

1: Liberal Zionists say that Israel is screwed up like the U.S. is screwed up

The Babylonians destroyed the First Temple, which was central to Jewish culture at the time. The Bar Kokhba revolt caused a spike in anti-Semitism and Jewish persecution. The ensuing exile from Judea greatly increased the percent of Jews who were dispersed throughout the Diaspora instead of living in their original home. Nasi, who never converted to Islam [40] [41] [notes 1] eventually obtained the highest medical position in the empire, and actively participated in court life. He first tried to establish a settlement in Gaza, but moved later to Smyrna. After deposing the old rabbi Aaron Lapapa in the spring of 1660, the Jewish community of Avignon, France prepared to emigrate to the new kingdom. The readiness of the Jews of the time to believe the messianic claims of Sabbatai Zevi may be largely explained by the desperate state of Central European Jewry in the mid-17th century. The bloody pogroms of Bohdan Khmelnytsky had wiped out one-third of the Jewish population and destroyed many centers of Jewish learning and communal life. The idea of returning to Palestine was rejected by the conferences of rabbis held in that epoch. Individual efforts supported the emigration of groups of Jews to Palestine, pre-Zionist Aliyah, even before 1882, the year considered as the start of practical Zionism. The conference of rabbis, at Frankfurt am Main, July 15-28, 1845, deleted from the ritual all prayers for a return to Zion and a restoration of a Jewish state. The Philadelphia Conference, 1869, followed the lead of the German rabbis and decreed that the Messianic hope of Israel is "the union of all the children of God in the confession of the unity of God". The Pittsburgh Conference, 1869, reiterated this Messianic idea of reformed Judaism, expressing in a resolution that "we consider ourselves no longer a nation, but a religious community; and we therefore expect neither a return to Palestine, nor a sacrificial worship under the sons of Aaron, nor the restoration of any of the laws concerning a Jewish state". Cresson was tried and condemned for lunacy in a suit filed by his wife and son. They asserted that only a lunatic would convert to Judaism from Christianity. He hoped to "prevent any attempts being made to take advantage of the necessities of our poor brethren FORCE them into a pretended conversion. Sir Moses Montefiore, famous for his intervention in favor of Jews around the world, including the attempt to rescue Edgardo Mortara, established a colony for Jews in Palestine. In 1871, his friend Judah Touro bequeathed money to fund Jewish residential settlement in Palestine. Laurence Oliphant failed in a like attempt to bring to Palestine the Jewish proletariat of Poland, Lithuania, Romania, and the Turkish Empire and The official beginning of the construction of the New Yishuv in Palestine is usually dated to the arrival of the Bilu group in 1882, who commenced the First Aliyah. In the following years, Jewish immigration to Palestine started in earnest. Most immigrants came from the Russian Empire, escaping the frequent pogroms and state-led persecution in what are now Ukraine and Poland. They founded a number of agricultural settlements with financial support from Jewish philanthropists in Western Europe. Additional Aliyahs followed the Russian Revolution and its eruption of violent pogroms, as well as the Nazi persecution of the 1930s. At the end of the 19th century, Jews were a small minority in Palestine. The WZO supported small-scale settlement in Palestine; it focused on strengthening Jewish feeling and consciousness and on building a worldwide federation. Jewish territorialism and Proposals for a Jewish state Throughout the first decade of the Zionist movement, there were several instances where Zionist figures supported a Jewish state in places outside Palestine, such as Uganda and Argentina. Some groups felt that accepting the scheme would make it more difficult to establish a Jewish state in Palestine, the African land was described as an "ante-chamber to the Holy Land". It was decided to send a commission to investigate the proposed land by 23 votes, with abstaining. The following year, congress sent a delegation to inspect the plateau. A temperate climate due to its high elevation, was thought to be suitable for European settlement. However, the area was populated by a large number of Maasai, who did not seem to favour an influx of Europeans. Furthermore, the delegation found it to be filled with lions and other animals. After Herzl died in 1904, the Congress decided on the fourth day of its seventh session in July to decline the British offer and, according to Adam Rovner, "direct all future settlement efforts solely to Palestine".

Although Zionism was not his invention, Herzl became the driving force of the movement. There were several factors that made him the ideal leader: He became obsessed with Zionism and relentlessly though out Europe, meeting many heads-of-state, in his attempt to gain support for a Jewish state. An Attempt at a Modern Solution of the Jewish Question which gained him much notoriety and transformed him into a leading personality in the Zionist movement. Present were delegates from 16 countries who formed the initial Zionist policy. This gathering proved a major event in the establishment of the modern State of Israel. Afterward Herzl wrote in his diary: At Basel I founded the Jewish State. Perhaps in five years but certainly in 50 everyone will know it. On May 14, - 50 years and 9 months later, the State of Israel was founded. Unfortunately, Herzl did not see it happen. He died at age 44 of a heart attack following the stormy controversy involving the proposal that the Jewish people make their home in Uganda. Herzl, who had provisionally supported the idea, settled the controversy convincing his detractors that he had remained faithful to Jewish settlement in the Land of Israel. Thus, he safeguarded the unity of the Zionist movement, but his weak heart gave out in the process. He died having given his life for the cause and he died bankrupt having spent all his money on his cause and leaving his family life and marriage in turmoil. Perhaps the greatest tragedy of his life was that he left no descendants to carry on after him. His wife Julia, who he was estranged from, died at age His three childrenâ€”Pauline, Hans and Trudeâ€”all died tragically. Pauline became a drug addict and died in France. Trude Margarethe, who was mentally ill, died at Theresienstadt at the hands of the Nazis. Herzl was buried in Europe, but in , after the state of Israel was declared, his body was disinterred and brought to Israel. He is buried in Jerusalem in a cemetery now known as Mount Herzl, where various heads of state and military heroes are also buried. Interestingly, Weizmann invented artificial acetone, the chief ingredient in gunpowder, in in the middle of World War I. His invention enabled the British to mass-produce gunpowder for the war effort. Because of this, he became friendly with Arthur Balfour, the foreign secretary of England. Balfour, who in promised British support for a national homeland for Jews in Palestine, said that acetone converted him to Zionism. We will discuss the Balfour Declaration in the next installment. A very significant personality, he was small in stature but a real powerhouse. Although he came from a religious family which was fervently Zionist, early on he, like most of the movements leadership, abandoned his religious roots. In that time, the land of Israel was still under the control of the Ottoman Empire and Ben-Gurion, who studied law in Constantinople for a while, favored loyalty to Turkey and adoption of Ottoman citizenship for Jews. However, when World War I broke out and the Turks began to persecute Zionists, he ran into trouble with the authorities and was exiled. He was originally one of the Maskilim who became disillusioned with their plan to acculturate the Jews to Eastern European society. He became the great intellectual leader of the early Zionist movement. Then, from this center the spirit of Judaism will radiate to the great circumference, to all the communities of the Diaspora, to inspire them with new life and to preserve the over-all unity of our people. When our national culture in Palestine has attained that level, we may be confident that it will produce men in the Land of itself who will be able, at a favorable moment, to establish a State thereâ€”one which will be not merely a State of Jews but really a Jewish State. Only later, when they found their efforts were futileâ€”in the face of terrible persecution which did not let up no matter how much the Jews tried to blend inâ€”did they turn to working for a Jewish homeland. Since many had been born into observant households and had had consciously left religion behind in the quest to assimilate, most carried their negative attitudes toward Judaism into their new Zionist ideology. The key factor which shaped their worldview was a nationalism based not only on the notion of creating a physical Jewish homeland, but also of creating a new kind of Jew to build and maintain this homeland. Many of these early Zionist thinkers felt that centuries of ghettoization and persecution had robbed the Jews of their pride and strength. To build a homeland required a proud, self-sufficient Jew: The pious, poor, ghettoized Jewâ€”who presented a pathetic image of a man stooped-over and always at the mercy of his persecutorsâ€”had to be done away with. Shimon

Persky became Shimon Perez. It was a deliberate attempt to create a totally new Jewish identity and rid themselves of any aspect of the religious, Diaspora Jewish identity. They believed that this new Jewish State, populated by fighting, farming Hebrews would revitalize the Jewish people, restore Jewish pride and put an end to anti-Semitism once and for all. While there is no doubt that the Jewish immigrants who created the modern Jewish state accomplished amazing feats against all odds-Zionism has not proven to be the solution to anti-Semitism and ironically, today, the number one excuse for Jew hate in the world is Zionism and the State of Israel. These early Zionist leaders knew of course that religion had preserved Jewish identity in the ghettos and shtetls of Europe, but in the modern Jewish state, they felt there would be no need for it. Of course the Bible would be used as a source of Jewish history and culture but there was no room for religion or ritual in the modern Jewish state. Torah and mitzvot commandments were the essence of what Judaism is all about and Jewish nation without these key ingredients would be like a body without a soul. More than that, the Torah explicitly stated over and over again Deut. How could a Zionist leadership that was largely anti-religious and bent on driving Jews away from Judaism possibly succeed in creating a Jewish presence in the Land of Israel? Rabbi Tzadik Hacohen Rabinowitz, who was known as the Tzadik of Lublin typified this view: Why did the Land perish? It may be assumed that if the Zionists gain domination they will seek to remove from the hearts of Israel, belief in God and in the truth of Torah. They have thrown off their garments of assimilation and put on a cloak of zeal so that they appear zealous on the behalf of Judaism. They are in fact digging a mine beneath our faith and seeking to lead Israel from beneath the wings of the Shechina, the Divine Presence. This was often achieved by deliberately placing new immigrants, often Sefardic Jews, into secular environments such as anti-religious kibbutzim collective farms. This led to the rapid secularization of a significant proportion of Jewish immigrants from Moslem countries that, having not experienced the European Enlightenment, had remained overwhelmingly observant, ironically, until their arrival in Israel. There were numerous religious Zionists who were some of the fiercest fighters for returning to the land. As we saw in Part 62 , it was Rabbi Shmuel Mohilever, one of the first religious Zionists from Poland, who heavily influenced Baron de Rothschild in supporting early settlements. Another key figure was Rabbi Abraham Isaac Kook , Torah scholar and Kabbalist, who arrived in Palestine in and was one of the leading Torah authorities in pre-state Palestine. In , he became the first chief rabbi of Palestine. The Mizrahi manifesto stated: It will serve as a focus for the ingathering of our spiritual forces and as a secure fortress for our Torah and sanctity. Reform Jews in America and Germany were very much opposed to Zionism. German Reform Jews said: The second aliyah following the Kishinev Progam on Easter see Part 57 and following the first aborted Russian Revolution brought another 40, Jews to Israel between and The third aliyah following World War I and the Russian Revolution brought another 35, between and By this time, the dream of a Jewish homeland was no longer just a dream. It was becoming a reality as the victorious Allied Forces conquered the Ottoman Empire which had picked the losing side in World War I and the British took over control of the Middle East. Sixteen Irgun members were killed in the incident which could have led to civil war. Religion and observance, on the other hand, are rapidly rising among the general population. Totally secular Jews are now the minority and truly anti-religious Jews are a very small percentage of the population.

Our two societies face the same problem, Naomi Chazan says. Speaker after speaker rose to say, What Israel is facing, we in the U. But the claim is central to liberal Zionism. Both countries are in crisis now, and both can be redeemed. And while the words I just said may be different, the sentiment is similar to everyone who is engaged in J Street. We believe in America, and we believe in Israel. But democratic norms and institutions are under fierce attack in both countries we love. Hmmm”which country am I speaking about? The truth is Israel beat us to it with a rightwing leadership years before we had Donald Trump. But here we are. And the similarities are abundant. Jeremy Ben-Ami also made the comparison at the conference. He broadened it to Palestine: Our partners in Israel and Palestine” they too must work to bring in new leaders who will show the courage of those who have ended conflicts, like Sadat and Begin, like Mandela and de Klerk and like the signatories of the Good Friday accord. Only when there are leaders who are ready to take the tough steps necessary to end their conflict will there be an end to the occupation, an end to the siege of Gaza, and an end to the threat of terror and violence. An Israeli leftwinger issued a similar challenge. Charlottesville is like the occupied West Bank. Coming to the U.. In both our countries we see these days the same contempt for civil rights, xenophobia, racism, and chauvinism and politics of fear all starting at the highest level of government. There is a clear alliance between the rightwing camps in the Israel and in the US. All over the world the idea of liberal democracy is under challenge, sometimes under attack. Today we are in an unprecedented political moment when the very things that we need to change about Israel have become the same ones you resist and fight for here in the U. The fight for democracy in Washington and in Jerusalem is the same fight. Netanyahu and Trump they both try to call us un-patriotic. There is nothing more patriotic than a joint struggle for our democracies, and this is what we are doing here tonight together. I think those various themes need to be part of how to rally the center left in Israel. I think we have to be able to seize the moment now, to recognize that our situation here, the people working against the populist wave here, are doing the same things that our friends in Israel are doing. They are not dead. How do we make American Jews who already share values with the Israeli moderate left, how do we make them aware of all the things and the currents that are going on? And one day the only thing I can promise and guarantee, is something will happen that will upset this wave, this hegemony in Israel. Sham said that if American Jews lose touch with Israelis, their Jewish identity is at stake: I conclude by saying if we forget what is going on in Israel, we cut away an essential part of our own identity. Identifying with the Israeli left is something that is now whether we like it or not part of our Judaism. And that has to be kept in mind. Many peoples have had movements of national liberation. About Zionism What is Zionism? Zionism is the political movement that is implementing the national liberation of the Jewish people. It is based on the assertion that the Jewish people, like any other people, has the right to self-determination; Jews have a right to a national home in their historic homeland. Zionism has made a reality of the "impossible" project of restoration of the Jewish people to our homeland, after nearly 2, years of exile. The work of Zionism is far from complete, however. Jews always thought of themselves as a nation or people. Jewish cultural and religious life always centered around the land of Israel. This did not change during two millennia of dispersion. History of Zionism The modern ideological expression of Zionism began to take shape in the nineteenth century. Jew s freed from the ghetto found that they could not, or did not want to, assimilate and lose their Jewishness, while at the same time, they could be part of a medieval religion whose time had passed. They came to the understanding that Jews are a people as well as a religion, and made explicit what had been implicit in Jewish culture. Zionism becomes a political movement Zionism became a political movement with the first Zionist congress in , organized by Theodor Herzl. The conference turned an intellectual "movement," scattered around Europe, into a political force, and provided a clear goal: Beyond this symbolic step, the conference was in reality a rather modest milestone. Without the support of the Jewish masses and rich financiers, it was hard for Zionism to show great concrete achievements. Without such achievements, it was hard for Zionism to win the support of the Jewish masses for a project that seemed hopeless and Quixotic. Tenacity, gradualism, pragmatism, courage and daring leveraged the tiny, gradually accumulated achievements of Zionism from a few people in a conference hall to a movement, from a movement in Europe to Jewish settlement in the land of Israel, from a few settlements to the British mandate, from the mandate to a Jewish state. In it, the British government promised to support the creation of a national home for the Jewish people in Palestine. When the Balfour declaration was incorporated in the League of Nations mandate for Palestine in , it became international law. The United Nations inherited the obligations of the League of nations. Therefore, the state of Israel is the result of a promise backed by international law, and not an "illegal entity" as anti-Zionists claim. Zionism creates the State of Israel An important tenet of Zionism was the understanding that the Jews of Europe were in danger, that Anti-Semitism would continue to rise and become increasingly virulent. Therefore, Zionists understood that there was some urgency about their work. Most of the world, and most of the Jews of the world, did not understand the urgency until after the rise of Nazism, when it was too late. Not even the Zionists could imagine the horrors of the Holocaust however. The revolt was evidently funded and supported by the axis powers in order to fight the British. The British reneged on their promise to create a national home for the Jews in Palestine, and shut the gates of Palestine to Jewish immigration in with the White Paper. The Zionist leadership despaired of the British and in , when they thought it was still possible to save some of the Jews of Europe, they adopted the Biltmore Program , calling for an independent Jewish state. A tiny remnant remained and wanted to immigrate to Palestine, but the British would not allow it. The Jews turned against the British and using guerilla warfare, forced them to relinquish their hold on Palestine, which was partitioned by UN General Assembly Resolution into a Jewish state and an Arab state. The Arabs did not accept the decision of the UN. Open warfare broke out. After the Declaration of Independence of the State of Israel on May 15, , neighboring Arab countries invaded the new state. The creation of the state did not end the mission of Zionism, since the new Jewish state was surrounded by enemies and since most Jews still did not live in Israel. They depict Zionism as a "pernicious plot" that controls European and American governments, just as anti-Semites depicted Jews as plotting to subvert governments and achieve world domination.
