train. Like a bunch of trained monkeys, we turned our backs to the track, covered our eyes, and waited for the train and its blinding light to go by. But this time, something was different. The train seemed to take forever to reach us, and when it finally did, we could hear the unmistakable squeal of train wheels slowly grinding to a complete halt. The train, and its billion-candle-power light, had apparently broken down right next to our observing spot. How could this happen? Why here, why now? After

a few minutes, they climbed back aboard their train and rumbled off on their way. The allure of Comet Hale-Bopp was powerful enough to stop a locomotive. Most would agree that the choice of best northern-hemisphere comet in the past 20 years comes down to choosing between Hale-Bopp and Hyakutake. Hyakutake felt like a gift. As we were biding our time waiting for Hale-Bopp to make its way to the inner solar system and live up to predictions, Hyakutake seem to come out of nowhere. While Hale-Bopp got all the press and public attention, Hyakutake was more like a private comet – a reward for the faithful who had endured a seemingly endless string of disappointments and no-shows that included Kohoutek in and Halley in. But above all, Hyakutake was visually stunning. In the same way the clothes make the man, the tail makes the comet. And Hyakutake had an extravagantly long, flowing tail. Those of us lucky enough to enjoy the view from a dark-sky site were very much aware we were seeing an object of extraordinary rarity and magnificence. Add to that the brevity of its appearance, and you have all the ingredients for once-in-a-lifetime cometary experience. Hyakutake on the night of closest approach. Note its size compared with the Big Dipper. While Hale-Bopp took a long time to come and go, Hyakutake went by like a shot. At our regular dark-sky site that night, there was an usually large crowd. When I arrived at the site and got out of my car, I looked up and was immediately stunned into speechlessness. I vividly recall kneeling in the snow to align my telescope mount for the photographs you see here. It was a wonderfully clear, cold, crisp, and calm night that seemed perfect for comet viewing. And even as we looked up in awe and astonishment, we also felt sadness nibbling away at the edges of our perception. It was as if we collectively knew that this was a one-night-only show. I stayed with the comet until morning twilight, not wanting to let it go. Two nights later I returned to the site hoping to recapture some of the magic from the previous session. I was the only one there – it felt like turning up for a parade the day after it had gone by. By then the comet was significantly diminished. There were afterwards, but they all look up to us and follow what we do. Most of them were even our customers at one point. How did the company develop? The development of our company was always based on ergonomics; the comfort of the player at the machine was paramount, and to provide the best quality materials and development. We have always invested our energy and time into developing these things. The second thing that we do best, is simplicity. We make our games as simple as they can be, to fully comfort real casino players. We study each specific market, we test and we learn about the habits and the likings of the players, and we come up with the game design designated and customized to fit perfectly. Human beings should always be creative and developing ideas â€” they should not be copying all the time. In Slovenia we have a saying: It means, if you buy something cheap, you will some time soon have to buy again to replace it because it will get broken, so you are buying twice. It almost seems to be working against the capitalist model, where you supply materials with a finite life span so you have to replace them with new â€” and sell more products. Alfastreet does not do that. Since we started in this field 20 years ago, a lot of things have changed. It started as a small part of the company, now it is the core of our business. We still provide interior designs and build furniture for casinos, if they are refurbishing we can work with their designs and provide a very complete service. We have requests because it is something we are still known for, and they know the quality of our Roulette products. He then developed his own ideas, and six years ago he started a new brand in Alfastreet Marine; we now offer three different of boat with different sizes and vast range of customization options. This side of the business is growing, visibility is increasing, and it is another string to our bow. No, at the beginning the first request came from abroad. Demand was high very quickly; we were recognised as a company that developed something the market really needed, especially our R8 machine which is still unique and still best-performing on the market. Today the player can play four games simultaneously; which is also unique in the gaming world. Once a casino sees what the terminal can bring to their venue, and see what they can do with it, they want to have it. But some markets are more traditional, they prefer the eight-seater but as markets grow, they are moving toward the options to add different games. If they have an R8 they can then add games and player options with the single terminal machine. They are very important for us in many markets worldwide. I gather you also sell used machines â€” is that a big part of the business? We do get asked for used machines, which we sell at a very

reasonable price suitable for that regional market. We take Alfastreet machines and refurbish them with all new parts, so it is like a new machine – new bill acceptors, new ticket printers, new monitors. So we are shouting about this now, about selling refurbished machines: I get heartache when I see operators being disappointed by our products, simply because they chose seemingly cheaper option. Our name stands for quality and we try our best to rectify these situations. Is that how you source the used machines? Our customer typically knows if there is a new development and they can afford it, and they know historically their revenues on the casino floor are highest from their Alfastreet machines, so where possible, they like to upgrade or add extra machine of ours. We want to encourage anyone that has Alfastreet stock not to sell it on, but to call us for our best offer. What separates you from your competitors? Our relationship with our customers, our care for our machines and their performance, and our honesty, these are the things that make us stand out. We are proud to always address any problem, to assist where the assistance is needed, to help the ones that need help. Our customers are loyal to us because they know they are getting more than just a machine. Which are your strongest markets, and where would you be looking to develop? Asia is still very strong, the demands from there are really high; Europe is growing. Latin America is very strong, and Africa is also growing. Of course we are always looking at where economies are growing and markets are opening up. South America, the Caribbean, Africa are all growing markets so they will develop and have more success. Other markets are still looking for new products but are not as hungry as emerging markets. The US market is developing for us, though we have not been in it for long; we need to add to our impetus there, we have installations that are performing well but our name and the quantity of machines needs to grow there so we can be number one there, too. You have to focus on the US, and gain the trust of your clients to get space on their floors. We work with distributors in some markets; you need to have a local presence sometimes, though each market is very specific. Local knowledge is very valuable but many things are still handled by us here in Slovenia. How do you stay competitive in those markets? By doing what we have done in recent years; we will continue to work this way: But there is also our pricing and payment terms, these are also flexible and our prices are extremely reasonable in our sector. Some competitors we cannot really describe as such because they are such a small operation, working out of a garage, for example, they might not be around tomorrow. It comes across that there is great pride in the company from its employees! AR: Nothing in Alfastreet is outsourced, it is all made by our own employees; one of the things that separate us from some other companies is our team spirit, we are all working toward our success and we have fun while we do it. There is real energy and it is focussed toward having the best product and to be the best in the area that you are working. Each individual here is respected, and we have many team building events: We are open to each other from management down; we are all on the same level with respect for each other and we are proud of the company we work for. One of those we had been asked many times to develop, and now we have; clients were asking us, can you make a horse racing game? Beautifully designed as other products that we have, is leaving amazing impression when our clients see it. This will be a huge success as it will replace some of the very old machines on the floor from other manufacturers. How can teachers and administrators deal with troubled students? And how can they make schools safer for all? Too often, their students are hungry, in need of medical care, traumatized by domestic violence, fearful of gangs, and living with perilous housing security or homelessness. Distressed kids act out their troubles in school, and overworked teachers often double as social workers. President Trump and others have advocated arming teachers and recruiting former police and military personnel for school duty. But it is not necessary to model our schools after prisons. There are ways to create safe, nurturing schools where kids can learn, even in the face of extreme poverty and social challenges. The elementary school is now a place where everyone from the principal to the school custodian seeks to understand and heal the difficult experiences that cause kids to act out. The success in San Diego in codifying a culture of care on K campuses affirms the growing call in the civic sector for nonprofits to explore more partnerships with school districts to leverage resources and launch programs with staying power. In this way, trauma can contribute to a range of problems, from poor school performance to violence, risky behavior, and early death. Such trauma is distressingly common. What was important, he told her, was that he wanted to know what was going on with her. He left the classroom with the agitated student and took a walk with her around the campus while she described what was distressing her. Higa said he told her he understood that people have bad days and asked her to think about it before she did something like that again and contact him if she felt she might. Williams and Phillip Buchanon leading the way. The Hurricanes also had to survive scares late in the season against Boston College and Virginia Tech, and Nebraska was an inferior opponent in the championship game. Florida State set an NCAA record for points scored in a season with , but what made this team so impressive beyond the talent was how easy it made everything look. The Seminoles won their first 13 games by an average of Trailing in the fourth quarter for the first time all season, Winston threw the game-winning TD to Kelvin Benjamin with 13 seconds left to seal the undefeated season. Playing one of the toughest schedules in the country, the Trojans capped an undefeated season with the most lopsided championship game victory against Oklahoma in the BCS era. Leinart won the Heisman, White led the team in rushing, and Bush was the most exciting player in the country. This was an all-time great team and should be remembered as such -- over the next two NFL drafts, USC had 16 players get selected. The Crimson Tide held 12 of their 13 opponents to 14 points or fewer and smothered No. There were 14 Alabama defenders who played in that game who would go on to be selected in the NFL draft. Sophomore quarterback AJ McCarron wrested the starting job from Phillip Sims the first week of the season and wound up being named offensive MVP in the title game after completing 23 of 34 passes for yards against an LSU defense that was also loaded with future NFL talent. The Crimson Tide, led by McCarron, averaged Alabama rebounded from a home loss to No. Alabama had to hold off Clemson and Deshaun Watson for a thrilling victory in the national title game. The Crimson Tide won their first 11 games but were upended by Auburn in the regular-season finale. After beating Clemson in the semifinals, the Crimson Tide met Georgia in an all-SEC title game that will go down as one of the more thrilling finishes in college football history. Freshman quarterback Tua Tagovailoa came off the bench in the second half and threw a game-winning touchdown pass on the final play in overtime to win it for Alabama. Despite being gutted by injuries at linebacker, Alabama led the country in scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense. But Clemson had to overcome some uneven performances and a loss at home to Pitt in early November before making it into the top four. Then, it had to overcome Alabama in the national title game again. How that game ended ranks among the most exciting in championship game history. The

lead changed three times in the fourth quarter, and Clemson got the final word when Watson threw the game-winning, 2-yard touchdown pass to Hunter Renfrow with 1 second left on a play called "Orange Crush. Barrett -- Ohio State staged an incredible run to claim its first national title in 12 seasons. A roster filled with All-America candidates and future first-round draft picks overcame the loss of Barrett, as backup Cardale Jones dazzled in relief. LSU beat seven nationally ranked teams that season, and both of its losses came in triple overtime. The defense was rock-solid, led by Outland Trophy winner Glenn Dorsey at tackle, and running back Jacob Hester was the heart and soul of an offense that scored 30 or more points in 11 of 14 games. The Gators and Michigan had one loss each, and the lobbying for the final spot was intense on both sides. In the end, Florida squeezed in by a hundredth of a point in the final BCS standings, setting up a meeting with the Buckeyes at the Fiesta Bowl. Ohio State went in as a touchdown favorite, and few outside Gainesville gave Florida much of a chance to win. This team, however, laid the groundwork for what was to come. Ohio State beat unranked Illinois in overtime, then outlasted archrival Michigan as running back Maurice Clarett returned from injury and Krenzel led a fourth-quarter touchdown drive. The defense had stars such as safety Mike Doss, lineman Will Smith and Chris Gamble, who played cornerback and receiver. Clarett, a true freshman, became the face of the offense. This was a team that simply knew how to win, style points be damned.
