The Southern Claims Commission was established in to judge petitions filed by Southerners asking to be paid for their propertyâ€”usually crops or livestockâ€”that had allegedly been seized by Federal soldiers during the Civil War. Before paying any claim, the commission required that claimants prove two thingsâ€”that they had remained loyal to the Union and that the U. Army had confiscated their property. Both propositions were difficult to prove, and consequently most of the 22, claims were denied. But every recorded claim, whether approved or not, illuminates what life was like for civilians in Civil War battle zones. First, Wenger and Rodes searched for claims filed by their ancestors, but they soon decided to dig up every claim filed by residents of Rockingham County. During their 15 or 20 trips to the Archives, Wenger and Rodes photocopied claims from Rockingham Countyâ€”more than 12, pages of documents, some containing tales of murder, betrayal, hatred and heroism. Fascinated by the stories, they decided to publish all of the claims. Between and â€”aided by grants from local historical groups and the expertise of Dr. Bittinger, a sociology professor at Bridgewater College in Virginiaâ€”they published the documents in the six-volume series *Unionists and the Civil War Experience in the Shenandoah Valley*. On May 23, Virginia held a referendum to decide if the state should secede from the Union. The Rockingham Register urged a unanimous vote for secession, and local rebels visited the farms of Mennonites and Brethren to demand their support. They had to announce their votes aloud. In the town of Mount Crawford, a man named Harrison defied the mob, voted for Union and then headed home. Of more than 2, votes cast in the county, only 22 favored staying in the Union. Secession meant war, as Elder Kline had predicted, and soon Confederate recruiters interrupted services at Mennonite and Brethren churches to demand that all men between the ages of 18 and 45 report for service in the army. Others refused to serve and were imprisoned. And many fled through the mountains, heading north or west, pioneering what would soon become a well-organized stream of refugees. But the jailed religious dissenters had their supporters. Elder Kline and two other religious leaders were also arrested and sent to Castle Thunder. Some wealthy Mennonites and Brethren paid their fines and kept working their farms. Those men also fled through the mountains, stopping to eat and rest at the farmhouses and churches that made up the underground railroad. Elder Kline continued his ministry as a circuit-riding preacher, visiting Brethren churches in Virginia, Tennessee, Kentucky, Pennsylvania and Ohio. The preacher tumbled from his horse and lay gasping on the path. During the Civil War, Jacob Miller owned this farmhouse. That was a terrifying job: I am 61 years old. I am a farmer and preacher in the Dunker church. I aided and assisted a large number of refugees and deserters to escape from the Confederacy. I have kept them concealed or have fed them and sent them to other agents and guides. I have had them come to my house from distant counties in the night. My house was one of the Depots of the underground RR, as it was called. But they called it that themselves. Poring through thousands of pages, Wenger and Rodes pieced together a picture of how the operation worked. The underground devised its own code: The usual destination was New Creek, now known as Keyser, W. And they found references to 12 different pilots. Keester told me he had taken about 2, men through [the mountains] during the last two years of the war. Patty Kelly Skeptics sometimes ask Wenger and Rodes the barbed question: It was entered by a trap door in my bedroom and covered by a carpet so no one would suspect anything. Lewis, who later served as a United States senator from Virginia, told the commission. The Union Army was also a threat. They stole the livestock and burned the barns of secessionists and Unionists alike. They also stole, killed and butchered two sheep, two hogs and two

cows outside the family barn. When she finished, the soldiers confiscated that meat, too. It was rainy in Plett, and the pass was covered in mist and fog. As soon as I passed over the Outeniquas however, the sky cleared. And the landscape changed too. From the moist forests on the coast, the land becomes much drier, a result of the rain shadow. It is a meeting point of several different climatic zones. It lies at the border of the winter and summer rainfall patterns, receiving some winter rain from the Cape, but mostly summer rain which characterizes the eastern and northern parts of South Africa. The valley itself is long and narrow, bordered with high mountain ranges which lie in a west-east direction. The Baviaans is a World Heritage Site, because it forms one of eight protected areas making up the Fynbos biome, the most diverse plant kingdom on earth, per square kilometre. The Baviaanskloof Reserve itself is run by Eastern Cape Parks and Tourism, and it lies in the east of the valley, in some of the most mountainous and wildest land. But most of the Baviaanskloof forms part of a mega-reserve, which incorporates not only pure conservation land, but also private farmland which is managed in line with naturally-sustainable agriculture. In the west of the valley is a narrow lowland surrounded by mountains, and it is here that most of the farmers live, alongside the perennial river which gives the valley its name. I am heading into the reserve tomorrow, but for the past few days, I have been staying on two different farms: Kamerkloof and Zandfontein, two beautiful properties lying close to the entrance of the reserve. It really is a good way to introduce yourself to the region, and the locals are charismatic, friendly and welcoming. I went for a walk on Kamerkloof farm with owner Nick Reyneke, and one minute we were walking through hot sub-tropical thicket with beautiful sweethorn trees, then we entered a narrow shaded canyon called Dam se Kloof, and immediately there was closed canopy forest of fig and stinkwood trees. There were rock pools and streams, frogs and birds – Nick says that there are Knysna loeries in these narrow ravines! Who would have thought! Usually these birds are only found in the moist coastal forests on the Indian Ocean coastline, and when I hiked the Otter Trail in November last year in the Garden Route National Park, I saw several loeries. Many of the families have been living here for several generations, going back to the early s. There are just 13 farms in the whole valley, and there is a strong sense of community. But times are changing, and farming is becoming increasingly difficult. More and more, the farmers are working to restore the land from overuse and degradation. At the heart of the matter is water – or lack of it. For more than hundred years, the farmers have exploited the alluvial soils, growing crops and letting their goats and sheep graze the natural veld. The river was artificially channeled to control water supply. For a long time, it was a productive farming area. But slowly farming became more and more marginal, as the veld was overgrazed, and the ground water diminished. No longer did the water soak into the soils, releasing slowly during the year. Today, many of the farmers are changing their farming practices, and preparing for the future. The long term climate trends suggest that this area will become drier and drier, receiving more winter rainfall, but enduring hotter, drier summers. Piet Kruger at Zandvontein has been here for 35 years, and he tells me this current summer has been the driest on record. Just 18mm of rain has fallen since June last year. But the winter rains up to June last year brought mm. Provincial and national government, as well as the Dutch government, are helping with the funding. Piet told me that the farmers in the valley hope to benefit from so-called payments for eco-system services that the valley supplies to the region. Downstream of the Baviaans River is the Kouga Dam, one of the biggest in the province which supplies the city of Port Elizabeth with fresh water. As a result of channeling of the river, and unsustainable farming practices, the dam has become increasingly silted over the years, and during rainy season, a lot of the water has to be released from the full dam because most rain that falls simply flows over the ground, not into it, a result of degraded veld. Once the veld has been restored however, the soil will hold the water through the year, releasing it slowly from the valley into the dam. South Africa is an arid country, and fresh water is probably its most important resource. Without fresh water, the cities and economy stop running. Along with restoration of

natural veld come the small antelope and wildlife. In the reserve itself, buffalo, mountain zebra, eland and rhino were reintroduced, starting in the early s. Piet tells me that he sometimes gets kudu and buffalo walking across his farm! And then there are the leopards, many of which have been hunted in the past by livestock farmers. The Landmark Foundation has done some good research here, studying these apex predators and working with farmers to resolve problems that arise from having these beautiful cats living side by side with juicy, fat livestock. Piet tells me that most farmers now have stopped hunting and trapping of leopards, and have come to realize that leopards actually provide a crucial role. The big cats keep other predators like caracal and jackal in check, stopping more livestock loss. As farming has become more marginal, so the community relies on tourists who come to the valley to see not only leopard, but also buffalo, kudu, eland, bushbuck and black rhino which all now thrive in the reserve itself. There are also some beautiful guesthouses on the farms in this dramatic landscape, and these would make for a fantastic stay-over in their own right – both Kamerkloof and Zandvontein are among these. Today I head into the reserve properly, but yesterday I had a short trip just inside the western border, hiking with ranger Klasie Kietas to a beautiful ravine called Geelhoutbos – which as its Afrikaans name suggests, is filled with yellowwood trees. Klasie took me to some bushman paintings at the top of Geelhoutbos, and to me they seem very unlike any other rock art I have seen in South Africa. Check out the photos and see for yourself. Klasie was born at Studtis, which is about 30kms west of the reserve near Kamerkloof, and he has been working for parks board for 25 years. It was seriously hot today, and as we walked out of the forest up onto the slopes, the temperatures seemed to soar. His DNA is clearly attuned to this landscape and climate – and no doubt his ancestry extends back several thousand years! My ancestors spent too much time in Europe acclimatizing to the cold weather!
