Ballman developed a plan for the structure with Troop leader Buster Schmitz and then acquired the necessary materials, including former telephone poles. Installing the poles as the base required a backhoe. He then added the support structure for the middle of the bridge, added cross-planks, and built a handrail to help hikers cross it. The park is crisscrossed by a system of hiking and biking trails. The poles and planks were provided by the Alcove Spring Trust, an organization that oversees the park. Ballman was pleased to see the bridge withstood unusually heavy rains in September. The project taught him leadership, he said, as he directed younger members of this troop. I wanted a challenge. Another was built by troop member Tristan Schmitz a few years ago. From there, Cheryl quickly became the point person for her area and invited other churches to join in the effort. When Trail Life requested last year that each Troop appoint a point person for OCC and that one person would have an opportunity to go on an Operation Christmas Child Vision Trip to see firsthand the impact of a shoebox, Cheryl was quick to take responsibility and sign up. In October, Trailmen stood in uniform in the lobby of the church and handed out shoeboxes with the coupons. Cheryl even set up a facebook page for project leaders in the community to share ideas and encourage one another. By collection time, her efforts with the Troop resulted in 1, boxes being packed. In November of , Cheryl was notified she had been selected at random from the list of Troop Coordinators to attend the Vision Trip to the city of Irapuato, in Guanajuato, Mexico. In February, the Troop surrounded and prayed over Cheryl before she left for the Trip. What she experienced on the Trip was far more than she expected. The gift is far more than a shoebox. This ministry opens doors, unites pastors, engages teenagers, and changes lives. The Holy Spirit moves in an incredible way in these simple events often led by youth where children find hope and the lives of families are transformed. Next year, we will pack even more shoeboxes. Ask your Troop leadership about filling this important position and play a crucial role in transforming the lives of children around the world!
