Fictional character biographies[ edit ] Dumfree Tweed and Deever Tweed are cousins who resemble each other so closely that they are often mistaken for identical twins. The two Tweeds always conduct their criminal activity in partnership with one another. They prefer to mastermind criminal schemes and let their henchmen carry out any necessary physical activity. The Tweeds will often use their extraordinary resemblance to trick their opponents into thinking there is only one of them. Tweedledum and Tweedledee first encountered Batman and Robin when they began a crime spree in Gotham City. Batman and Robin have fought against the Tweeds and have overcome them on subsequent occasions. The pair makes an appearance in Arkham Asylum: In this incarnation, they appear attached to each other by a pair of electroshock helmets, with Tweedledum representing the right half of the brain, and Tweedledee the left. Although Tweedledum and Tweedledee are most often depicted as being the leaders of their own criminal organization, they sometimes are reimagined as the henchmen of the Joker. Joker refers to them as "Tweedledee and the new Dum" implying that the original Tweedledum is either dead or still incarcerated. It was later confirmed in Detective Comics that Dumfree Tweed had died and his twin brother Dumson Tweed had taken his place. The new Tweedledum and Tweedledee were part of the Wonderland Gang. After Batman took down the henchmen, Mad Hatter eventually got back at them by sticking mind control chips on the two and turning them on each other. The villains were eventually arrested by the police. In this new timeline, they are reintroduced as the Tweed Brothers, working with Mad Hatter. They have been manipulated by Mad Hatter in a plot to make Gotham City insane. They are soon taken out by Batman. They also seem to have superhuman strength and resistance. In The New 52 , the brothers have superhuman strength 1 tonne and resistance. Arkham[ edit ] In Batman: Road to Arkham they are seen on a seesaw. Both escaped when Batman arrives, and leave behind their beanies. Arkham Knight prequel comic series, both Tweedledee and Tweedledum are hired by Penguin to steal a shipment from Waynetech. They are also given a henchman they dub "Tweedledie. Tweedledum and Tweedledee are later killed by the Arkham Knight in their cell with a shotgun. Gods Among Us[ edit ] In the Injustice: They appear as the henchmen of Mad Hatter alongside the other Alice in Wonderland-based henchmen. Tweedledum and Tweedledee appeared in Batman: The Brave and the Bold. They demonstrate a coordinated fighting style, working with each other, as when they bounce off each other and the prison walls to knock out a guard. In "Night of the Huntress! In "Legends of the Dark Mite! Tweedledum and Tweedledee were defeated by the real Batman who bowls them right into the other villains. This version of the characters are professional wrestlers who makes part of a group of boxers named the "Terrible Tweeds", alongside their 3 other unnamed brothers. In their debut episode "Mad City: New Day Rising", they are mind-controlled by Jervis Tetch as his muscles. They orchestrate an attack on the G. The one arrested is interrogated and gives up a location on Tetch upon Bullock threatening to burn the masks of his deceased brothers. In the episode "Mad City: Before he can have Mayor Cobblepot and those attending drink the Red Queen-spiked drinks, Harvey Bullock and Nathaniel Barnes lead the police in a raid on Cobblepot Manor which leads to the arrests of Jervis and the Tweeds. Video games[ edit ] In Batman: Tweedledum and Tweedledee appear in Batman: In this game, they are unrelated and are named Frank Dumfree and Willy Deever, who are patrons of the Stacked Deck Bar and with whom Bruce Wayne has interacted with before with Dumfree as far back as the previous game. In the fifth episode "Same Stitch", Joker recruits them to work as his henchmen, whether he takes the Villain or Vigilante path.

As accessories, she wears long, white gloves that end just under her armpits, and long boots that end at the middle of her thighs. These boots have a red accent on them, both which start from the middle top of the boot, just under the v-shaped cut, and end on the other side of the bood, making it seem like a rhombus shape when looked from the side. She also wears the same red, heart shaped hairclips as she wears every time she appears on screen. As make-up, she wears red lipstick, usually only on the bottom half of her lips. Everyday outfit Edit Her everyday outfit consists of a dress and high heeled shoes. The upper part of the dress has a modern version of a Qipao collar, with two buttons instead of the traditional knots. The upper part, which if light blue coloured ends in short sleeves. There is an asymmetrical dark blue part to the dress, which starts from the middle of the upper bit and ends in the middle of the lower bit. This shape goues from under the right armpit up to the left shoulder, where is meets the lihe of the armpit, creating a pointy shape. The dress from under the shape if dark blue, and ends in a petal shaped cut, creating the impression of a flower-like bottom half. At the end of each of these petals, there is a golden outline, which separates the blue from the lower part of the dress. Under the golden outline, there is a white, much more flowy skirt, which ends just about above the knees. The skirt itself resembles a flower, with the tight, less flowy blue part and cut-out giving it the shape of a flower. Tweedledee also wears low-heeled shoes, with blue as their main colour and white as their sub-colour. The entire heel of the shoe is white. As accessories, Tweedledee wears her red, heart shaped hairclips. For make-up, she wears the same make-up as she does while on her missions; red lipstick, which is usually only seen on the bottom lip. She now wears her hair in two buns with two pigtails falling out of the buns. She changed her overknee boots from Kiddy Grade to ballerinas, which are purplish red in color with a black tip. Her dress was changed to a white skirt and a asiatic styled shirt, which ends in a zigzag cut. The shirt has a high collar, and the top part of the shirt is also colored black until shortly above her chest. It also has golden outlines at the shirt and the bottom, with bows at the bottom at every zigzag. It also has a golden bow at the collar, closing the shirt, which is slightly open from where the bow close it down to the color change from black to purplish red. A golden strip also runs over the middle of the top with buttons over it, closing the shirt. The sleeves are detache and go from around the high of the armpits to her wrists. They are in the same color as the shirt and a golden band with a bow at the top holding them in place. The bottom of the sleeves are decorated with pink flower prints and white frills at the end. When on missions she is usual the one to take command and dislikes it when her brother calls her sister on one. Moreover, on missions she can be rather ruthless. She also worries over her friends, like when she comes to visit Lumiere when she is sick. Etymology Tweedledee was one of the twins in Alice in Wonderland. However, they not only were male, but they used their names that they are referred to as their surnames, while Tweedledee in Kiddy Grade uses it as a first name. The rose has many symbols; it represents love, honor, faith, beauty, balance, passion, wisdom, intrigue, devotion, sensuality and timelessness. However, the two roses interlinked have a different meaning as well; they represent mutual love and affection, which shows the deep bond Tweedledee and Tweedledum are sharing. Trivia Edit When on missions, Tweedledum often calls her "sister", which she rebukes him for. Tweedledee has two pigtails in Kiddy Girl-and; one of them is always in the front, while the other is at her

back. Ascoeur wore her pigtails in a similar way in the Kiddy Grade 2 Pilot. She is one of the E. S members that was seen in the original Kiddy Grade promo. Background The Tweedles are two fat brothers dressed in schoolboy uniforms and wearing propeller caps. They take particular delight in reciting poems and songs. They enjoy company and will always insist in a little game. They also have the ability to multiply. This makes the brothers think about the Little Oysters who were curious and that something sad happened to them when they were. Alice decides to stay to listen to the story which is actually a poem called The Walrus and the Carpenter. Tweedle Dee and Tweedle Dum tell Alice how one time in the middle of the night The Walrus and the Carpenter managed to lure the Little Oysters away from their mother in the sea and offered them to dinner. Then while the Carpenter went to get some stuff to go with the meal The Walrus ate up all the Oysters for himself. This made the Carpenter mad and the Carpenter chased the Walrus away. Tweedle Dee and Tweedle Dum are seen again during the reprise of the caucus race, and briefly during the scene when Alice is running away from the Queen of Hearts before she wakes up from her dream. They are the most athletic residents of Wonderland, often playing sports and organizing games. Once Upon a Time in Wonderland When Alice returns to Wonderland with Will and the White Rabbit, they immediately find themselves in a sticky situation; quite literally. The two amateur portal jumpers land in a mallow marsh and begin sinking. A worried White Rabbit runs off to get help for them. Tweedledum and Tweedledee, who are both dressed in masquerade styled clothes and are both presumably working for the Red Queen as slaves under a threat, open the door and accompany her majesty off the carriage so she can meet with the rabbit. Another guard apprehends the rabbit and the Red Queen approaches him, with Tweedledum and Tweedledee by her side. She angrily tells the rabbit that he os late, to which he responds that he came as fast as he could. Printed media Wonderland The Tweedles make a brief appearance during chapter 1 of the comic book based on the movie. The Queen intended to execute them both at the same time for the crime of "being unnecessarily annoying" which is a fitting accusation, given their characters. However, they are able to escape their punishment by lying that the White Rabbit was conspiring against her with the "Alice Monster". The Tweedles are rarely-seen meetable characters at all theme parks except Hong Kong Disneyland , mostly appearing in parades, live shows, and other entertainment entries. Currently, they are rarely ever found for meet-and-greet sessions. Disneyland Resort The Tweedle Brothers also appear in the Alice in Wonderland attraction in Disneyland giving opposing directions to riders as to where to find the White Rabbit.

This leads them to expect Alice to abandon them at various times throughout their routes. At some point, they formed a contract with Blood to guard the gates to his mansion. While the specifics of the contract are not clear, they seem relatively pleased with it. At first they seem to view Alice as a new toy, then a friend to show off their various toys to. Eventually, they start to try to become someone Alice can depend on, which draws them into conflict with each other. Alice has to decide if she sees them as potential romantic interests or as just little children. In their single volume manga Bloody Twins, they enter the bath with her and scare her. At first Alice has no clue who the twins were and was scared to be with them but then they scare her more when she finds out that the older twins are really the same twins she has always known. In the game, the twins often play hooky from the entertainment the Assembly and play in town. It is here that they reveal their ability to change their ages and they switch from young children to young men as they please. Alice has to come to terms with their viciousness as adults, as well as their innocence as children.
