Step. Find out whether you can view any web pages. Open Internet Explorer and type in the address of a site with which you are unfamiliar. If you need an idea, look around the room and type in a brand name you see, such as "www.enganchecubano.com" or "www.enganchecubano.com".

It works by extending the existing Protected Mode functionality to help prevent attackers from installing software, accessing personal information, accessing information from corporate Intranets, and from modifying system settings. To do this, Enhanced Protected Mode must reduce some of the capabilities available to Internet Explorer. These restrictions may cause issues with your browsing experience when using Internet Explorer. By disabling Enhance Protected Mode, your performance in Internet Explorer may improve but could leave you at risk for possible attacks. How to disable Enhanced Protected Mode: Swipe in from the right edge of the screen, tap Start, and then type Internet options. Tap or click Settings located under the search box to the right of the screen. Then, tap or click the Internet Options icon located under the search results. In the Internet Options windows, tap or click the Advanced tab. Tap or click to uncheck the box. Tap or click the Apply button, and then tap or click OK. Restart Internet Explorer and check to see if the issue is resolved.

Delete your browser history To delete the browsing history in Internet Explorer 10, follow these steps: Start Internet Explorer from the desktop. Press Alt to show the menu bar. On the Tools menu, tap or click Internet options. Under Browsing history, click Delete. The screen shot for this step is listed below. Select all the applicable check boxes, and then tap or click Delete. Tap or click Exit, and then restart Internet Explorer.

Disable add-ons in Internet Explorer Internet Explorer 10 is designed to provide an add-on free experience, and it plays HTML5 and many Adobe Flash Player videos without having to install a separate add-on. Add-ons and toolbars work only in Internet Explorer for the desktop. To view a page that requires add-ons in Internet Explorer, swipe down or right-click to bring up the Address bar, tap or click the Page tools button, and then tap or click View on the desktop. You can view, enable, and disable the list of add-ons that can be used by Internet Explorer for the desktop. Add-ons that you can manage include browser helper objects, ActiveX controls, toolbar extensions, explorer bars, browser extensions, search providers, accelerators, and tracking protection settings. To manage add-ons Start Internet Explorer for the desktop. On the Tools menu, tap or click Manage add-ons. Under Show, tap or click All Add-ons, and then disable all of them by tapping or clicking each one, and then select Disable. Tap or click Close. Restart Internet Explorer and test it. If you can successfully access the Internet, the issue involves an installed add-on. Re-enable each add-on one at a time, and test to determine which add-on is causing the issue.

Check Proxy and DNS Settings Proxy settings are used to tell Internet Explorer the network address of an intermediary server known as a proxy server that is used between the browser and the Internet on some networks. Changing proxy settings is something you usually only have to do if you are connecting to the Internet through a corporate network. By default, Internet Explorer automatically detects proxy settings. However, if this setting has been changed and you are not trying to connect to a corporate network, you may experience connection issues. To verify that Internet Explorer is automatically detecting your proxy settings, follow the steps below: Tap or click the Connections tab, and then tap or click the LAN settings. Tap or click Automatically detect settings and verify that there is check mark in the box beside it. Tap or click OK to close the windows. Restart Internet Explorer and verify the issue is resolved. Click the Advanced tab, and then click Reset. Click Close, and then click OK two times. Exit and then restart Internet Explorer. The changes take effect the next time that you start Internet Explorer.

Check whether a third-party service, program, or anti-virus is conflicting with Internet Explorer Some third party anti-virus programs may cause issues for Internet Explorer getting connected to the network. Remove any 3rd party anti-virus from your system per the instructions given by the developers of those programs. To determine whether a third-party program or service conflicts with Internet Explorer, follow these steps: Tap or click the Search charm, type msconfig in the search box, and then tap or click the displayed System Configuration icon. Tap or click the Services tab and select the Hide all Microsoft services check box, and then click Disable all. Tap or click the Startup tab. Tap or click Disable all in the bottom right corner, and then

click OK. You are prompted to restart your computer. After the restart, test Internet Explorer for an online connection. Depending on the result, go to the "The connection works" section or to the "The connection still does not work" section.

The connection works If the connection works, a third-party service or program may be conflicting with Internet Explorer. To identify the conflicting service or program, follow these steps: Tap or click the Services tab, and then select the Hide all Microsoft services check box. Select half of the listed items, and then click OK. Restart the computer, and then test Internet Explorer. Repeat steps 1â€”4 until you identify the service that is conflicting with Internet Explorer.

The connection still does not work If the connection still does not work, re-enable all programs, and then go to the "Temporarily disabling the firewall" section. To re-enable all programs, follow these steps: Tap or click the Services tab, and then enable all the programs. Tap or click the Startup tab, enable all the programs, and then click OK.

Updating older drivers and editing registry keys

Checking Windows Updates for drivers Even if you already receive automatic updates, you can manually check for and install updated drivers in optional updates. Tap or click Check for updates, and then wait while Windows looks for the latest updates for your PC. If updates are found, tap or click Install updates. Read and accept the license terms, and then tap or click Finish if the update requires it. You might be asked for an admin password or to confirm your choice. To do this, type regedit in the Start Search box, and then select regedit in the Programs list. If you are prompted for an administrator password or for a confirmation, type the password, or select Allow.

Locate and then select the following registry subkey: Type EnablePreBinding, and then press Enter. On the Edit menu, select Modify. Type 0, and then select OK. Try selecting the desired text from the web page, copying it, and pasting it into a word processor. Delete any unwanted remnants, adjust the margins, and print the portion you want. Copy the entire page and paste it into a word processor.

Too often pages get cut off at the margin so the ends of lines are missing or pictures are cut off, or blanks appear where words or images should be. Never fear-- we have a few how to tips and tricks for you to get those internet pages to print out nice, neat and complete. First Click on Print Preview Before you print out a page, go to your browser menu usually the file menu and click on print preview. This will bring up images of the web pages as they will appear on a print out. If they look good, all you should have to do is click the print command, usually also found in the browser menu file window, and they will print out as shown. Note, however, that once in a great while the print preview will not be accurate, and the print out will not match the preview. Look for the Printer Friendly Link Some pages will have a "printer friendly" or "printable version" link or the like. Click on this link and you will get a version of the web page or pages that is optimized for print out. Once you have brought up this printer friendly version, just click on your print command found in your internet browser window. You might still have some problems if you are printing on a black and white printer, which we will discuss later, but otherwise you should get a faithful print out. If it is the usual html file, it may also have a link that will take you to a pdf file version of the same pages. Look for this pdf file link and click on it to bring up the pdf file. To read this pdf file, you will need a copy of adobe acrobat, which you can download for free by clicking on this adobe acrobat link. Clicking on the browser print command may cause all kinds of problems, depending on how your computer is configured. When you print in landscape, you are pretty much guaranteed that nothing will get cut off at the margins. Black and White Printer Problems Some black and white printers do not convert all the colors to black or gray causing some elements of pages not to print out at all. You get blanks spaces instead of words or picture. I have a black and white printer that does not print out blue. This is really aggravating when printing out text that contains a lot of those blue underlined links. You are reading a sentence and suddenly there are missing words. There are a couple of solutions here. The obvious one is to print out the pages on a color printer or a different black and white printer that does not have this problem. Another solution is to cut and paste the web page into another program such as a word processing program. In many cases you can just then print out the pages and they will print fine. Problems Photocopying Web Page Print Outs Sometimes a page prints out fine on a color printer, but you have problems copying color portions on a black and white photocopier. This may be intentional, as it allows you to get good copies of things written on yellow legal pads, and to eliminate yellow highlighter marks from pages you have marked up. However if the yellow is content you want to keep, it just gets lost. Alternatively, print out on a black and white printer before you photocopy.

Slow-loading Web pages are a symptom of many different issues. The problem could be your computer or a server hundreds of miles away. A businessman is using his laptop. If there are numerous sites on a single server, they may all slow down if only one or two sites max-out the bandwidth restrictions. If you suspect this to be the problem, wait a little and try again. Some ISPs also have bandwidth restrictions. If you go over your limit, your connection is limited for a set period. If every other site you visit is fine, the problem is likely the site itself. Sites using an abundance of unoptimized images, bulky design elements, flash animations and embedded media, such as videos, often load extremely slowly. The larger the file size for each page on a site, the longer it takes to load. Sneaky Malware If all of the sites you visit are loading slowly, the problem could be your computer. One of the most common symptoms of malware, trojans, spyware and other viruses is a seemingly slower Internet connection. They might also be sending data back to a hacker, which makes your own browsing experience excruciatingly slow and a potential security threat. Run an anti-virus and anti-malware scan on your computer. You can use either free or paid programs. The first three are available in both free and paid versions. Network Problems Galore Congested networks or network outages may prevent Web pages from loading at all. The more people there are using a network at one time, the slower it becomes. This is true for both private home networks, company and public Wi-Fi networks. To fix this problem, try reducing how many people use your home network. Also, check the current connections on your home network for neighbors piggybacking off your Wi-Fi. Use a strong password to secure the network and lock your neighbors out. Blame It on the Browser Often, the browser itself is to blame for slow-loading pages. Every add-on or extension you load can drastically reduce loading times. Older browsers are also a problem. Not only will you be more secure, but the browser will be optimized for newer Web pages. Some sites only support certain browsers. Some legitimate sites are flagged as dangerous by your anti-virus and your firewall may block them. If you trust the site, temporarily disable your firewall or anti-virus software and try to load the page again.

4: How to Create a Simple Web Page With HTML (with Examples)

Typically, the HTML file includes associations with other files that either appear on the web page or govern how it looks or works. The resulting PDF behaves much like the original web page. For example, the images, links, image maps, and most media files appear and function normally within the PDF. Animated GIF files appear as still images, showing the last frame of the animation. For example, you can navigate through the file by scrolling or using bookmarks; users can add comments to it; you can add security, form fields, and other features that enhance it. In preparing to convert web pages to PDF, consider the following factors, which affect how you approach the conversion process: How much do you want to convert? If you want to convert only selected areas of the currently open web page, use PDFMaker from within Internet Explorer. If you want to convert several levels or all of a multipage website to PDF, work within Acrobat. You can do both in either Acrobat or Internet Explorer, but you choose different buttons or commands to accomplish these things. Also, it is preferable to select an appropriate encoding from the HTML conversion settings. Using the commands on this toolbar, you can convert the currently displayed web page to PDF in various ways. For example, you can convert the entire web page or selected areas of it. The toolbar has additional commands that initiate further actions after conversion, such as attaching the new PDF to a new email message or printing it. A menu on the PDF toolbar provides easy conversion and print capabilities. Go to the web page. For Mac, use Firefox. Then select a location, type a filename, and click Save. Then locate and select the existing PDF, and click Save. When the conversion is complete and the Print dialog box opens, specify options and click OK. Then specify a location and filename for the PDF, and click Save. Type the appropriate information in the email message that opens after the conversion is complete. Right-click on the selected content and choose one of the following: Then select a name and location for the PDF. Then locate and select the PDF to which the selection will be added. Convert selected areas in a web page to PDF Internet Explorer only You can use the Select option to select specific areas on a web page to convert. You can use this option to convert meaningful content on a web page and omit unwanted content, such as advertisements. As you move the pointer around the web page, a red dotted line indicates areas of the web page that you can select. Click the areas to convert. Selected areas appear in blue boxes. To deselect an area, click it again. Proceed with conversion as usual. To deselect all areas and exit the select mode, click Select again. Convert a linked web page to PDF In the open web page, right-click the linked text and choose one of the following: If you select either of these options, the currently open web page, not the selected link, is converted. For example, you can include an entire website in the PDF or just some levels of a website. To change the number of levels in the website to convert, click Capture Multiple Levels. Enter the number of levels to include, or select Get Entire Site to include all levels from the website. Some websites have hundreds or even thousands of pages. Converting a large website can make your system slow and unresponsive, and can even use up available hard drive space and memory, causing a system crash. If Get Only N Level s is selected, select one or both of the following options: Stay On Same Server Downloads only web pages stored on the same server. You can view PDF pages while they are downloading; however, you cannot modify a page until the download process is complete. You do not need to wait for the conversion to complete before adding more requests. While a conversion is in progress, you can convert another page to PDF and that gets added to the queue. The number of requests in the queue are indicated by the Pending Conversions field in the Download Status dialog box. If necessary, scroll to the page containing links to the pages you want to add. Right-click the web link, and choose Append To Document. After pages have been converted, links to these pages change to internal links, and clicking a link takes you to the PDF page, rather than to the original HTML page on the web. If necessary, scroll to the page containing a web link you want to convert. In Windows, you can also convert a linked page from a web page displayed in Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, or Firefox, using a similar right-click command. Copy the URL of a web link Use

this procedure to copy the path for a web link to the clipboard, to use it for other purposes. Open the previously converted PDF in Acrobat. If necessary, scroll to the page containing links to the pages you want to copy. Right-click the web link and choose Copy Link Location. Change web page conversion options The settings for converting web pages to PDF apply to the conversion process. The settings changes do not affect existing PDFs. Do one of the following: Click the Settings button to see additional options for the selected File Type. On the Page Layout tab, select options for page size, orientation, and scaling, as needed. Choose a file type and click Settings to select the font properties and other characteristics. If the page has no title, the URL is used as the bookmark name. This structure lets you create tagged bookmarks for paragraphs, list elements, and other items that use HTML elements. Headers show the web page title, or if no title is available, the web page URL or file path. Footers show the web page URL or file path, and the date and time of the download. Page Layout tab The Page Layout options specify a selection of page sizes and options for width, height, margin measurements, and page orientation. The Scaling options are as follows: If this option is not selected, the paper size adjusts to fit the contents of the page, if necessary. Switch To Landscape If Scaled Smaller Than Changes the page orientation to landscape if the new version of a page is less than the specified percentage of the original size. Available only if you selected portrait orientation. Default Encoding Lets you specify the following options: Default Encoding Sets the input encoding of the file text from a menu of operating systems and alphabets. Language Specific Font Settings Use these settings to change the language script, body text typeface, and base typeface size. Default Colors Sets the default colors for text, page backgrounds, and web links. Click the color button to open a palette and select the color. Multimedia Content Determines whether to disable multimedia capture, embed multimedia files when possible, or link to multimedia such as SWF files by URL. Retain Page Background Specifies whether to display colors and tiled images in page backgrounds and colors in table cells. If options are deselected, converted web pages sometimes look different than they do in a web browser, but are easier to read when printed. Underline Links Underlines textual web links on the pages. Text Settings Sets the input encoding of the text for a file. Default Colors Sets the default colors for text and page backgrounds. Click the color button to open a palette, and select the color. Wrap Lines At Margin Inserts a soft return when the text reaches the edge of the text area on the page.

Print window settings Printer section: The default printer is the Windows one. When a web page is printed with the selected printer, it becomes the new default printer. Lets you specific which pages of the current web page are printed: Select All to print everything. Select Pages and enter the range of pages you want to print. For example, selecting "from 1 to 1" prints the first page only. Lets you specific how many duplicates you want to print. If you enter more than 1 in the Number of copies field, you can also choose whether to collate them. For example, if you choose to make two copies and select Collate, they will print in the order 1,2,3,1,2,3. Otherwise, they will print in the order 1,1,2,2,3,3. The following settings are saved as Firefox preferences on a per-printer basis. Select Portrait for most documents and web pages. To try to make the web page fit on fewer sheets of printer paper, you can adjust the scale. Otherwise, Firefox leaves page backgrounds white. You can enter the width of the page margins for the top, bottom, left and right sides of the page separately. Use the dropdown menus to select what appears on the printed page. Nothing will be printed. Print the title of the page. Print the web address of the page. Print the date and time when the page was printed. Print the page number. Print the page number and total number of pages. Enter your own header or footer text. This can be used to show a company or organization name at the top or bottom of every printed page. Click OK to finish making changes and close the Page Setup window. Advanced tips If you want to edit the web page content prior to printing, you can use an extension from Firefox Add-ons. To print a single image from a page, you can typically right-click it and select View Image or View Background Image then print using the instructions above. If you see some colors on background images missing, follow the step preceding step.
